- 960 WFGL MA Fitchburg: erroneously reported to have returned to the air this summer, this sulent station has announced they will return to the air on 9-23-94, hopefully our members in the area will let us know if this took place.
- 970 CKCH PQ Hull: station is SILENT and license has been DELETED. Rival network operators Telemedia and Radiomutuel have combined to form Radiomedia, luc and have turned in the licenses for one of their facilities in each market where there was a duplication due to the merger. Below in Otherness we will list five more stations that have met with this fate. Most of these deleted stations have very desirable power and frequency so we imagine some applications for new facilities to fill these empty frequencies will show up.
- All these stations ceased operations at 6 PM on 9-30-94

 WV Point Plesant: reported to be on the air, this new station is NOT yet operating, our member in Point Plesant reports there has been some sporatic site testing with unmodulated carrier but never any audio. This seems to indicate that WBGS is still a viable CP so keep watching this frequency.
- 1060 CJRP PQ Quebec City:station is DELFTED, see 970 above.
- 1090 WMFL FL Monticello station is SILENT
- 1140 CJTR PQ Trois-Rivieres: station is DELETED, see 970 above
- 1170 WBRW NJ Bridgewater Lownship according to an article in the Somerset Messenger-Gazette the new owners of this silent station expect to return it of the air "by the end of the year"
- 1190 WOWO IN Fort Wayne: the long-awaited announcement of WOWO's fate has been made by the new owners. The night power will be reduced to a level not yet

- specified and the night directional pattern will be changed to allow their WLIB-1190 in New York to operate fulltime. Rumors that WOWO would be taken off the air or become a daytimer are false.
- 1220 WOTS FL Kissimmee: silent as WMIK, station is ON THE AIR
- 1240 WWWC NC Wilkesboro' silent station is ON THE AIR (had been silent for SIX years)
- 1270 WWCA IN Gary: station is SILENT
- 1280 CIMS PO Montreal: station is DELETED, see 970 above
- 1400 WJRV PA Loretto: silent station is ON THE AIR, had been reported silent in MSJ but
- 1420 KZMO MO California: station is SILENT as reported earlier after lightning damage in June. Owner has been busy upgrading the FM facility and then is taking a "long vacation" before worrying about the AM station, don't expect this to return anytime soon.
- 1420 CIMT PQ Chicoutimi: station is DELETED, see 970 above
- 1430 WNFO SC Ridgeland: station is SILENT
- 1470 WCFJ IL Ford Heights: the city of Chicago Heights has officially changed its name to Ford Heights, this confirmed during Tony Fitzherbort's visit to WCFI
- 1510 CIRS PO Sherbrooke: station is DELETED, see 970 above
- 1580 KTGR MO Columbia: silent station is ON THE AIR
- 1590 KBBY CA Ventura: silent station is ON THE AIR
- 1590 WEIT MD Ocean City: despite a report this summer that this station was not likely to return, it has been sold and the new owners plan to make extensive technical repairs, including replacement of the aging antenna system, and eventually return it to the air
- 1590 WAWA PA Chester: station's call change from WCZN has stirred up some problems, seems there is a chain of stores in that area called "Wawa" and they have filed a cease and desist order against the station and are considering a lawsuit if WAWA doesn't find another call. Member Dave Schmidt reports from Chester that as of now they ARE using WAWA.

From Laurence Kearley on the situation in Quebec: "The six stations all quit broadcasting suddenly, with no advance warning on Friday, September 30th at 11:00. They are: CKCH-970-Hull; CJRP-1060- Quebec; CJTR-1140-Trois-Rivieres; CJMS-1280-Montreal; CJMT-1420-Chicoutimi; and CJRS-1510-Sherbrooke. They are silent due to a merger of the Telemedia and Radiomutuel networks for financial reasons. As you can imagine, this has opened up new vistas for DXing from this area. CKCH and CJMS always wiped out their own frequencies as well as slopping over to adjacent ones."

Good to hear from Steve Whitt in England with an UNID report via E-Mail, and also a request: "In DXN Vol. 61, No. 24 you mention the GTO network. I've heard it on nearly half a dozen Canadian stations but I'm still looking for a flagship station or a listing of affiliates. I've heard GTO on CJYQ 930, CHNS 960, CHTN 720 and CFNB 550 plus unidentified sources on a couple of other channels."



