REMINISCING WITH ROSENBAUM

In this article, Sid comments on the old system of listing channels in meters. Radio waves are measured in meters (the European standard of length), one meter being equal to 39.37 inches or approximately one yard. For example: a radio station is operating on a wave length of 309 meters (the distance from crest to crest of the radio waves) or 338 yards. Radio waves travel at the speed of 186,000 miles a second, which is equal to 3,000,000,000 meters per second. If the waves travel three hundred million meters in one second and the distance between peaks is 309 meters, there will be 970,000 of these peaks in one second. The latter figure (970,000) is called the frequency of the waves and is measured in cycles per second. One kilocycle is equal to 1,000 cycles. To change from meters to kilocycles, divide 3,000,000 by the wave length in meters.

Thanks to J.A.C. XEFU has been ID as jy Mexican s/on 830 kc/s. of 10/25; a real nice catch for me, I'd say, second only to XEAP-1290 as far as Mexicans are concerned among my loggings. November off to a tremendous start, so picking up from my last report: Nov. 2- KFSG-1150 ET, s/off 4:35 a.m. for a long sought after station, and only needed L.A. station, although KGFJ-1230 not verified; (#15 logged in Los Angeles itself). WXIN-1150 Lexington, Miss. son 5:00 a.m. (Brand new!) Also, awfully early for a CST daytimer). XEJP-1150 Mexico, D.F. believe Mexican heard briefly around 5:50-6:00 a.m. (AN?) Nov. 6- Some LA splits noted; stuck with 875 kc/s. noted Managua mentioned, so believe it's YNW-1 in Leon, Nicaragua, 11-12 p.m., occasional gongs; nice DX for me. Nov. 7- KBRV-540 (unneeded here) noted ET 4:50-6 a.m., conducting said ET like a DX show! WTOD-1560 barely in at 6 a.m. s/on. Sunset skip netted 250 watt KWBA-1190 Vallego, Cal. though 50 kw. First the now KOOD-990 Honolulu heard on RS in Japanese at 3:54 to s/off at 4 in English. Also at 3:58 caught KYSS-910 Missoula, Mont. signing off an ET. Only two other reports this week. On 11/12 KCTA-1030 Corpus Christi ex-KATR logged at sunset on RS at 6:52 to s/off 6:45 p.m. Then on 11/13 KGAF-1580 Gainesville Texas logged at 5:31 on r/c-TT. Veries also slowed down with only one in this week, being WDSK-1410 and from last week CKFH-1470 KKSX-730 WXYZ-1270 all letters. Still four short of reaching the 1,700 goal in veries. I now have a Webcor Royalite Hi-Fi Stereo Tape Recorder so will be glad to exchange tapes with anyone NRC member who is interested. The Denver Post ran a series of four articles this past week on the radio situation in the Denver area which I found quite interesting. WE'D LIKE TO SEE SOME MORE "MUSINGS" FROM OUR WESTERN SECTOR. HOW'S DX OUT WEST?

Leon S. Neblock - 863 Yates Street - Galesburg, Illinois

DXing has been pretty much hit and miss here lately but here it is. Oct. 30- WBBQ-560 RS. Somehow WIND hasn't bothered as much as usual. KDAL-610 in strong. KFI-640 with NX/WX at 2:00. Nov. 4- CFRB-1010 at 2:30. WKON-1340 for a new one at 2:50 and WBIG-1470 and KSO-1460 both seem to be AN. At least they were going strong at 3:00. Nov. 6 found KGAk-1330 on r/c 2:00-2:15. WIRL-1290 now 24 hours. WKMI-1360 NX 2:25-2:30 and KFAB-1110 on with Six Fat Dutchmen recordings 2:30-2:45. Nov. 7 - One new one, WMAK-1300 s/off at 3:30. They had a clear spot just long enough for a good s/off, then the rest closed in. Nov. 8 - This was for me one of those nights! At 2:00 heard 250 watt WMBH-1450 s/off, then at 2:05 WHTC-1450 signed off r/c. Going down to 980 I hit the jack pot with KFWE s/off at 3:00. They just cleared the air for KUTI on XR test saying they would be on for half hour, then at 3:20 KSVC knocked them off with their r/c - all this without moving the dial and KUTI and KSVC never heard before! WTUP-1490, ex-1330 in the ET at 3:55; then back to 950 to catch s/off of KIMN at 4:00. The latest on WGIL-1400 is they will go on 24 hours after the 16th with 250 watts. When they get 1,000 watts it will be daytime power but 250 or 1,000, it will be the end of DX on 1400 except Monday mornings. Praise the Lord! The DX NEWS is now coming in the best ever on Monday delivery. When I lived in Knoxville, Ill. it sometimes came via Knoxville, Tennessee!

