Radio Difusora Popular is the name of a station that formeriy operated in San Cristóbal, Dominican Republic. First time I heard them was in 1966 on the frequency of 9960 kcs . but announcing it as 4980 kcs . After they identified and mentioned address I visited them and gave them some information as to what DXing was; they were very kind, showed me the small place and the transmitter which was giving them some trouble, that was the reason why they were heard on 9960 kcs . instead of on 4980 , the frequency assigned by Telecomunicaciones. Later on, the station was closed down as they could not do any competition to a local medium waves station: Radio San Cristobal on 1450 kcs . long before in operation.

Some time later, 1 heard that they had moved to another town: Sabana brande de Boys, and name became "Radio Boyi". Even though they still announced their frequency as 4980 kes. when they relayed some sport or news prograll, as advertised in newspapers, I could not hear then. But the station was always mentioned in special events when relaying on a network. I cane to tho conclusion that they Were probably operating on Medium Waves on a frequency covered by a Santo Doningo station as they wire not heard either on mediun waves or. in short waves. Mobody could give ne the infornation needed, so II decided to investigate by nyself, and the date was set on Sunday April 4.

Sabana Grande de Boys Is a town with a population of 7526 inhabitants, not so far away from Santo Doningo, about 35 miles north-north-east on a stralght line, but some 55 or 60 miles on the road. Two hours were spent to rach the place through a narrow and partly dirt road on a sugar cane plantation district. As soon as I arrived the frequency was moted to be about 1310 kcs. in a transistor set, with wide splashing to both sides, (At home, on April 8, when Radio Radio 1300 kcs . Was off for the Holy Week I could log them at 19.30 G. $1 \mathrm{H} . \mathrm{T}$. and the frequency mas measured more exactly as $1311.6 \mathrm{kcs}+$ )

A visit to the station gave me the satisfaction of meeting again the same person I had talked to in San Cristobal 5 years ago, he was Mr. Juan Aquiles González, owner of the station. The house Was really small made of cement blocks. A living room about $5 \times 7$ feet with two seats and some young lads chatting inside. Hanging on the wall was a framed certification from the Voice of America for their relaying the first moon walk on July 1969. To the rfght, through a glass, a speaker could be seen announcing and playing records, mostly 45 rpm , all piled up on a small table in the narrow pperating room, some $5 \times 4$ feet, no air-conditioning and terribly hot. Another room in the back a little more spacious where an old transmitter waiting for repairs could be seen. Antenna was quite close to the house in the back some 50 or 60 feet high.

Our talk was mainly about their working conditions, regrettable indeed, as business was not very good, ads were scarce and low-priced in the town, and to make matters warse a lightaing bolt struck the antenna burning most of the transmitter, about one
month before. But they were not discouraged and repaired it quickly despite the difficulty of finding replacement parts in the country, only onda Musical owner gave them some help. When asked about the frequency he insisted that they were operating on 4980 kcs., as this was the frequency assigned by Telecomunicaciones and they had no right to operate on medium waves, but they were not heard on that spot, complaining that Ecos del Torbes in San Cristóbal, Venezuela, always covered them. Optimistic they intend to keep on fighting against hardships and even obtain a medium waves frequency from Telecomunicaciones in the future. In all they operate from 10.30 G.M.T., when they start relaying news from a Santo Domingo station as they have no facilities for newsreels, till 03.00 or 04.00 GMT daily. Transmitter is homemade with an output of not more than 500 watts. There is no telephone service in town and no address is necessary as "Radio Boyá" is enough for a letter reaching the town. Some reports have been received from the Inited States and Europe, probably faked, as the station has never been heard outside the country on any frequency. He could not show them to me as he had not them at hand.

Receiving condition in the area is good as most of the medium waves stations in the northern area of the country are heard, from Santiago in the north-west, including Jarabacoa, Constanza, La Vega, down to San Pedro de Macorís on the South-east, including Hato Mayor and Santo Domingo. Bani and San Cristobal on the southwest were not heard, the former probably as it is this same frequency they are using. Nagua on the north and Samana on the northquency they are using. Reception was only done in the day as my visit was from about noon to

were noted in the area in some stations, already reported to IDXD, and a new list of Dominican stations is almost ready to be published soon in DX NEWS.

