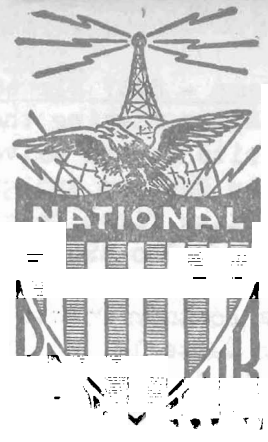

Station WDLR, Delaware, Ohio, 150 kc/s., 500 watts, will present a special test on Monday morning, November 20, 1961, from 4:30-5 a.m., EST. This station took the air in December 1960, and has been heard by few DXers thus far. The program will be on a completely clear channel, we hope, and will consist of pertinent information that might be of interest to DXers. WDLR has less than one dozen DX reports of reception, primarily from Pennsylvania and New York, but this ideal arrangement should find a great many of the fellows hearing WDLR for the first time. All reports should be sent to Mr. Stan Anderson, Chief Engineer, whom we thank for notifying us of this test.

ET 5:06. 10/11- KPAY-1060 s/off 12:06, finally heard through KNX's XR only eight miles away. 10/15- KXA-770 Wash. RS 5:30. 10/16- WESC-660 S.C. s/on 6:00 for new state, logged while trying to hear WNBC which I've yet to hear; KARS-860 New Mexico f/c 2:15-2:30. 10/17- KBRN-800 ET 4:25. 10/29- KPBM-740 N.M. ET 3:00 heard weakly through pest KCBS. 10/30- KPTL-1300 Nev. ET 4:30; WRR-1310 Tex. RS with KDIA off, 4:00. 11/3- KASH-1600 Ore. After a full summer of TV and FM DXing, I guess it's about time I reported on the above average CX here last month or so. Have added 72 new stations here since 9/1 to bring total now logged up to 568. More important catches follow: From 1-6:30 a.m. 10/8- CJCA-930 Edmonton after WBEN 12 Mdt. s/off with Eskimos football (heavy WKY QRM), CJOC-1220 Lethbridge at 2:18 a.m. in the clear, same for CHEC-1090 Lethbridge ten minutes later. Many long-time wanted stations also heard were KONO-860 San Antonio 2:40 a.m., KRMG-740 Tulsa who modestly ID as "one of America's favorite stations" 2:45 a.m., KNBC-680 San Francisco atop channel at 2:50 a.m., CFAC-960 Calgary, ID at 3 a.m., KPNC-1560 Bakersfield, Cal. really booming in between 3:15 and 4 a.m., Radio King-1090 Seattle at 4:25 a.m. with fine signal. Others heard that AM between 3 and 6 a.m. were KXYZ-1320 Houston, WRDW-1480 Augusta, Ga., WABB-1480 Mobile, WKWK-1400 Wheeling, WNAK-730 Nanticoke Pa., WEZN-1600 Elizabethtown, Pa. at 5:52 a.m. Sunday s/on, WETZ-1330 New Martinsville, W. Va. at 5:56 a.m. s/on. Next good loggings were in a half-hour period from 11-11:30 p.m. 10/15. By far most notable to my mind was YNW-930 Managua at 11:17 p.m. with ID as "Radio Mundial". It was by a very lucky coincidence that I heard them as WBEN s/off 11 p.m. Sunday night and WPAT-930, I think it was, played soft background music. Hi all! Denver in '63! CX are better or worse, depending on the location of the station you want to hear. New stations: 10/26- CMBC-690, CMHQ-640 CBF-690 WCOP-1150 WKYW-900. 10/29- WLIZ-1380, WCOC-910. No veries received yet, and I sent out a f/up to KGLC-910. CMBC CMHQ CBF are all old stations that I have neglected to log in the past. Also while tuning to WJJD, I heard WCOP real strong on 1150 where I usually hear WCUE or WIMA. WKYW was spattering over on WLS. WCOC was in real clear on 910 for most of the evening. WLIZ was heard over WLCY-1380 just before they went directional. I still have plenty of WAKR and WHLO surveys if anybody wants one. This now makes me have 303 stations heard and 45 verified. I have heard 32 states, two Mexican provinces, and four Canadian provinces. Now everyone's on standard time, which means an extra evening hour of DX. Stations in the Akron area s/off, cut power, and go directional at 5:15 p.m. I have been really finding out that winter CX are here during the past few days. On 10/28 I heard WLCY-1380 real clear for the first time since March, though I've heard them faintly in between. When I heard them last Saturday, they were in gdod