1010 WERQ MD BALTIMORE - 12/28 1642 poor but alone in CFRB null with UC/rap and non-ID: Happy holidays from Baltimore's new 92-Q; ex: WYST; MD #65 (REH-ON)

1070 WIBC IN INDIANAPOLIS - several reporters have noted that the Log says their night power is 250 watts, but I'll bet it's 10000, as it has been for decades [Ed.-CA]

1090.7v WJBW FL CANTONMENT - 12/21 1705 at last, enough audio to ID this guy that I'd been chasing for the past two weeks; het started at 0745 SRS and stopped at 1745 SSS (in December); frequency has

been varying from 400 Hz to 1 kHz high of 1090; finally noted with 40s thru 60s NOS and non-ID as WKGT is 105-FM and FM-105 is WKGT; never did hear AM CLs but at least now I know where this one is located; is WJBW correct call or are they still WRBK? (REH-ON) [follow-up received same day! - Ed.] I finally got past the station's FAX machine and talked to a real person who confirmed WJBW is correct call and WRBK is a thing of the past; also want to thank Gerry Thomas of Pensacola for his help; still noted off frequency as of 12/29 (REH-ON)

1230 WODE PA EASTON - is now simulcasting w/WODE-FM, with oldies format; non-IDing as Oldies 99 (RJE-PA)

1250 WQXA PA YORK - 12/29 1400 with UC, simulcasting FM; ex:WXKU/WNOW (DS-DE)

1300 WJFKMD BALTIMORE - 12/30 1549 good with 106.7 FM and 1300 AM WJFK ID and traffic report; if I understand this arrangement correctly, the FM, which has a Fairfax, Virginia address, is simulcasting in Baltimore on 1300 while a Fairfax AM sits on 1310; strange . . . (MJ-MI)

1520 WVOI OH TOLEDO - is JK-VA's unID of 11/16; they're UC and use The Blend slogan; hrd here now and then at night (TS-MI)

GEOCLOK - A second look

GEOCLOK system, Version 4.2. During the lag addition. time between submission and publication of that review, Version 4.3 was released, and, a customization of several of the GEOCLOK since publication, Version 4.4 was released. In that vein, here is a brief summary of the main features of these two releases, followed by some number of still-DX'able frequencies for me. The further comments on customization for BCB data files which mark the maps were altered to

Version 4.3 of the program added a number of new maps to the already good library. As noted before, not all of the maps are available with either the basic or the extended distribution of the program, but are available either from the originator or from his Bulletin Board. The main enhancement was the conversion of what had been an 18 page documentation file with an interactive on-line help/reference facility. This feature makes both initial start-up and subsequent customization much easier, as the topics are arranged in a map. hierarchical arrangement and easily accessed.

of orthographic maps and the program enhancements necessary to support their presentation. These maps present an outerspace view of the earth with several different focal points. As before, these are equipped with data files which mark and label a number of cities, and, again, these are able to be customized by the user. These maps do provide a certain amount of insight into such things as transpolar signal paths and such, but, unless one has a problem perceiving these from the existing world and polar projections in prior releases, the orthographic maps are a "nice-tohave" feature, but certainly neither a must nor a particularly practical feature for the BCB hobbyist. Over the past few months, I have worked on maps for use for targeting DX and likely sources of QRM for Sunrise/Sunset DX on a show call letters and frequency rather than city name (naturally, since most of the stations in question were not in cities contained in the program, it was necessary for me to do some manual work with the Atlas), and to then color code them between such things as heard and targets, and, within each, daytimers and fulltimers or extended daytimers (my jargon for lumping CH operations and those stations which have several months of extended PSSA's), and, finally, locals. I then prepared a color key to appear in a remote corner of each

Now that this is more-or-less completed Version 4.4 features the introduction of a set (realizing that nearly each DX session necessitates some change or other, and that each issue of DX News does the same), I am just beginning to use the variable time and date features in conjunction with the NRC Sunrise/Sunset maps (since I have yet to synchronize the FCC zones into the process in any automated fashion), to actually set about determining which months and/or days of those months may present the optimum conditions for reception of a given target station. Even absent this step, the much larger map sizes available on GEOCLOK as compared to the SR/SS maps has helped me to estimate some of this based on experience, and log a few new stations which might well have taken me longer otherwise.



