We've had a few members ask questions concerning the use of abbreviations, some editors unable to decipher the meanings of those sent by members, and some new members indicate that they had a hard time understanding the radio jargon used in DXN (oops, another abbreviation). For the past 10 years, I've been trying to cut down on the unnecessary use of abbreviations, and I would simply ask that members, when sending in reports, not use any but the most obvious shortened forms (see Bill Hale's legend on p. 10 for an idea of which forms to use). As this bulletin is not in Morse code, and as through the magic of electronic typesetting we can create more space by condensing type, there's really little need for very many shortened forms. The rule of thumb would be not to use an abbreviation in a report; let the editors abbreviate, if they need to condense. That way, DXN (sorry) will be understandable to all.

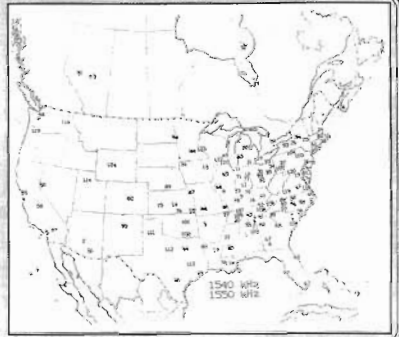

MEDIUM WAVE RAMBLINGS

- Shawn Axelrod reports that with a 4 kHz filter and a phase-locked AM (PLAM) board installed in his R-70, reception is improved tremendously. Signals are boosted (sometimes 2 to 3 S-Units) and the receiver locks onto the signal better.

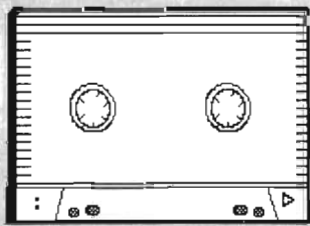

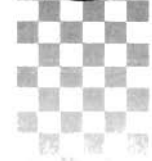

Changes in programming status; reported by listeners

Welcome to the late spring edition of Formats. Locally, grim forbodings in the AM market, as WQQW-1590, Waterbury is silent. This station, a Waterbury institution, has formatted over the years country music, rock, and most recently adult standards. It had sold its transmitter site just north of Waterbury, and was sharing the WWC0-1240 site just north of I-84 on the bank of the Naugatuck River in downtown Waterbury. In a curious arrangement, WQQW had put up two short unpainted towers, one on each side of the 400 foot high WWC0 antenna. Also locally, WICC-600, Fairfield Country's biggest full service station, in Bridgeport is now brokering the 7pm to 9pm hours at \$500 per hour. Down in New York, WNEW has dumped its news staff, and is taping all of its weekend programming, and according to New York Newsday and the Daily News may be sold to Salem Communications, and format religion. WQXR-1560, another New York mainstay is allegedly looking for a new format, and pre-teen programming is reported to be the leading contender, to replace the classical music simulcast with its FM.

Al Holtz, at Conrail in Philly advises that WNJR-1430, in Newark has been sold to Douglas Broadcasting of Palo Alto, CA for a reported \$6.1 million. The new owners have dumped the long time urban, gospel and jazz format in favor of brokered ethnic programming. WNJR has been the full service voice for North Jersey's huge Black population for the last 45 years, and has been bankrupt for the past eight years. So another long time, valuable part of the metro NY radio scene is gone.

Mike Hardester, of Jacksonville, NC notes that WLAS-910, silent for a year will return to the air with a news, sports, and talk format.

On the West Coast, Eric Norberg, of Portland, OR, sent a very ambitious Dial Scan. However, it needs formats. Eric notes that KPBS-1450 has been operated by the Portland School System for almost all of its 69 years. KPBS broadcasts from Benson High School, and the transmitter is right next to the school. He also notes that KKGR-1230, in suburban Gresham is temporarily silent.

George Santulli, of Leesburg, VA writes that Liz Roberts, a former NPR reporter has bought WTRI-1520, Brunswick, MD, and she is formatting mostly music from local artists. (Sort of a local voluntary rendition of the Canadian Content Law). However, she is interested in hearing from any of us as to suggestions for formats for a outer suburban AM daytime. Brunswick is about 35 miles from DC, at the end of the MARC commuter rail line. So do write her if you have ideas. Her address is Liz Roberts, Owner, WTRI Radio, Box 248, Brunswick, MD 21716. WTRI ran a DX test for you earlier in the year, so here is a chance to repay a big favor for a friend of the NRC.

Also from the mail, Rob Brazell likes the column, Ken Onyschuk has suggestions on how to standardize and further define the formats (as AM radio narrowcasts to the hilt!), and Dave Schmidt, the M Street Journal, first time contributor Don Trelford, and your editor have contributed to the column. Here we go!!