until 6 p.m. when they dropped out with the words "Shoot me!" WNOE-1060 was also in real good, though I've heard them many times during the summer. Next day WNOE was in, and so was WLCY. At 6:00, when WLCY usually makes the direction change, they still were clear until 6:10, when it sounded like they changed. That's when I heard WLIZ. On Monday, WLCY was all right until they went off at 6:00. WNOE stayed in with their booming 50,000 watts until 6:30. At 6:30, they were playing "Crying" and when they switched, CX to Philly were so bad that they stayed in fairly clear. When they switched, ~~XXXXXX~~ it sounded like Rou Orbison who was singing at the time, fell off a cliff. This type of reception continued until 6:40 when I changed stations. However I could hear WNOE most of the rest of the evening. Tonight, 10/31, CX have been so that WABC and WLS are good, while I didn't hear WLCY at all or very little of WNOE. Who s/off with SS accent at 6:29 on 1260? Sounded like W-OJ. Now to back-track. 10/29: XEMU a powerhouse on 580 - I wonder what they really run at night? WDIA-1070 copied on skip until 6:30 pattern switch. Others logged are WLOK-1480 and WZST-1550 s/off 6. (There may be some overlap here). On 10/26 the cavalry rode in on 580 kc/s.! That is, there was the queerest type of QRM I've ever heard on the BCB. It sounded like galloping horses, and was intermittent, and ran from around 8-10. If WX is OK, I will be in Urbana on 11/5 and might have a chance to see WDWS WKID WILL. YNOL has come in fairly regularly lately, Well, I did it, got my 200th veries, a QSL from WHIO. I was interested to get a WDAK-540 v/c and so got a report to 'em last week, during a WGR off period (still Sunday and Tuesday AMs). Joyce Jordan, S to P sent the v/c and wrote in green ink, "We're 24 hours, seven days and "Big Johnny Reb" is our station, not an individual, thanks " etc. It's a color card with Big Johnny Reb, a soldier figure, standing at the left side of a billboard with "Dial 540, WDAK, 24 hours, NBC." The back of card mentions from 27 vantage points etc., leading into Columbus, Big J.R. reminds to dial 540, the South's Finest, Suh. Anyway, now I'm not stumped anymore; besides, I've WDAK v/1 for 1340 and also for 540 a v/1. This AM 11/4, again WRVA-1140 s/on 5 a.m., before it 3:30-3:43 came the "Sparkle" station KGEW-AN in Boise, Ida. R/c-TT WGHV through WSPD AN-1370, while r/c WANY-1390 started at 4:28 a.m. topping WEAM-AN, gave WX and mentioned TT/1,000 and was tape-recorded (is that permissible?) WHLD-1270 signs at 6:01 and "FBG-1290 Altoona Pa. at 6 a.m., WHVR-1280 at 5:02 mentions 5 kw. day, 500 w. nights; WKIN-1320 signed 5:00:30 a.m. On 11/2 got new KBLR, Bolivar, Mo. 3-4:07 a.m., then KKJO took it. 10/30, heard WMTW-1300 Moultrie Ga. s/on 5:30-5:52 a.m. through WERE who signed at 5:27 a.m. Locally, Jimmy Lyons, DJ, leaves WWOL Sunday to await the s/on of WUFO (new call) 1080, when WYSL moves to 1400 kc/s. Larry Schwartz - 4819 Atlanta Drive - San Diego 15, California

Hi everyone! No DX with one exception due to a strange noise from a street light! This noise began last November when I first started DXing and was fixed by the City Works in April but it's back now in its full fury! It's so bad most Las Angeles and San Francisco stations can't be heard. It usually comes on between 9 and 10 p.m. PST and lasts AN. The one exception was 11/4, this morning, when I finally logged Commie China on 840. Is their power only 10 kw.? Heard through WHAS then completely over them. Only two veries the whole week, WKYR-1270 in Keyser, W. Va. and a two-month-old report from KGUL-1560 in Port Lavaca, Tex. WKYR has an application for full time with 1 kw. directional nighttime.
