WERV, a fine New York station, informs Kenneth Lyon it will test on this date ... a frequency check with tones. Information on their November 17 test, regrettably, did not come to NRC HQ in time for pre-publication. Reports go to the Chief Engineer.

I must admit I got a bit miffed at reading Randy Seaver's discourse on quality vs/ quantity in relation to DX Specials. It seems a Special is not considered as being "wuality" if it is on a graveyard channel. I beg to differ - just because YOU can't hear a Special at YOUR location, that doesn't mean it can't be called wuality! I always thought the "sport" of DXing came from hearing those more difficult receptions, not having it handed to you on a silver platter, so to speak. Just because a Special isn't heard I&C from coast to coast, doesn't make it any less a Special as long as it's not in the station's RS. Perhaps we should initiate another term for these; i.e. Test, Special, (which we have already) & Dedication if it's during a RS. I agree w/Randy that an AN-6 station conducting a Special during its normal silent period should be considered a full-fledged TEST. However, a station listed in the DX Calendar for a time period in which they would be on the air anyway (RS or f/c, etc.) can't be called any more than a Dedication. If nobody from a CPC ever contacted the station, it would be on the air at that time anyway. It only shows the station is interested in receiving reports, BUT it is NOT a DX TEST or Special. I think this was what JAC was hitting ag in the 11/4 DX NEWS. I also wonder how many of these RS "TESTs" (or whatever you call them) are arranged by accident? To wit: This year I have received no less than THREE letters from IRCA CPC members asking that WHOT go on the air on a MM & conduct a TEST for the IRCA. None of these letters asked for a dedication, they were written as though WHOT were not on the air on MM. However, a simple check of either club's CX of Frequencies list would show that we are NSP. I think it would be foolish to think this was an isolated incident. If a station receives a request to "test" at a time that turned out to be in its RS, the station will no doubt write back to say "OK" since it requires no special effort on their part. How can that possibly be called a TEST? Naturally some will say this is a good way to get new members, but how many do you know of who actually came into the Club that way? Probably very few. Getting back to graveyard stations I recently saw the reports from the WFRA-1450 DX & they included excellent "copy" from as far away as Mass. Mich. Wis. etc. DX on these frequencies is very much a possibility & lots of fun too. And at such distances it certainly is quality. Let's tell it like it is guys- If it's not in the station's RS, it's a SPECIAL; if it's during a time when the station would be on the air anyway (RS or f/c) it is a DEDICATION, nothing more. Both have an important place in the DX Calendar. Both Clubs have had good TESTs and "bombs". The TESTs are there for ALL DXers to hear & the term "wuality" is, at best, a relative one depending on your location. KGB would be "quantity" to Randy Seaver, "quality" for Jerry Starr, hi.

DX conditions here in the Northeast have been fair a best during the past two weeks; very similiar in overall pattern to those experienced beginning about December 10th last year. This may well be the so-called "Midwinter Anomaly" and it may well have hit earlier and will last longer than last year because of the elevated sunspot count. TA conditions did not begin to return to normal last year until the beginning of March, although a few brief periods of enhanced reception were noted in the interim. It looks bad for those tempting Ramadan catches this year. Ben Dangerfield, recently re-received, reports "11/13 thru 11/16 I would say was quite poor... all TA signals were extremely variable and faded fast, nothing steady... reminds me of conditions back in 1959, early 1960." Ben does note a short period of what seemed to be Mideast reception on 11/23 2200-2315 w/traces of what seemed to be Cairo on 773 and 818, and a second carrier u/RNE-737 that might have been Israel. Gray Scrimgeour in Ontario notes, "best TA night yet on 11/20-11/21." If conditions continue in this pattern, give up on TA's and concentrate on signals from the South: Africans, Zedders, Deep SA's, and the like.

*On Reciprocal Paths. While we here in New England experienced remarkable conditions on 11/6 (e.g., ZCO, traces of unusual Deep SA's), John Hoogerheide in Chile reports: "Only DX done on 11/6 and that day conditions suprisingly good despite summer cx here in South America. The dial absolutely covered w/U.S. stations including many 5 kw'ers. Coast to coast audible including KGBS and KFVK, KQB, and first New York city stns in WCBS and WABC. Also WHDH-hi, Gordon, for 2nd Massachusetts. Some stns like WGBS, WKBW, KTHH and KTRH almost like local signals despite static. Woefully few Deep SA's on. Only definite AN'er noted was CA-127 in Antofagasto on 1270. Sincerely doubt if any other Chilean, Argentine, or Peruvians were on AN that day at 0230. A few Brazilians and other Northern signals in - Colombia noted but generally overridden by US signals. Only new country was TICS in Costa Rica at 0030 with a newscast overriding the Mexican." Very interesting, John. Please keep us posted! In England, Al Slater also noted fine conditions during the 10/21-10/28 "hot period": "Certainly the conditions of October 19th/28th were more like the cx of 2 or 3 years ago...only West Coast was a tentative on KOMO, though KING has also been reported by other British DX'ers...it was nice to note the Chicago stns again - WCFL and WBBM; also KXEL behind WPTX and also on its own at S7 the marvellous 5000 watts of KXYZ, Houston on 1320... also nice to catch 250 watters again like WFPX and WMID... those N.J. coastal locations must be real good... as I was not active on 11/5-11/6 I cannot comment on conditions then..."

