From the Publisher ... The "dog" days of summer are definitely here, and I salute all of you who are still in dogged pursuit of DXN and reporting to the appropriate columns.

Spooky DX ... From Glen Hauser, our man in Enid, OK: "The FCC has licensed some more experimental operations on the MW broadcast band. Digging deep into FCC info, I find Psyop mentioned in connexion with this, altho the licensee is the Multi-Spectral Laboratory in Ponca City of Oklahoma State University whose main field seems to be sensing. This is part of a 27 megadollar Navy contract, on behalf of the US Special Operations Command, Charleston SC. The authorization expires July 1, 2009.

"The consultant making the filings is Dr. Wayne G. Walker, who also happens to be CEO of Republic Aerospace Corp., Duncan OK.

"There are two locations: Chilocco, Oklahoma, which is right at the Kansas border north of Ponca City, on an abandoned water tower at an Indian school; and Flying H, New Mexico, which is in the back country SW of Roswell.

"Both mobile (suspect aeronautical) and fixed are authorized. The same callsign applies to both locations, WE2XFZ. Like last year's tone tests from Virginia on 1610, 1020 and 590 kHz, each of these has three frequencies at the bottom, middle and top of the band, and ditto FM: "Chilocco, OK: 540, 830, 1680 kHz, 92.3, 99.1,

107.5 MHz

"Flying H, NM: 530, 950, 1680 kHz, 88.3, 97.7, 107.3 MHz

"They are using a 2.5 and a 10 kW AM transmitter and 1 kW on FM, 5 kW ERP. They also mistakenly give ERPs for the MW frequencies.

"Tests will consist of 1 kHz tones or audio for 5-10 minutes. The equipment is capable of transmitting the callsign.

The occasion was the time switch of eight Indiana counties from the Eastern Time Zone to the Central, which occurred on April 2, 2006. Well, a fact that has come to my attention has forced your Editor to eat a big slice of humble pie. When Daylight Savings Time for 2007 started back on March 11, Pulaski County rejoined the Eastern Time Zone, after less than one year in the Central! CKPR ON Thunder Bay. 7/30 2355. Fair in WMT IBOC null with "CKPR 91.5." Last 580 time I'll hear them unless I get lucky tonight (8/2). Site says the AM will die

