WPGC-1580 s/on 5:15; 1580 WVKO at 5:30; HJED on 820 12:02-12:30 very strong. 14th- 1130, 11:56 p.m., Radio Salas 635 kc/s.; AM-1580 CMJZ topping channel all AM; 12:33 on 960 WELI TT; 12:11-12:30 WFST 600 f/c-TT; 930 YNW tops this channel from WBEW s/off to 12:10 s/off. 13th- WTKY ET/f/c-M all AM. 12th- 1220 2:50:3:10 XEB on ET/M, cutting in now and then station gave call of WERI; 1:50-2:00 through CJRH 1310 KMAQ f/c-TT; 1570 1:03-1:33 TT WEAS. 11th- 1490 WSSB 2:30-3:00 ANer; 1580 2:15-2:30 WOVE ET/M. Got WWOW-1290 and WBOY-1400 on ERs.

Not too much DX, but the little I've managed to drag out of the band has been fairly good. Apr. 25- CHGB-1350, Ste. Anne, Que. with a tremendous signal over local CKEN and others from 9:55-10:15 p.m. Apr. 26- The South was noted very well this night, and as a result, two new countries were added. HIF-1162 made the scene from 9:20-9:40; YNOL-825, weak, but there, from 9:40-10:10. Apr. 27- The only catch this night was quite amazing, for the frequency, number of stations on that time, and for the station's power (either 500 or 1,000 watts). YVLF-1290 came in for a beautifully strong ID at 9, and tape made and sent (ditto for HIF and YNOL). May 2- Lots of static, but CJSS-1220 for a new one on AN for Canadian Radio Week. May 3- The Civil Defense Test here proved quite successful for me, as well as the U.S. Army, hi. I was really going to try 1230 for VOAR, after WQDY went off, but I wasn't counting on CKEW slop. Anyway, I did hear CRAJ-1230, Yarmouth, CBAH-1490, Meteghan, and CBAG-1550, Weymouth, all 40 watt relays of CBAF. Most of those places are 80-100 miles away, so still not too bad for daytime. Hi. Not too much DXing done yet. The trouble is antenna problems. I use a 90° E/W running, flat-top antenna between out garage and house, but would like to build a new one. This one is too directional to the North and South. (I have 25 veries for North Carolina while obly 11 from Ohio). After looking around, the only place where I could add more wire would be to two telephone poles, but the phone company said no dice. Besides, these telephone poles are carrying over 5,000 watts. To make matters worse, three of the four local XRs are located dur North of here, which doesn't help much, hi. I have room only for a whip or loop. The local radio shoper couldn't help me with either one. I would sincerely appreciate any ideas and descriptions of a loop antenna, or a whip. Would the SW antenna companies have anything? Or is there a company dealing with the DXers' needs? So, please send in your tips, I sure can use them if anyone is thinking of buying a small Army loop, don't. I tried one and WARM-590, 57 miles away with 5,000 watts barely made it in. Or does it separate 90° away stations? I tried to get WEEZ-1590 Chester which is South of here. WHOL's XR directly East of here. No dice. Last DX since last reported is on 5/13 when five new ones peeped through. The s/ons of WTRX and WTRN, 1290, Belleaire, Ohio and Tyrone, Pa. made it in here at 5:00. WTRX dominated the religious programs at Tyrone, with Jumping Dan, a R&R program. Unneeded WPPA cut through WDRC on their 5:30 s/on. And WNSR cut the last part of WNDU's s/on at 1430 kc/s. at 6:00. Not many reports lately. Twelve second f/ups and eight first f/ups were sent out May 24th, with these results so far. 600 KCLS (surprise!), 710 KIRO QSL, 930 KIME, my PP form; for 6/18/59 report; 1320 WCPC, another surprise; 1380 KPOI, 1410 KQV 1420 WKOW stationery in WKIEF envelope; 1480 KLEO PP form in same color envelope as local KDEO, same company; and 1570 KACE, distinctive stationery. ID on AN at 4 a.m., KOGT-1600 Orange, Tex. s/on 6 a.m. 5/19- KWIV-1050 Douglas, Who. f/c 3-3:15 a.m., no trace of XEG. May 22- KPOD-1510 Crescent City, Cal. s/on 3:30 a.m. (log #200 from California). 5/23- KQEN-1240 Roseburg, Ore. (ex-KRKL) s/off 3 a.m. May 24- KUDY-910 Renton, Wash. (ex-KQDE) ID at 10:50 p.m. after noting call change in DX NEWS. (Washington log #100). May 25- KPCA-1050 Longmont, Colo. f/c-TT through XEG, 3:05-3:23 a.m. May 30- KYSS-910 Missoula, Mont. atop AN KEWB at 7:35 a.m., ID after NX and WX. June 2- KMGM-730 Albuquerque, N.M. f/c through CKLG/CKDM 2:15-2:24 a.m. June 3- WAMY-1580 Amory, Miss. f/c over KLOU 5-5:16 a.m. June 5- KOZE-1300 Lewiston, Idaho ET, ID at 5:08 a.m. June 6- KLIV-1590 San Jose, Cal. Boo-bood last Musings in matter of ET heard on 1580 kc/s., off at 2:25 a.m., which I reported as Santa Ros., Calif., careful checking turned up positive ID as KDOM-1580 Windom, Minn., a welcome 250 w. catch on May 6. I have a noise problem I'd like to toss out for ideas. For many years 860 kc/s. has been subject to a rough noise disturbance heard on all receivers, all antennas. Most pronounced when XEMO KTRB off, and channel clear in West. Does not cease on Tuesday AMs, so apparently no connection with KONO, although KONO puts no decent signal into this area. Wonder if Cuban might be source? How about this in other parts of the country? Since 11/1/59 25 new stations have been logged on the 1570-1600 portion of the BCB; that's better than 1/5 of all new loggings in that time! Logged and verified totals on these channels now are: 1570 - 17 and 13; 1580- 25 and 17; 1590 27 and 20; 1600 30 and 21. XERF's off spell, and KLAK's quitting AN were major factors in this DX slurge at the high end of the band. Very happy with the above loggings of KWIV and KLMO on 1050; ones I've looked for many times. No word from KBIC's DX, nor from VOA re 1200 kc/s. XR, most anxious about both. 73.

