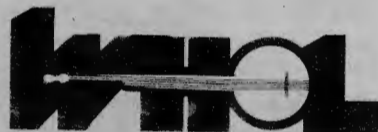

### KJOE Silent After Transmitter Seized

Instead of airing gospel tunes, KJOE radio station was silent today after sheriff's deputies seized the station's radio transmission tower and electronic equipment.

The action today reportedly was the first seizure ever of a local broadcasting station by sheriff's deputies.

The seizure followed a court order which was the result of a civil lawsuit by several property owners who claimed the radio station owed \$3,150 in rental fees for its transmitter location. The station had not paid rent since January, the property owners said.

Sheriff's deputies arrived at KJOE's tower site at Aero Drive and Northway Boulevard about 9:30 a.m., according to Jim Green of the Caddo Sheriff's Department civil section. The deputies were accompanied by an engineer who took the station off the air and a locksmith who changed the locks on the premises.

"To my knowledge, we have never seized or closed down a TV or radio station," Green said.

Sheriff's deputies said lawyers for KJOE were attempting to resolve the dispute this morning so the station could get back on the air. James Ederer, station president and manager, was unavailable for comment. A secretary said no one

would be in the office for the rest of today "since we're obviously making plans."

Today's seizure follows a suit filed by A.W. Murphy, T.H. Murphy and E.M. Murphy, owners of the property where KJOE's transmitter is located. They sued for \$3,150 in back rent and asked a lease between the two parties be rescinded.

Attorney Alex Rubenstein, representing the broadcasting company, filed a petition in answer to the suit denying the charge and asking the suit be dismissed.

Judge James Clark ordered the broadcasting company to make good its past debts and rescinded the lease on Aug. 26.

The property owners returned to court again Sept. 4 and asked to have the broadcasting company evicted from the property. In their petition, the landowners said the broadcasting company had made no effort to leave the property even after receiving a court order to leave Aug. 26.

The landowners also claim they have "tresor's rights" to the electronic equipment on the transmitter site "to the extent of the past due rent, interest and cost of court proceedings."

Clark granted the property owners request Wednesday to have the property vacated.

Thank Heavens the long hot Summer of 1980 is over! Amen!! Hallelujah! Sixty-seven days of 90 or more, including 21 straight days of 90 or more. It's beery too (thank gosh I'm not in Texas with six weeks of 100 or more of 1000 plus). With the end of the extra-hot Summer, it's more time at the dials and goodbye to bikini-chasing and swimming. This month has been good to me with five newies in four days. In addition to WYCB-1340 & WOL-1450 I have several out-of-town GY pests, three in Tidewater, Va. (WNOA-1230, WPCB-1400 & WPEE-1490) and one 40 miles S (WCNC-1240) in NE N.C. However, the local yokels WITH-1230 and WFIN-1400 dominate in the daytime. WPCB sticks out like a sore thumb. Even with severe GY QRM, it stands out, particularly when a screaming Bible-pounder is on the air (sounds like our own WUST-1120). I can get a good null on WWDG-1260 but the pest from Steeltown WTAE dominates 1250. It's a slopper like WDDC. When WDDC had an unsked SP recently, I logged WCHV despite spray from WTAE. Back in my Zenith Royal-500 days of 1957-58, I used to get good catches when I nulled out WTAE. Now when I null out WTAE, I get WDDC splash. Another slopping pest from Pittsburgh is WKTQ-1320 (ex-WJAS), which has a stronger signal than that of local WEEL-1310 at the same volume setting, although both stations have 5,000w power. The proof is in the nighttime antenna pattern. Other slopping pests are CKLW-800, WBT-1110, & WKBW-1520. I see a rainbow when the sun shines on the spray these rockers put out, hi. However, I'm an ordinary listener when I hear WBT on Sunday nights with the oldies mx (50's & 60's.) When I hear WGY-810 play such mx on Saturday nights, CKLW slops that channel at times. I can get as good nulls on the TEF as I can on the Royal-500. WINX-1600 and WOL-1450 are easier to null out at night than in daytime, probably because of lower power. Thanks to TOM BULL, who cleared up the "mystery" of 1530. No switcheroo after all - false alarm, hi. This ends Musing #28. 73's.

