LICENSE PULLED FOR DRUG CONVICTION

FCC revokes license of Kingstree, S.C., AM for majority owner's drug conviction; owner says ex post facto ruling is unfair

seph Chachkin has revoked the license of WKSP(AM) Kingstree, S.C., citing the 1987 drug-trafficking conviction of the station's principal owner, Gregory Knop.

Knop, who along with other family members acquired the now dark AM daytimer in 1979 for \$200,000, was arrested on federal trafficking charges in August 1987. Three months later, he pleaded guilty to one count of consoiracv to distribute cocaine and was sentenced to five years in prison,

Now unemployed and living in Myrtle Beach, S.C., the 45-year-old Knop told BROADCASTING he intends to appeal the judge's revocation order at the FCC. Having little money, he added, he will act as his own attorney

In finding Knop unfit to hold a broadcast license, Chachkin also cited Knop for "lack of candor" and violation of full disclosure rules in failing to report the drug conviction in a 1987 application for a new FM station in Kingstree.

The FCC, by a 5-0 vote, began a revocation hearing against Knop in September 1989. At the same time, it stated convictions for drug trafficking would be potentially disqualifying. The agency maintained it was "clarifying," not modifying, its so-called character poli-

Knop admits (and is contrite for) his involvement in drug trafficking-"I did what I did"-but believes the FCC treated him "unfairly." More than two years after he was arrested, he said, the FCC expanded the scope of misconduct that could result in revocation or nonrenewal of a license to include drug con-

In deciding to go after his license due to the drug conviction, Knop said, the FCC was responding to mounting political pressure to take a hard line against drug users and traffickers. 'For Ithe FCC] not to take a stand would have been politically dangerous," the said. "For it to take a stand after the fact was unfair to me.

All broadcasters should be alarmed by the FCC willingness to take away licenses, he said. His case "sets a dangerous precedent," he said Broadcasters convicted of drunk driving or income tax evasion could find their licenses in jeop-

Knop also complained the loss of the

CC Administrative Law Judge Jo- + license would unjustly hurt the owners of the stations-his wife, mother and sister-in-law-who were not involved in his drug activity. "I don't think it's fair they put everybody else's head in the same noose with me," he said.

If anything, Knop said, the FCC should have ordered him to divest his interest, which amounted to 51% at the time of his arrest. "Why hurt the other stockholders who had nothing to do with

And contrary to the judge's finding, Knop said, he was "very open and candid' in his FM application. According to Knop and the FCC record, he noted in the application that he had been convicted of a nonbroadcast-related felony and was willing to supply details upon re-

Lending some credence to Knop's charge that the FCC changed the rules of the game is the fact that the FCC renewed the license for WKSP in 1988, even though Knop listed on the renewal application the unspecified felony con-

Knop has acknowledged he was arrested a second time on drug charges in Myrtle Beach by Horry county police on Oct. 17, 1989, just two days after being released from a halfway house in Wilmington, S.C. Knop entered the halfway house August 1989 after serving 17 months of his five-year sentence at a minimum security prism at Maxwell Air Force Base in Montgomusy, Ala.

Following his arrest, he said, he was jailed in Horry county until officials dismissed the charges on Jan. 23, 1990. "The charges were baseless," he said, declining elaboration.

However, because he was still on probation, upon his release from the Horry county jail he was incarcerated at a federal prison in Atlanta while federal officials investigated the new charges. He was fimally freed, again on probation, on May 30, 1990.

After his release, he got a job selling ads for WSMN###) Georgetown, S.C., but left the station in November. When the station went into bankruptcy, the receiver brought in a new management team, and Knop said he no longer felt welcome. "They wanted to do their own thing.

Barry Brown, the current manager of the station, confirmed that Knop had worked there until November, but would not comment on the circumstances of his departure

While he was in jail. Knop said, his brother Allyn took over management of the station and, in November 1989, was forced to shut it down due to the same financial troubles that Knop has said led him to become involved in drug traffick-

Knop said he hopes to pay off back county taxes on the station facilities and sell them to repay creditors. In addition to \$75,000 for the original note, he said, he owes "less than \$20.000

Knop, who said he worked in Chicago in the 1970's as an engineer at CBS's WBBM-OM-FM-TV Chicago and as a helicopter traffic reporter-pilot before setting out on his own in Kingstree, is eager to resume work in broadcasting as either a reporter or salesman "I have a tremendous amount of experience." he said -



WIL-AM Switches Its Name To WRTH

SOME AM listeners were confrused last week when they thought they had tuned in to WIL-AM (1430) only to hear the deejays say that they were listening to WRTH. "I thought I had lost my mind," said a reader who listens to WIL and was a fan of the old WRTH-AM.

WIL-AM changed its call letters to WRTH last week. General manager Dick Williams said the station had been contemplating changing the call letters back in the summer when the AM station dropped the country music format in favor of hits from the 1940s, '50s and '60s by singers such as Frank Sinatra, Johnny Mathis and Barbra Streisand.

The new format was similar to the format that made WRTH a popular station years ago, Williams said. "But first of all I have to tell you that any time you have a set of call letters like WIL that have been on the air since 1922, you think long and hard before you change them."

The FM station (92.3) will retain the WIL call-letters.

Like most things in the radio business, changing call letters is not so simple as announcing it over the airwaves. The WIL situation was certainly no exception.

Usually it is pretty easy to get the Ferral Communications Commission to OK a change in call letters provided that nobody else has them. In this case, a small station owner in Maine had obtained rights to the call letters and planned someday, to get a St. Louis AM station and revive WRTH under its old format.

Williams said that when the FCC informed station owners that the rights to the call letters belonged to someone alse, they promptly struck a deal with the Maine operator.

"We paid him to give the call letters back to the FCC. We wanted those call letters." Williams said. "They are synonymous in St. Louis with the kind of music that we will be playing."

What's Wrong with Present-Day Loop Antennas... Dallas Lankford

@ March, 1991

The purpose of this article is to discuse what's wrong with present day loop antennas, and to suggest some solutions for those problems.

There are often several reasons why a given loop antenna does not perform well, but the most frequent problem for amplified loops is excessive amplifier gain. I don't know why so many bxers believe that wore gain is better. Excessive signal input to a receiver has only one effect, and that is bad - the dynamic range of the receiving system is degraded. Also, high gain amplifiers frequently have poor dynamic range; they are often the cause of spurious responses such as intermodulation distortion products and cross modulation.