1224 SPAIN, OCT 9 2325 - COPE synchros, poor with SS teletalk show with man & woman; over growl. [Connelly*H-MA]

1251 LIBYA Tripoli, OCT 7 0119 - AA talk to good peaks. [Connelly*R-MA]

1251 LIBYA / unID, OCT 9 2325 - AA talk by man LOUD over second station that was most likely Portugal. [Connelly*II-MA]

1296 SPAIN Valencia, OCT 9 2324 - SS teletalk; fair. [Connelly*H-MA]

1305 SPAIN / unID, OCT 6 2311 - SS talk & possible AA (Algeria?) in graveyard-like jumble. [Connellv*R-MA]

1314 unID OCT 6 0202 - strong het turned into fair AA chanting; UAE Dabiya? Gone completely at 0220, which would be their sunrise. [Sullivan-N]]

1314 SPAIN, OCT 6 2310 - RNE5 synchros, poor to fair with man in SS. No sign of Norway.

1323 GERMANY Wachenbrunn? OCI 7 0307 -A woman was speaking in an UNID language. I have been wondering if this station is still on the air or if I heard someone else. Was generally a Moroccan night. [Dangerfield-PA]

1349 MAURITANIA Nouakchott, OCT 6 2256 - HUGE S9+30 carrier (blowing out 1350 totally): audio (chanting) was only modulating about 20%. [Connelly*R-MA]

1386 GUINEA Labe, OCT 6 2258 - surprisingly loud with music that sounded Islamic, then man in Afro-accented FF. [Connelly*R-MA]

1413 SPAIN, OCT 6 2259 - RNE5 synchros. noted with woman in SS. [Connelly*R-MA]

1422 ALGERIA Algiers, OCT 6 2308 - AA vocal at low audio level on huge carrier. [Connelly*R-MAl

1431 UKRAINE Kopani? OCT 7 0255 - Weak with talking in UNID language. Other signals that night were not from this area so I can only guess, but in the last 2 years, only Kopani has been heard here. [Dangerfield-PA]

1467 FRANCE Roumoules, OCT 6 2308 - EE preaching to EXCELLENT peak. [Connelly*R-MA]

1494 MOROCCO Agadir? OCT 7 0235-0320 - Fair signal with AA type orchestra and singing. Heard 2 different men speaking between 0245 and 0250. WRTH shows Agadir on frequency listing, but not under Morocco country list. This was pretty much a Morocco night. Heard St. Petersburg here last season. [Dangerfield-PA]

1502 unID (ANGOLA or TOGO), OCT 6 2300 - muffled talk hetted by 1503 (Spain/Azores ?) and

slopped by WTOP/YVRZ-1500 & WSSH-1510. [Connelly*R-MA]

1512 SAUDÍ ARABIA Jeddah, OCT 7 0128 - AA vocal in WSSH slop. [Connelly*R- MA]

1521 SAUDI ARABIA Duba, OCT 6 2302 - Koranic style vocal, then man in AA; good. [Connelly*R-MA] OCT 8 0038. Very good signal but more than 2 hours before usual 0300 sign on. 2 men were speaking in AA. [Dangerfield-PA]

1521 SPAIN Manresa, OCT 9 2322 - fast SS talk by man; poor. [Connelly*H-MA]

1530 unID, OCT 6 2306 - woman in AA popped up out of the jumble here. Maybe this is the Mideast clandestine operation cranking up more actively now that Iraq is stirring things up again. [Connelly*R-MA]

1530 VATICAN, OCT 7 0123 - instrumental version of "People" // 5882; good. [Connelly*R-MA]

1544 CLANDESTINE (ALGERIA or MOROCCO), OCT 6 2302 - man in AA; EXCELLENT. This was coming in 30 to 40 dB better than I ever get them back at the house less than an hour's drive away. [Connelly*R-MA]

1566 TUNISIA Sfax (t), OCT 6 2303 - AA-sounding talk by woman, hacked by WQEW slop.

[Connelly*R-MA]

1575 SPAIN, OCT 6 2305 - SER SS news by man // 1584; fair to good. [Connelly*R-MA]

1584 SPAIN, OCT 6 2305 - SER SS news by man // 1575; good. [Connelly*R-MA]

1602 SPAIN / unID, OCT 6 2304 - SS talk with choppy fades: possible AA music station under. [Connelly*R-MA]

Ben speaks: "I am now using my new KIWA loop, and after a week of parallel checking, have consigned the Radio West loop to the attic, to be used as a spare. I have no quarrels with the Radio West (or is it Sanserino?) loop, but there isn't enough room for both of them beside the HQ-180 in my den, which is also our rec room. I am very pleased with the KIWA loop. It brings in everything I was getting on the other one, and it seems to me in many cases that the signals are stronger, with less background noise. And, I think, with less splash from locals and strong stations. And with the various sophisticated tuning mechanisms the KIWA offers, you can do quite a lot to enhance weak signals. I would say the nulling ability is much the same as Radio West, but KTWA being much smaller and compact enables it to be moved easily to different spots in the room, and just a few feet can make a considerable difference in nulling a station. But the best part about this loop is that because of its precise tuning I have almost completely gotten rid of the spurs, images, and cross-modulation annovances that the HO-180 is noted for. I don't know about your HO-180, but down through the years I have had some trouble with these problems, especially for a period of about 2 years after I had had the set for 5 years. Most of my image problem came while I was using long wires, but was much easier to control when I went to loops, especially the Radio West loop. So for this sort of thing. I think the KIWA loop will be very helpful. The HQ-180 is very sensitive."

