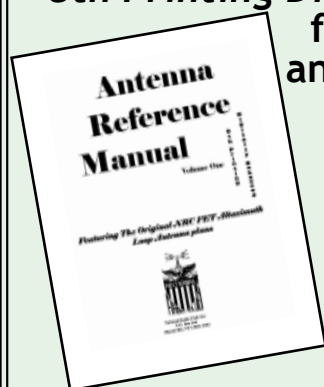

☐ Reference **Applications** above: Both **CKBD** and **CBU** go back to the 1920's. CKBD was CJOR for several decades. CBU started in 1925 or so as CNRV (operated by the Canadian National Railways), and later as CRCV when the Canadian Radio Broadcasting Commission (CRBC) took the station over in 1932-33. Then the calls became CBR when the CBC took over the CRBC, and finally CBU. [via **Deane McIntyre**]

☐ Changes coming in H-Town: The BizRadio Network plans to start broadcasting on a new frequency and its own station in the Houston area on Feb. 1, with plans for stations in other markets. The organization purchased KTEK-1110 Alvin, Texas, calling it the first in a series of acquisitions and expansions. The station has been owned by Salem. BizRadio is based in Houston and envisions KTEK as its flagship station. BizRadio now leases on KXYZ-1320; the programming is also heard in Dallas-Fort Worth [during the daytime - Ed.] on KMNY-1360. The Houston Chronicle reported the station purchase price at \$7.75 million.

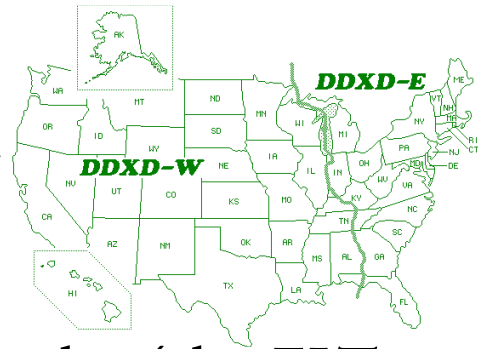

However, sweep tones and morse code were sometimes audible with QRM beneath a slightly nulled WBBM and assumed CFDR (C&W music). QSLed with "The Planet" WBCQ card signed by Allan H. Weiner. **(EH-MA)**

- 920** **WYBYp** **NY** **Cortland** – 12/20 1616 – "I'm Uncle Charlie and this is "Children's Bible Hour Storytime." In the story, Peter and Becky Jackson are talking about Christmas presents with Nancy, who says she doesn't know much about Jesus. Nancy goes to Becky's house to bake cookies. Signal faded at 1621. Came back in with "later he died for us on the cross... he loved us that much... later he went to heaven... the best gift we can have is Jesus... you need to believe." Children singing. Lots of interference and fading, never heard an ID. **(GL-NY)**
- 1150** **WMRDp** **CT** **Middletown** – 12/16 1644 – Instrumental music, then Connecticut Lighting Centers ad. Lots of interference. **(GL-NY)**

- 1500 WLQVp MI **Detroit** – 12/28 0634 – male talk show host says “our listeners here in Detroit”, then faded out. Poor. **(GL-NY)**
- 1580 CKDOP ON **Oshawa** – 12/28 0656 – “The Wanderer” under/over a lot of static and noise, then another oldie sung by a man. “107.7 and 1580” non-ID said by man. Poor. **(GL-NY)**

