

PUBLICATION PROBLEM SOLVED

That's right -- and it will be done by one who has faithfully served the National Radio Club since 1940 -- our own Ray B. "Pop" Edge! The schedule will begin weekly issues again on October 10; and until then, this will be the only issue, a special one, being published by a fine group of avid DXers and loyal NRCSers, the Amarillo troupe of real live-wire DXers, who volunteered not merely to do this one issue, but who had offered their services to take over entirely. A low bow to them all, and especially to John Callarman and Larry Godwin, who brought forth this proposal at the Omaha Convention.

There will still be 34 issues of DX NEWS this season, in spite of issuing only once in September. There will be four issues in October and November and December; five in January, four again in February and March, four in April which has five Saturdays, and then four more, to make 34, in May, June, July, and August.

NRC'S NEW GOVERNING BODY

At the business meeting at the Saturday evening Convention Dinner, Pop Edge Proposed, and it was seconded and carried unanimously that the two editors, Lefty Cooper and Fred Van Voorhees, would have complete charge over their respective sections, and would assume FULL responsibility for anything they might print in them. Likewise, as new Executive Secretary, Ray Edge will assume complete responsibility for anything he may add to his section, or comments he might place in DX NEWS.

All complaints, suggestions, proposals, etc. must be sent IN TRIPLICATE to Ray B. Edge, 325 Shirley Avenue, Buffalo 15, New York. Ray will then send a copy to Cooper and Van Voorhees, and their decisions - majority ruling - will be final.

All other offices in the NRC were eliminated. The vote was unanimous, by all present at this NRC Convention Dinner in the Town House, Omaha, Nebraska.

The 1959 - 1960 NRC Domestic Contest was re-approved, and Maurice Nittler will again be the Contest Manager. Entry fee is 25¢ in coin, to be sent to Maurice Nittler, 2818 South Cherokee, Englewood, Colorado. The rules are exactly the same as last year, and the dates of the eligible veries will be from September 15 1959 to April 15 1960, inclusive, with June 1 the deadline for receiving verifications. Almost everyone at the Convention signed up in the Contest, so all you who were not there, please join it too and make it the greatest ever. The full rules will be re-printed as soon as they are received from Maurice.

Ray Edge and his wife Kate are taking an extended vacation trip, and will not return to Buffalo until October 4. So that those who were not at the Convention might know of the good news that all is well once again, the Amarillo lads proposed publishing this issue, to pass the tidings along to all of you, and also to present some hot tips to you, which follow.

KRNY-1460, Kearney, Nebraska, will conduct a special ET on Monday, September 14, 1959, starting at 1 AM EST and running at least two hours. This is too late for you, but is the latest it could be done by our member Phil Robbins who has been a DJ there, as he is leaving the station two days later. If you heard this test, send another report now to Phil Robbins at this address: 7005 Woolworth Avenue, Omaha 14, Nebraska.

KOCC-1420, Omaha, Nebraska, is about to go 1,000 watts daytime directional. ET's will be run on either 9/14, 9/21, or 9/28, all morning, with TT and announcements, on what should be a clear channel.

KIXZ-940, Amarillo, Texas, is about to test their new 5,000 watt daytime non-directional pattern, and will do so for several weeks, but especially will they do so on Mondays either 9/21 or 9/28, or both, and on days in between.