When Gordon Nelson introduced his 4 foot square, balanced, tiltable, amplified, air core loop in the 1960's, it was not optimized for strong signal handling performance. This should not be taken as a criticism of his pioneering work. After all, concepts like dynamic range and 3rd order intercept had not yet been defined, and DXers were generally not familiar with the negative effects of excessively high signals.

A 4 foot square loop is too large. Most DXers do not have room for such a large loop, and it is not easy to construct a 4 foot square loop which is mechanically stable. The are Nelson used also has too much gain. Nelson himself mentioned cross modulation problems with his loop and amp. Other DXers developed scaled down versions of his loop, but excessive amp gain has remained a common problem.

The first balanced, tiltable, air core loop I built was 2 feet square, inspired mainly by Russell Edutuds' NRC loop and Ralph Sanserino's loop (RRCA reprint AB). It is still my main air core loop antenna. However, the first amp I built was long ago tossed in the circular file. Subsequently, I must have built just about every loop amp ever published. They all had too much gain for a 2 foot air core loop, and they all suffered from spurious responses and other problems related to excessive signal levels.

Perhaps it is appropriate to remark here that no single loop antenna is optimal for all receivers and all locations. For some receivers, like the NG-180(A), an unamplified, 2 foor, air core loop is sufficient. For others, like the R-390A, 51J-4, and HQ-150, a low gain amp is needed for adequate signal levels with a 2 foor, air core loop. And for some recent solid state receivers with desensitized MM bands, still more gain is required. In addition, the minimum ambdent background noise is an important factor in determining how much loop amp gain is needed. For example, a DXer in a large urban area will usually have higher power line and other man-made noise than a DXer in a small town or rural location. Consequently, a less than optimal loop antenna is generally satisfactory for an urban DXer.

It doesn't make any sense to use a high performance loop antenna for MW DXing unless you use it with a high performance MW receiver. So the following discussion about loop antennas is concerned mainly with loop antennas for use with an R-3964, 51J-4, HQ-180(A), or HQ-150. The loop antennas I will describe may also work well with other receivers, but I make no claims in that regard. Many recent top of the line solid state receivers, such as the R-71A, R-5000, and BRD-525, are either insensitive throughout the MW band (they are deliberately designed that way), or emit digital display noise in the MW band, or both. I have been told that it is possible to use one of these MW RFI emitters with a loop antenna by separating the receiver and loop antenna, but I cannot guarantee that.


If you aren't inclined to build a rather large and complicated air core loop antenna, there is a much easier way to get a small and very good loop antenna. Buy the Radio West "Great Little Loop" and modify the amp for reduced gain. This loop has been around in various forms for many years, and is built by Ralph Sanserino. The amp used in these loops is a balanced differential amp which Ralph told me he obtained from John Kolb in late 1970 or early 1971; see Figure 1 below.

I first saw this amp about 1980 in IRCA reprint A8, a description of a balanced, tiltable, amplified, 2 foot square, air core loop written by Ralph. A few years later I tried the amp with my 2 foot air core loop, but like all the other amps I tried, it had way too much gain for a 2 foot air core loop. Through correspondence with Paul Kowalski I learned that the same amp was used with Ralph's ferrite rod loops, so eventually I tried it with some ferrite rod loops I prototyped. The map gain was too much even for the lower signal levels developed by the ferrite rod loop coil. Moreover, I recently discovered that amp gain can be reduced by reducing the values of the load resistors R4 and R5. With lower gain the overall performance was much better—less amp noise, fewer and weaker spurious responses, clearer split reception, and so on.

After considerable listening tests with different values for R4 and R5, the optimal value of R4 and R5 was found to be about 470 ohms for the following three types of ferrite rod configurations; see Figure 2 below. One loop consisted of a four rod bundle with two rods end to end and the other two rods stacked in the middle. The rods were 8" long, 3/8" diameter, 125 permeability. The A rod bundle was wound with 24 turns of Teflon insulated #22 tinned stranded wire, center tapped, close spaced, at the center of the bundle. A second loop consisted of seven rods of the same kind, bundled together without overlapping, and had a 26 turn coil. A third loop used a Space Magnet rod which is 12" long by 9/16" diameter, 400 permeability. The


DIFFERENTIAL BALANCED



coil was 30 turns. Signal levels with all three loops was about the same. A smaller single rod or fewer bundled rods are not recommended because sensitivity of the antenna would be reduced.

After discovering how to reduce the gain of the amp, I turned my attention to the remaining two problems with this amp — amp noise, and spurious responses. With the original 4.7 K load resistore, amp noise was quite obvious as 10 dB or more carrier meter indication on an R-390A with the receiver tuned to an empty spot above or below the MW band and the loop detuned to the opposite end of the MW band. Some improvement in amp noise was obtained by hand selecting Ql for minimum noise, but 3 or 4 dB noise remained despite my best efforts. Spurious responses were minimized by "matching" Ql and Q2 in the sense that they were hand selected for nearly as possible (within 2 %) equal drain voltages. However, some spurious responses remained. The remaining spurious responses were found to be 2nd order IMD products, and were generated by both pairs of MW

signals and pairs of SW signals. Not entirely by accident (while testing a differential amp designed and developed in UK by Trevor Brook and Dave Porter) I discovered that amp noise could be further reduced (to 0 neter indication on an R-390A) by changing the FET load circuit, and that spurious responses could be further reduced by increasing the source resistor R3 from 1 K to 4.7 K. My final circuit is shown in Figure 3 below.

In addition to the load circuit and source resistor changes, you will observe several other changes from the original circuit. First, the two band tuning via switched C2 has been replaced with single band tuning by deleting C2 and replacing C1 with a 660 pF air variable. I have also specified the main tuning capacitor C1 as straight line frequency. Second, the 100 K gate resistors R1 and R2 are not optional for this circuit. Without the gate resistors R1 and R2 the Q of the tuned circuit is considerably higher, so high that signals may be distorted unless they are tuned precisely. With R1 and R2 the Q is lowered and audio quality is improved. Also, the lower Q reduces amp gain by maybe 4 to 6 dB, which lowers 2nd order IMD products by about 8 to 12 dB.


