While on the subject of DX TESTS, we'd like to make a little plug for NRC's Flash Alert Service (FAS) now handled by dAN MYERS of Toledo. FAS is a system where members can get last-minute info on late-breaking TEST or SP info which doesn't make our copy deadline at HQ. Send REGULAR SIZE USPS POSTAL CARDS ONLY to dAN, with all cards self-addressed and stamped. We suggest you number the cards, so that you can keep track of when to send a new supply. Stress regular size cards, because dAN will be running them thru a machine to print info on them. They will then be sent out to you. How does he get the info in the first place, you ask? You and other members who get late word on CPC TESTS or SP's from NSP's who occasionally SP, you call dAN at (419)-726-4348 and give it to him. Or, you send him a card. Don't send it to HQ unless it's a duplicate of what you sent to dAN or you will not get it to him that way in time. There's only a few members participating at present. Let's build it up for the 1976-77 DX season!

 -PANAMA R. Reforma, Chitré, w/long melody of Panamanian mx at a local party, at 0315 on 4/18. (Objfo)  
 890 -DOMINICAN REPUBLIC HIPJ R. Continental, 0000-0015 ID. SS mx, fair, 4/10. (Straus)  
 909 -CUBA Camaguey, Cadena Agramonte here from 910. Good days w/out het (WFLA-910 is faint) but really screams at night. (Schatz)  
 919 -COLOMBIA Cartagena, Ems. Fuentes howling eves against R. Popular-920, which is weaker. (Schatz)  
 940 -VENEZUELA R. Punto Fijo, pop mx, ads, at 1748 on 4/17. (Objfo)  
 953 -CUBA Guantánamo, R. Progreso here from nominal 950. About equal in strength to Carrillon on 956 eves. (Schatz)  
 970 -COLOMBIA R. Peninsula, Maicao, announcing political lists of candidates on th election the following day, and mentioning the regulations for road transit during the day, then nx, as good as a local stn w/50 kw 1746 on 4/17. (Objfo)  
 975 -COSTA RICA San José, now "Radio Centroamericana", ERC's mystery. (Schatz)  
 990 -VENEZUELA R. Tricolor, Barquisimeto, ads to "Discoteca Siglo Veinte" plus some other ads. ID at 0320 on 4/18. (Objfo)  
 1000 -MEXICO XEFV Ciudad Juárez, Chih. 5/3 1150. Hrd just after logging KTOK and boy did XEFV almost ruin my logging of KTOK for the first time this one (both of them) were hrd. KOMO came on about 7 mins later and completely ruined the sig from XEFV. (Lobel)

 -UNID SA HJ or YV likely, possibly Combeima, but too weak to read. First noted 5/5 eve. (Schatz)  
 1027 -SPAIN San Sebastian good w/female vocal, FF and SS talk by man and woman, then male vocal (FF), 0503, 4/28. (Connolly)  
 1034 -PORTUGAL Porto Alto CSB2 at fair level in WBZ slop w/FP male vocal then PP talk, 0504 on 4/28. (Connolly)  
 1040 -CHINA Shanghai. 5/9 1230 w/ancr in JJ. Fair S5 sig u/QRM from neighbors goldfish tank heater. (Lobel)  
 1045 -PANAMA (Tentative) Las Tablas HOJ2 suspected as the SS stn noted here on numerous occasions. Slow inst mx at poor level in WHN slop noted 0047 4/11. (Con)  
 1059 -CUBA Bafacoa CMKG at usual potent level, jamming KW/JRFP w/SS talk by man, 0045, 4/11. (Connolly)  
 1080 -VENEZUELA R. Universal, Maracay, orchestra mx, and ID at 0043 on 4/17. (Objfo)  
 1085 -UNID SS Running AN MM 5/3; has much US old mx and a harp glice IS after mostly every selection, man ancr except every 15 mins or so when woman gives ID and AST TG. I suspect this is R. Amistad, slipped offa 1080! Too much WTIC-1080 slopover to get positive ID. (Cooper) \* Honduras, R. Aeropuerto likely fair w/local mx, SS talk, no ID noted, 0405 5/3. (Falconer) You sure of those AST TCs ERC? I strongly suspect you had the HR - pgm flts. (ED)

