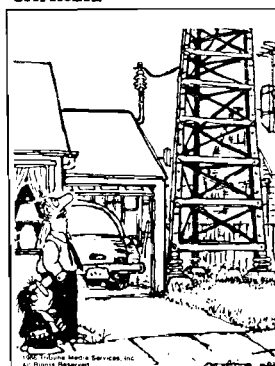

# FCC proposes changes in call-letter regulations

WASHINGTON—The Federal Communications Commission has proposed changing one of the oldest rules in American telecommunications, and broadcasters aren't sure they like it.

The FCC last week proposed eliminating the 55-year-old regulation that stations west of the Mississippi River begin call letters with a "K" and stations east of the Mississippi with a "W."

That proposed change, along with two others regarding call letters also proposed last week, befuddled broadcasting industry officials here.

"It took me by surprise," said Eddie Fritts, president of the National Association of Broadcasters, who said there has been "no groundswell toward further relaxation of the rules."

Under the new proposal, stations would still have to begin their call letters with either a "K" or a "W," but would have the option of choosing either, regardless of location.

The K-W restriction, which came out of a decision at the 1932 International Telecommunications Convention in Madrid, has "no public-interest justification" today, the FCC said in announcing the proposed changes Feb. 9.

# What's the point?

You have to hand it to Mark Fowler. Here it is, just a few months before he takes his final bow as chairman of the Federal Communications Commission, and still he can't resist taking his last swipes at whatever regulations are still standing.

In his quest to achieve some mythical state of total market freedom, Mr. Fowler's FCC has now proposed doing away with that most venerable of American broadcasting rules, the division of call letters into a "K" series west of the Mississippi River and a "W" series in the East.

The rationale for this, according to the FCC, is that such a division serves no public purpose. Of course, eliminating the rule also serves no particular public purpose, except to confuse everyone even more than they may already be confused.

When the regulation was first devised at a 1932 international conference, the point was to carve the world up by distinctive call letters, so that broadcasters could tell at a glance from which country a station originated.

In the case of the United States, at that time considered a large country with many broadcast outlets, it

was decided to subdivide even further.

The FCC has now apparently determined that the country is no longer as big as it once was, and there is no longer any need to make these subtle distinctions. Who, after all, really needs that convenient call-letter code that tells us whether a station is from the East or the West?

We submit that the FCC is asking the wrong questions. The real point is, why add to the growing confusion in the communications marketplace? Why tinker with one of the few common-sense guidelines that no one objects to? When does a drive for deregulation become nothing more than the mischief-making of idle hands?

Officials at the National Association of Broadcasters caught unaware by this new deregulatory assault, say they're upset at the proposal. They also say they have no idea where such a plan originated.

Neither do we. But it seems symbolic of Mr. Fowler's sometimes overzealous anti-regulation fever that he would choose to close out his tenure swinging mightily against a pleasant little regulation that no one had even thought about for 50 years. #

The ITC had originally assigned nations a first letter, such as "X" for Mexico and "C" for Canada, to avoid confusion between countries. But the distinction regarding the Mississippi River serves no real purpose, the FCC said.

Mr. Fritts disagreed, saying that lifting the restrictions will cause confusion for the audience and for ratings services. He said NAB will examine the complete text of the proposed changes and could then air its opposition in an FCC filing.

The commission's second proposal involves abolishing rules that prohibit different owners from assigning the same call letters to broadcast properties in the same market. Currently, for example, owners can't take the call letters used on a competitor's TV station for use on their own radio station

### With written consent

The FCC has now proposed that this be allowed, as long as the original owner of the call letters gives written consent.

"This rule was intended to prevent public confusion as to the management and operation of stations," the FCC said, but added that "this type of protection was not necessary or desirable" anymore.

"I think they're trying to fix something that nobody thought needed fixing," said Jeff Baumann, NAB's former vice president and general counsel. "I don't understand the rationale behind it."

Mr. Baumann said he also felt the FCC's proposed changes would cause confusion.

In the third proposal, the FCC wants to simplify the process of changing call letters. Under the current system, if a station wants to adopt new call letters, it must relinquish its old moniker and apply for a new one.

### Another could pick them up

Theoretically, it's possible for another station to pick up those old call letters before the other station is granted new ones, although an FCC spokeswoman said this rarely happens.

Under the proposed rule change, the old call letters would not be available to another broadcaster until the station seeking the change had been granted a new set.

Regarding the K-W restriction, a handful of stations around the country are exceptions to the rule, having either been given a waiver to the restrictions or allowed to retain call letters through a grandfather clause if the letters were assigned before the 1932 decision.

One of the most well-known examples involves the nation's first commercial radio station, KDKA AM in Pittsburgh, which has retained its call letters, since signing on in 1920.