As before, resistors R4 and R5 are the load resistors, and they determine the gain of the amp. The maximum gain of the amp occurs when R4 and R5 are about 2.2 K, so there is no point in using larger resistors. Maximum gain should be used with the ferrite rod loops discussed above. I have also used the amp with a one foot air core loop, 20 turns, 1/4" spacing between turns. In that case the load resistors R4 and R5 should be 470 ohms. However, I do not recommend using the amp with a one foot air core loop because weak 2nd order IMD products were observed at the threshold of detectability on nights with strong signals (loop tuned to my super local, and R-390A tuned through the 480 - 520 KHz range with the BFO on). The only amplified air core loop I have used which is completely free of IMD products is my 2 foot air core loop with high dynamic range balun amp. I will discuss a 2 foot air core loop, baluns, and a high dynamic range amp in a future article.

With a 660 pF air variable capacitor the tuning range can be adjusted for at least 500 KHz to 2000 KHz. This is more than is needed for tuning the MW band, even with the upcoming frequency changes. So a smaller capacitor can be used. For example, Ralph uses a Mouser two section poly film variable capacitor with both sections wired in parallel for a maximum capacitance of 532 pF. But I like to use the old style metal frame air variables both for aesthetic reasons and because the mechanical rigidity is needed for stable operation with my phasing units. I also use air variable capacitors with a straight line or semi-straight line frequency. The shaft of these capacitors does not pass through the center of the metal plates, but is offset to one side, with teardrop plates for straight line frequency, and semicircle plates fo semi-straight line frequency. With these capacitors the tuning is not squeezed together at the high frequency end of the tuning range. And I use a Jackson Brothers dual speed planetary drive, 6:1/30:1, for loops which I plan to use with a phasing unit because the extremely low tuning rate is needed for phase adjustments to generate cardioid null patterns. If you do not plan to use the loop with phasing units, no tuning reduction is needed. The 660 pF value is not critical. You could use both sections of a two section 365 pF air variable, which would give a maximum capacitance of 730 pF.

The 2N3819 FETs are currently available at Radio Shack, as are MPF102s which work equally well. If you use MPF102s, be sure to observe that the pin out (G,S,D) is different than the 2N3819s. The JB dual speed drive is available from Radiokit for (gasp!) \$18.00. Their catalog is \$1, and their address is P.O. Box 973, Pelham, NH 03076. Other parts (metal boxes, 9 volt battery holders, etc.) are available from Radiokit and suppliers like Mouser. You can get a Mouser catalog by calling their toll-free number (800) 992-9943 if you live in the continental USA. For Alaska, Hawaii, Canada, and Puerts Rico call (800) 346-6873. With prices like \$28.75 for Radiokit's two section 365 pF air variable (and I don't even know if it is semistraight line frequency), one is inclined to shop around for less expensive parts. One of the nicest 660 pF air variables I have found recently is available from Antique Electrionic Supply, 6221 S. Maple Ave., Tempe, AZ 85283. The capacitor, catalog number CV-240, is a dual section 320/345 pF, priced at \$4.65 each plus shipping. I believe the AES catalog is free. If you buy some of these capacitors, you will need to remove the old dried out grease with a suitable solvent and regrease the bearings because the original grease is so dry that shaft rotation is stiff and bumpy.

High Dynamic Range Balun Loops ... Dallas Lankford



This article is a continuation of my previous article, "What's Wrong With Present Day Loop Antennas." In that article I pointed out that the main problems were excessive amplifier gain, usually accompanied by spurious responses, and amplifier noise. The improved version of Ralph Sanserino's balanced differential amp which I presented in that article is excellent for use with ferrite rod loop antennas, and very nearly solves those problems completely. For DXers in large urban areas with high ambient noise levels, one of the amplified ferrite rod loop antennas I described in my previous article is more than adequate for their needs, provided it is used with a top-of-the-line tube receiver such as an HQ-180(A) or R-390A in good operating condition. But for some of us who are fortunate to have occasional low levels of power line and other manmade noise, a well designed 2 foot sir core loop antenns will sometimes produce audible signals where these kinds of amplified ferrite rod loop antenns will not. It may be that small feerite rod loops are inherently less sensitive than a 2 foot air core loop, or it may be that balanced differential amp noise limits their sensitivity. In any case, I have concluded that a 2 foot air core loop is the best starting point for a high performance MW loop antenna.

As I said in my previous article, no single loop antenna is ideal for use with all receivers. For example, a 2 foot unamplified air core loop is sensitive enough and provides adequate signal levels for an RQ-180(A). In fact, it is ideal for an RQ-180(A). An amplifier would not improve sensitivity; it would merely degrade the dynamic range of the receiving system. For other receivers, such as an R-390A, 51J-4, or HQ-150, the signal levels produced by an unamplified 2 foot air core loop antenna are not sufficient. Perhaps a larger air core loop, say 4 feet square, would provide adequate signal levels for these receivers. But as I said in my previous article, most DXers do not have adequate space for a 4 foot square air core loop, and mechanical stability becomes a problem for such large loops. A better solution is to use a low gain, high dynamic range amplifier with a 2 foot air core loop.

In this article I will describe a balanced 2 foot square air core loop in several versions for use with the receivers mentioned above. First, I will describe the loop with balanced feed lines for use with an HQ-180(A). Next, I will describe the loop with s balan (BALanced to UNbalanced transformer) so that the loop can be connected to an HQ-180(A) with a single unbalanced feed line. Finally, I will describe the loop with a low gain, high dynamic range amplifier which makes the 2 foot air core loop ideal for use with an R-390A, 51J-4, or HQ-180(A) curiously, the amplified version has virtually no gain when used with an HQ-180(A), and so the amplified version can be used with all these fine receivers.

In my opinion, loop antennas should be balanced because balanced loops have deeper nulls than unbalanced loops, which makes them better for nulling local noise sources or strong interfering stations. The simplest way to connect a balanced air core loop to an HQ-180(A) is by direct coupling with balanced taps; see Fig. 1 below.