Len Kruse - 816 Euclid Street - Dubuque, Iowa

The NRC DX from KSEN-1150 Shelby, Mont. set for 11/9 was not heard at this den, and really doubt if they were on the air as planned; also the NNRC DX from CKMP-1230, Midland, Ont. could not be heard as a number of ANs controlled the 1230 spot at this den, ones like KNUZ WNOR, WJBW and others. I did log two others on 11/9 AM, namely KURL-730 Billings, Mont. on f/c 2:30-3:00 a.m., and also WEZJ-1440 Williamsburg, Ky. s/on with "Dixie" with RS at 4:43 a.m., with QRM from WGCB with its RS. Later in the afternoon of that date I logged Station KUTA-1030, Corpus Christi, Tex. (ex-KATR) from 6:6:45 p.m., when they signed off the air. The only other logging of the week was Station KFAY-1250 Fayetteville, Ark. on a f/c-TT from 1:35-1:45 a.m., interference noted from WEMP AN. Only one verification received this past week, and that came from WEAQ. Your CPC has a number of fine DX Specials up-coming, so do make every effort to listen and send a report - ones like CJMT KKIS WEUC KASK KNDE etc. If you don't hear the programs, as a courtesy to the station, please send that thank you note to them.

Raymond H. Kraul - 6423 33rd Street - Berwyn, Illinois

I guess the DX season is really here now - couple of inches of snow yesterday, sleet today, and high of 250 tomorrow! With this WX the only sensible thing to do is stay inside and DX. Last Monday, the 9th, proved futile on all DX programs except KFAL NNRC DX. It was received well here in spite of WLS TT on 890. The Northwest was dead with Mexican stations overriding Canadians where they are on the same channel. Managed to hear, besides KFAL, three Californians: KFRE-940, RS at 1:40; KOBY-1550 RS and s/off 1:50-2:00; and a pretty good catch, KFIV-1360, Modesto, just after 2:00 on RS. The station I was happiest to hear was first Arizona - KDJI-1270, on r/c 3:35-3:45. All quiet till Thursday 12th. WGAT-1050, f/c-TT 12:17-12:30. This is new station in Gate City, Va. The 13th found lot of TT activity, but practically all was covered by ANs. Most of these testers were IDing, but readability nil. Two stations did top the channels though, WRAJ-1440 r/c 1:05-1:15, and WHHC-1460 f/c-TT over KSO! from 1:10-1:28. That's the extent of DX activity for this week. The verie situation picked up considerably with letters from WGUS KLGR WLTC WIMR WROX WGTA KFJM; PP cards from WGHN and WCPK; and QSL from KFH. The latter is one of those stations you always hear, and figure you can verie anytime. I finally got ambition enough to verie them.

James McWain - 816 Lakeview - Arlington, Texas

This is my first report to the DX NEWS. I don't have much to report. I am the transmitter engineer of KXOL-1360. I work from sunset to 4:00 a.m. and about the only time I have to DX is between 4:00 and 5:00 or 5:50 a.m. We are the first station in the nation to go 100% tape with the new Collins Automatic Tape Control. COUNTRY OF THE WEEK

You now have reported to the United States, Canada, Mexico, and the Bahamas. This week we are going to pick up a country that has been elusive to many, but just now has a strong station, which we should all grab while we can. I refer to Honduras, and to HRN now operating on 685 Kcs., and good in most parts of the USA during the mid-evening hours. See last week's and this week's DIGESTS for more details. WRH lists his address as Avenida Lempira, Tegucigalpa, Honduras. Let's add this one while we have the chance.

GENERAL

Thanks to BD and HD for comments on Alaska and Hawaii. We will continue to list them as DIGEST material unless and until a majority of our readers decree that they should be dropped. I feel that they are certainly just as hard to hear.

SR sends along some information which may prove interesting to you. He found a list of broadcasting stations in 1923. At that time 833 Kcs. was the only graveyard channel, and it was reserved for commercial stations. Here is a list of Caribbean stations of 1923:

Sid adds that radio waves are measured in meters (The European standard of length), one meter being equal to 39.37 inches or approximately one yard. For example: a radio station is operating on a wave length of 309 meters. (The distance from crest to crest of the radio waves) or 338 yards. Radio waves travel at a speed of 186,000 miles a second, xxx which is equal to 3,000,000,000 meters per second. If the waves travel three hundred million meters in one second and the distance between peaks is 309 meters, there will be 970,000 of these peaks in one second. The later figure (970,000) is called the frequency of the waves and is measured in cycles per second. One kilocycle is equal to 1000 cycles. To change from meters to kilocycles, divide 3000,000 by the wave length in meters.

We continue to want your comments on counting countries. I know that we will not come up with a country list that you will all agree with, but I would like your comments now so that I can come as close to hitting the right list as I can. Remember, of course, that this country list on which I am working, is for the use of the DIGEST and its departments, like the Supremacy Ratings and the Foreign Contest, and in no way will it be intended to force you to regulate your own method of counting. Continue to count as you will for your own satisfaction, but use our list when entering the contest or submitting your ratings to C. P. Atherton. Guess that about covers the news from here this week. So for now, 73.