*Quotation without Comment. "In Musings, someone mentioned receiving 2 other Mexican spurs on 1002! Wish he would tell IDX about it! In future maybe require all loggings reported only in IDX and DDXD? ? ? With Musings only for B.S.?" (A very active DX'er)

*Holland Plans Rival to Pirate Radio Stations. Holland is to launch its own commercial broadcasting service in March of 1968 to counter the growing popularity of R. Veronica and the fear of proposed Dutch transmissions of the re-anchored Radio Caroline South. Rates from 30s. (\$3.75) to about 3 pounds (\$7.50) a second at peak listening times. Radio Veronica broadcasts 20 second commercials at 30 s. a second. Advertising has already been introduced on Dutch TV, but advertising on both TV and radio came only after bitter controversy. The press, for example, complained that its revenue would be hit and the government has agreed that it should have a share of the advertising income to compensate for this. (Calkin, N.B.)

*Navassa Island. When I visited Haiti this summer, I visited 4VUE, R. Lumiere, in Port-au-Prince. Mr. Walker, the Manager, told me that R. Lumiere had once considered establishing an FM station on Navassa Island to beam to areas of the country not served by the Les Cayes and Port-au-Prince AM stations. With an engineer and a boatman, he took a motor-launch out to the Island; he found it infested with snakes and totally unsuitable for the establishment of a radio station or anything else. Radio Lumiere is now building an FM relay network on the Haitian mainland. (Richard Wood) In addition to this, I've talked to one of the hams who visited the island some time ago on a ham DXpedition, and he delivered a similiar report about Navassa. And last week we heard from a non-NRC member who even more recently flew over Navassa and reports that if there's any activity there, "it's under the sand." There seems to be absolutely no question that recent reports of planned activity on Navassa have been entirely the result of the spurious information initially circulated by Kneitel as reported here in IDXD several weeks ago. So don't bother doing any more research on Navassa, it's really a dead issue. (Ed)

*Don Kenney, who's been following the Radio Free America matter from California reports, "I think that you can probably forget about Radio Free America. Lipton's column in the Free Press (entitled, oddly enough, 'Radio Free America') hasn't mentioned anything about it for six weeks. If we are ever blessed with this visitation (and who needs it?) 840 will probably be the frequency (that's the one I'd use if I didn't go FM) and I'll bet on low power, as that is less likely to bring in the FCC, Coast Guard, Navy, etc., in to cancel a fairly healthy investment."

*Malta. It is now settled that Radio Malta will be an official station to be run by Rediffusion (Malta) Ltd. The Malta Broadcasting Authority and the Malta Government decided that the programs will be mainly in Maltese. Frequencies will be 1214 and 89.7 FM. (Micallef, Malta; via SCDX)

*Radio London, formerly off Britian, is under offer to a New Zealand company. If it is purchased, it will sail to New Zealand and broadcast off Auckland with 50 kw and it is stated that it would retain the call of Radio London. (Cushen, N.Z.; via SCDX)

*Rhodesia. According to a press report, the Rhodesia Broadcasting Corporation intends to introduce a new commercial service in EE with the proposed name "R. Jacaranda", sometime next year. Will be similiar to SABC's "Springbok Radio". (Ginbey, S.A.; SCDX)

RADIO LUMIERE'S LABOR IN HAITI

By Victor C. Jaar, Port-au-Prince.

Haiti, one of the first independent countries in the Western Hemisphere, (January 1st, 1804), after being in the past a Spanish and a French colony, retained the French culture and language. It occupies the western and smaller part of Hispanola Island, in the Caribbean Sea. Port-au-Prince is the capital and the center of all activities in this mountainous country. In spite of its small size, some 4.5 million people are estimated to live in Haiti.

Due to its past history, Catholics constitute the great majority of the population in Haiti. However, in modern times, Protestants are doing a good labor, mostly in the countryside. Thus the Oriental Missionary Society operates 4VEH from Cap-Haitien in the North, and the West Indies Mission operates Radio Lumiere from Cayes and Port-Au-Prince in the South.

Radio Lumiere ("Light Radio") operates on MW, SW and FM with programs mainly in Créole and French to reach local listeners. However, plans exist for higher powered transmissions, as well as the building of new relay stations. Today the station operates a few hours a day during the week and all day on Sundays. However, their ideal and intention is to broadcast 120 hours per week, and instead of mainly religious broadcasts, to have the following distribution: 25% Gospel, 12% news and information, 13% educational, and 50% music. This is a method of attracting a greater audience, both from the peasants and the "elite".

During the 1963 hurricane "Flora", the southern part of Haiti, the most densely populated part, was severely affected, and Radio Lumiere brought great help to the victims who were completely isolated at the time.

Today the station receives some 500 letters a week, due mostly to Bible lessons and Song Requests. In spite of its limited staff - mostly Americans, with a few local members - Radio Lumiere tries to attend to such correspondence. (This should be kept in mind by DX'ers because how could Radio Lumiere manage to reply to all letters received? For the time being at least, DX reports have little chance of prompt verification or even at all...)

The Network Director is Louis Markwood. The chief Engineer is David Hartt. The Network Manager is Edwin S. Walker. The Engineer at Cayes is Jim Huckaby. The Cayes address, where most of the station's facilities are operated at present is: Radio Lumiere, Boite Postale 71, Cayes, Haiti. The Port-au-Prince station's address is Radio Lumiere, Boite Postale 1051, Port-au-Prince.

Future plans at Radio Lumiere are many: daily broadcasting 0500-2200; using a convertible 5/10 kw transmitter at Torbec (Cayes) on 760; programs beamed to Cuba in one direction and to Guadeloupe and Martinique in the other; building of 4VIE 250 watts on 660 at Jérémie; 4VIA 250 watts on 730 at Desdunes; and 4VIT 1 kw on 700 at Pignon. Plus 3 low powered FM relays to make the above AM network possible.

Already under construction is a new 1 kw transmitter and antenna at Port-au-Prince to operate on 660 (or on 780, the same frequency as used now).

CMQ has been noted here at times w/carrier only; especially last two MMs. Obviously xmitter troubles; now back on 640. (Silvera, Jamaica)