An HQ-180(A) has two A terminals and a G terminal on a rear chassis terminal strip. When the shorting link between the G terminal and the adjacent A terminal is opened, the antenna input terminals are configured for balanced input. With a 14 turn loop coil, which is typical for 2 foot air core loops, the coil taps should be one turn each side of center tap. In this case, the taps provide an impedance transformation of 49:1. Taking 240K ohms as the impedance of a tuned circuit at resonance, a source impedance of 4.9K ohms is presented to the HQ-180(A) antenna input terminals. Theoretically, this is not a good

impedance match. According to the HQ-180(A) manual, the antenna trimmer can be used to match antenna impedances between 50 and 600 ohms. However, as I will explain below, a better match does not increase signal levels or improve sensitivity.

While enough details will be given for an experienced builder to duplicate my circuits, it is not my intention to make this a step-by-step construction article. If you are not an experienced loop builder, but would still like to try building one of these loops, get the NRC Antenna Reference Manuals and Ralph Sanserino's IRCA reprint A8, and study how loop antennas are built. It is unlikely that you will copy any of those designs exactly because your loop frame will be determined to some extent by locally available construction materials.

My loop coil L is 14 turns, center tapped, of #18 stranded bare copper wire, 7 strands of #22, which was obtained by stripping the insulation from some Radio Shack speaker wire. The 7x22 speaker wire does not seem to have a fixed Radio Shack catalog number, but my friendly Radio Shack salesman stripped about an inch off the end of a 50 foot spool and let me count strands. I do not recommend other kinds of wire because I have found that the 7x22 has the best balance of strength, rigidity, and flexibility. Currently I am using 11/16" spacing between turns with a 1-3/4" gap between the two 7 turn halves of the loop coil. The 1-3/4" gap is due to my use of 2 by 2 fir (actual dimensions 1-3/4" by 1-3/4") for the loop cross arms and a metal box containing the tuning capacitor C mounted on a cross arm below the bottom loop coil support; see Fig. 2 below.




The upper and lower frequency limits of the tuning range are determined by the air variable capacitor capacitance range and by the spacing between turns. In my previous article I recommended a 660 pF air variable, and discussed several sources. In that article I neglected to mention that if the capacitor has trimmers, the trimmers should either be removed (the best approach) or at least set for minimum capacitance. Otherwise, the minimum capacitance of your air variable capacitor may be rather high, which would restrict the tuning range. With 11/16" spacing between turns, 1-3/4" gap between 7 turn halves, and a 600 pF air variable, the tuning range is from just below 540 KHz to beyond 2000 KHz for the circuit of Fig. 1. With the amplified version which I will describe below, the tuning sange is about 510 KHz to 2050 KHz. I did not have a 660pF air variable capacitor when I built my original loop, so the tuning range is not quite as wide as I would like. My design target was at least 500 KPZ - 2000 KHz. That is why I Terommend a 660pF capacitor for the main tuning capacitor. With narrower spacing between turns, the high end frequency 11m1t is lower -- about 1925 KHz for 1/2" spacing, and about 1750 KHz for 1/4" spacing. The narrower spacings also lower the low end

frequency limit (to well below 500 KHz for the amplified version). I don't recommend spacing between turns wider than 11/16" because that is about the widest spacing possible with 12" coil supports, and wider coil supports might present rigidity problems.


I used 12" wide by 4" high pieces of 3/16" thich plexigless for my loop coil supports. A better choice would have been 1/4" thick plexigless, at least for the bottom support, because when tension is applied to the coil with spreaders, the bottom loop coil support flexes slightly. Spreaders are desirable because they apply tension to the #18 stranded wire which helps maintain uniform spacing between turns and a rigid geometry for the turns. I used 12" long pieces of 2 by 1/2 fir (actual dimensions 1-1/2" by 3/8"), and threaded the spacers between alternate turns of the loop coil; see Fig. 3 below. The plans for "The N.R.C. Two-Foot Loop" specify 3/4" wide spreaders, but I found 1-1/2" wide spreaders a better choice.



As shown in Fig. 1 the tuning capacitor C is mounted inside a metal box. This is not recessary for the unamplified version. In my experience nulls are about as good with a simple "open sir" mounting arrangement as with a metal box. However, the box does protect the capacitor from dust and from damage by accidental contact. If the capacitor is mounted in a metal box, it must be insulated from ground, and the tuning knob should be isolated from the tuning knob with an insulated coupler such as a Millen #39002. Shortcuts like using a short length of 1/4" wood dowell are acceptable for prototyping loops, but they don't hold up well under heavy use. The coax for connecting the loop to the receiver may be RG-58 (my choice), RG-59, miniature coax, or even audig coax: Wires entering and exiting the box may be implemented with grommet lined holes, or with insulated feedthroughs (H. H. Smith #955G or #9555) and connectors (RCA, BNC, or SO-239). I like Smith #9550 feedthroughs and BNC connectors.

To make tuning easier, I recommend a 6:1 planetary reduction drive. If you plan to use the loop as part of a phased array for generating cardioid patterns, you should use the amplified version below with a dual speed 6:1/30:1 Jackson Brothers planetary drive.

As I said above, the output impedance of the loop of Fig. 1 is not well matched to the input impedance of an HQ-180(A). A better impedance match is obtained by using a balun; see Fig. 4 below. The balun T of Fig. 4 is a 4:1 balanced to unbalanced broadband transformer. With the 4:1 balun, the 4-9K ohms source impedance of the taps is transformed into a 1.25K ohms source impedance. However, there is little, if any, difference between the 5-meter readings for the two methods of feed. Apparently any loss due to mismatch in the balanced feed of Fig. 1 is offset by the higher voltage levels of Fig. 1. The only advantage of the unbalanced feed circuit of Fig. 4 is that it permits the use of a connector (PL-259, or BNC with a BNC to PL-259 adapter) for connecting the coax to the HQ-180(A).



The balun T of Fig. 4 is 70 bifilar turns of #30 enameled copper wire on an Amidon FT-82-61 ferrite toroid core. This is not an off-the-shelf item. You will have to wind the balun yourself. Take two 8 foot lengths of #30 enameled copper wire, twist the two lengths together, about 4 twists per inch, and start winding. It is somewhat like sewing. The 70 bifilar turns are close spaced, and will just barely fit, covering the entire toroid. The exact number of turns is not critical. With close spaced turns, which means the turns touch each other on the inside

circumference of the toroid, you will be within a few turns of 70 turns when the toroid is completely covered.