- 540 WETC NC **Zebulon** – 12/10 1622 – SS talk, male, with telephone caller named Roberto. Song with male vocalist, then faded into hip hop music. Faded back in with male announcer, mentioning “la economia”, “Hispanic center”, and presidential candidates John McCain, Ron Paul, Duncan Hunter and Mike Huckabee. “Boulevard... in Raleigh” heard twice in SS. Much fading. **(GL-NY)**
- 550 WDEV VT **Waterbury** - 12/19 2140 - Stowe-Harvard high school hockey game, multiple IDs for WDEV, into ads. Fair to good. **(TM-MA)**
- 560 WMIK KY **Middlesboro** – 12/14 2230 – ads for business “...in Middlesboro, on US25E...”, ID, into Southern Gospel music, announcer had strong mountain accent. Heard on my SRF-59 with local WFIL-Philadelphia nulled. **(JC-DE)**
- WSVA VA **Harrisonburg** – 12/6 1639 – “Question of the Day” – why seeing so many mass shootings? Man answers that maybe it’s the media: violent films, video games, etc., “anything that dehumanizes human beings.” Then announcer says “hi, you’re on WSVa”. Faded. **(GL-NY)**
- WKRC OH **Cincinnati** – 12/13 1638 – “mornings at five on KRC... the talk station...” popped out and immediately faded. **(GL-NY)**
- 570 WKBN OH **Youngstown** – 12/20 0603 – Road construction news, including Route 11. News about Congressional spending bill, mentioning “Valley congressmen.” Mercer County mention. PA Attorney General quote about toys, then “WKBN newstime...” Weather included 40s on Sunday; mention of WKBN.com. Poor reception. **(GL-NY)**
- 580 WKTY WI **La Crosse** – 12/16 0205 – over CJCL-590 slop with promo for Packers football on “Western Wisconsin’s sports leader, 580 WKTY” into Sporting News Radio. **(MKB-ON)**
- +++ 12/15 2248 – Over under CFRA and CKWW with Bucks-Timberwolves basketball. ID at 2302 as “Western Wisconsin’s sports leader 5-80 WKTY, La Crosse”. **(NW-BR)**
- WKSK NC **West Jefferson** – 12/6 1700 – ABC News, then ad for Ford dealership in West Jefferson. “WKSK newstime”. Faded. **(GL-NY)**
- WCHS WV **Charleston** – 12/6 1705 – Weather report: 22 degrees overnight, snow north of Ohio River, sleet and freezing rain to south; precipitation very light. Meteorologist says “I think we’ll pretty much dodge this one.” Then announcer says “it’s 7 after 5... in Charleston... WCHS.” Reception spotty, much fading. **(GL-NY)**
- WGAC GA **Augusta** – 12/7 0558 – “Newstalk WGAC” into CBS News, then Garman ad. Faded into noise. **(GL-NY)**
- 590 VOXM NL **St. John’s** - 12/14 1500 - In local pre-sunset co-channel. “You are listening to five ninety VOXM St. John’s” followed by local news. ID caught several additional times during news cast. See 650 observation for related info. **(DL-ME)**
- WMBS PA **Uniontown** – 12/21 0710 – morning sports report on Pitt Panthers college basketball and Pittsburgh Penguins NHL, several mentions of Uniontown and WMBS, local QRM at 0715 wiped them out. No sign of WARM, maybe off-air or reduced power due to recent ice storm? **(JC-DE)**
- WROW NY **Albany** – 12/7 0607 – “Newstalk five-ninety WROW News” by female voice. Heard on 592 kHz. Poor. **(GL-NY)**
- 600 WMT IA **Cedar Rapids** – 12/15 2233 – Fox news and ID as “News radio 600 WMT”. **(NW-BR)**
- WSOM OH **Salem** – 12/7 0608 – “AM... WSOM” into “Can’t Smile Without You” by Barry Manilow. Faded into waves of static. **(GL-NY)**
- 610 WIP PA **Philadelphia** - 12/24 2308 - Sports Radio WIP ID, ads for Eagles broadcasting event, another ID. Poor to fair, lots of co-channel QRM, including a Fox news affiliate -- maybe WTVN in Columbus? **(TM-MA)**
- 620 WRJZ TN **Knoxville** – 12/20 0558 – over WTMJ with “32 degrees at Joy 620 WRJZ” ID

