Greetings. A slim column this week, everyone must have taken a vacation from DXing or condx very poor. Ye ED only listened one evening, 1/8, and noted very strong and clear signals from Spain/Portugal but the rest of Europe including 1586, 1554, etc. very poor. Here is what we have.

New stations, changes, skeds, etc.

INDIA New stations are Mysore, 1400 khz, 10 kw; Allahabad, 1420 khz, 10kw; Tawang, 1530 khz, 10 kw; and a new station is planned for Visakhapatnam with 100 kw., no frequency given. (DSWCI)

PUERTO RICO Radio Sol Broadcasting Corp. has applied for a new station at Orocovis on 1470 khz with 1000 U2. (Broadcasting)

SAUDI ARABIA New station at Gizan on 576 khz with 1 kw. (DSWCI)

SOUTH KOREA The following frequency changes have taken place: Yanggu is now on 1115 khz, ex-540; Inje now on 1115 khz, ex-910; Soguipo now on 1320 khz, ex-1240; Chongju now on 1060 khz, ex-1370. (DSWCI)

WEST MALAYSIA New stations are Batu Melintang on 590 khz and Grik on 1070 khz, both 10 kw and both carrying the RM Program. (DSWCI)

- 595 -DOMINICA R. Dominica, Roseau 0605 EE OM w/sporting event 1/4. (Straus)
- 640 -GUATEMALA TGW R. Nacional in SS 0600-0613 s/off u/CMQ, cl piano and s/off w/a choir. (McCoy)
- 660 -MEXICO XERP 1/5 0700 w/US rock and Radio Uno IDs. (Lobel)
- 730 -MEXICO XEX 1/5 0412 in fair w/mucho KDWN slop. Male ancr sounded like he was talking about Mexican National Hour. (Lobel)
- 746 -HOLLAND Lopik 2200 on 1/3 have been trying for this one a long time but no luck til SM-2 arrived, OM, YL in DD, rock mx. (Straus)
- 750 -VENEZUELA YVKS R. Caracas, 0640 1/5 o/WSM w/pop vocals and SS anmts. (Burke) *On 12/27 at 0540. SS w/American pop mx, ID. (Kauffman)
- 771 -UNID 1/5 0705 5k tone heard on high side of KOB not hrd exactly on 770 u/KOB had to be foreign but what was it. Bearing was 170 degrees. Freq is just a rough estimate; could be 772 or 773. (Lobel)

 1030 -MEXICO XEQR Mexico, DF 0730-45 1/5 R. Centro ID, must be more than list 1 kw.
 WRTH has 5 kw, vy good sig. 1/5. (Straus)
 1040 -CHINA 1/2 1439 probable TP het here w/XED 1050 sloop causing difficulty.
 Slight audio for a second or two but not good. (Lobel)
 1050 -MEXICO XED 1/2 1439 causing mucho sloop to 1040 where China was audible (het
 only); tuned to 1050 at 1442 and found out why sloop; XED had loud boistrous
 ancr w/Ranchera mx. ID "La Grande Mexicali" at 1444. Something about a Ma-
 rachi Band at 1444:15, followed by "X E D La Grande Mexicali" 1445. (Lobel)
 1180 -BRAZIL PRE3 Rio, R. Globo thanks to tip from Ron Schiller country 56 for me at

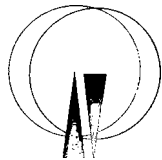

A merger between NRC & any other club would not benefit NRC, since it's already one of the best. Since our Club cannot benefit from a merger, I see no need to support or encourage it. 73.

This unit operates on either self-contained batteries or from an external AC power source. It has an external antenna jack making it easy to hook up to a loop or LW. I found with the SM-2 hook-up the TRF had a tendency to overload, even with the local switch on. But when hooked up to my Sansone Loop the combination was perfect. The tuning knob had a very precise feel to it, not at all loose & sloppy as other portables in this price range tend to be. It was interesting to note that along I-74 out of Indianapolis, the Chicago clear were much stronger than WHAS, probably due to the flat terrain between there & Chicago as opposed to hillier S. CHAPTER XII - CONCLUDING OUR VISIT TO PITTSBURGH BY BEN DANGERFIELD.

Three big stations that put good signals into Pittsburgh day and night were WTAM-1070, Cleveland (later 1100); WJR-750 (later 760) & of course, the Nation's Station, WLW-700 which temporarily was allowed to use 500kw during the middle 30s. Frankly, I didn't notice that much difference between 50 & 500kw, although I spent the Summer of 1936 in Western N.C., & super-powered WLW was strong day & night. The daytime scene in Pittsburgh in the 30s also featured fairly good reception from such places as Buffalo, Toronto, & Windsor (remember CRCW-600 that - I believe - just broadcast during the evening hours?) There were some low-powered Ontarians too, like 100w days! And what about the nights? Almost all parts of the country could be heard any night. The regionals were easy to DX: usually one or two - three at the most - stations in the East to a frequency, & you could actually listen to the graveyard channels. The clears were almost just that, & there were quite a few share-timers: KVOO & WAPI on 1140; KOB & KEX on 1180; KRLL & KTHS on 1040; WTIC & WBAL on 1060; KWEN & WFL on 850. Most stations just mentioned were using 5 or 10kw. Later, WBAL would move to 760 nights to be synchronized w/WJZ (now WABC). KTHS would move to 1060 and WTIC to 1040. Others synchronized were WBBM & KPAB on 770. Other high-powered time sharers were WLS-WENR, Chicago on 870, & earlier, KYW-KPEX Chicago on 1020. It was quite easy to pick up Western & Pacific Coast stations in those days in the Pittsburgh area. All you had to do was wait till the EST & CSTs signed off, which was usually around midnight or later. Then, up to about 3 or 4am, just about each channel had a Westerner on it, many of them re-broadcasting (live!) the Jack Benny, Eddie Cantor shows, or whatever that had been broadcast earlier to those of us living in the Eastern half of the country. After 4am, when CX were right, many DXers could have the thrill of hearing Australian & New Zealand stations, and sometimes, Japanese, & right here in the East! AS FAR AS I knew, there were only a dozen or so ANs in the 30s, including WHEW, WIP, WJBE, KRE, KPAC, KGPJ, and KEPL. Let'sa luck!
