was then filed for U1 3500/146 from Daphne, diplexing into the WIJD-1270 tower. The current application on file seems to have **deleted the frequency move** with no explanation. So the original paperwork either contained a typo, or the application on file was substituted with no official explanation.

- **960 WFIR VA Roanoke -** Licensed for **U2 5000/5000**, WFIR submitted an application to change to U2 10000/4650 while relocating to the WVBE-610 tower site, but was dismissed. They resubmitted the application addressing the FCC's concerns about interference to two South American superpowers on the frequency. Now, they've submitted another amendment with dozens of field intensity readings and requested a new nighttime power. If granted and built, WFIR would become U2 10000/4890.
- **1130 NEW OR Mount Angel -** Initial application was for U4 3000/250. This amendment requests U4 25000/490.
- **1220 WIBQ FL Sarasota** Licensed for **U5 1000/159**, WIBQ applied for U4 5000/900 changing their CoL to Lakewood Ranch, Florida. Now they amended the application to read U4 2000/249 back at Sarasota.
- **1360 KELE MO Mountain Grove -** Licensed for **U1 1000/60**, KELE applied to move to Ripley, Ohio (correct) on 1200 kHz with D4 10000/0 CH 6500, then amended the application to read D1 1000/0 CH 1000. Now they've applied for D1 1000/0 CH 625. Again at Ripley. Again on 1200.

APPLICATIONS REINSTATED

1220 WOTS FL Kissimmee - Application for U4 2500/200, initially dismissed, has been reinstated after they modified the nighttime so as not to interfere with co-channel station XEB.

APPLICATIONS FOR RECONSIDERATION

1440 NEW VA Hamilton - Initial Auction 84 application was for U4 960/5000, then amended to U4 1000/5000, which was dismissed. Now they have made some changes to the parameters and requested U4 500/1200.

NRC AM Log, 27th Edition, says "// WWL-FM 95.7," so change the listing. (REW-HI) (This change actually appears to have taken place in April of this year, from what I have been able to research. The 27th Log reflects the addition of an FM //, but as Richard has pointed out, the listed frequency is wrong. Ed.-WI) CA Oakland. Per station website, station has replaced Al Franken with tape-960 KOKE delayed Thom Hartmann weekdays at 1206-1500, brought back Rachael Maddow, added the new Nova M network's Mike Malloy and pushed back Randi Rhodes to 0006-0200. (DP-HI) 1020 KCKN NM Roswell. 10/20 0025. Noted with a new format. Listed in AM Log 27th Edition as C&W; observed with SS and bilingual EE/SS gospel teaching, mailing address Miami. This program was followed at 0030 by SS from Radio Transmundial, i.e. Trans World Radio. Not known whether this format change is complete, as some C&W is still noted other days and nights. **(REW-HI)** (The KCKN website does show a large chunk of brokered religion, Monday through Friday 9 PM-5 AM Mountain. What Richard was hearing matches this schedule: "Leading the Way" in SS/EE and "Thru the Bible" SS version. According to the website, the format the rest of the time is Classic Country. **Ed.-WI**)

- 1110 KAOI HI Kihei. See 570 KQNG above. (Ed.-WI)
- 1140 KCXL MO Liberty and:
- 1160 KCTOMO Cleveland. When KCTO first came on the air in September, J.E. Lewis reported that the station was running programming from KCXL. This simulcast arrangement appears to be permanent, according to recent observations by both J.E. and Steve Sprague. J.E. also reports "I understand that 1160 is or has made some adjustments to its night pattern for unknown reasons. I live about four miles south of downtown and 1140 comes in a little better most of the time." (Ed.-WI)
- **1340 KOMY CA La Selva Beach.** Per blog ltradio.blogspot.com, station drops Air America as of November. Apparently, according to the blog, the station owners are more concerned with the conservative programming on KOMY and sister station KSCO 1080. **(DP-HI)**
- **1380 KDXE AR North Little Rock.** Per network website, station adds the new Nova M talk network. **(DP-HI)** (Nova M is a new liberal talk network formed by founders of Air America, but in competition with the older network. The fledgling network began operation on 10/30. In the meantime, Air America has filed for bankruptcy, raising questions about its future. **Ed.-WI**)
- **1460 KHRA HI Honolulu.** Per spokesman on 11/8, station's contract with its main program provider Radio Korea of Los Angeles (KYPA 1230) ended, and the lack of programming is why the station remains off since the earthquake-related blackout of 10/15 (see Dale's "Special report" in DDXD-W #74-6 Ed.-WI). Station hopes to return next month. (DP-HI)
- **1480 KPHX AZ Phoenix.** Per network website, station is the flagship of the new liberal Nova M talk network as of 10/30, featuring Mike Newcomb (who leases KPHX for liberal programming), Mike Malloy and Peter B. Collins (who co-owns KRXA 540 CA). **(DP-HI)**
- **1600 KGYM IA Cedar Rapids. 11/4 1959.** Local news "from the TV9 newsroom," PSAs, local sports update into legal ID: "You're listening to 1600 ESPN Radio, KGYM Cedar Rapids, Iowa." ESPN Sports Center followed. New calls, ex-KCRG. Format remains ESPN sportstalk, but gone is the slogan "The Zone." (Ed.-WI)
- **1600 KZGX MN Watertown. 11/5 0730.** Good signals with lady singing. Have heard this during the last week or so and finally IDed it. KZGX is no longer in Spanish but in the Hmong language. This is a language from Laos. This should be easy to spot as it is very different from anything else on the frequency I have ever heard. **(SA-MB)**

