On June 9th, the 2nd session of the ITl's Regional Administrative Radio Conference ended in Rio de Janeiro with an agreement to open the $1605-1705 \mathrm{kHz}$ band to AM broadcasting starting July 1, 1990 . This band is now matnly used for radiolocation,
aeronautical navigation, cordless phones, remote broadcast auxilaries, and fixed and mobile services. In the United States, $1605-1615 \mathrm{kHz}$ is used for Travelers Information Stations (TIS).

After the re-allocation takes effect, fixed and mobile stations will still be allowed to operate between 1625 and 1705 kHz outside the US, but broadcasters will have priority in the choice of frequencies throughout the Western Hemisphere. Radiolocation beacons can also continue operating in that band on a secondary (noninter1984, so these are already headed toward extinction. The US presented no proposals at the conference for reassigning TIS stations, regarding this as a wholly domestic issue. The Rio meeting set technical criteria for band-sharing among the various authorized services, which we haven't seen yet.
The conference gave individual countries substantial leeway in deciding how these new broadcasting channels are to be used. Anticipating this, even before the conference ended the FCC issued a Notice of Inquiry to solicit comments on whether to treat
the new allocation like the existing AM band, or "adopt a system of fering substantially less governmental oversight..., to offer new and novel services and promote diversity and distribution of radio services in a different way."
Specifically, the FCC is considering offering nationwide licenses on up to 9 of the 10 new channels. These would not be like the old "clear channel" stations, since pow-
er would be limited to 10 KW or less (or 1 KW equivalent at borders with other couner would be limited . Instead, licensees could decide for themselves how many stations to put on "their" channel and where to locate them. To provide as much flexibility as possible, national licensees would probably be exempt from the Commission's limits on the number national licensees would probably be exempt from the commission's inits on the

The FCC also has some novel ideas about dealing with co-channel interference in the new band - through station-to-station negotiations and the "operation of the marketplace": "there may be public interest advantages in permitting licensees to decide on
the level of interference to be accepted." As for TIS stations, the Commission suggests moving the ones now using 1610 kHz up to 1700 kHz .

The deadline for filing public comments in Gen. Docket 84-467 (regulation of broadcasting in the $1605-1705 \mathrm{kHz}$ band) was July llth. Reply comments are due by July 26th. Considering the complexity of the issues raised by the Commission, the comment period may be extended. In any event, an Inquiry is just a first step, a wet
finger raised in the breeze. Actual rule-making is further down the rad, so if any of you wants to have a say in the use of the new band, you' 11 have a chance later.

（Editor＇s note：John Malicky prepared the following WGSA profile as a result of his pilgrimage accross the Keystone State to the Wilmington Convention．

WGSA Radio is Ephrata＇s first radio station，having signed on the air on July 26，1955．Mr．Samuel Youse originally owned the station，and was its operator for some 29 years．，from 44 Bethany Road，Ephrata．WGSA－FM
began broadcasting in November，1962．Today，the FM carries the call WIOV．In the fall of 1964，Mr．Youse sold both stations，as he decided to retire fram the hectic world of broadcasting．Brill Media，of Evansville，Indiana，purchased WIOV，and Joel Michaels Media，Inc． obtained WGSA．In March，1986，WGSA moved its entire operation from ethany Road to the renovated Mentzner building．The signal is is beamed 16 degrees north of true west to protect WSSJ，in Camden，N．J．The station operates with 5000 watts of power．

WGSA carries an adult contemporary format with emphasis on local， as well as regional and national news，community information，fanm news，and sports．Farm news comes through Agrinet programs，and local Ag－updates air eight times daily．Sports coverage includes the play－by－play of the Philadelphi
Eagles and Penn State teams．Central Pennsylvanians are informed of driving onditions during both AM and PM drive times from the Traffax Camand Cent The news and information，as well as the music stops，on Sunday mornings from 6：AM to Noon，when religion is aired．

WGSA is unique in that its offices and studios are in a most interesting ouilding．Constructed in 1889，the Mentzer Building is an exceptionally sophisticate and nearly intact Queen Ann cammercial and office building．，standing at the its prominant site represents the siovificance of the Mentzer family，who had lomg been instrumertal in tite ewonnic growth of the area，operating a cigar manufactory as well as being involved in the coming of ageof Ephrata as a small regional market，with its shops bringing the wondors of the late 19th century consumer age to the town．The building is very significant as a＂small town skyscraper＂that describes the archictectural sophistication available in