- 1187 -INTERNATIONAL WATERS/GUATEMALA Caroline and TGT hetting each other so fiercely that good audio could not be brought up on either stn., 0455, 4/28. (Connelly)
- 1188 -GUATEMALA R. Sonora TGT, Guatemala City w/block buster sigs w/many Sonora IDs, no WOWO slop at all 0350 5/3. (Falconer)

- 1196 -WEST GERMANY Munich VOA fair w/soul show; then EE VOA ID and Yankee Doodle IS, 0400 on 4/11. (Connelly)

- 1270 -NETHERLANDS ANTILLES Antiliana, St. Nicholas, Aruba, announcing football by repeating the word several times like this "football, football, football" (for US readers this means soccer), also other ads, all of it in Papiamentu at 1700 on 4/17, QRM from R. TV Dominicana, Santiago. After the hour, mx. (Objfo)
- 1280 -COLOMBIA R. Sonorama, Bogotá, pop mx and ID at 0323 on 4/18. (Objfo)
- HAITI R. Metropole, Port-au-Prince, announcing a Dominican singer to sing at Port-au-Prince. Suddenly IDed in SS announcing frequency as 1290 (but they were on 1280), also FM on 100 mhz. (Objfo)
- 1285 -NICARAGUA "Radio Gima", YNBC (?) at 0305 s/off 5/6. Location not noted, A bit weaker than Plata-1295. (Schatz)
- 1290 -VENEZUELA R. Puerto Cabello, ads and pop mx, announcing party w/"Los Melodicos" at the end of the Holy Week, ID at 1653 w/clock slow 4 mins, on 4/17. (CO)
- 1295 -ENGLAND Crowborough BBC strong w/CHU-style pips preceding regular s/on, 0345 on 4/11. (Connelly)

- 1295 -NICARAGUA "Radio Plata en Matagalpa" ID one past eve - so finally got a city on this one. Per WRTH-76: YN00-1290, ex-"R. Plaza Reloj", w/3 kw. (Schatz)
- 1300 -PUERTO RICO R. Util, Mayaguez, ID at 2033 on 4/17 in EE, then pop mx. (Objfo)
- 1307 -HONDURAS Tegucigalpa. Name and slogan: "Radio Majestad, La Voz del Guayabo".
- 1312 -CUBA Santa Cruz, "R. Santa Cruz", ex-R. Mabo-a-1450. S/off 2300 LT. (RFS, 2)

- 1375 -ST PIERRE & MIQUELON R. France fair w/man in FF, 0113, 4/27. Fair w/man in FF, buckshot from potent WDEA/WFEA mess on 1370, 0029, 4/11. (Connelly)
- 1376 -FRANCE Lille poor, bits of talk noted, mostly just a carrier wallowing in bad WFEA slop, 0448, 4/28. (Connelly)
- 1380 -VENEZUELA Ondas del Mar, Puerto Cabello, w/too many ads and some pop mx at 1335 on 4/17. (Objfo)
- 1390 -DOMINICAN REPUBLIC Puerto Plata, R. Televisión Dominicana is operating a relay transmitter in this town. (Objfo)

- 1525 -COSTA RICA Turrialba TIEAW in at good level w/"Columbia" ID, SS talk, reported previously as unid, best reception ever of this one at 0428 on 5/3. (Connelly)
- 1529 -VATICAN CITY Poor/fair in WPTR splash, het, fragmentary cl mx, 0010, 4/11. (Con)
- 1538 -WEST GERMANY Mainflingen DLF topping WPTR buckshot w/good sig, old style female/male duet vocal, 0337, 4/11. (Connelly)

- 1550 -TURKS & CAICOS ISLANDS (Cont) and again "Turks and Caicos Islands", again they just carrier off, no N.A. I did not hear them again in the afternoon as I had to return home after daylight. A report is in the mail to them for a verification. The short wave xmtr was not hrd, it is quite possible they have dropped it. As the sked is extended perhaps there is a possibility that the stn will be hrd in the States. Keep tuned to this freq. (Objfio) Very nice, Cesar! This one will definitely be worth looking for during auroral cx. May- be some enterprising soul will contact them about a possible DX Pgm. (ED)

This and that . . . . .