However, would CJBC have a lengthy, serious ½-hour talk show at midnight, or would this be more likely on CKBF-2 at 11 PM local? Can Canadian DXers help? When

DX'ing In Hawaii Without Locals: The Quake Of '06 Silences Most Of Oahu And Maui - By Richard E. Wood

An earthquake centered near Puako on the northwest coast of the Big Island of Hawaii and measuring 6.6 on the Richter scale struck at 0707 HST (1307 ELT) on Sunday, October 15, 2006.

All AM stations on the Big Island (620, 670, 850, 1060 and the Part 15 station on 1640) stayed on the air, but power was lost on most of Oahu and Maui. All Oahu stations went off the air with the exception of KSSK 590, KRTR 650, KKNE 940 and an apparent open carrier from KORL 1180. The situation on Maui was mixed. KMVI 550 and KAOI 1110 stayed on the air, but KNUI 900 went off.

The result was that numerous channels which are normally blocked, or where locals have to be carefully phased or looped out, were perfectly clear for reception from North America throughout the prime evening listening hours, and several new stations were logged. Many stations that had previously been weak, irregular and QRM prone were now local-like, and many reception reports were sent. Conditions to all parts of North America were good (Alaska through Mexico), although only one East Coast station, WPHT 1210 PA, was logged.

On a morning check at 0445 HST (1045 ELT), the great majority of Oahu stations had returned to the air at normal strength, except for KHRA 1460 and KHNR 870, which were still silent, and presumed KORL 1180 (not 100% certain) and KUMU 1500, both of which had open carriers. KNUI 900 on Maui was still off the air, leaving CKMO BC still in the clear. Here is what was heard this night, **ALL TIMES IN ELT**:

Results KEVA 1240 & WWNH 1340 DX Tests

WWNH 1340 kbz, Madbury, NH

Broadcast

"The DX'ers Best Friend", Paul Walker did it again, arranging for a DX test from the rare state of New Hampshire. This is perhaps the 8th or 9th test that Paul had either personally conducted or played a key role in arranging during the past three seasons. And it looks like he may even pull off another one from hard to hear South Carolina soon. (Stay tuned for details) Paul, thank you doesn't cover it. WWNH currently does not have a "record holder" for it's best DX...one of the loggings below can now claim that record. Visit Bill Hale's great Graveyard DX Achievement web site for details: <u>http://www.nrcdxas.org/GYDXA/</u>

Here are the results: WWNH actually performed an last minute DX test on September 30th, prior to the announced test in October. A few lucky DX'ers were up late and on the e-mail lists (it pays to be connected to the Internet) and snagged this "mini-test". Rene Tetro of Landsdale, PA heard the test "loud and clear". Other "probable" loggings included Russ Johnson and Bert New of Watkinsville, GA. Joe Miller of Troy, MI heard some tones, but not enough to claim reception. Ditto for Bill Harms. Willis in Old Fort, TN also heard brief bits of code and sweeps, but his local, WBAC in Cleveland, TN made reception very difficult.