[^0]Six California quakes，and one in extrene northern Mexico，of 4.0 or greater from June 10 to July 1 combined with very large deviation averages over most of that period have supplied a שood opportunity to look for cor－
relation patterns．Some of the apparent deviations loged here in Missouri were as high as 8 khz．，wiht many at 5 and 6 Khz ．These were verified by a second radio set up to automatically mechanically scan one station＇s sienal on a 24 hour basis and feeding a chart recorder．

Several conclusions have been reached．
First is that the time lag average of 6.36 days between high deviations here and a quake（over 3．0）on the West Coast seems to have changed to 3.5 to 4 days for these seven quakes，and timing must be figured from the high point
of deviations rather than the drop－off point．This makes it much more dif－ ficult to decide whether a local quake is going to occur or whether deviations are going to drop off here and be followed by a quake westward．And since monitoring of 17 stations is usually done only two or three times daily，with a 12 hour overnight gap，the potential warning time for California would be cut by a critical half day．

Secondly，the lag tine for extreme southern California and northern Mexico seems to be about one cay longer than for the Los Angeles to San Francisco area．Since no quakes have recently occurred north of the latter，I can only guess that the same might apply there．

Third，the possible accuracy of such predictions，due to insufficient data it in a class similar to the U．S．Weather Bureau，and which，I am told，is not sufficient to be accepted by the scietific community．This is a good thing， that science should only accopt very solid evidence．But without better means of investigation，the better evidence will never exist（nor can the relation－ ship between the phenomena and quakes be disproved）．
Meanwhile， 18 months have supplied evidence of an amazing correlation of As of now this phenomena seems to be limited to this area certain rules the extent found here．The actual extent of the local area may be loo miles wide and 200 ：liles long，but the time and means to investigate this have not been available．
There may be，and probably are，other such＂sensitive＂areas in the country． And it is definite，from some reports received，that areas over some inactive quake faults are either not＂sensitive＂or are＂mildly sensitive＂．This of supposed inaccuracies of high grade digital readout receivers，it seems safe to assume that many areas are either slightly＂sensitive＂or sometimes ＂sensitive＂．

Mention should be made of an interesting discovery with automatic mechanical monitoring（＂fanning＂of the dial very slowly across a station＇s frequency）． The chart recorder shows an unusual pattern or disturbance of the signal curve for a short period on the side of the peak toward which the signal is deviating the pattern is sometimes centered on the peak，but usually is non－existent． Now，thanks to a suggestion by Mike Medeke，it has been discovered that null directions（when a ferrite core coil radio is rotated）are ridiculously distorted here－some as much as 30 degrees－on deviating signais．What this discovery will mean is anybody＇s guess．It could be a vital clue－and it i added evidence that something peculiar is going on here．It will be pursued with what means are available

WINE-940, in Brookfield, CT, is now programming oldies all the time. Its primary rival WLAD-800 has had a mostly oldies format for a while, with Ridgefield's WREF progranming misic of the big band era. Not much of a musical AM selection in northern fairfield County, CT. That is one of the problems living in the shaoow of the Big Apple, just 65 miles away. FM'ers clearly hold the edge in this, as well as other, parts of the country. My only real programing complaint with area local stations, both AM and EM, is their sparse news departments. They do an outstanding job of informing the public during hazardous weather conditions and local anergencies but fall down drastically covering routine (if there can be such a thing) news. Many listeners have told me that they honestly believe that the local stations pick up a copy of the morning newspaper and react accordingly. While this is a bit harsh, the time value factor is certainly a difficult one for local stations with
understaffed news departments and small budgets to combat.

In this part of connecticut many small towns utilize the town meeting form of government. Local issues, such as taxes and other voting issues, are important but rarely reported in time-valued manner. Many stations go with syndicated or network programs during The bigger, regional stations totally ignore local happenings, unless it's negative, a murder or major accident. What a shame. The results of elections or cormunity votes are muknown to area residents until the morning, despite the fact that the polls closed the previous evening. Some area residents have even formed telephone trees to get the word out to interested parties. (!!!! -pls) What a sad commentary. The local FM sisters of these stations have little news time allocated. The local hardrocker probably figures that kids don't want it, as it breaks up their continuity, and the beautiful music probably rationalizes the same way. (The same problems exist all over the country, too. News coverage is expensive in radio -pls)

As Mike and Sue 's tenure as editors of DX News comes to an end, I would like to thank them for all of their hard work on behalf of the NRC. I would also like to thank Paul for his editorship of the Musings of the Members column these past years. I feel that the fine line he has walked proviouing the members with a vehicle to share thoughts and information, without the personal attacks and non-related garbage of years ago, has done a lot to enhance the quality of the column.