WHAT IS A PRE-SUNRISE
AUTHORIZATION?

No doubt many DX'ers are etill somewhat confused with regard to the why and wherefores of the PSA, especially with the adrent of the new MexicanAmerican Broadcest Treaty, which allows designated Mexican stations to exercise Post Sunset Authority, as opposed to our own Pre-Sunset Service Authority. According the the FCC Rules Scetion 73.99, the purpose of the entire thing is "In order to afford the maximum uniformity in early morning operationa compatible with interference cansiderations, the following.... are eligible to request Pre-Sunrise Service Authority." In common English, this means that the idea of the PSA is to equalise the competition during the early morning hours, as well as to provide the maximum possible broadca ot service to the general listening public.

The section goes on to say that only certain stations are eligible for PSA, namely Clase III stations and some Clase II stations. Both classes are subject to restrictions becuuse of interference to adjacent and co-channel stations both in the U.S. and in Canada and Maxico as well. This is the reason why we have a large number of stations operating with PSA powers of odd denominations other than 250 or 500 vatts, the latter being the legal maximum for PSA powers follouing a court case which eliminated higher powers. The actual power used if othor than 250 or 500 watts, is computed using a basic formula which is specined eisewhere in the Rules for use in computing powers for Critical hours and the like, and need not be gone into here, as it would only confuse the iskue uith needless technical data.

For Class II etations, which are those secondary stations operating on clear channels (sections $73.21 \& 73.25$ ), the eligible stations are those which do not have a J.S. Class I-A etation located west of the etation in queetion, or which operate on channela where there are no such stations from other North American countries on the channel. For Class III stations, the only reotrictions are for interforence as noted above. In both cases, the PSA allowe the station to operate from 6:00 AM local time until local sunrise with thei daytime antenna pattern, with the exception of those class II stations which bave a class I an the same channel located east of them, in which case, they may comence operations at local sunrise of the clase I gtation rather than 0:00 AM. If there are more than one class I stations east of the station in question, the munrise at the vesternmost such station would apply.

The obvions question then becomes one of how this type of operation would be desirable for fulltime stations, especially those which have powers for aighttime operations in excess of the 500 watt PSA maximum. In order to show this most clearly, we shall take a fow examples, and illustrate by means of some fictitious stations and their coverages.

Let us aseume that Station A operates as a Class III with 5000 vatte daytime and 1000 watte nighttime, U2, or non-directional day; and that Station B is also class III, operating with 5000 watts fulltime, 04 - two separate directional patterns, and that both are asgigned PSA's of 500 watts, which means that they can operate before local sunrise with 500 watts on their day patterns. As we will in Figure 1, Station A's coverage with their day power and pattern is denoted by the solid line. The dashed ine indicates night pattern and power coverage, while the dotted inne indicates coverage with PSA power on day pattern. The same symbology will hold for Figure 2, which deals with Station B. in both cases, we vill see that it is to the advantage of these two atations to utilize PSA, while Station C, with the same facilities in terms of power and patterns as Station B, finds it non-advantageous (Figure 3) to use a PSA. Figure 4 will show the effects of a need to compensate for interference by reducing the PSA power of Station A would affect the effectiveness of the PSL operation.

Thus, we see that there is good reason for many stations with more severely directional nighttime arrays to take advantage of the PSA to increase their elfective coverage during the early morning hours.

it should be remembered that although a station has applied for and even been granted PSA operation, it is not necessary for the station to use it. This makes it possible for a atation to apply for a PSA and obtain it for future use, or for seasonal or occasional use. This bringe to light another interesting point, which is that in certain parts of the country during certain times of the year, the local eunrise may occur oither at 6:00 A.M. or before, thereby precluding presumrise operations for that month. This too, may account for why some stations are noted with PSA sometimes, and without it at other times.

Hopeiully, this article will help to clear up some of the confueion surrounding the ontire pre-sunrise broadcasting situation. Please addrese any coments or questiona to the author via DDXD.