Hello. Having been a member of NRC for about three years, I guess a Muse is in order. My age is 30 and I have remained single for all of those long years. I work for Ford Motor Company. My DXing career started in 1966 when I purchased a 1937 Fada radio for \$5.00. The antenna back then was two 75' longwires connected in parallel. My best catch with this set-up was KICY-850, Nome, Alaska. In 1968 I moved up to an HQ-180-C and it is still my main receiver. Other radios are a Panasonic RF-2800, GE Superadio, and a TRF. Antennas used are a 4' box loop, SM-1. Albany is located about five miles NE of San Francisco. Three MX XRs are within three miles of my location (KDIA, KNEW, KIQI). KNEW & KPRC are the two local stations that cause the most slopover. Recent loggings by date are 9/10 Vladivostok-1476, China-1206, China-1044, China-1197, JOGB-873 Japan, KIKI-830, KORL-650, KPOI-1040. 9/13- Korea-1566 (strongest TP), JOGB-774 Hapan, JOBB-828 Japan. 9/14- USSR-576, 2BL-702 Australia, 2GF-1206 Australia. 9/20- North Korea-657. I have heard 315 stations, 31/21 states, 4/3 provinces, 22/9 countries. I do not have very many veries, but will try to improve totals. I would like to thank HANK WILKINSON for his fine reports to IDXD. His catches have renewed my interest in MW DXing; maybe I can hear a few of them. I have been DXing with the SM-1 and 4' loop in combination. I have the SM-1 connected to the HQ-180. I tune in the desired signal on the SM-1, then adjust the unconnected box loop to peak the signal. The signal is stronger than using either loop separately. I have ordered some NRC reprints on loop antennas. Good DX to all this season. 73.

I used to contribute a lot more to NRC in the past than I have lately, because while NRC is a top-notch club, it really is Eastern oriented, and consequently have been more involved with the IRCA, which is mainly Western. After having given this some thought, I have come to the conclusion that this is not a healthy situation for the hobby, because valuable interaction is lost. It's easy to say that if you want to, you can belong to both clubs (and many do), but it's harder to devote full attention to both, and you end up taking sides. I wonder how many new WC members considered contributing to DX NEWS, but didn't because of the lack of Western involvement. A fellow DXer here told me that he stopped contributing to NRC precisely because "No one else did." At the same time, to bring up again ERNIE's concern of QSLs going to the trash man, these vintage QSLs are "history". Although I do not have a solution to the question my present interests on the hobby come quite close. At this time, I'm spending my lunch hours writing up one loose leaf page per each radio call per each frequency. Naturally this involves approximately 5,000 looseleaf pages. At the present time I've logged 24 hours & have reached a point at 960 kHz. Each sheet contains simply call letters, location, frequency. These will be later filed in with powers, earliest known QSLs (of each design) & any station history to enable me to write a brief history of the station & to include dates of changes. I totally invite & urge all DXers to write concerning all QSLs they may have. I have planned to prepare a name credit list of all donors. As far as preserving QSLs - let's say you have a QSL from WNBC & it's the earliest dated known to exist, or even WEAF (before changing to WNBC) then I will arrange to photograph your QSL for historical sake & publication for all to share. This goes for current stations as well (for I have two different designs for WHAS). This is no easy task and between my job & responsibilities to God, family & self I would assume this to continue for several (repeat) several years. At present, I will acknowledge the few letters already received at a future date. In the meantime, should any of you have nothing to do (Summer months) I would invite you to get in on this "verie game" by simply listing your QSLs as such: Fred., call, state, date, short description." An example is: "1190-WOWO-Ind.-April-'72 - history folder card." Of course, there's no rush for I still have half the dial to write up. Here's your chance to make history. Cops - almost forgot - I'm interested in U.S., U.S. Territories, Canada, stations, plus oddities, i.e. pirate stations; rare foreign v/qs for longest catches, etc. 73's.