- 1095 DOMINICAN REPUBLIC unid 2/16 0330 with 100% merengue format. Very poor. (Gleason) Hurry up and ID it. I've been trying for years-Chuck
- 1125 COSTA RICA TISHE "Sonido" San Jose 2/9 0031-0038 good w/EE and SS pop and rock mx; ID as "Sonido 11-20". (DeLorenzo)
- 1134 UNID TAs 2/9 0005-0055 two Europeans battling for dominance here; one with classical and opera mx and man in lang similar to FF, the other w/pop and light rock mx. Very active SAH-I suspect Yugoslavia and Spain. (DeLorenzo)
- 1205 CAYMAN ISLANDS R. Cayman 2/9 0023 good w/hymn on a Sunday night // 1555. (DeLorenzo)
- 1261.6 COLOMBIA HJHU R. Morgan, San Andres 2/16 0400-0458 vallenato and cumbia music, ID with time and back announced song titles after every record. \* No commercials noted. S/off annc't 0454 followed by vocal version of NA. \* Cut anthem before fully ended. Severe fading, ranging from readable to very good. Frequency seemed to move up over the hour that I listened, \* ending at 1261.9. Note that all music and announcing was in SS, although \* EE is supposedly spoken extensively on the island. I believe that this \* qualifies as a separate country. (Gleason) I know it does for hams. \* don't know what the BCB clubs say but it should follow the ARRL list in \* my book. I don't remember this as having been reported at all, anywhere, \* anytime by anybody so I suppose you go down in the DX'ers Footman \* Memorial Hall Of Fame-Chuck
- 1314 UNID looped Dominican Republic or central CA 2/15 0240 with SS ballads. Very poor. (Gleason)
- 1521 SAUDI ARABIA Duba 2/1 2148 AA instrumental shortly faded out for female annc't, 2149 traditional pop tune of western type with electric guitar on lead. Signal good with WKBW-1520 phased and het suppressed with 2.2 KHz filter. 2149 female AA talk starting to get drowned out by operatic music, perhaps from Czechoslovakia. 2155 light orchestral music with female AA talk again dominant while operatic music had faded out. Periodic fades with distortion. A minute later, opera re-appearing but only in background. 2157 male AA talk in low pitch, muted style, this signal now clear and dominant, also slop-free. 2158 more light orchestral music but with some opera again in background. Male and female AA talk alternating. Some slop. 2200 light pop tune. (Weeks)
- 1521 CZECHOSLOVAKIA Cizatice 2/12 0055 concert music fair but over a jumble of signals. 0100 6 beeps, the last a little longer. Male annc't. Pause. IS chimes (so so fa/so me) repeated twice, matching what I have heard previously on 272 KHz. Male talk with what sounds like news. Good signal at this time but with female SS talk clearly in background which rose to become almost dominant. Little slop, WKBW phased. Not heard here before, usually Saudi Arabia. (Weeks)

**John R. Malicky** - 995 Shadycrest Road - Pittsburgh, PA 15216-3023

Yes, it's that fun time again when your mailbox says, "Open me and see what surprises there are for you", hi! All signers sent to Wayne. Now starting in the present and moving backwards beginning with a friendly v/l on January 23 from the Lyndon LaRouche-owned stations (see Issue 13, page 12), WIRI-1520 Brunswick, MD, with no mention of the group, but did say, "What a fantastic hobby to have!" Next, the mystery station some members thought, coming in nightly here past midnight until WHLO stayed on, with NPR jazz and classical music, WOI-640 Ames, Iowa (State U.) who sent a v/q and 2 days later, a coffee mug on the 19th! A bonus day on the 9th as 3 v/l arrived including "660 in Dixie" WESC-AM/FM Greenville, SC as I caught them on 12-15-86 for a solid half-hour at 3:45 pm, so the signer said, "I only wish we could equip our entire listening audience with Superadio II's". Hello, G. E. Salespeople - hi! Also, WBOB-1360 Galeax, southwest VA as the signer is a former Pittsburgher mentioning they're on PSSA 2 hours after sunset and is the only station in a 40-mile radius not playing country and/or bluegrass with many promotions, a quality operation.

A December logging of WHVL-1600 NC netted a v/l and info with that ID, but in an envelope with the new call, WIZQ, on the 7th. Finally, on 1-8, a new catch on 12-13 at 5:15 pm, v/. and package came from WHEB-750 Portsmouth, NH who notes from 6 am powers of 16.5-3.2 watts to Atlanta sunrise. In 1986 on December 26, a v/l from WYNN-540 Florence, SC, stated my reception of them on 12-7 and 8 after 1 am came while on a night power of 166.2 watts, but the long-distance record for hearing them, "along with a copy of a recent letter is from one of your fellow radio club members, Ernest Cooper!" How 'bout that! Hey, Ernie, you paying them to promote you? Hi! A profile sheet mentions WYNN "represents one of the most amazing broadcasting success stories in the country", earning the reputation as "The Giant Killer", ranking 3rd out of 22 area stations beating out 14 of 16 FM's, 7 of which are 100 kW! 12-24 saw a v/l from CJFT-530 ON stating they use a Nautel transmitter from Nova Scotia and 2 of the night towers of CJRN's 12-tower array. A 2 am catch on 11-17 and v/l on 12-15 from KWMT-540 Ft. Dodge, IA mentions this occurred at 175 watts and their c/m lists a 6-state daytime area (A very conservative estimate -pls) (5 kW) and a comparable signal would need 219 kW at 1100 kHz and 2,400 kW at 1600 kHz! A puzzling return on 12-6 came from WZAM-1110 Norfolk, VA with a c/m profile and religious song sheet, but no verie! (CNI)