As with Fig. 1, the circuit of Fig. 4 may be mounted "open air" or the capacitor and toroid may be mounted in a metal box. And as before, the nulls of the open air version of Fig. 4 are about as good as with the metal box mounting arrangement. In Fig. 4 I have shown the coax attached to the A and G terminals on the HQ-180(A) chassis rear. Alternately, you may use a PL-259 connector and attach to the SO-239 socket on the HQ-180(A) chassis rear. In both cases, be sure that the shorting link is connected to the adjacent A terminal.

The 2 foot, unamplified, air core loops I have described are ideal for use with an HQ-180(A). Unfortunately, the signal levels are not quite adequate for an R-390A, 5JJ-4, or HQ-150 if (and only if) you occasionally have very low levels of power line and other man-made noise. In that case, some (but not much) amplification is needed. After extensive testing over several years, I have arrived at the amplifier design shown in Fig. 5 below.


Before I discuss the amplifier, let me belabor the point I have made repeatedly in this article and the previous article. Excessive signal levels do nothing but degrade the dynamic range of a receiving system, which may make it more difficult to hear the DX you want to hear. At my location, for a foreign split to be audible with my amplified loop or 80 foot inverted L, the signal level must be at least 30 dB and usually more like 40 dB on the R-390A carrier meter. The signal levels with one of the unamplified loops I have described are typically about 15 dB lower than with the amplified version when used with an R-390A, so a split becomes audible when it reaches 15 to 30 dB on the R-390A carrier meter. That is plenty of signal. Virtually any foreign split I can hear on my R-390A with the amplified loop can be heard equally well with the unamplified version of Fig. 4. The only exception might be Senegal on 765 KHz at local sunset which tends to have lower signal levels, but I have never made a comparison to find out. For DXers in large urban areas with high power locals, one of the unamplified versions may be a better choice for the following reasons. Because they have no amplifier, the unamplified versions have theoretically infinite dynamic range and no spurious responses. Any spurious responses you hear with the unamplified versions originate in your receiver or elsewhere. If you are plagued by powerful locals, one of the unamplified versions may actually improve the performance of your receiver. Here is how. In theory the 3rd order IMD products of any amplifier increase or decrease 3 times as fast as the fundamental signals increase or decrease, and the 2nd order products increase or decrease 2 times as fast. Consequently, in theory the 3rd order IMD products should be about 45 dB lower and the 2nd order IMD products should be about 30 dB lower when using one of the unamplified loops I have described as compared to the amplified version below. The only cases where the amplified version is need with an R-390A are for sunrise DXing, daytime DXing, sunset DXing, and when using the loop as part of a phased antenna system.

The amplifier is based on designs discussed in A. Burwasser's November 1979 Ham Radio article, "How to design broadband JFET amplifiers to provide top performance from VLF to over 100 MRz," pages 12 - 18. The amplifiers discussed in that article are growned gate amplifiers which have low input impedance, low gain, and high 2nd and 3rd order intercepts (typically 35 dBm and 25 dBm respectively). Their only disadvantage is that the source is usually biassed for rather high current drain, typically 18 mÅ, which eats up batteries quickly. The drain current is determined by resistor R of Fig. 5. The article above contained no information on how a lower drain current would effect the 2nd and 3rd order intercepts. So I spent a lot of time listening with different values of R. I observed no spurious responses with values of R as high as 470 ohms (which corresponds to 5 mA current drain). I recommend escinst lower drain currents (higher values of R) because a Siliconix data book shows that the noise figure for grounded gate U-310 amps begins to increase as drain currents fall below 5 mÅ. There is only one super local at my location, so it is possible that some spurious responses would be experienced in urban areas with several super-locals. I suggest that you start with R=470 ohms and use a lower value of R (higher drain current) only if spurious responses are observed.

Transformer Tl is a 4:1 broadband below which converts the balanced and rather high impedance of the loop coil taps to an unbelanced and lower impedance. Up to this point, the circuit is identical to the circuit of Fig. 4. Transformer T2 is a 4:1 broadband transformer which converts the impedance to a still lower value, about 312 ohms assuming 240K ohms for the

impedance of a tuned circuit at resonance. The 100 μ R choke and 180 pF capacitor following T2 are artifacts from a previous design of mine and are supposed to function as a 3 MHz cutoff low pass filter. The 180 pF capacitor seem to have little or no effect in the circuit of Fig. 5, and so could be omitted. The 100 μ H choke should not be omitted because it seems to reduce amplifier noise. The ferrite bead on the U-310 drain lead is to suppress VHF parasitic oscillation which sometimes occurs in broadband JFET grounded gate amps. The output is coupled to the receiver through a 4:1 broadband transformer.

The gain of the amp depends on the load it sees. For example, a receiver with a 50 ohm antenna input impedance presents 200 ohms as a drain load for the U-310. In theory, the voltage gain equals the power gain for this amp, and both are equal to $\mathbb{R}_L/\mathbb{R}_{11}$ where \mathbb{R}_L is the load resistance and \mathbb{R}_{11} is the resistive component of the U-310 input impedance. Taking 10,000 micromhos as the nominal transconductance of a U-310, it can be shown that the input impedance is approximately 100 ohms. Thus when this amp is used with a receiver having a 50 ohm antenna input impedance, the voltage gain is 2, or 6 dB. For an R-390A the nominal antenna input impedance is 125 ohms, so we would expect about 14 dB gain. This is in good agreement with the observed gain when the amp is used with an R-390A.

Curiously, as I mentioned before, the amp has virtually no gain when used with an HQ-180(A). By this I mean that signal levels with the amplified version of the loop are at most maybe 3 dB greater than with the unamplified version when they are used with an HQ-180(A). I do not consider this to be a problem, but rather an advantage because the amplified version of my loop works equally well with all of the top MW tube receivers - HQ-180(A), R-390A, 51J-4, HQ-150.

For best performance, I recommend that the amplifier and tuning capacitor be enclosed in metal box.

Information and advice of interest to inexperienced DX'ers

This is the first of a series intended to help the beginning DXer. The concept is not new. Similar columns have been done before, but as people continue to take up the hobby, the idea needs to be rejuvenated occasionally.