Some comments on TIQ's EE pgms from James Snow: "I read with interest the item in the May 3 issue of DX News of the reception on 1175 khz of TIQ, Radio Marino. Mr. Connolly made the good DX catch. Also I have seen another item or 2 recently in (Cont)

DX News about the reception of TIQ. The reason I am writing is that it may be of interest to some members that the comment Mr. Connolly made about the EE programming on TIQ was somewhat inaccurate. About 2 months ago, I was in Puerto Limon and had occasion to visit this stn as well as several others in the area. TIQ broadcasts often in EE as do a few other stns in the city. The reason for the EE programming is that, unlike the other cities of Costa Rica, and like cities on the Eastern Caribbean side of Central America, the population of Puerto Limon is 2/3 black Jamaican and is EE speaking, therefore is is a dual language city. EE programs are often aired. An interesting sidelight also, is that this stn, TIQ, operates on shortwave in the 49 meter band on approximately 5.9 mhz. TIQ is 1 kw on BCB and drifts a bit in freq, but is fairly easy to catch in the southeast part of the US because of the split freq. It is an interesting stn to listen to and they play much of the new Reggae songs that are so popular in Jamaica and the Caribbean".

From RFS: "The Caribbean coasts of Nicaragua, Costa Rica, Panama, etc. are populated by ex-Jamaicans - who still speak EE. This explains TIQ-1176's EE pgmg."

From Norm Maguire: "Been too bust DXing, fighting hay fever, getting socceritis (watching too many soccer matches) and doing everything but get to my correspondence. Have been camping on 610 khz looking for KUAM, but either get 2PC or KPRC, grrr!! Do this even with KGMB on 590. Lots of mainland stns, w/WJR furthest East. Finally got KFI when KORL was off. If I ever tried listing the mainland stns hrd, would run to several pages, hi. Tried for Radio Millon, but no luck. Went out near Diamond Head lighthouse, used car radio and Sanyo portable. Had tape recorder w/me. No luck. Was not about to drive out to Haunama Bay to listen, hi."

From Cesar Objfio: "All these loggings were made during the Holy Week when most Dominican stns s/off on Thursday, Friday and Saturday permitting to hear stns from other countries, especially Venezuela and Colombia, also I was at my home town, Bani, these days and most of it was hrd during the day w/my TFM1000WA Sony receiver."

From Mark Connolly: "For the last few days in March and during the first week of April, propagation at local sunset was a "dog", no skip whatsoever. Then by mid-April, short skip prevailed; skip stns up to 750 km distant in well an hour before sunset, but no long haul DX until well in to the night, a marked change from winter cx which yielded excellent low band TA DX at local sunset."

That is it - absolutely everything that was on hand through 5/16. Can't say that I'm sorry, hi. 73 - DX - See you in a month or so. . . . .

### AM, FM popularity overwhelms FCC; six-month freeze put on applications

#### Station Name Can Go Between Call Sign & City

The FCC has amended the rules to allow a broadcast station to put the licensee's name between the call sign and the name of the city, in ID announcements. Under the superceded rules, the call sign had to be "immediately followed by the name of the community . . ." Under the amendment, which was effective March 18, 1976, the station can give the call sign, then the licensee's name, then the city. The FCC, however, refused a proposal from station KGMI that a phrase such as ". . . the sound of . . ." be allowed in ID's. The FCC said that this would not only tend to increase confusion, but also posed a problem in terms of the FCC prohibition of promotional material in ID's.

A flood of AM and FM applications has caused the FCC to declare a "closed" season on the filing of any more. The commission says the shutdown will remain in effect for six months, beginning June 30, to give the staff an opportunity to cut into the backlog.

The FCC noted that, in its June 1975 order relaxing rules on AM applications to permit continued growth in that band, it said that pent-up demand might lead to just such a glut, and that it might have to declare "open" and "closed" seasons. With an increase of more than 600% in AM applications, the backlog has doubled, and the time for a "closed" season has arrived, the commission said last week. The backlog stands at 257.