The Main Event on November 5th saw mixed geomagnetic conditions, and receptions reflected it. First to report success was Wade Smith of New Brunswick who copied sweep tones, Morse code, and TV show themes. John Sgrulletta of Mahopac, NY pulled out the sweeps and code as well. Barry McLarnon of Ottawa, Ontario returned to his winning ways, logging yet another test. What is his secret? Peter Jernakoff sent in a nice MP3 of his recording from Delaware, and Jeff Falconer submitted a detailed written log of details from the test, confirming his reception from Clinton, Ontario. Michael Diers used a Watkins-Johnson HF-1000 (nice rig!) and a Kiwa loop to pull in the test from Huntingon Station, NY. While Brent Taylor needed only a Sony 2010 and the Radio Shack loop to pull this one in from Doaktown, NB in Canada. Ron Musco used the Drake R8B and a set of longwires to log WWNH, noting that the sweep tones made all the difference in Poquonock, CT. A Drake R8 and some attic mounted wires helped Jim Chenard of Blairstown, NJ add this one to his log, and yet another Drake R8 owner, Brett Saylor found success in Central, PA. (Maybe Drakes are the secret weapon?) Saul Chernos used his trusty car radio in downtown Toronto to pull in some "faint sweep tones", so maybe the magic isn't in the rig afterall. Dave Hochfelder heard sweep tones and the theme from "Jeopardy" in Highland Park, NJ, and another success story came in from Michael Procop who logged the test in Bedford, Ohio using a Kenwood R600 and a homebrew loop antenna. A Quantum Loop and a Drake R8B were the tools de jour for Phil Greenspan in Marshfield, MA, and he gives them credit for his logging of the test. Vermont got into the act with another successful test logging from Steve Howe in St. Albans. He's been hearing them all this season! Another superstar DX'er, Mark Connelly noted the sweep tones during the test. WWNH is a daytime regular for him, but hard to hear at night. Dave Pyatt used the rock solid NRC 545 receiver along with a 40" homebrew box loop to snag a new one from his shack in Burlington, Ontario. Nice catch, Dave!

We have also heard reports of possible receptions from California and even Australia, but we've haven't yet received the recordings to verify these. I haven't calculated the distances for these receptions, but the one that is furthest away should automatically qualify for the NRC Graveyard DX Achivement listing on Bill Hale's web site. There is currently no record holder for WWNH. Visit his site to see how to submit your logging: <u>http://www.nrcdxas.org/GYDXA/</u>

Paul Walker's "relief operator" failed to show up on time, forcing Paul to stop the test early at around 12:40AM EST. Paul had to be back on the board at 6AM, so he really had no choice. Some folks tuned in late to try for the test, and missed any chance of hearing it because of this situation. Lesson learned: Get em while they're hot! :)

Many found that this New England state will remain out of their logs for a bit longer, trying but failing to log the test. These included Les Rayburn of Helena, AL who dug through almost four hours of recordings without a trace, Doug Smith of Nashville, and even Neil Kazaross came up short too, making the bitter medicine easier to swallow. If Doug and Neil didn't hear it then conditions must have been bad! James Niven usually has good ears in Moody, Texas, but was lone star blue after this test. Bill Dvorak of Madison, WI had to taste defeat, as did Randy Stewart of Battlefield, MO.

Propagation to Southern states was also poor, with Chris Johnson of South Carolina failing to hear this one, and the some Yankees joined their Rebel brother's misery, like Jim Renfrew of Byron, NY who reported, "no love from NH." Mike Brooker of Tronto, NH also had no love, and joining him in disappointment was Martin Foltz of Mission Viejo, CA, proving again that conditions must have been poor when all-stars like these fail to log new ones.

WWNH Sweep Tones coming through loud and clear in SE PA. -Rene Tetro, Landsdale, PA

The channel was pretty jammed and this was faint through the jumble. Sweep tone make it out much better than the Morse Code. -Jim Chenard, Blairstown, NJ

Kind of handicapped here. I have a local on 1340 that I could null, but the null is in the wrong direction, so I had really no shot at this one, though I did try for it. -Randy Stewart, Battlefield, MO

A shame ... had just gone to the radio for a post-midnight DX session. This would explain why I heard nothing the final 2 hours of the test. Thanx for your efforts just the same. -J.D. Stephens, KY

In general 1340 was "mush" about 50% of the time, a country station calling itself "God's Country" about 40% of the time, somebody running the New England Patriots - Indianapolis Colts game about 8% of the time, and snippets of the WWNH test the other 2%. On a non-auroral night WWNH's groundwave simply cannot compete with the blob of skip signals. It is too close (about 40 miles) to present any serious skywave signal of its own. -Mark Connelly, Billerica, MA

KEVA 1240 khz Evanston, WY DX Test Results

In what is becoming an annual event, Michael J. Richard of KEVA conducted another DX Test on October 23rd, 2006. While we didn't have the nearly perfect conditions that allowed last season's coast to coast receptions, this year's test still allowed a number of lucky DX'ers to pull in this graveyard giant!