8/3 at 0930. A shame. (**DB-IA**) (A shame indeed! We have already lost two other Canadian stations on 580 that were DXer favorites: CKAP and CKY. Ed.-WI) 600 **WMT IA** Cedar Rapids. 8/1. Has been running IBOC at night for over a week. Also is emitting splatter out to at least 700 KHz and at times up to 900 KHz; sounds like negative-going overmod. Engineering Department hasn't returned my call, hi. (DB-IA) WI Milwaukee. An e-mail from Milwaukee-area NRCer Ray Totzke on 7/19 620 WTMJ revealed that this station's IBOC has been down lately. A check of the Milwaukee online radio forum www.brewcityradio.com explained much about this situation (the forum is a cozy little group, among whose contributors are both IBOC cheerleaders and bashers). IBOC was first noticed off in late June. WTMJ's downtime appears to be for an IBOC firmware upgrade for their Harris transmitters. From my understanding, firmware is neither software nor hardware, but may be thought of as software imbedded on hardware. Thus to make the correction, the exciter (hardware) must be sent in to Harris, and the usual downtime is about a month (an explanation also on why other IBOC stations have experienced downtimes of a few weeks at a time). The Harris upgrade has been successful in other cases, and the station has no plans to dump IBOC. In the meantime, Ray is enjoying (while it lasts) listening to WMFN 640 from across the pond in Zeeland MI. That includes the day of this column's deadline, 8/3, as WTMJ's IBOC remains off. See also 1640 WKSH below. **(Ed.-WI)** WHOS AL Decatur. Adds Fox Sports Radio 6/25 per network news release. (DP-HI) 800 950 **KTNF** MN Saint Louis Park. Adds WOR Network's "The Pet Show with Warren Eckstein" per program 7/21. (**DP-HI**) **KMA IA** Shenandoah. In DDXD-W #74-27, we ran an item regarding this station's 960 middle tower in its three-tower array. Ernie Wesolowski had reported then that the deteriorating 48-year-old tower was taken down on 5/31, and the station would be using an STA for 1250 watts non-directional for nighttime operation while the new tower was constructed. During a recent phone call, Ernie told me that he visited the station on 7/12. The new tower is up but engineering issues remain, and the station did not expect to be ready to begin nighttime directional broadcasting again until around 8/1. In the meantime, the STA remains in effect (and the DX opportunity remains intact). As of this column's deadline of 8/3, I can neither confirm nor deny that these operations have begun. (Ed.-WI) **WBHP** AL Huntsville. Adds Fox Sports Radio 6/25 per network news release. (DP-1230 **WSBM AL** Florence. Adds Fox Sports Radio 6/16 per network news release. (**DP-HI**) 1340 **HI Pearl City.** Noted testing on 7/12 at 1420 with smooth jazz, then off at 1426. 1370 **KUPA** Later noted on 7/14 at 2047, seemingly on regular schedule with a mix of adult alternative, smooth jazz and "light music." Played the same songs over and over, thought apparently not on a loop but shuffled randomly, by Peter Gabriel and Kate Bush, Sarah Brightman, Paul Simon, Van Morrison, Leonard Cohen, Harry Nillson, etc. Finally an ID at 2352 "Coming soon, KUPA 13-70 AM, Pearl City, Hawaii." Still testing upon recheck 7/26 and 7/28. Then on 7/29 at 0307 noted airing Fox Sports Radio, IDs as "KUPA AM 13-70 Pearl City." (**DP-HI**) 1420 **KKEA** HI Honolulu. Adds Premiere Radio's "Costas On The Radio" 7/1 per monitoring, airing Sunday nights at 7:06 to 9:00 PM local. (DP-HI) WRLL 1450 IL Cicero. During weekday mornings from 6 AM to noon Central, 1450 WRLL simulcasts WVON 1690. ToH ID is "This is WVON Berwyn/Chicago and WRLL Cicero/Chicago." I've noticed the 1690 signal is 5 seconds delayed. (KO-IL) (No doubt because WVON is broadcasting in IBOC and WRLL is not. Ed.-WI) 1460 **KHRA** HI Honolulu. 7/17 0600. Finally heard formal ID sequence: the sound of waves, brief jingle in Korean, ID in Korean, 3+1 time pips, EE ID "This is KHRA 14-60 AM, Honolulu, Hawaii." (DP-HI) **WJTI** WI Racine. As Bill Hale is reporting in this month's AMS, this station with its new 1460 facilities is back on air, ex-silent. The format is SS music, using the slogan La Nuevo Ritmo. I talked to **Al Hajny**, the engineer who worked on this station, and he tells me that day facilities are complete, but that completion of night facilities, diplexed into the WNOV 860 tower, are several weeks off. Because the station cannot be given a Program Test Authority until these facilities are complete, the station applied for a Special Temporary Authority (STA) to use their daytime site at night, with a power of 49 watts. The STA was granted. Thus in a rather unorthodox way WJTI could begin regular schedule. **(Ed.-WI)**

