QTH is 16, East Cliff Gardens, Folkestone, Kent; Will QSL by letter. (This may be GMT; tr. 0100-1300, Ed.) 2) R. Albatross should be on the air by the end of Sept. off the mouth of the WASH. It's an ex-minesweeper, 240 tons, owned by Mr. Robert Tidswell. Will have a range of 50 to 60 miles. R) R. Sutch now heard on 1530 kc., weak signal here in Derby. This station carries no. commercials. (Patrick, England)

MONACO. R. Monte Carlo will be on L.W. band in 1965 in Arabic and Italian. M.W. outlet to increase power. (Patrick, England.)

NEW ZEALAND. 3ZA, 750, should be on the air now. Scheduled to go on August 17th; location apparently Kumara. "Greymouth PO staff have yet to run a temporary circuit to Kumara for the programs," reports the New Zealand DX Times.

VIETNAM, SOUTH. VOA Saigon is apparently on 760 kc., according to the VOA frequency schedule. They list the power as 50 kw., beamed to S.E. Asia, no XR location, but I think this must be Saigon. (Patrick, England) The long-awaited VOA XR is due to take the air officially 9/6 on 760. Transmission times are 0600-1130. (NZDXT) Sturges D. Dorrance, Lt. Sig Corps, Station Manager, Armed Forces Radio Saigon, Hedsupact APO 143, San Francisco, says "We radiate 1000 watts on 820 kc., and are on the air from 1630 to 1300 EST daily." Lt. Dorrance continues, "Radio Vietnam operates an English service nightly from 0:30 to 1000 EST on 870 kc. (Callarman)

WINDWARD ISLANDS. According to their QSL card, the Windward Islands Broadcasting Service has made some frequency changes. 540 St. Georges, GRANADA, unchanged, 500 watts; 695 kc. Roseau, DOMINICA, 25 watts, moved from 1530; 705, Kingstown, ST. VINCENT, 25 watts, ex 1570; and 1580 kc., Castries, ST. LUCIA, 25 watts, unchanged. (NZDXT) FBIS-1963 listed projected facilities for Roseau on 635 with 500 watts, and Kingstown for 695 kc., also with 500 watts. Suspect the one reported on 695 is Roseau with 500 watts.

I have considerably more around the world-type material on hand, but will hold off until there's more space. I'm working on obtaining independent sources of information in various parts of the world, particularly South and Central America, to help on ID's and changes. "DX NEWS"

N. R. C. 1964-1965 DOMESTIC CONTEST RULES

1. This season's Domestic Contest will begin at 12:01 A.M. EST on 9/15/64 and end at 11:59 PM EST on 7/15/65. Stations must be logged between the above dates and must be verified and reported to the Contest Manager by 8/15/65.
- 1a Two stations from each of the 50 States; D.C.; and each Province of Canada will be eligible. The 1st station from each State; D.C. or Province will count ONE (1) point. The 2nd station will count THREE (3) points. A total of FOUR (4) points possible in each State; D.C. or Province.
- 1b Any Domestic Special TEST or DX for N.R.C. will count an additional THREE (3) points. This station may also be counted for the 1st or 2nd station in that State; D.C. or Province.
- 2 All NRC Members are eligible and must submit the entry fee of .25¢ to the Contest Manager BEFORE December 1 1964. New Members must submit their entry fee of .25¢ within 30 days after becoming an NRC Member. All contestants must be in good standing during the entire contest, in order to be eligible for any prizes.
- 3 Final standings will be announced at the annual NRC 1964 Convention which will be held at Cedar Rapids, Iowa Labor Day Week-end.
- 4 No station may be re-verified for this contest if first verified AFTER 1/1/62.
- 5 The Contest Manager will issue the standings about every SIX (6) weeks in DX NEWS. He also has the right to reject any station that a contestant may issue in error, and have the final decision. Any question that a contestant may ask must be sent with a self-addressed 4¢ government post card for the Contest Managers reply.
- 6 List of Entries must include CALL LETTERS - FREQ - LOCATION - DATES HEARD AND VERIE RECEIVED and the VERIE SIGNERS NAME. Each contestant SHOULD report his additions at least every TWO (2) Months. Do not send me the verie unless I ask for it.
- 7 Prizes will be awarded to at least the first FOUR (4) places. The prizes will depend on the number of entrants. There will be TWO (2) MYSTERY STATIONS worth 100 Report Forms each to the FIRST entrant who verifies one of the MYSTERY STATIONS. ONLY ONE (1) person may win, that is a different one for each Mystery Station.
- 8 All stations used for this contest must be logged within a TEN (10) mile radius from the contestant's home address in his city.
- 9 The person in FIRST PLACE in this contest may not take FIRST PLACE in the LETTERAMA CONTEST. If this occurs, he will become 2nd PLACE in the LETTERAMA CONTEST.

CONTEST #2 - LETTERAMA

This seasons LETTERAMA CONTEST will begin and end at the same time and dates as the Domestic Contest above.

1a Stations eligible for this contest are the same as the Domestic.

1b There shall be NO bonus points given for NRC TESTS or DXES, nor for completed Tiers.

1c Keep in mind the LAST LETTER of the stations are the determining letters. ie-WCEA the A is the determining letter. In CKWS the S is the determining letter. Object of the contest is to build tiers and obtain as many points as possible. A TIER is completed by obtaining a verie from 26 stations representing each letter in the alphabet. When one completes the 1st TIER in any order, he proceeds to the 2nd TIER. Remember that K - W - or C calls can be mixed for each and every TIER. Remember though if a contestant receives a verie from WCBA and CKDA for example, the contestant must wait until he has completed the FIRST TIER before the other can be counted. 1 Point for each VERIE.

2 Rules #2 thru 9 in the Domestic Contest (above) shall apply to this Contest also.