This column has two editors; Mike Hawk and Jack Woods. Mike is a young person, an active DXer, and relatively new to Dxing. He has a beginning DXer's viewpoint and fresh memories of problems encountered. Jack has a technical background and has been DXing in Alaska and Oregon for about 25 years. The editors will divide the ongoing workload of the column as follows: Mike will be contact man for the readers. He will receive the questions, comments, and other correspondence. Jack will type up the column.

The column will be a combination of questions and answers, and written articles.

Questions will be welcome. They should pertain to the basics of medium-wave DXing. Questions which the editors believe are more appropriate for "The Answer Man" column will be forwarded to R.J. Edmunds. The names of the persons who submit the questions will not be published. Some questions may be published for answering by the members.

Mention of a commercial product in the column will not imply endorsement of the product. The editors won't give opinions on the merits of any product, but may refer the reader to existing product reviews.

Remember, the sole purpose of the column is to help novice DXers to enjoy the hobby. The column format is subject to change. Readers' constructive comments will be welcome.

Let's start this series with some thoughts on radio frequency noise. RF noise is a continual and perhaps increasing problem for nearly all DXers.

RF noise is caused by a great number of voltage fluctuations, both natural and man-made, present at the receiver input. Some noise is generated within the receiver itself. It is obvious that noise sets the lower limit on which stations can be heard. Station signals below the noise level are covered by noise and cannot be identified regardless of how sensitive the receiver is. If it were not for noise, almost any weak signal could be amplified to a useable level by designing adequate gain into the receiver.

Just how much of a problem is noise? Obviously it varies with time of day and place to place. Estimates of magnitude vary but are surprisingly high. In his article "Noise Levels and Useable Receiver Sensitivity" (available as an NRC reprint), Hutton says that it is improbable that we would ever need sensitivity in a medium-wave receiver below 20 microvolts.

Cosmic, or galactic noise arrives from space. It is sometimes known as cosmic hiss. Thermal agitation noise results from small voltages caused by the random motion of free electrons in a conductor and is proportional to the temperature of the conductor. Antennas at usual temperatures generate thermal agitation noise in addition to whatever signals they pick up. The forgoing are present at broadcast band frequencies but are usually masked by atmospheric noise and electrical noise. Atmospheric noise (for the most part static caused by lightning) is certainly significant at some times of the year in much of North America. Electrical noise is the dominant noise most of the time except in remote areas away from power lines. It is also the kind we can do something about. Electrical noise is caused by man-made devices, including TV sets, light dimmers, power lines, fluorescent lights, automobile ignition, etc.

What measures can we take to reduce the effects of noise? Measures include the obvious action of simply turning off the offending device, and also the selection of antennas and receivers.

The loop antenna is the type most used by medium-wave DXers. Inspection of the credits at the end of the DDXD columns will verify this. The loop antenna will pick up less local noise than a longwire antenna, for equal desired signal pickup. Its directive response can be used to null a local noise source, such as a power line. When tuned to a desired signal it will

discriminate against noise and other spurious signals. Construction of an effective loop antenna is not particularly difficult.

Let's digress here and consider the reference material available from the NRC Publications Center. The Product Catalog lists a wealth of DXing information in the form of booklets and reprints. Prices are nominal. The material has been contributed by NRC members over the years and includes articles on antenna types and construction, receiver performance and comparisons, and many other subjects. If you don't have the catalog, send \$1.00 to the Publications Center. The mailing address is on the back cover of DX News

The horizontal sweep circuits of TV sets generate noise throughout the medium-wave band. It shows up at 15.75 kHz intervals. It is more of a problem with older sets. The noise is radiated by the set itself and by the signal input cable and power cord. Ferrite beads and toroids can be easily installed to reduce radiation from the power cord and signal cable. Whether the noise reduction in any particular installation is worthwhile can only be determined by trial and error. A free catalog and RFI tip sheet can be had from Palomar Engineers , Box 455, Escondido, CA 92033.

Electric light dimmers are a common source of noise which shows up as a loud buzz throughout the band. Dimmer switches which contain interference-suppressing circuitry are available at small extra cost. When buying a dimmer look for words such as "with RFI suppression" on the package.

Overhead power lines can generate noise due to defective insulators, transformers, connections, etc. Prompt repairs by the power company may result if they are told where a trouble source is. Therefore, some detective work in the neighborhood with a portable receiver may be time well spent. Some street lighting systems use photocell units to switch individual lights on at dusk. Those units when defective can generate high amplitude noise. If the noise starts about dusk, look for a light fixture with reduced brilliance or which does not come on at all.

Some ideas on choosing a receiver will be the subject of a future article.

A word of explanation from the editor - actually two. For those of you who regularly follow this irregular feature in DX News, you'll notice that only onehalf of the normal column is here. I have not received an update for the period of "Prior to Jan 1, 1960" since December 6, 1989 (for 1230). Therefore, no changes. So what was...is. I understand that those who currently hold a place on the GYDXA lineup for that period deserve to be mentioned. But considering the space constraints of DX News, I am not going to print up the "Pre-1960" loggings for submission until I get some updates. Possibly some of the new members have Graveyard loggings which surpass those in the record books. If anyone would care to see the "Pre-1960" lists, send me an SASE with 75¢ worth of stamps affixed (naturally more to Canada and abroad), and I'll send you a personal copy of all six lists. Number two item ... a number of the mileages seen here will differ, some greatly, from the last printing. Here's why. I have a set of the FCC Database containing exact geographic coordinates of transmitter locations for all stations. Slowly, but surely, I've been updating my mileage computing program with the new data, and recomputing a great number of records. Those records of stations I found with little (less than 5 minutes of latitude or longitude) difference, I left as is. Several were 10-15 miles away from previous data, and a couple as far as 20. As I've always used "best data available", say the city center (coordinates from an atlas) or an airport nearby, and the transmitter was on the outskirts of town or on the other side of the city from the airport, these locations have changed most. Some of the previous record-holders have gained mileage; some lost a few miles. But rest assured, the distances are more accurate than ever before. And, as time permits, all frequencies will be "fixed" with the new data included in the computations. So, here we go...enjoy...and hope to hear from some new Graveyard DXers!

Answers to members' questions, from the basic to the technical

Greetings again' At long last, the Answerman column is back, in between a fair bit of travel here. First off, we'll address some "old business", hi.