- 1490 WFFX IL East Saint Louis. New calls, ex-WESL. Per Saint Louis American, station dropped its full-service African-American format (known as "14-90 Soul Classics") 7/9 and switched to Fox Sports Radio, re-branding as "14-90 Fox Sports." Station carries FSR all day except for Jim Rome at 1100-1400 and local sports at 0800-1000 and 1900-2000 weekdays. Station is also the new home for the Gateway Grizzlies baseball team; both Rome and the Grizzlies come over from sister station KSLG-1380, which carries ESPN Radio. (DP-HI)
- 1510 KCKK CO Littleton. An Asset Purchase Agreement was signed on 7/27 for the sale of KCKK to Mile High Sports. Format change occurred the morning of 7/30. Station noted at 10:00 AM local time IDing as Mile High Sports Radio with dual ID for KCKK Littleton-Denver and KSXT Loveland. Programming is syndicated Sporting News Radio. A memo from the management of outgoing owner NRC Broadcasting indicates this will be a local management agreement operating from the studios at NRC until FCC approval of the sale. (PG-CO)
- WMBH MO Joplin. 7/28. Noted off air on this date, but on air on 7/31 with UC format, while driving between Lamar and Joplin MO. (JEL-MO*) (John Tudenham has documented the on-again, off-again woes of this station. See DDXD-W #74-12 for a good narrative of some of the station's problems. Ed.-WI)
- HI Haiku. I spoke to someone at now-silent KUAU, owned by King's Cathedral, on 7/25. The spokesman said the station went off 7/1 so that the transmitter could be moved to Kihei, hopefully by next July. He pointed out that the shutdown was approved by the FCC. I once visited the transmitter site; it's in the back yard of the original owner's house and uses an amateur radio antenna; the previous owner serves as the chief engineer. (Incidentally, the tower shared by KNUI-900 and KAOI-1110 is north of Kihei.) (**DP-HI**)
- WKSH WI Sussex. While researching the WTMJ IBOC situation on brewcityradio.com (see above), I discovered that a second Milwaukee area station, WKSH, had also turned off its IBOC, also in late June. Unlike the case of WTMJ, the reasons were not as clear. Various explanations were transmitter problems, antenna problems and "IBOC implementation" problems. Also not clear: if this situation is permanent and if not, how long it will be off (it remains off on this column's deadline of 8/3). So, two of the five Milwaukee IBOC stations are down (the other three: WOKY 920, WISN 1130, WJYI 1340). (Ed.-WI)
- **1690 WVON IL Berwyn.** Carries some of the Chicago Sky WNBA games. It's been ten months already since WVON moved to 1690, but no noticeable gain in listeners yet, to their disappointment. **(KO-IL)**

Narrators, News Junkies, Sports Jockeys, Tattletales, Tipsters, Toastmasters and Coffee Klatch Couples Who Verbalized the Jargon of the Aural Ether from the 1920's to the 1980's---A Biographical Dictionary

Prolific old time radio historian and author Jim Cox has written another book. The subtitle almost eliminates the need for a review as it clearly explains the book.

Okay, what is it with the title? I have not interviewed the author about his thought processes, but my interpretation follows. Jim has written a great number of media history books, most of them about old time radio, but at least one about television, soap operas in the early days of that medium.

So, having covered radio music, soap operas, crime fighters, audience participation shows, and the transition years when television took over radio network resources and audiences, the author, in an effort to be comprehensive in his coverage of old time radio, decided that the categories previously written about had not covered a huge number of radio people who were not crime fighters, cowboy stars, soap opera characters, musicians, or comedians. This book covers the important other radio onair personalities, and his subtitle explains whom they might be.

The more prosaic titles of the persons referred to in the subtitle are announcers, newscasters, sportscasters, showbiz reporters, consultants, masters of ceremonies, and husband and wife chat teams.

Anyone with some knowledge of radio's "golden age" will likely think that Drew Pearson, Walter Winchell, Hedda Hopper, Art Linkletter, and Edward R. Murrow would be covered in this book. They are. So is at least one still active radio artist. You may guess who that is. Two clues: he seems to have an eternal career, and his first name is Paul.

The format of this book is a short biography of each audio arts performer, listed in alphabetical order. In most cases, listings include birth dates and places, date and place of death if applicable, position or positions (announcer, emcee, etc.), radio program names and dates, and any movie roles and television jobs during or after the individual's radio career.

A tremendous index is included listing personality names, radio networks, radio programs, movie titles, and television programs.

Amount of data about each performer ranges from a few lines for more obscure individuals up to five pages for one of the most famous persons, Edward R. Murrow. The average entry is about one half page.

I didn't count them, but the author states in his preface, and I believe him, that 569 performers are covered in the text itself, with another 592 listed in the appendix. Appendix listings are one or two lines each, showing name, title, and networks. Pages? 360, including the index.