Hi, gang. This is our first report to the Musings since joining in April. We've found that the first issues of DX NEWS that we received were well worth the \$4.00 membership dues alone! SOUTH VIETNAM--Current frequencies for this country are 1090 Kcs. in Vietnamese; 838 Kcs. in Vietnamese, English, and Thai; 1360 Kcs. in Vietnamese, French, Chinese, and Cambodian. (WRH)

NORTH VIETNAM--This country is operating on 1010 Kcs. and 1200 Kcs. Called "The Voice of Vietnam", Hanoi.

SINGAPORE--"Radio Singapore" uses 630 Kcs. for most English medium wave transmissions. (DXG)

RYUKU ISLANDS--FEBC (Far East Broadcasting Co.) Naha station is operating on 1250 Kcs. (KSDX-1 Kw.) and 1020 Kcs. (KSAB-1 Kw.) both at 1600-0900. KSDX in Japanese and KSAB in English. (DXG)

SARAWAK--"Radio Sarawak", Kuching, operates on two BCB frequencies which are 730 and 850 Kcs. (DXG & WRH)

I find only day-timer XEGD and 250 watt XEHT Huatmantla, Tlaxcala, listed. Help would be appreciated. Very weak SS heard on 1522 most nights around 2300, tried on 5/30 when WKBW off, but no ID due to fade and static. Has anyone else heard them? WKBW slop covers most nights. New station in Central America heard testing first on 5/24 and didn't recognize it then. Heard on 5/31 and 6/1 on 1160 exactly, topping CMJK most of the time, with WJJD phased out with directional loop here.

June 18, 1960

Fades in around 2030 till close-down at 2100, with US type ballroom and light music, only announcements at 2045 and 2100. Slogan "Radio Kwan" or "Radio Quan" and "La Voz Incarnacion del Pais". They are entirely in Spanish, mention being a new station with fifty kilowatts, and they say "Este es doble-ve ah eme (Or ehc) siete oy, apartado mil doscientos cuarenta y siete, Nueva York, apparently some sort of call and their address (Box 1247, New York). No location heard beside Central America. It is not HIF who are heard and clearly separated on 1162 Kcs. CMJK audible after "Radio Kwan" s/off.