David speaks: "My first post, so be gentle. Actually, this is the first time I've ever heard TA's, so I'm excited. I heard what I assume is Nitra, Slovakia on 1098 (I don't know Slovak), Spain also on 1098 (in SS) and Monaco on 1467 (in GG), but all in the earlier half of September and all reported by others in DX News."

STATION NEWS

BULGARIA: The latest schedule from Radio Bulgaria provides information about a medium wave of their "Horizont" home service broadcast. It can be heard at 0700-1000 UTC Monday through Saturday on 1224 kHz and 1000-1300 UTC Monday through Sunday on 1224 kHz. The transmitter site is Vidin with 500 KW. [Radio Bulgaria schedule via Rich D'Angelo]

GUINEA/KENYA: One evening I heard Radio Guinee on 1386 until 0000, and some mornings KBC Nairobi is heard here with repeated ISs and IDs 0155-0200. KBS has also been heard at the same time on new 927 kHz. [Alm-SVE] 1386 KBC is also on 4935 kHz at the same time [SUFF GIG in Play-DX #806]

INDIA: The signal of the new AIR Titicorin 1053 kHz is consistently good at 0000 sign-on, so this station must have a powerful skywaye, apparently intentionally. [Alm-SVE]

NETHERLANDS: 1224 Holland FM did not start broadcasting from the Communicator as expected. The ship was ready only at the end of September and I don't know if they've starrted yet. Over the weekend I thought Holland FM were OFF 1224 and 828kHz - so perhaps change is imminent. [Whitt-UK]

PARAGUAY: ZP1 920 Radio Nacional, 0745-0400 (0845 Su). The government station has 100 kW capacity but generally operates at 48% because electricity is very expensive. [Relampago DX #59, AUG 1994, in Play-DX #806] (article includes lots of info about other Paraguayan stations, none of which are currently off frequency - Jim)

ROMANIA: I must correct myself regarding the Romanian on 1053. This morning I found out that at least Sundays, of all days, they are opening up an hour earlier with the Radio Romania Actualitate network. Burnell heard them on a Saturday morning and the same early sign-on (0250) winter UTC) may be valid for Saturdays as well, although I have not confirmed this. My apologies, Jean, for any inconvenience. [Alm-SVE]

RUSSIA: Radio Netherlands is now being relayed via the Kaliningrad-Bolshakovo monster transmitter on 1386 kHz with Dutch 2030-2130 and English 2130-2230. (and according to Jonathan Marks, in Medium Wave News OCT 94, there are no SW parallels to this broadcast - Jim) Radio Moscow World Service has instead appeared on the Moldovan transmitter at Maiac on 1467 and is heard 1900-2300. (see Guinea above) The Krasnodar (Tbilisskaya) transmitter on 1089 has special news broadcasts in RR, IDing as Radiostantsiya Deimos, concerning the civil war situation in Chechnya at least at 0000 and 0200, possibly at other times. After the 0000 newscast the transmitter goes off again. It signs on with several minutes of on/off tone. The audio of these special newscasts is awful with lots of background noise in the studio. [Alm-SVE]

ST. PIERRE ET MIQUELON: 1375 RIO St Pierre last heard here 4th Sept. Do you know if it is definitely off air (maybe Jean Burnell can double check) and why? [Whitt-UK]

UNITED KINGDOM: 1296 NEW STATION Supa AM rumoured to be starting tests today. I've left a tape running. Will confirm as soon as I know. The Radio Authority has announced the following AM licenses in London: 1548 kHz Capital Gold retains its AM slot. 1332/1386/1413kHz London Christian Radio - speech based Christian station (multiple sites up to 5 locations). 963 kHz Radio Viva; speech & music in a magazine format (single site transmitter). [Whitt-UK]



Dial changes in AM markets, from 1930 to 1948 to 1992



Changes in programming status: reported by listeners

Al Holtz, in Philadelphia, sent information that WCZN-1590, in nearby Aston, Deleware Country, has received FCC permission to drop its call for the call WAWA, named after Wawa, a tiny unincorporated hamlet, with fewer than 200 residents, less than a mile from the station, WCZN dropped its country music format in favor of adult standards a year ago, WAWA became available when a station in suburban Milwaukee dropped the call. However, a major problem developed when Wawa, Inc., operators of over 500 convenience stores throughout the Middle Atlantic States, threatened a lawsuit because of possible infringement of the convenience chain's registered trademark plus "false advertising and unfair competition". The station's argument was that the station was named after the nearby hamlet which, according to a Wawa lawyer, "does not even have a ZIP code". The general manager noted that the 3000 watt station does not earn as much in billings annually as does one of the Wawa stores! The resolution of this issue will be interesting!