What's more, the Broadcast Facilities Division, which handles AM applications, is also responsible for FM applications. And proposals for new or FM stations or major changes in existing outlets have been growing at an even faster rate than those for AM facilities: the backlog includes 467 applications.

The only exceptions to the June 30-Dec. 31 hiatus:

- Proposals essential to continuing an existing service which cannot be accommodated on a "minor change" or Special Temporary Authorization basis.
- Mutually exclusive proposals filed in response to a cut-off notice.
- Applications to replace deleted facilities.
- Applications mutually exclusive with renewal applications.

## Is this the ultimate in captive audience?

## A Florida tunnel is rigged to deliver commercials, PSA's across whole AM car-radio band

If all goes as planned, AM car radios will no longer go silent in the New River tunnel at Fort Lauderdale, Fla. Instead, travelers will hear the same commercials and public service announcements, no matter what station they were tuned to upon entering the tube.

The low-power broadcast system, operated by J. Rodger Skinner, formerly an account executive at WGMA(AM) in nearby Hollywood, Fla., uses an antenna over each of the tunnel's four lanes. The service, which was scheduled to be in operation last Friday (April 23) was successfully tested over one lane three days earlier, Mr. Skinner said.

The system is not infringing on any listener's rights, Mr. Skinner said, because the radio can always be turned off. Plans are for a 24-hour-a-day operation.

Mr. Skinner claimed to have conceived the idea while driving through the tunnel. Later, he said, he found backers for his Tunnel of America Radio Inc., received permission for low-power broadcasts from the FCC and secured a three-year contract with Florida's Department of Transportation. Under the agreement, Mr. Skinner's firm must broadcast 50% PSA's and pay \$510 monthly to broadcast commercials.

The system repeats 10-second announcements 90 times, alternating every 15 minutes between commercials and PSA's. Mr. Skinner said it takes 15 seconds to drive through the tunnel. He hasn't accounted for traffic jams.

Mr. Skinner was hesitant about revealing the system's costs, stating only that it ran into five figures. No advertising commitments were to be made before operations began, he said, but interest has come from "many of the blue-chip local advertisers" such as banks and automobile dealers. He expects national advertising once the system becomes established. His rate card has yet to be formalized, Mr. Skinner said, but he claimed his prices will be "competitive" with other local media.

According to Mr. Skinner, negotiations are under way for the broadcast rights to most of the country's 63 tunnels that are at least 1,000 feet long.



## PUBLISHERS' CORNER

It seems that another new issue is taking root in several DX clubs of late, namely that of the status of DX clubs. Primarily, this issue deals with the fact that our (all DX clubs!) publications are not indexed in any reference material in libraries, nor are they preserved, nor are important DX articles indexed. The other primary concern is that the clubs themselves are not listed in any registries of record, and that they (currently) have no (documented) legal standing before bodies of government (primarily of interest the FCC). In a recent proposal by Steve Kamp, a former NRC- and IRCA-member, ANARC will soon be urged to undertake the following:

1. Getting DX bulletins & publications properly indexed and into college libraries, etc.
2. Compiling lists of past DX-related articles for inclusion in the appropriate academic and legal journals, and also in DX bulletins.
3. Maintain an ongoing list of current material from said publications for use by DX Clubs, (a more comprehensive version of what EDXC is doing in Europe).
4. Explore the possibility of acquiring legal standing for DX-ers or DX groups before the FCC for appearances on such issues as superpower (but not limited to that).

We have also had a suggestion from a longtime member for a new and more sophisticated form of blacklisting stations who do not conform to our expectations. Previous such lists were intended for non-verifiers, to save DX'ers bothering to write to them. This one would urge DX'ers to report all TT's going unID for over the allowed period of time, as well as all RS-type ET's to the nearest FCC office, and filing a formal complaint for violation of FCC rules. We include this here, because it ties into #4 above.

