Way back in 1922 the DXer as we know him today was knwon generally as a "Radio Bug", but most of the early radio stations referred to him as a "Listening Monitor". The Radio Bug knew little of the effect of sunspots, weather or other forms of radio interference and spent much of his time building and tearing down his receivers. The early radio builder would complete his receiver and if his initial test proved satisfactory, everything went well, but if unfavorable propagation come along he blamed the receiver for poor reception and the receiver would go through a tearing down process.

Antennas were another weakness with the DX Bug. It must be remembered that early receivers were usually one or two tube affairs and depended much on the energy afiantenna could supply. Most of the early aerials consisted of two or more wires of 100 feet and erected as high as possible. Radio tubes in 1922 cost \$15 apiece for the 1.25 and 3 volt tubes, commonly used by the home-builder. Dry cell batteries furnished the "A"

and "B" power.

Early reception reports were entirely different from those of the DXer of today. Reception reports were more in the form of applause and signal strength was given as weak, medium or loud. Most veries were letters asking for further reports and request ing comment on programs heard. The high power stations (500 watts) usually had daily programs with a midnight s/off local time, but many of the low power stations operated on irregular schedules.

"Radio Digest" was probably the most popular radio publication of its day, having columns for building hints, circuits, antennas, etc. The first org nization of Radio Listening Monitors the writer ever heard of was a Linstening Ring sponsored by the I.R Nelson Co. of Newark, N.J. owners of WAAM in 1924. Most of the members of the "Ring" were in the Newark area and the Newark Evening News gave some space to the organization - probably the forerunner of the N.N.R.C.

Some of us still need this country! For any considering an "automatic" monitoring setup such as I utilize, I might present the following "consumer's report" on two time switches that I use. First, a 24 hour, 15 minute period, AEMCO. This is very versatile giving you any combination of 15 minute recarding periods that you wish; either continuously, or in breaks, 15 minutes or more apart. Two drawbacks to this unit are first, some degree of inaccuracy as to time "on" switch trips; varies over one minute on occasions; secondly, no manual "off-on" operation. Different models of this switch may provide for this. Now to the 24 hour TORK switch, giving operations of 5-55 minutes once an hour. This clock is highly accurate (to within five seconds) and has manual "off-on" switch, but being only "once an hour" operation, is not as vesatile as the Aemco. Examplanary settings I might use: AFMCO, 15 minute periods beginning at 1, 1:30, 2, 2:30, 3, 3:30, 4, 4:30 and 5 a.m., or say 1 to 1:45, 2 to 2:45, and 15 minute periods at 3, 3:30 and 4 (all depending, of courses on tape time available). On the TORK, 45 minute periods at 1, 2, 3, and 4 a.m., or 15 minute periods at 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 a.m. As a practice I set all my clocks six minutes fast to give me periods commencing six minutes before the setting time, i.e., 1 a.m. actually starts at 12:54 a.m., etc. Happy New Year, all!

A better idea might be to replace your IF cans with cans of the same value but with higher Q coils. You might have to cut down the B-plus a little to prevent it from feeding back but in the end you would end up with the same sensitivity, but more selectivity. It is not advisable however to mess around with the innards of your RX unless you have the proper knowledge and tools. I plan to add a 10 ke. multivibrator to my 180 soon and possibly to replace the grounding resistor on the mixer coil of the first IF converter with a variable resistor so I can control sensitivity and spurious response rejection more readily. At least it will give me another control to fool around with, as I like to fool with controls, hi. I do not say this just to take up space but I really have a guilty conscience for missing the last few issues of DX NEWS for no reason. But can verify my good intentions in the up-coming issues. Sound fair enough? Glad to see reports from new members in my home state, Virginia. Would surely like to meet C.W.Alcott in Hampton in the near future. Now to DX. Being such a day time DX fiend, this phase of DX so far is out of this world. On occasion I have heard CBN-640 CBA-1070 around 10 a.m.! CBM-940 is like a local all day. The old theory about daytime reception is sort of being disporved at my experimental receiving station here. According to age-old theory in the daytime only the ground wave is prevalent which would tend to give fairly constant reception. For example, WCKY-1530 at noon today would be S-9 as it was at 10 a.m. and will be at 2 p.m. as it was two weeks ago and will be two weeks from now, etc. This is not true on weaker daytime signals like the two above, WJJD-1160, WKEW-1520 WMEX-1510 etc. I believe there is a pattern for this and will report regularly as to my progress in this field, hi. The key to DX is the antenna. This location is fabulous for DX so there is every opportunity for a good antenna. Several engineering books make mention of the "Beverage" antenna which is merely a long wire elevated 10-20' about the ground, half to several wave-lengths long and terminated in a resistive load equal to the characteristic impedance of the antenna itself. This terminating load makes the antenna non-resonant and can be used successfully over a wide range of different wave lengths. Also it give the Beverage antenna its characteristic which appeals most to me; it is very directional with maximum signal along the wire from the end away from the receiver. A directional antenna is most useful here to take advantage of the great daytime DX. With same it may be possible to get WWON/WOCB-1240 which will now be 1,000 watts days. For nighttime DX the antenna does not seem to be very critical. For example on a 35' vertical here I have gotten KFWB-980 and for me that is quite good. In just about two weeks of steady DXing here I have logged close to 200. Will have partial daytime list next week. I am still enjoying my happiest years in Uncle Sam's wonderful Navy in great and fabulous Norfolk, Va.! Everyting here for me is BCB DX, communications and electronics. DX in my apre time. 73s to all.

The list is steadily growing on the number of LA stations who won't verify regardless of the number of reports that a DXer sends them. I realize that many U.S. stations are guilty of the same thing but you have half a chance as the language is in our favor whereas with the LAs it isn't. Now, just what are we U.S. DXers going to do to improve our percentage of replies? When I think of the number of IRCs I've sent out of the U.S. I wonder if this isn't a lost cause. Also, another thought is: when we use certain standard expressions, sentences and phrases in the Spanish Letter Forms to the various Spanish speaking countries are we insulting the intelligence of these people who run these radio stations as many times I find that many many words are not spelled the same on replies as written to the station on our reports. Surely there is an answer to this problem. Due to lack of veries from LA stations we have many DXers who won't go into the field of Foreign DX and actually you can't blame them. I am now proposing several items which I think would be very helpful if it could be handled. First, I suggest that one of the members of eitner the NRC or NNRC contact some of the members of Legation of Spanish speaking countries, located in Washington or possibly in New York (United Nations) and find out if we are using the "right approach" when writing to these stations. Secondly, should we abolish sending IRCs and send stamps instead (I believe we have a stamp exchange). Thirdly, should we stop writing in Spanish and send all reports in English? Should we stop sending PP cards which is actually forcing an issue and perhaps making the people at these radio stations feel "inferior" to their big American Cousins? I assure you members that there isn't any personal criticism towards any DXer in the above. I'm just wondering if there isn't an answer to the verifying of LA stations at a higher percentage than at present. How about some Musings from Hank Tyndall, Roger Anderson, Ben Dangerfield, Kermit Geary, C.M.