- at end of Radio Bible Hour program. **(MKB-ON)**
- WZON ME Bangor** - 12/24 2255 - ad for Oriental J, Sports Radio ID with calls; good in WVMT null. **(TM-MA)**
 +++ - 12/28 0631 - "On radio six-twenty WZON" singing ID, then man with "on Broadway in Bangor". Local news covering an auto accident; Maine congressional delegation response to Bhutto assassination; 98% reduction in mercury levels in fish in New England. Good reception, some talk underneath. **(GL-NY)**
- 630 WMFD NC Wilmington** - 12/15 2135 - ID with Charlotte-Atlanta NBA game. **(JC-DE)**
WPRO RI Providence - 12/28 0628 - Ad mentioning Rhode Island; mattress ad; bakery ad; credit card relief ad with phone number 1-866-290-6868. Then "on WPRO" by woman, "on the WPRO morning... black ice... good morning, I'm Bill..." Lots of static and interference. **(GL-NY)**
- 640 WHLO OH Akron** - 12/23 2320 - ID just as the station surfaced through Cuba, into sports talk show. Poor, with het. **(TM-MA)**
- 650 CKGA NL Gander** - 12/14 1500 - Gander weather forecast & VOXM call sign observed several times. "For the Gander area tonight's weather available 24 hours a day at VOXM.com" This audio was reduced from the same dsp file at the VOXM observation at 590 kHz. The stations were not simulcasting. There was no news on CKGA, just the weather forecast followed by music. The program was apparently unique to the Gander emitter. There is a separate CKGA web page, which indicates that the format is musical and that CKGA is part of the "VOXM Radio Network". **(DL-ME)**
- WSM TN Nashville** - 12/24 2245 - Merry Christmas ID, and into more country holiday music. A regular here, good signals usually, with a nice mix of old country in the late evenings. **(TM-MA)**
- 740 KRMG OK Tulsa** - 12/7 2030 - dominant with "News Talk KRMG" ID. **(DA-SC)**
CHWO ON Toronto - 12/9 1727 - Male singing "Your Light Still Shining in My Heart", then male announcer with Irish/Scots accent says "congratulations to Dylan... the show must go on, right?" Ad for store in Toronto, then "a little breath of Scotland on Prime Time Radio, AM seven-forty." Decent reception with some fading. **(GL-NY)**
- 760 WCPS NC Tarboro** 12/27 1700* - Under WJR; s/off announcement with St. Andrew Street, Tarboro address, "You are invited to join us again tomorrow morning ...music, news, and information on AM 760 WCPS." New log! **(BC-NH)**
- 770 WYRV VA Cedar Bluff** - 12/21 1800* - Under WABC; "You're tuned in to WYRV AM 770 in Cedar Bluff, Virginia," and s/off announcement. New log! **(BC-NH)**
- 780 WCXH ME Monticello** - 12/13 1400 - "From America's most northeastern broadcast facility, this is the Channel X Radio Network, WCXU Caribou, Presque Isle, Westfield; 98.1 WCXV, Van Buren, St. Leonard, Grand Falls; 102.3 WCXX Madawaska and...; 103.1 W276AY Fort Kent ... St. John's Plantation; its 2pm 3 Atlantic" CNN Net **(DL-ME)**
- CFDR NS Halifax** - 12/18 2257 - country music, ID at 2300 for CFDR Kicks, good in WBBM null. **(TM-MA)**
- 790 WPIC PA Sharon** - 12/26 0846 - over nulled CIGM with local weather, promo for Liberty v. Farrell high school basketball on "News talk 790 WPIC, the Valley's talk". **(MKB-ON)**
CIGM ON Sudbury - 12/9 1736 - "CIGM" by male announcer. Discussion of Timothy Elliott lottery scam, then "coming up next on CIGM is Toby Keith." Reception poor. **(GL-NY)**
- 830 WTRU NC Kernersville** - 12/10 0527 - "1-877-LOVE GOD... join us in celebrating God's truth... you're a vital part of this ministry." Mention of lwf.org. "Tomorrow... complete our lesson on honoring your father and mother." Mention of North Carolina and WTRU.com. Lots of fading. **(GL-NY)**

Taylor adds: Having splurged for \$14.99 on Amazon for a Sony SRF-59, I'm listening again to MW in my spare moments. It's great fun to try to hear DX with the little radio, which is remarkably sensitive. It's also good at evading the electrical noise around here, which is so prevalent. Some day I'll have to drive up to Rockport and point my little radio east, and see what comes in! (*Welcome Taylor!* - Bruce)

Doug says: Cuba booms in here. The island is 840-1150 miles from here and, despite no antennas that favor south and without auroral conditions, several Cubans dominate most every night. For instance, *Reloj* 570 and *Progreso* 640 and 900 are usually on top. In fact, over 10% of my stations logged here are Cubans - 36 of 328. New *Reloj* loggings this week are 930, probably CMJS, and 880 CMAF, for a total of 13 *Reloj* stations. Besides the two dominant *Progreso* stations, 630, 690, 730, 740, 750, 760, 810, 890, and 900 are sometimes heard as parallels. On the evening of Dec 15 (UTC) with slightly auroral conditions, all twenty three of the above *Reloj* and *Progreso* stations were logged. Next time I'll list the *Rebelde* and other Cubans heard here at the new South Carolina QTH during the couple of months I've been DXing. High latitude conditions were somewhat enhanced evening of Dec 17 with TA carriers and a bit of audio on 549, 558, 567, 756, 756, 774, 1044, 1089, 1134, 1152, 1206, 1305, and 1602 kHz.