The high point of 7/4 came early - 12:04am - w/WFR-1230 NC, readable at s/off w/SSB. 7/12- The new WVVN-1550 GA loud w/6am s/on-SSB. 7/30- PER KARL FORTHE'S DDDX tip, WATE-860 Baltimore easy w/quick 5:15 s'on, no SSB. 8/1- I had local WEAG-1470 on during the 5pm NX to hear a spot I'd done and ended up w/a new catch; the new WLTN-1480 NC, thanks to WEAG getting knocked off by lightning. ## DAVE UNEARTHS SOME REAL LOW-POWERED STATIONS

Greetings and halucinations. I don't know when this missif will land upon ERNIE, what with the present state of labour unrest in the federal government. (Postmarked 2 X (Oct. 2) & rec'd 10/6 -ERC) However, nothing ventured, nothing gained. The main reason for writing is to report on a series of low powered stations I came across in my travels this past month. They are operated by Parks Canada on 1490 kHz & I found three of them; in Banff, Jasper, and at the Columbia Icefields, all in the Banff-Jasper Parks chain in Alberta. Only one, in Banff, used any call letters, CBPH. They are all extremely low power, and are used to transmit messages to people passing through the area about roads, the parks, wildlife, etc., in a continuous loop recording. The local range is very limited, and if the antennas I saw were actually the ones involved, no wonder - they look sort of like short, base-loaded CB ground planes with large capacitive hats. There may be others, but as those were the only two parks I was in, I can't make a report. Reference to another network I came across in a book in the Vancouver Public Library - "Maps - Broadcasting Undertakings in Canada" published by the CRTC. These are identified as low power multilingual stations, all on 1450 kHz, in Ontario; CHOP - Gull Bay, CHEW - Helen Lake; CHOX - Pays Plat; CHAS - Aroland, and CHIP - Macdiarmid. There's no reference to any of these in the last Domestic Log I have (78-79), but they are apparently the same sort of thing as CHAP-Longlec, which is listed in both sources. This CRTC book was accurate as of Nov. 1, 1974, published in 1975, and is catalogue number BC92-5 from Information Canada, Ottawa KIA 0S9, if anyone wishes to get one. I don't know if this stuff is news to anyone or not, but I thought I'd pass it on for whatever it's worth. PS- CKNW-980, New Westminster, is picking up Montreal Expos playoff games from CFCF. (?? -ERC). Also, CISL-940, Richmond, is on the air.

CHAPTER CXLIX - STATION PROFILE - W E A K N - 790 - by PETE KEMP.  
WEAN went on the air June 2, 1922 with a power of ten watts. It was origin-  
ally licensed to the Shepard Company of Providence and Boston. The transmitter and studio  
were located in the Shepard Department Store of Providence. Donald Spear from Brown Univer-  
sity built and operated the station. Harold Thomas was the first chief engineer. In 1934  
Mr. Thomas founded WATR in Waterbury, Conn. In 1924 the Shepard Building burned to the  
ground and a new transmitter was needed. Early in 1928 the station moved to the top of the  
Biltmore Hotel in Providence. In 1922 WEAN started taking programs from its sister station  
WKAC in Boston. This was the start of the Yankee Network. WEAN was also affiliated with  
the CBS Network. In 1927 station power was 250 watts, this was increased to 500 and then  
to 1,000 watts. In 1930 studios were transferred to the Crown Hotel with transmitting fac-  
ilities built in East Providence in 1935 and power increase to 5,000 watts that same year.  
The Providence Journal Company acquired ownership of the station on October 9, 1954.