We wholeheartedly support items 1-3 above, and we support the underlying principle of #4 above. Our reservations with #4 are that the privilege of standing could be over- and/or mis-used to the ultimate (long-term) detriment of the hobby. The member's proposal noted above is a perfect illustration of the type of thing which could, while well-intended, backfire into fever veries, fewer (or NO) DX TESTS and other unanticipated results. We feel that legal standing would be a good thing if it were accorded only to ANARC, or only to major clubs representing more than a certain number of members, which clubs should also be members of ANARC. Individual DX'ers in a moment of unthinking anger, or small clubs with very narrow interests — or, worse yet, clubs formed especially to take advantage of standing for a spurious special interest of importance to them but not to a larger segment of the DX hobby — could be a most dangerous precedent. Yet, the grounds for such precedent exist as illustrated in the cover portion of the article containing the above proposals. We are inalterably opposed to turning in violators to the FCC, because of its ultimate and very real portent of backlash to DX'ers and to our hobby. We strongly urge ALL members to resist any temptations to report unID TT's (including those when you know who they are) to the F.C.C. A more constructive approach would be a letter to the F.C.C. by groups of members (with or without copies to Congressional representatives) informing them that these practices are widespread, and that something should be done about it. This will not likely harm the hobby, and probably neither approach is more than 50% certain of being given any sort of attention by the F. C. C.

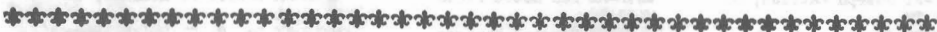

# FCC Settles Oldest Pending Case

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Federal Communications Commission announced Friday settlement of probably its oldest pending case, a 35-year-old squabble between two high-powered 50,000 watt stations over the airwaves between them.

It involves WABC, the ABC network-owned station in New York City, and KOB in Albuquerque, N.M. Both have operated on clear Channel 770 since 1941, with both complaining about interference from the other.

But the settlement could end up in the U.S. Appeals Court here, as have previous FCC rulings in the case since 1958. At one time it reached the Supreme Court, which refused to hear the case.

A clear channel, of which there are 25 in this country, is one on which there is normally a dominant station that operates with high power, designed to provide interference-free service over large areas at night.

There is no interference problem between WABC and

KOB in the daytime since the signals do not carry as far as at night.

WABC complained that an FCC decision has allowed KOB to broadcast since 1963 without giving WABC the same protection given other dominant clear channel stations.

The FCC agreed Friday in a 5-0 decision that directed Hubbard Broadcasting Inc., owner of KOB, to file an application by June 30 to change its directional antenna pattern to provide WABC more protection, such as existed from 1957 to

1963. Martin L. Levy, chief of the FCC's Broadcast Facilities Division, said this might require KOB to build an extra tower.

The FCC decision was in line with the court ruling, which gave the commission the alternative of lowering WABC to the same class station as KOB, provided WNBC and WCBS "network flagship stations" also were reduced in status. But the commission said that would not be in the public interest.

In reference to the "Travelers' Information Service" report that appeared in the 4/12 DX NEWS, I have the following addendum. I am the El Cajon DXer who has heard the U.S. Border Patrols station on 1600 from San Ysidro. It was on MM 6/2/75 at approximately 10am PLT. The quality was fair w/considerable interference from KWOW on the same frequency in Pomona. My tape recorder was out of order but I was able to jot down most of the transmission, which was announced in both EE & SS, & got enough info for a report to the station. My report was sent to the U.S. Customs Service Office in San Ysidro. They forwarded it to the Regional Office of U.S. Customs in Los Angeles. I received a very nice letter verifying that reception from a Jerome Hollander, Public Information Officer. My report had a PP/c in it that was also returned. See DX NEWS Vol. 43, #1, p 33 for a copy of that letter. Now for some additional info on KQ2XUB on 530 at the L.A. Airport. I have heard the station as far as two miles from the L.A. Airport at times when I have been there. Evidently that buried cable takes the transmission much farther than 80' from the buried cable. I was able to hear the station while leaving the L.A. Airport then. It faded completely 100 yards from the approach road; it was again heard when I entered the Freeway on ramp (I-405) about 1 1/2 miles away. It faded completely & was not heard after that two miles. Well, my 30 lines are about up. I just thought this little bit of info might be of value to those of you who read the report by Mike Hardester. Till I next appear in these pages, 73s.