"Right now we have 500 watts. and we expect shortly to have our application in to raise that to 1,000, or possibly 2,500."

The many areas that will not change much include a split country and gospel format, with the retention of the popular Shepard's Hour and Jack Mraz's daily community forum, local announcements and news, and a breakfast

In recent years the station has had financial problems, stemming mainly from inadequate advertising and community support.

But the Albrights hope experienced management will change that

Corkey says the station should be back on the air early this month, and he encourages groups to send in announcements of coming events. Listeners are asked to tune to 790 on the AM dial The new address and location is 208 N. Main Street, Ashland City, Tenn.

The phone number is 792-6789.

Fitchburg station goes off the air

FITCHBURG - WXLO-AM has gone off the air for good, laying off two of its four employees and transferring the other two to the station's sister station, WXLO-FM.

Jay Williams Jr., chief operating officer, said the station closed down at 5 p.m. Friday.

Williams blamed the shutdown

on "technology, the economy and advertiser resistance to older demographics." WXLO-AM had an older following for the Big Band format it used until recently.

Williams also told the Telegram & Gazette of Worcester that the station's demise was an example of "the general decline in AM radio."

WXLO-AM has been up for sale for more than a year, according to Broadcasting Unlimited of Wayland which owns both stations. (AP)

License renewal challenged

DERBY - The owner of WADS radio said last week the station is for sale, but a group of former employees has filed a challenge with the Federal Communications Commission to the station's license renew-

Marshall T. Smith, the station's former chief engineer, and the other former WADS employees submitted a lengthy brief to FCC officials in Washington listing several alleged violations, some of them substantive and some of them technical in nature.

A radio station's FCC license is considered its major asset, and it would be difficult to sell a station that does not have clear FCC approval to operate, sources said.

"WADS renewal application is pending, and a few informal objections have also been filed," said FCC spokesman Lawrence

FCC policy is not to comment on contested cases, Eads said. The station has continuing authority to operate while its re-

newal is pending, he said.

The FCC official said the agency has a large backlog of contested renewal applications, and he could not say Thursday when a decision might be imade on WADS' li-

Smith's group has cited several instances where they allege the station operated at daytime power levels of 1,000 watts at night, when its license requires it to cut power to as low as 40 watts.

They also claim that when Manuel B. Santos assumed sole ownership of the station from his partner Jack Silva, he violated FCC regulations by not reporting a shift of more than 20 percent in ownership.

Santos said Thursday he has been renting his facilities since August to independent programmers, who have been broadcasting Spanish-language music and talk

WADS suspended operations last May 20, 1991. It had been broadcasting in English, with an adult contemporary music format, from studios at 361 East Main

Santos has since relocated the studio to the station's transmitter site, on Great Hill

"I have no payroll and no overhead." he said, because the independent programmers sell their own advertising and give him a share of the revenues.

Operating an English-language station was 100 expensive, Santos said, because of the newscasters, disk jockeys, engineers, secretaries and receptionists that were

Remote broadcasts from area sports events, popular with listeners, were among the most expensive programs to produce,

But Jack Whitten, the program director when WADS went off the air last May, said

Santos gave up on the English-language programming too soon.

Listenership and ad revenue had dropped sharply when Santos and Silva switched WADS format to Portuguese soon after buying the station in 1988, but both were increasing after a switch back to English two years later. Whitten said.

Santos said there are 200,000 Hispanic residents in the area stretching from Waterbury to Bridgeport, which his station can

The station often simulcasts the programming of Naugatuck station WFNW, Santos said, and Mercedes Chinchilla is now the program director of both stations.