Most of the persons included were on network programs; regionally famous individuals are not likely to be covered if they never made it to a network (ABC, CBS, NBC, MBS) slot. However, the data for those covered will often indicate local stations on which they started or were on the air during or after their network positions.

One commendable aspect of this book is that it is not all praise. Most personalities were mostly known by their work and for positive reasons. However, Jim is not afraid to mention some of the issues that pertain to a few of the performers; issues such as arrogance or too much fondness of the bottle. But these are mentioned only if pertinent to the story and if evidence exists; this is not a down and dirty tell-all by any means.

The book has been published this year by McFarland, , phone 800-253-2187. Of course, you are welcome to contact me should you want to discuss the book, or find out more about it.

Is the book for everyone? Nope, but it is my kind of old time radio book, perfect for reading while a slow baseball game is on TV. There may be a few more readers out there like me, as Jim keeps turning out these interesting products. On the other hand, I expect that he enjoys his work too much to quit.

It's BOISE 2007!

National Radio Club and WTFDA Club in a Joint Convention

Here are details of what is planned for the 2007 National Radio Club Convention. First of all, we are holding a joint convention with the Worldwide TV-FM DX Association, the WTFDA. And they will be hosting this first joint venture in Boise, Idaho over the Labor Day weekend, with Frank Aden as the Master of Ceremonies. Some of you may know Frank as a pre-eminent historian of Idaho broadcasting, both radio and TV.

Now, those of us who have attended NRC Conventions have always paid a large registration fee that included a banquet on Saturday night. This year, at Frank's suggestion, we are not including the price of ANY meal in the registration fee. This keeps the registration cost low and lets each attendee select each meal, and where to eat.

This Rodeway Inn hotel has been used in years past for radio conventions so we know it will have just the amenities we need, and if the weather cooperates, there is a large area around their outdoor pool that should be a great place to tune for stations you've only ever dreamed of hearing from your east-coast or mid-west home.

The program will begin on Friday morning around 11 o'clock with a tour of a Boise television station, and Frank has arranged it so the group can sit in and watch how their noon newscast is put together and broadcast. Friday night, Frank is going to speak on the history of Idaho's earliest radio and TV stations.

Saturday will be filled with a tour of the local radio transmitting sites around Boise for those who want to see where the signals are coming from. For others, the hotel meeting room will be open for musing and swapping stories or demonstrating what you have brought with you to the convention. In the evening after dinner, we will hear about how our two clubs are doing. Frank Aden will present some video about the DuMont Television Network, and that will be followed by the annual auction.

Sunday will include the annual "Candy Quiz" for the early risers, followed by the annual "National Radio Club Examination" for those who wish to compete for a free full-year's membership in the NRC. There should be time for a visit to 7100-foot Deer Point where the Boise FM and TV transmitters are located in the hills just outside of town.

Sounds pretty good, right? Well, here's what to do:

1. Call the Rodeway Inn (Rodeway Inn, 1115 N. Curtis Road, Boise, ID 83706) now at 208-376-2700 for your room reservations. Be sure to tell them you will be attending the National Radio Club convention. Remember that the program events start Friday morning, August 31, and the convention winds up after lunch on Sunday, September 2. You can stay longer, of course, but I know many people like to beat the Labor Day traffic rush on Monday. The room rate, including tax, for one person is \$67.75 -- but the great news is that two can stay in the same room for exactly that same total price! And a third person can be in the room for only an additional \$8; \$20.34 if you want a roll-away bed. So three people could split a room for less than \$30 a night if you want to make those arrangements.

MOST important: You MUST make your room reservation by August 15. We will be checking with the Rodeway Inn that day to make final plans for the weekend.

2. You should also send in the Convention Registration payment by August 15. Be sure to include your name, mailing address, a phone number and your e-mail address if you have one. We need all those things so we can notify you of any last-minute change in the plans. The Registration fee is \$15, and if you're bringing a spouse, the spouse will only be charged \$10! Children get in free.
