The Radio Titania Network

In the heart of Central America lies a country which is an exception to all the rules and generalizations about the Latin American countries ... Costa Rica, the "rich coast," known as a haven of peace, stability, and harmony in the middle of a turbulent continent. And although Costa Rica is a model which many other Latin

American countries would like to emulate, its very uniqueness is the greatest obstacle to the otherwise flourishing movement towards Central American unity, which is almost universally supported in Nicaragua and Guatemala, and has many adherents in El Salvador and Honduras. Costa Rica knows that it is different, and if swallowed by a larger federation, it might lose, not riches, for except in its name, it has none of any note, but something

which, in Latin America, is more precious and rarer than gold -- harmony and tranquility.

It is, therefore, no surprise that this peaceful and friendly country should boast of some friendly and cooperative radio stations. And perhaps the most friendly of all are the stations which go to make up the Radio Titania network.

This network is owned by Sr. Mario Sotela Pacheco, with the title of Presidente General. There are 75 employees, working at four radio and one television stations. The general manager (Gerente) is Fernando Carazo Cordero, to whom requests for verification should be addressed. There are three sub-gerentes, Victor M. Viquez, Marcos A. Munoz O., and Francisco LaFuente Canossa.

TIOS, Radio Titania, the "emisora matriz" or key station, operates on 823 kHz (nominally 825) with an Elcor Electronic 5000-watt main transmitter, and a 3000-watt emergency standby. It transmits adult light music, mainly North American, and in the market it serves, it rose to top rating in San Jose six years ago, and still occupies that position. Radio Titania transmits from a

one-story building, 50 by 250 metres, 450 yards west of the Orange Crush stand at San Rafael in the Tibas district of San Jose. Schedule is from 6 a.m. to midnight local time (0700-0100 EST).

Radio Eco is the second station in the network. Call-sign and frequency not stated, but the station operates 3000 watts to an inverted L antenna. It plays sentimental, old-fashioned music, and is located in the same building as Titania.

Radio Satellite operates from San Isidro del General with 3000 watts and varied light music.

Radio Golfito is the well-known station on 1442 kHz (nominal 1450) with the call TIMC. It runs 2500 watts from Puerto Golfito, a banana port owned by the United Fruit Company, with varied light music.

Telecentro Canal 6 is the television station with the highest rating in San Jose.

The Titania network verifies by letter, and often includes with the verification pennants, bookmarks, stickers, and other souvenirs. Its address is Apartado 512, San Jose, Costa Rica.

AFRS in Santo Domingo Closes Down

By Cesar Objio

The radio station which started to broadcast on August 22, 1965, in Santo Domingo during the troubled days of the Civil War with the ID: "This is AFRS, your Armed Forces Station at Santo Domingo, 10-60 on your dial," came to an end on September 15, 1966, 2400 EST (or 0500 GMT September 16).

In a special program broadcast twice that day, at 1830 and 2230, they told how the station came into being:

Taking into consideration the need for some kind of entertainment of the American soldiers who landed in Santo Domingo at the beginning of the Dominican Civil War, the Chief Commanders decided there was an urgent need for a radio station speaking their own language and bringing them some music which might help ease the loneliness and risk.

Everything was hurriedly prepared, with the MW transmitter rushed from California and carried by helicopter to the new location, the ground floor in the east wing of the Jaragua Hotel, where the OAS had established headquarters. Antennas were placed atop the roof, and

studios and transmitter in a room with no air conditioning. With the temperatures sometimes running to 110°F, air-conditioning was quickly brought in. The whole operation was just a black away from "no man's land", where the shots were clearly heard. The station was completed at 2 a.m. that day, 10 days ahead of schedule. So, early in the morning, the ID was heard for the first time in Santo Domingo, of an all-English-speaking station.

The station, which used a power of 250 watts, started broadcasting several hours a day, enlarging the schedule step-by-step to 19, then 24 hours. The American speakers were brought from so many different and separated places of the U.S. as Fort Benning, Ga.; Presidio, Calif.; Newark, N.J.; Alabama; Colorado; and Stanford University, Calif. The programs included news every hour



on the hour, popular music, dramas, big league baseball, programs in Portuguese, with a Lt. Oliveira speaking for reports from all over the world, information, religious programs, and in addition, the correct local time, temperature, and weather report (these two last items not given by the local Spanish-speaking stations). At first, the world news was taped from shortwave receivers and released later, but in May, two teletypes arrived, and they began to give news live. A portable tape recorder was brought later on and certain local news, interviews, and actualities were given on the spot as an added service.