U.S. Census data show that the Hispanic population of the Naugatuck Valley doubled between 1980 and 1990, but that it is still only a

small segment of the overall population: 2.5 percent in Shelton, 1.3 percent in Seymour, 4.4 percent in Derby and 2.6 percent in Ansonia.

Santos would not comment on reports that he and Silva often argued loudly, and once actually fought in the studio while the station was on the air.

He said that Silva's name remains on the license, but that Silva did not invest 50 percent of the money for the partnership. Silva owns WACM, a Portu-

guese-language radio station in West Springfield, Mass. He could not be reached for comment eithe at the station or at his home

Santos said that Smith helper him prepare the license-renewal ap plication and submitted it late to

As an engineer, Smith said, preparing the documents was not par of his duty. "Looking back, I'm sorry I helped him," Smith said.

The station owner said he fired general manager B.J. Harvey in October 1990 because Harvey "was promoting himself."

Harvey said he was bringing the station back to popularity and profits during his five-month tenure, and that his problems with Santos stemmed from the owner's difficulty communicating in English.

But Santos said the biggest reason that WADS cannot operate profitably is the \$3,400 monthly rent it must pay for the four-acre transmitter site.

That is what is killing this station - the lease is too high," Santos said. "Is there gold in these

Radio days: how ceiling sparks led to a career

The 20th century came hurtling through time with its inventions, its artists and its Model T, while an unsuspecting child impressed hollows in a hay barn on the family farm and daydreamed for the

That farm on the lower South Side of Youngstown had sustained four generations of farmers, blacksmiths and carpenters for 100 years. Born there in 1900, that youngster, Warren P. Williamson Jr., would become the founder of WKBN Broadcasting Corp.

As a member of the Youngstown school board for 27 years, he would also become a sculptor of many of the city's schools.

With 91 years to his credit, Warren Jr. has weathered 23 presidential elections, two world wars and too many small ones. He's endured the Great Depression and multiple recessions. Yet in spite of change and because of it - he remains optimistic and adaptable.

Early years: Born in the horseand-buggy days at the brink of the electronic century, Williamson was a pioneer in the communications industry. As a child, he had a curiosity that danced with visions of electrons.

At 12, he had an interest in amateur radio that led him to "borrow" a spark coil from his neighbor's Ford for a transmitter

"Father found out where I got the coil and sent me off to straighten out my affairs," he recalls.

The first ham radio broadcasts issued from the Williamson home at 1840 Market St. When sparks began to fly from the ceiling light fix-ture, Warren Sr. banished his son's transmissions to the chicken coop.

"Mother thought I would electrocute myself," he said. But dots and dashes of light and transmissions of code continued to flash through the neighborhood.

Warren came of age encountering encoders, decoders, electron beams, laser light and satellites. Technology, however, surprised him only once.

Pardon me: Stationed in Pecos, Texas, during World War I, Williamson, 17, was a wireless operator with the Army Signal Corps. He was on duty one morning listening to code transmissions when a wom-

an's voice came over the air.
When she'd called her butcher to place her order, somehow the telephone lines and the radio transmissions created a fluke in the fre-

'That's the first voice I ever

heard on radio," he said. Home from the war, Williamson entered the broadcast business with partner Creed Chorpenning and ulterior motives. "I figured if people thought we could run a radio station, perhaps they'd let us fix their radios.'

In 1926, the first radio broadcast was beamed from Warren's house at 26 Auburndale. A few months later, the penniless partners moved the small studio to the YMCA and then ... well, you know the rest of the story.

Warren's sons, Warren III and Joseph D. II, continue to carry communication's technology toward the future

Reflections: Warren Jr. says he was too busy keeping up with technology to look over the hills to see where he was going. Retired, he takes time to reflect and to write the story of where he's been.

The times in which we live mold our lives. Warren shows us that the way we choose to live within those times shapes the life of the community in which we live.