Our special thanks again to Michael J. Richard! He not only has conducted these tests, but worked tirelessly to arrange the upcoming Montana DX tests (along with other members of ABDX!), so we all owe him a lot.

Here we go: Frank Aden of Boise, Idaho started off the reports, logging the sweep tones and code almost immediately after the test started, shortly after Midnight Mountain Time. Mike Hawkins of Campbell, California joined in next, followed by reports from Tim Hall of San Diego, Martin Foltz of Mission Viejo, and Mike Sanburn in Bellflower, CA. Tom Kraft of Billings, MT used a Kenwood R600 and the all mighty Kiwa Loop to pull the test in "easily", and Terry Keyowski of Regina, Saskatchewan noted how helpful the "sweep tones" were in logging the test from his location over 800 miles away. Kevin Redding logged this one from Gilbert, AZ using only the CCRadio portable with no problem. While Phil Bytheway of Seattle, WA forgot to turn on his recorder! His paper log details were first rate though, allowing enough for a successful reception report. But as Steely Dan observed, "they've got a name for the winners in the world, and I want a name when I lose"---so many of us went to bed disappointed this year. Among them were John Wilke of Greenfield, WI, Doug Pifer of Albany, OR, and your editor, Les Rayburn of Helena, AL. Bob Foxworth of Tampa, FL reported "not a peep" of the test from his shack, but Willis in Old Fort, TN reported a "possible reception" with some mystery tones and bits of Morse Code. Bert New of Watkinsville, GA also heard the "mystery tones" and fast Morse Code--- He reported that the sweep tones sounded similar to those used in past tests...but couldn't claim the logging just yet. The news was all bad for Paul LaFreniere of Grand Marais, MN, who listened for the entire test without success. Barr McLarnon who usually hears pin drops from his shack in the Great White North, couldn't pull this one out. Doug Smith, another DX'er with a top notch shack failed to log this one as well from Nashville. Joe Miller, who has done the wonderful designs for many of the DX test QSL cards this year, tried without success for this one too. His Troy, MI shack proven to be just too far away this year. Dave Hochfelder of Highland Park, NJ also felt the "agony" of defeat" this time around.

For Beginners Shared techniques for both the new and experienced DX'er

Are you in a condo or apartment ? (I am!). No outside antenna because some association watches your windows like hawks? Electrical noise everywhere? This isn't uncommon nowadays. Sometimes a solution is a DXpedition. Originally an Amateur Radio term, Hams would haul gear to spots with few or no hams, and "activate" it. What does this term mean to us as AM BCB DX'ers? In a nutshell, taking receivers, antennas, logs, etc., to a noise-free location and spending time at the dials. I may not be in an ideal location, but sometimes I can GO to the ideal location.

DXpeditions can be extremely simple (Many years ago when your author was onboard a DE then undergoing overhaul in the Pacific Northwest the urge to DX hit. DXing from a shipyard is not the answer. I took my Radio Shack TRF, my Communications World, and a notebook and found a hotel room well away from the shipyard for the weekend.).

What to bring? Much depends on where the DXpedition site is. If it is public property (a state park or such), get permission before setting up. It always pays off.

These are some suggestions, not all inclusive:

Batteries (for places with no A/C), antenna wire, tents, rope to help string up antennas, sleeping bags, flashlights, first aid kit (hopefully it won't be used!), chow (granola bars, ready-to-eat items, etc.), chairs, a folding table to serve as an operating table. Anyone can increase this list ad infinitem.

DXpeditions can be embarked on solo or in a group. Sometimes the tales told on these DXpeditions are worth more than what is (or is not) heard!

A check of the weather at the DXpedition site before you shove off is well worth it. If a portable computer is required for logging, ensure its battery is charged. If contemplating a "first time" DXpedition, there are many NRC members who have been on several of them. Advice from experienced DXpeditioners can help much.

However a DX'er chooses to go, DXpeditions are a blast, and an amazing amount of DX can be logged that might not be logged in the home shack. 73