**Ollie Alm** - Tja"derva"gen 6A - S-871 00 - Ha"rno"sand, Sweden

Since my picture was published in #17 I think I should also introduce myself. I am 44 and single. I have a well-paid job translating patent documents from GG/EE/FF into Swedish. I do this at home with no fixed office hours to attend to, the ideal situation for a DX'er! I started DX'ing in 1955, and have been more or less active ever since. I concentrate on MW/SW AM DX'ing, but the exact preferences have varied throughout the years. At present they are North America and East Asia on MW. Before that I concentrated on Latin America for a few years, etc. I am very QSL minded, counting verified stations/countries only. Since 1970 I have been a WRTM co-editor. My present responsibilities in this regard are North American commercial stations (including AK/HI/PR), USSR/China/Taiwan home services, Japan commercial stations, and finally the North American table section. The information provided by DX'ers worldwide (including NRC members) is invaluable in this work.

I started off with an antique MW only receiver, which I purchased at the equivalent of 50 cents in 1955! Two more domestic sets followed before I could afford a communications set (TRIO ER202). After that followed a Drake SPR4, a Drake RR2 (not a good receiver), a Drake R7 and finally a modified JRC NRD-515. All three Drakes are still in my possession but have to stand aside for the NRD. Antennas locally are 180/180/270 meters with another 350-meter one temporarily down. Best listening recently has been on DXpeditions, though.

Some verified station totals (no call changes counted): Continental USA, 192; Alaska 23; Hawaii 15; Canada 175 (all CCB only); China PRC 37 (MW+SW, 30 replies direct); Japan 42 (MW+SW); India 50 (MW+SW); all Central and South America 415 (MW+SW); Spain 110. Latest QSL's are KCOL-1410 ltr, KUAI-720 QSL card, NHK Okayama 1386, KDIG-670, WXXI-1370. KDIG told me that the KSDP-840 outlet has only one person on location and mostly relays KDIG by satellite. KSDP is 250 W only, and has no broadcasts on Sat/Sun. Other interests: For many years I was an avid stamp collector but have given that up. Instead I have taken up

photography and send my own personal pictures with my reception reports. I also write some articles for a prestigious Swedish satirical magazine (and the Hagar Svensson spoof last April).

Just recently received the Feb. 3 DX News and noticed a few comments in the Musings section regarding declining NRC membership. I would like to submit a long overdue Muse, especially since this has been a tremendous TA season and to advise other midwest DX'ers on what TA's to look for. Presently, I am DX'ing with a Panasonic B300 and using a Mark Connelly modified Palomar loop and AP73 amplifier. The B300 has to be one of the best portable rx's for MW DX and can compare favorably with an HQ-180 and is far easier to carry around. M. C. modifies the Palomar Loop by adding an additional amplifier, high/low Q switch, adjustable Q pot, adjustable gainpot. I would like to get Mark to ask Radio West to modify these loops for other DX'ers. His time is very limited and I consider myself fortunate to have another modified Palomar Loop, and DX'ers should be extremely grateful for what he has done to the hobby.

1985 (?? -pls) TA's were limited to the Iberian Peninsula: Lisbon-666, Seville-684, Spain-774, Murcia-855, Lisbon-1035, Morocco-1044. These TA's and the regular Senegal-765 were heard well into April. This year I have finally heard a few other TA's that used to be semi-regular back in the early '70's. These include France-1207, -1554, W. Germany-1593, Monte Carlo-1467, Albania-1215, -1395. Two-693, RAI-846, Algerian het especially strong but no audio, what appears to be a het on 882, 1503 het. Yugoslavia-1134 was very good this night. I thought I would try to get RTE-567 Ireland and was not able to hear its s/on at 12:30 am but at 12:57 RTE came in with typical Irish music and EE rx which surfaced at 1:03 and YL anncr following some beautiful violin music. This was taped and am anxiously waiting to get this TA verified. To hear Yugoslavia-1134, Algeria-891, Ireland-567 in a month can be extremely invigorating. To John Herman in Vinita, OK: you should be able to hear some of these TA's with your R388 RW Loop.

I just read Andy Rugg's Musing re DX on "third-level" radios and I hope you won't mind if I make some rather belated comments on the subject. (Not at all! -pls)