I guess I qualify for the MUSING edition for 25 year members as I've been a member since April 1962 (whew! almost 30 years!). I own WRJM-1450 in Poquonock, watch for an upcoming test on a Saturday morning! There will be a prize for the best reception report received. In 10 years, the only report I've received is from KEN CHATTERTON and he has verification #1. I started DXing with a LW and a Heathkit GG-la 'Mohican', and the 1st station I 19gged was WNOR-1230 on 4/29/62. On 1/20/65, I traded the Mohican' for a new HQ180A and the 1st station I heard with it was WENE-1430. On 12/18/67, I started to keep totals and CJRW-1240 became my 292nd station heard and 232nd verified. On 9/22/77, I hought an Amelco R390A/URR and at that time I had heard 1108 stations with 969 verified. I've still got those receivers as well as an HO150 & another R390A. Totals today are 1326 heard and 1184 verified. I do not count call letter changes, I verify the facility. Through the years, I've done a column on Log Updaters, produced an NRC Domestic Log, and back in 76, took over the Membership function. I've worked with 4 different publishing committees in that time. I hosted the 75 convention in Windsor Locks and the 50th Anniversary Convention in Enfield, I may be bragging but it was the best convention I attended with WAYNE HEINEN's 1984 shindig at COLORADO SPRINGS giving me a run for the money. I also have an HO guage model railroad which covers a good deal of my cellar and while working on it, I've got the 390 or a TRF tuned somewhere in the hopes of hearing a new one. It's getting tougher & tougher to hear a new one, much less verify a station. I would like to once again THANK all the people who operate the NRC and only wish we had more contributors to DX NEWS. Only a small percentage of the 700 plus members contribute-just imagine what DX NEWS would be like if 10% more of the members joined in? Well, enough's enough, thanks DAVE (you banana!). DICK TRUAX - 3018 GUS EMMETT TRAIL - SELLERSBURG, IN 47172 Greetings from the Hoosier State! Note the change - I'm not in the Bluegrass state any longer, but I live about 10 miles N of Louisville in IN. Dave wanted to hear from 25 year members, so this should hit just about exactly 25 years from when I sent in my 1st MUSING! When I joined in 1967, ANers were a problem but MM's were still a window to DX with many ANers silent. I've logged Hawaii, Germany, BBC and countless low powered West Coast stations then that are all-butimpossible to hear. Needless to say, I haven't been up to DX on MM's for over 8 years. Due to recently relocating here from an apartment to a house in the country, my interest in DXing has been revitalized. Current equipment includes an HQ150, R390A & HQ180AX as well as a 2' box loop and a Radio West ferrite loop. I still need AK, VT, & ME to log all 50 states. Not to much recent DX to report, but 3 TIS stations in this area deserve mention. On 530, there is a TIS audfible within a 20 mile radius and in Frankfort, another TIS is audible u/Louisville most of the time at almost 40 miles distance. It gets out very well & has been heard 20 miles N of Louisville in IN also. A third TIS on 4610 is at the KY Horse Park just N of Lexington and is audible in a 15 mile radius, heard on frequent trips to Richmond, KY. That's about it from this end, more as it happens!

PETE TAYLOR - 2614 JACKSON STREET - SAN FRANCISCO, CA 94115-1123 A few words from another NRCer involved in the radio profession. My first involvement was with my neighbors mini-watt station WANR-690 (We Annoy Neighbors' Radios) in Coral Gables, FL where I grew up. His name, fittingly, was Fred Watts. I got a phono oscillator in 1950 and transmitted over that as WOTA-1180 (We're On The Air, obviously pre VOA). It finally fizzled out last year after 41 years. In prep school in Chattanooga, a technically-oriented fellow student built a transmitter using the oscillator as the foundation. This one was a good 5 or 6 watts but with no outside antenna, it didn't go too far. At Duke, as "WDUK, The Voice of House J" with a nice outside antenna, it got out guite well. The FCC heard it in Norfolk and sent a spotter truck to the campus, the occupants of which told the dean that it would be a good idea if I cooled it. The unit experienced a meltdown in 61 in Honolulu while I was driving around testing its range. I began my actual career in 9/56 as the AN DJ on the 'new' WOAM-560 Miami, the Todd Storz station which had just gone rock. After I got a shore job in Hawaii in the Coast Guard, I worked parttime at Kaiser's KHVH-1040 and then fulltime as Music Director when I left the service 1960-61. I came to SF in August 1962 and worked as DJ/Promotion Mgr at the old KPEN (now K101) and