ANSWER: I have received several comments regarding the question posed last time about the antenna jack on the Realistic DX-440, which is, I am told, virtually the same receiver as the Sangean ATS-803A. The answers I received were about 50/50 as to whether or not this jack is for SW only. I don't know how to respond further at this point, nor do I wish to further an open debate on the subject. I would therefore recommend that you write directly to the manufacturer on this, and, if you get a reply, I'd appreciate seeing a CODY.

QUESTION: I recently purchased an ICOM R71A receiver. I am having a problem of sideband splash. I live about two air miles from the heart of New York City. Will a good loop help with this problem?

ANSWER: You bet ' Any received would have that problem in that location. I would suggest that you first try an unamplified loop, as the use of a high-gain amplifier could cause other problems which could offset the benefits of the loop. If the receiver has not be aligned recently (or, if

you're not sure) that would help also, as would the addition of mechanical filters, however that is neither an easy nor inexpensive route. The loop should help, and there are several designs in the NRC Antenna Manual, Yolumes 1 & Z, available from NRC Publications.

QUESTION: Why, when conditions are severely auroral, do I pick up not only deep south stations, but a lot of CW signals and other noise that sounds like every IV set in the house is on at the same time? I use an NRD-525 W/ a 2 Sanserino loop, but I also hear this stuff on my 450 LW. When the auroral cx subside, these problems go away also.

ANSWER: The reason that the southern stations predominate during auroral cx is that the closer, stronger signals from the northern stations are absorbed, leaving the field clearer for the weaker, more distant stations. Accepting that premise, it stands to reason that, in the absence of the strongest skywave signals because of absorption, and the concurrent absorption of the skywave components of other stations where only groundwave is now heard, the residual noise level which is propagated via groundwave electrical wiring locally would be enhanced. In your location, within groundwave distance of all sorts of government

installations, CW spurs, harmonics and/or subharmonics would be included. The TVI and other electrical noises are, of course, common in many locations. The loop should outperform the longwire as far as locally-generated electrical noise, unless it's actually getting into your receiver via the power lines. The signals etc. which are externally generated should show little difference between antennas, other than directionality.

QUESTION: I am in possession of a McIntosh program called "DX Helper" which calculates Maximum Usable Frequencies (MUFs) anywhere in the world based on the Solar Flux numbers. What is the relationship between MUFs and BCB DX ? Can I somehow use the program for BCB ?

ANSWER: I've seen something about this package (which is available in other than Mac as well) somewhere recently, but I'm not sure what or where - probably in Popular Communications, but I can't remember how it works. Generally speaking, however, the MUF never gets down as far as the BCB, and, if it did, it would mean that signals above that frequency would be so heavily absorbed that there'd be little left. I'll see if I can dig up anything more, and perhaps we'll get an assist from one of our other readers as well.

QUESTION: For BCB DX I use a McKay-Dymak DA-7 amplified loop. This has metal casing on 3 sides. The top and ends are covered by an aesthetic panel. I have opened up the box and inserted aluminum foil behind the end panels, leaving only the tog open. and have seen improved directivity as a result. I have noticed, however, that the Great Little Loop, the Shotgun Loop and the Palomar Loop are all totally unshielded. Would I be better off removing all of the shielding on the DA-7 ? What are the benefits and drawbacks of this shielding ?

ANSWER: For starters, the designed purpose for the DA-7 is different from that of the others. The DA-7 is not specifically a DX antenna. It was originally designed for use in the broadcast industry, for monitoring stations with high fidelity over moderate distances. Therefore, 1'm not surprised to see such differences. The fact that you've achieved greater directivity (I would guess that this results in a tighter pattern) from your modification is a plus for BCB DX, and indicates that on the DA-7 at least, removal of the shielding might further degrade directivity. I'd leave well enough alone there. Your antenna, as modified, strongly resembles the Worcester Space Magnet series antennas in terms of shielding now. Without knowing the various design elements of all of these antennas, i'd not be able to state with accuracy how features of one might work on another.

QUESTION: I use an Autek QF-1 audio processor. It consists of a notch filter, a peak filter, and a lowpass filter. Only one of these can be used at any one time. Each is tuned by two knobs, Frequency and Selectivity, For spoken word. I have considerably more trouble getting a good peak. Where, in the spectrum of sound, does the human voice lie? How should I set this unit to maximize its voicepeaking capabilities ?

ANSWER: The GF-1 is primarily designed for SW use, although it is usable on BCB. A filter of this type is primarily designed to work on CW signals, heterodynes and the like, as opposed to voice. Second, as you peak any variable selectivity device, you automatically degrade the audio quality of it, making it sound more "tinny" owing to the fact that the sharper the peak, the narrower the band passed is. I'm not saying that what you're looking for can't be accomplished, but you probably won't be able to achieve really high quality. You will need a peak less than maximum, and you can safely cut off down to about 5000 Hz on voice without losing much. My high school physics seems to have fallen out of the memory banks as to just what the actual numbers are, and there's a good degree of variance between the male and female voice. My experience indicates that different people prefer noticeably different audio characteristics for DX'ing, and I'd recommend that you set the lowpass filter up for your preferences by ear, and adjust for the particular vocal characteristics you're hearing individually. It's not a short-cut, unfortunately.

QUESTION: Sometimes there is a heterodyne near a weak signal. Would it be useful to use two audio processors in series, one to notch out the het and the other to peak the

ANSWER: It may be, but it may also not be necessary. Referring to the previous/ discussion, you may find. depending upon the frequency of the heterodyne, that you can do both with the same processor, using the lowpass filter. If your receiver has a crystal notch filter or a Qmultiplier built in, gither of these could be used to notch out the heterodyne, leaving the audio processor to take care of peaking the voice. Remember that as you add more circuits into the audio line, you also add loss and noise. I think that the combination of a receiver with a crystal filter and/or Q-multiplier. along with a variable bandpass audio filter (generally available at amateur radio flea markets or in

other places where surplus receivers can be found) is a better setup, but of course that's because I've been working with such a combination for over twenty years, hi.