I have been mulling about the fact that a DXer is not without honor except in his own land. At least it seems harder to get veries out of the stations nearby than those farther away. However I have finally made the grade. There are three stations within 50 miles airline of here (none within 50 miles by road - stop drooling on the page, Lefty - and I have finally verified them all. KSRF is furthest and therefore easiest. All it took was one report and a year of patient waiting. KJAX is only a couple of miles closer but it took three reports and a PP card before conquering them recently. KUKI-1400 is closest. This took three reports, PP cards helped not a bit, neither did my first visit to the station. However the second visit brought me in contact with the proper person and so they are all in the bag. When that Santa Rosa permit on 1580 hits the air I'll have it all to go through again. I am already wondering if they'll locate the other side of town near KSRF or out this way near KJAX, hi. Actually I now have veries from every station currently operating within 150 miles of this DX den. I need KINS-980 and I'll have everything in the Northern half of California, the dividing line running from King City to Fresno to Bishop. But in all California I still need 32 that are on. Recent veries are from KHQE-1400, KEZY-1190, KJAX-1150, KALL-910, KIT 1280, KGLN-980, KSMA-1240 and KWJB-1240. The latter is AN including Monday on automatic equipment according to their verie. Speaking of Monday AM ANs, the three graveyard channels in the 1400s have all been KOed here: KONI on 1400, KONE on 1450, add KOWL on 1490. The latter runs parallel to KOH and KNBC until 4 a.m. and then runs till dawn on its own. There has been a constant shift of AN stations on 1240 so you never know what to expect. KSON KWJB KFLY seem to be fully scheduled on AN, though the latter may be off Mondays. KROY is AN on Sundays, but seems to go off eventually other AMs, but you can never tell when. Others heard very late are KRXL and KRDO. KTIP may be AN on 1450, along with KONE. KHQE-1400 runs 8-2 daily but they carry Giant games and might run later if double-header kept them on. KUKI also carries the same on 1400. That's all for now so I'll go back to waiting for the news from Omaha. 73s

Not much DX to report, but I did want to make issue #1 Volume 27 as well as let everyone know I'm still alive. Between working and traveling, very little actual listening has been done, but a few "goodies" have been heard. Trips to New York and West Virginia were sandwiched in between housepainting jobs near Erie this summer and although I did plan to phone a few NRCers in the New York/New Jersey area, the fact that I had car trouble forced me to cut the trip short. Going way back to April 19, WFRB-740 heard at 12:15 p.m. Funny thing, on the East Side of New Castle WFRB can be heard regularly through CBL, but at my home on the North Hill they are very tough. On 5/2 new WABQ-1540, new WKKS-1570 and WBOY-1400 call change from WBLK all heard between 8:30-8:45 p.m. WBUZ-1570 finally heard on 6/4 at 9 p.m. 6/15 brought KSCJ-1360 s/off and WICK-1400 AN at 2 a.m. and later. Between 1:00 and 2:00 a.m. 6/27, WTON-1240, CJRH-1310, WHAR-1340 and WNBT-1490 were heard. Next logging was long-awaited WTAD-930 at 1:00 s/off on 7/22. WCOM-1230 at 12:01 a.m. on 7/31 with NX. Rules

The contest will officially begin on September 15, 1959, with exceptions noted below. Stations heard on Sept. 15 or later and up until April 15, 1960, will be eligible as follows:

2 stations from each of 50 states, D.C. and Canada. They must, however, be 10 kw or less. Verifications must be received from said stations by June 1, 1960, to qualify.

The first stations in each state will count one point and the second will count 3 points, or a maximum of 4 points from each state or province, with 2 stations eligible from each province of Canada.

All members in good standing in the NRC are eligible. Entry fee is 25¢ to be mailed to the contest manager by November 15, 1959. New members will be eligible to enter the contest until 30 days after they join the NRC. F

Final standing will be published in the June 1960 issue with standings also published monthly starting with the first issue in November. Lists of veries must contain the following information: Call and location of station, date heard and date verified. Prizes will be awarded to the first 5 winners. Prizes will consist of NRC stationery, depending on amounts of entry fees received, and divided between the winners on a scaled basis, according to position finished. Amounts announced later.

Exceptions mentioned above concerning starting date of contest as follows: 3 stations will be eligible if heard on September 14, 1959, on their special test broadcasts for the NRC: KRNY-1460, Kerney, Nebr., KOOO-1420, Omaha, Nebr., and KEOK-1450, Payette, Idaho.

This year's contest promises to be a good one, with 28 entries already received. These were all signed up in Omaha at the NRC convention. We have already exceeded last year's entry list, so you can see that this should be a contest with lots of good competition again this year.