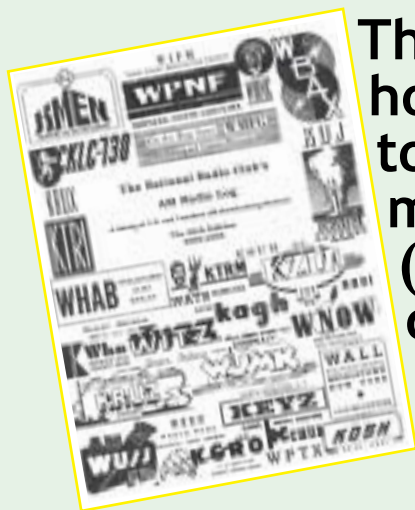

Brett speaks

LBI-6 marked my 5th consecutive year at the Long Beach Island Dxpediton. Personal schedule changes resulted in the smallest number of attendees in the past several years, meaning we could all fit into one DX room at the hotel. This reduced the amount of setup time and simplified the coax routing and splitting, although I certainly missed everyone who couldn't be there. I hope the live web video feed from the DX room and IRC chat on #mwdx allowed them to experience a little bit of the excitement (although I imagine looking at the backs of five guys sitting at radios for hours on-end got a little boring.)

Our antenna deployment on Friday went well this year, with no interruptions by the local police or curious fishermen. We had once again taken the precaution of sending a letter (on ARRL stationery) to the local city government ahead of time to alert them of our activities, and were able to get the beverage-on-the-ground antennas (BOGs) deployed before the rains came. The standard 750' EuroBOG (at 33 degrees) and 900' Southern BOG (at 213 degrees) were laid out along the base of the dune fence and buried at the vehicle and footpath crossings. When we were rolling up the BOGs on Sunday, we discovered one place where a BOG was pulled out and exposed by someone at a crossing creating a tripping hazard, but there were no breaks in either wire this year. Once again, the BOG's fan terminations appeared to provide the required grounding as directionality of north vs. south wires was noticeable.

On Saturday, we put out the broadband loops, and this year was the debut of Bruce Collier's 7-foot "alumiloop" BBL, fabricated on-site from aluminum windowframe hardware. The alumiloop was deployed at a bearing of 130/310 degrees, while our other BBL (a Mark Connelly-designed 6') was aimed at 80/260 degrees. Both loops were amplified with DX Engineering RPA-1 16 db pre-amps (one with a single amp and the other with two cascading amplifiers) and the consensus of the group was that the loops provided as good, if not better, signal levels compared to the BOGs and reduced the annoying television interference (TVI) levels considerably. We may rethink our use of BOGs in favor of BBLs in the future, as they are much easier to deploy.

We tracked the solar conditions for several months prior to the DXpedition and all signs pointed to low numbers; on Friday both A and K indices were at 1 while on Saturday A spiked up to 5. However, the consensus of the group was that the conditions this year were very middle-of-the road, with no real standouts other than Saturday night's good reception of Iceland on 189 kHz. While the trans-Atlantic stations started to appear as early as 3:45 PM EST, reception both nights was mediocre, although our logs totaled nearly 30 countries on LW and MW. No sign of TP signals, once again.

The biggest change this year was the closure of the Greenhouse Cafe (our normal breakfast location) due to renovations, which led to us to discover another (even better?) restaurant, ScoJo's, a few blocks down the beach (billed as the "best breakfast spot on LBI"). Once again, we had many interesting discussions on topics like AM radio, IBOC, our best receptions, and personalities in the radio hobby over waffles and breakfast skilletts. LBI-6 is one for the books, and I look forward to next year!