Sorry, this time I could not do my usual listening on the Holy Week. My mother-in-law died on the Tuesday evening of Holy Week so on Wednesday and the rest of the week, I had to attend to the burial and the fragile health of my wife, who had to be taken to the doctor, and then taken care of, in addition to work at home and my particular job, you can see that I had no time to listen. She is much better now. My few loggings have been sent to IDXD. I really enjoy listening those moments of the Holy Week when most of our stations are off, most of the people leave the city and it is almost empty, you may think it belongs to you as you can hardly see people on the street and the extraordinary stillness at night that you are surprised. Most of the frequencies on the dial were covered with Venezuelan stations which rarely sign off. I wanted to catch some Columbian & Central American stations late at night but nothing could be heard, I was not lucky with them. Maybe next time! 73

Well, it's the end of April and all the snow is gone and we hope it stays that way. It seemed to be quite a long winter but it was a good DX season here in Winnipeg and at Valhalla Beach. New countries such as Belize, Jamaica & New Zealand made the DX most pleasurable, even at -20 C. I have finished my latest project, a 4 foot box loop. It tunes from 510-1700 and has quite deep nulls. In fact, in the first few days of use, I managed 3 new stations including long sought Belize on 830. Nulling WCCO is no mean feat up here. I can also use all frequencies, even the adjacent channels next to our locals. CKCK & WTMJ are becoming pests on 620 when only a month ago they were DX. By using the S meter on my ICR70, I can create a null that will register between 20 & 40 db. I'm not sure that if it is great or not but it does the trick for me. By the way, this loop is an enlarged version of my 3 foot Don Momen designed loop. It is passive in nature and therefore uses no amplification. Also, the thing I really like is the fact that the loop, stand & rotating/tilting device combined only has 5 screws and 2 bolts. This simple but very effective design I feel contributes a large amount to why the loop works so well. With almost no metal involved, the loop maintains an excellent pattern and that translates into more signal to the radio. If it works well, I may have to consider a 5 foot version but that will mean a major re-do of the radio room so it will fit. As for now, I intend to use the 4 foot loop to its max. Next is a PLAM board for the ICR70. This will be a big boost to my DX. Any member with a R70 S/or R71 who want to boost their rigs performance, the PLAM board is the way to go. I used one at Valhalla Beach on LARRY SHEWCHUCK's R70 S was amazed at the way it worked. Further reports on the PLAM (Phase Locked AM) in the future after I give it a go.

MARK CONNELLY - 30 WILLIAM ROAD - BILLERICA, MA 01821-6079

WKPE-1170 is back after a temporary absence. Sometimes unmodulated carrier is noted, usually the contemporary hit programming // 104.7 FM is heard. On 4/18/92, I got together with JEAN BURNELL, BRUCE CONTI & TOM BEATON. The day's activities included demonstrations of DX-enhancers (MWOXS phaser, MMT2 tuner, RTL-1A remotely tuned loop) and the installation of a sloping antenna from the top of a 90' pine tree at Tom's Manchester, MA location. I used the bow S arrow method of putting up the sloper. I expect to do similar antenna work at Bruce's NH locale soon. Jean, Bruce & Tom are now phasing-unit equipped, also Jean has a DX440/MMT2/RTL1A set up for after work coastal DXpeditioning of the type I used to do in the late 70's/early 80's when I worked near the Boston waterfront. After spending part of the afternoon at Toms, we all headed over to Gloucester for a seafood dinner. This was followed by a sunset DXpedition to Granite Pier in Rockport, a site I've often used. We ran a DXing position in each of the 2 cars. DX440 receivers were used exclusively. The DX440 in my car was connected to the RTL1A loop phased against a homebrew remotely-tuned active whip with the DCP1 controller/phaser. The antenna set up going to Tom's car consisted of 2-100' LWs on the ground, these were phased with the MWOXS. The loop vs whip set up did a bit better for North Africa, SW Europe and Jean's NF 'home' stations, CHCM-740, CBT-540, CBN-640 & VOXM-590. Nulling WEEI to get VOXM was easy! Tom's phased wires set-up worked better to the Caribbean & S America. Conditions were slightly on the auroral side, mainland Europe were only represented by Spain & Portugal. The loudest TA's were from Algeria & Morocco. Egypt-1107 came in well, Azores/Canaries battled it out on 837 & WBSK/CKA0-1250 were loudly hetted by Mauritania-1349. Numerous Caribbean stations came in well, St. Lucia-840 (in Creole FF) had the best signal I've heard from it at a location other than Cape Cod. It was blowing WHAS away! Overall, I'd rate conditions as average for April, short-skip domestic noise worse than during the winter, TA signals not up to peak until an hour after sunset. Nonetheless, a good time was had by all 4 of the New England/Maritime Canada region DXers involved. Some of us heard new countries.

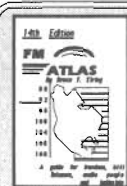