then went back to work for Kaiser as PD/Operations Manager/DJ at KFOG which we

put on the air 3/1/63. In 11/66, Kaiser sent me to Boston as VP & GM to dismantle WXHR AM/FM (740/96.9), these reemerged as WCAS (Watertown-Cambridge-Arlington-Somerville) in 3/67 & WJIB in 9/67. WJIB was ultimately sold to GE & was the first FM to be sold for \$1 million or more. My final move was back to KFOG in 1970 as VP & GM. GE bought it in 1972 & I left in 1978 to form my own advertising an PR firm. As for NRC membership, when I was in Chattanooga, I wrote a dozen stations in ID, MT & WY asking them when they tested (I needed those states for the log). KTFI-1270 wrote back with info about the NRC in April 1951. As for other quirky things, a musical I was in at Duke was written by Nat Greenblatt (now Nat Lande) who ultimately married one of Bob Hope's daughters, and the play was directed by Larry Taishoff, son of Broadcasting magazine founder, the late Sol Taishoff. In real life, I married Kristine in 1978 and after tolerating my DXing during our honeymoon in NZ & Fiji (and everywhere else we have been) she has finally accepted the hobby as part of the package. Our 10 year old son John is already into amplifiers, tuners & mikes so he shou-1d be an NRCer some day. In other activity, I am currently president of the 500 member SF Rotary Club and will be at the Orlando convention in June. 73

I am 38, single & operate a commercial art-illustration outfit in my home. I am the sole employee and boss, which means I don't have to get up early and let my employees in. When the phone rings early, though, that's another matter. I have really not been doing much DXing at all since mid-November. Work has really been busy and there have been a lot of other things going on in my life. Also what DX I've been doing has been mostly on the FM side. I recently had a 110 khz filter installed in one of my Superadios to improve the selectiv-

ity of the FM. Wow, what a difference! AM has seemed for the most part rather auroral in nature this season. Over the Christmas week, I made a trip down to Baltimore's Inner Harbor again. I stayed at the downtown Holiday Inn where I had my small Sony pocket radio that I purchased at the NRC auction in Lima in 1987. Either AM CX were auroral from 12/27 thru 12/29 or I was experiencing the 'hotel effect'. I did note the local radio: the best run stations seem to be WCBM-680 & WBAL-1090 with their talk formats. I tuned in to the new WJFK-1300 and note that it is just a relay of the FM station. WCAO-600 booms in like a ton of bricks at the Inner Harbor. I remember 17 years ago when I lived a mile N of here that WCAO had quite a weak signal (new xmtr sight-DWS). WBGR-860 has religion and is extremely weak downtown, especially after the pattern change. Also, I was surprised at the incredibly weak signal from WMAL-630 at night, this despite the fact my hotel window faced towards Washington, DC. As far as DX from BAltimore, despite the horrible conditions, I managed to pull in a weak signal from CKLY-910. I thought by some oddity I might have been able to get Scranton here. I will check in again sometime in '92, especially if it is a slow year.

Also, WCCM is on fulltime now, with 500 watts at night. Actually, some of th Spanish programming is very good. I enjoy listening to WRCA-1330 during the day. IDing as Radiolandia, and Trece-treinta Super Stereo, they play a good mix of pop salsa & merengue, along with Cubanos big band classics and even an occasional tango. The international news is excellent. Radio Feriodico El Mundo news reports are heard every ½ hour with a full one hour report at noon. El Mundo is one of Boston's local Spanish newspapers. I've moved to a DXer friendly location in Nashua. Compared to my previous address, noise levels are way down. I've run a couple of 75 foot LW's out to a tall pine tree, supporting the far ends at about 40 & 50 feet above ground. The results have been impressive in the few days that the wires have been up.