Bruce speaks:

Once again the Drifting Sands Motel cheerfully welcomed "the radio guys" as we transformed room 126 into the "DX Inn" for LBI-6. I don't think they quite understand us, but we cause no trouble, we bring \$\$\$ to the beach in November, and we pretty much clean up after ourselves, so they seem happy enough to rent to this strange bunch. Unlike the Newfie gang who saw their former DX Inn go downhill to being unusable, our DX Inn has actually improved from a bare-bones weather-beaten beach motel that in 2002 browned out to 82 volts(!) into a remodeled version with a new third floor and internet service. It's nice to have internet, but with that and all the new RCA TVs which probably aren't as well made as the old ones, TVI/hash has become a real problem. My noise floor was about s3-s7 much of the weekend. Some channels were unusable; others could be used in USB or LSB only, depending on which side the hash was. Brett had brought a couple of noise reducing transformer boxes, and these did seem to help on the bogs a bit. Relocating is tough---we all agree nowhere else in NJ will be better. And if you go south, you start to lose TA strength---north and you get into the

NYC RF jungle.

Setup was smooth with good weather—no curious police or other distractions. Also, due to career moves and conflicts, we only had 5 DX'ers this year, so we could use just one radio room, eliminating a set of splitters and cables for the 2nd room.

As for conditions, I'd say fair. I've been here when there were NO TA's (2002) and when there was something on every channel (2003). This likely ranks 3rd out of the 6 LBI's so far. My personal highlight was finally hearing Iceland 189 with good audio—a first in 30 years of DX'ing! We did have some interesting moments, such as 2-3 stations fighting on 1215, one of which we believe was the Russian. Conditions rose and fell quite often; I think with less TVI, I'd have been able to snag Russia on LW, but it was tough down there—so bad that I didn't even beacon chase much. Chatting online with Marc DeLorezno who had been at a Cape Cod DX GTG at Chris Black's the same Saturday, they found conditions mediocre as well.

I brought the stuff to make a 7 foot broadband loop onsite—I used aluminum window screen framing and dubbed it the Alumiloop. It proved to be a bit wobbly, but it held together and seemed to work fine. Once I got home and deployed it here, it promptly laid folded over, but it still works--about 2 inches off the ground! Seems to be a winner, with better signals below 700khz than my old 6' Connolly version. We also had Brett's 6 foot Connolly-design BBL, and there is talk of a possible spring LBI using just BBL's, no bogs. We shall see....

Our usual breakfast spot was closed for renovations, but we found a good 2nd choice. Bill Harms was kind enough to stop at the Manahawkin Pizza Hut and pick up Friday's dinner as he arrived later than the rest of us, and we found out Subway on LBI is closed Saturday night—but the Wawa mini-market nearby turned out decent subs, so we didn't starve. All in all, another fun weekend with good friends, food, and DX. Beats a good day at work!

Russ speaks-

With 6 LBI DXpeditions now in my rearview mirror, I can say that we've had great conditions (2005), very good conditions (2006), average conditions (and 2004), auroral conditions (2002) and just plain poor conditions (2003). 2006 had our largest number of participants – 8, while tied for the smallest – 5.

We've certainly become much more adept at setup, organization and breakdown, and we've collectively (although the lion's share still comes from "Saylor Electronics") acquired a solid collection of splitters, amps, matching transformers, coax, coax switches, plugs and adaptors. Along the way, we've added BBL's to the mix, a wireless router, the DX chatroom, and the webcam. This year also yielded more audio recordings as well. The ability to DX in concert with others via email and the chatroom on both sides of the Atlantic during the weekend also enhances the experience and also adds some efficiency.

We considered adding a 3rd day for this year's event, but in retrospect, we'd not have had good enough DX conditions to support it – especially had we added the extra day at the end, as the geo-magnetic indices spiked again on Monday – something that's happened a couple of times before. And this year's experience certainly proves that while the best advance planning in tracking solar activity for the prior 3 months yielded optimum numbers, that still didn't yield the expected results.

As has been noted, we spent considerable time talking about alternate sites, but given the limitations imposed by proximity to New York, lengthening the TA paths or lack of direct access or even accommodations on the beach, coupled with some greatly-increased travel times, we've decided to continue where we've been, but to work toward minimizing the effects of the inevitable TVI by going for more and better BBL's.

Bottom line, though, it's still the overall experience that counts the most, with annual reunions of friends gathering to DX, share memories, play DX recordings and talk DX.

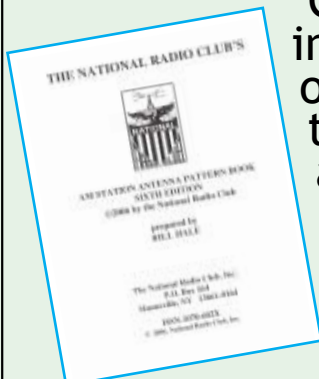