QUESTION: I have an ICOM R70, and a Radio West Ferrite Loop w/ 2-FET preamp. Short of encasing the R70 in lead, is there a way to eliminate the noise from the digital readout ? While I can mull it to some extent, it does limit the directivity of the loop. The 1900 cable to the rx is shielded coax, 6 feet long. I try to keep the loop and rx separated by the full six feet. It does help some, but the hash is Still there, and the operation is a bit awkward.

ANSWER: See what high-tech does, hi. All I can suggest is trying longer coax. Granted there will be a tradeoff in unwanted vertical pickup from the feedline, as well as marginal losses, your individual circumstances may permit a longer line, but of course, that makes things weree in the awkwardness department. Perhaps another reader will have some further suggestions. I'm not familiar enough with the receiver to know how well shielded the digital readout is.

QUESTION: My truck radio 585ms good enough for DX when the engine is off. but the shielding isn't too great when it's on. What can I do here ?

ANSWER: First, try exchanging your sparkplugs for a low-noise variety. Next, low-noise distributor cables can be purchased either from many dealers, or, thru many larger auto supply houses. J. C. Whitney darries them, for sure. Keep the engine welltuned, and keep the points clean. If all of that's not good enough, try re-positioning your antenna to the rear of the vehicle if it's not there already. If the antenna must stay in front, try re-routing the antenna of players who are unable to cable away from the engine compartment Wherever possible. If you have one of those built-in =indshield-imbedded antehna5. disconnect it and use a rear-mounted whip instead. Finally, try a noise filter in the power line to your radio. These are available from many amateur radio suppliers.

DUESTION: I've read some fine reports in DX NEWS by members using the Kowalski loop. I know that it is no longer available, but can I somehow reproduce it ?

ANSWER: Have I got news for you! You can build it exactly, if you choose. Simply order NMC Reprint # A-41 from NRC Fublications. That is the original construction article for the Kowalski loop.

QUESTION: whatever became of Allied Radio and Lafayette Radio ? Are they still in business ?

ANSWER: Lafayette went out about ten years ago. I don't beireve that Allied is around either, although I'm not sure when they did. Changes in technology, marketing, and consumer habits were to blame.

QUESTION: I'd like to build James Hagan's Large Aperture Ferrite Core Loop Antenna. The 42" ferrite core is made up of seven 12" by 0.6" rods- I have been unable to find any. Amidon Associates' largest rod is 7.5" by 0.5", and are \$15 each. Can I order the 12" rods direct from Japan, or from a North American supplier?

ANSWER: Per the author, the original rods were imported exclusively from Japan by Joe Worcester of Space Magnet antenna fame. I don't know if anyone else is now importing them, but perhaps someone out there knows-An acceptable substitute would be the Amidon rods, however yes will require more turns on each toll to achieve the desired effects. Since Jim hasn't tried these, he can't provide any specifics here-

First, thank you to all who wrote to tell me how much you enjoyed the CKLW profile. I am glad that you did - CKLW was indeed an unusual station. The next profile you see will be the last for a while, UNLESS you send me some Profiles of your favorite station. I do want to do profiles on WRHC-1550, Coral Gables, and transmitter in the middle of Biscayne Bay, KICY-850, Nome (my first verie, but I got it in Fairbanks, not in CT!!!!), CJMR-1320 (they use 13 towers), with its compendium of rock, religion, and local news, CIAO-790 which lives on ethnic programming, and KIEV-870, Glendale, as well as any others which you can suggest. There is a station on 1230, I believe, that is in a small town at 12,000 feet elevation, somewhere in Colorado. Also would like to do WCHB-1200, in Taylor, MI, which is allegedly 50,000 watts with 17 towers, WNZK, in the same area as WCHB, which operates on 680/690, WJR with quite a history, and KTNN-660, a Navajo station. Other suggestions???

Jim Guthrie writes from Los Angeles that KIEV-870, Glendale is now running CNN Headline News between brokered talk shows. Also, KIEV has laid off half of the staff. 

... To start off this edition, a confirmation of scretning waters nave long suspected - in 42p of the stations visited, Ab. power patterns were operating out of licensed tolerances, and 18% of AM's checked were operating over or unuer licensed power. This from MC reports for 1990 ... Saying that it isn't "economically viable as a satellite-delivered format", Unistar will no longer carry Music of Your Life as of April 15. LUYL was originated at station what in springfield had by Al ham in 1978. ham is reportedly reviewing options to keep the format available ... As noted elsewhere previously in this magazine, we've lost two very Dkable Ak's recently in WPkW 1460 manassas VA and WheB 750 Portsmouth NH. As for 'hkw, it's been speculated that it's multi-acre 5-tower former transmitter site will be sold, being in a prime location adjacent to an IBW facility in a fast growing area. kegarding 'HEB, Norman Knight, chairman of hnight quality stations, cited as his reasons for shutting the AM/Fm combo down as the troubled New England economy, and nigh construction costs for the FM's new 500' tower. he also claimed that protecting wSb on the 750 clear channel limited to too great an extent the Alm's alotted air time, allowing wHEb-AM to operate only between atlanta sunrise and sunset. White-Alk signed on in 1932... 1,646. That's the grand total of new commercial Ab. & FM stations on the air since the FCC passed Docket 80-90 in

1984. It breaks down to 1,327 FB's and 319 al.'s. Those numbers from a survey done by the M Street Journel. More #'s to confuse you there are 4,582 Fh.'s actually on the air this week, compared with 1984 when there were around 3,250. That comes out to 41% more commercial Fh.'s on the air in '91 than in '84. Al's also went up. though, as expected, by much less. Ab.'s clock in at 4,686 in '84, compared to 5,005 in '91... And lastly, the FCC is trying once again to dispel a rumor that has persisted for 16 years - that they are considering banning religious programming. The story begins in 1974 when a petition, kk-2493, was filed seeking a freeze on applications by religious institutions for radio or TV channel use. The FCC dismissed the petition the following year. and that was the end of the issue. Unfortunately for the FCC. rumors continue to circulate that they are considering a religious program ban, and they continue to receive as many as 83,000 letters a month concerning the imagined "ban." The problem with inquiries has become so pervasive that the FCC now has a phone number those with questions on kM-2493 can call. The phone number is the latest attempt to quell the rumors; in the past the rCC has issued a public notice on the subject, and aid stories in Tv Guide and Time, hoping to get the message out. For whatever reason, it's turning out to be the runor that simply refuses to die.....
