75 YEARS AGO – From the August 1937 issue of *DX News* – This will be the last issue of *DX News* published from York by editor and club president R.H. Weaver, who is stepping down for reasons of health. If someone does not come forward to take on the editorship of *DX News* by August 21, the NRC will be folded into one of the other existing DX clubs.

50 YEARS AGO – From the September 15, 1962 issue of *DX News* – The full membership was informed of the shocking and tragic news of the deaths of Harold Wagner, Carroll Seth, and Francis Nittler in an auto accident on August 31, while they were traveling to Indianapolis for the NRC convention. The passing of two other NRC members, Grant Batson, 46 and longtime member Pat Reilley, 67, was also announced.

25 YEARS AGO – From the September 21, 1987 issue of *DX News* – A news clipping discussed the 300 kW Cuban station broadcasting on 1040 and 1160 kHz and how WHO and KSL had taken a number of 5-minute silent periods at the FCC's request to measure the Cuban station's strength.

10 YEARS AGO – From the September 16, 2002 issue of *DX News* – Mark Connelly published an article on the construction and testing of flag antennas; WIBW-580 is in the process of buying out KKSU-580, which will end one of the last remaining share-time station arrangements.

Bright Lights, Tall Antennas?: The following was moved from the "Hear and Thar" section of Bill Hale's final AM Switch for space reasons – but is an interesting tale nonetheless.

"The FCC has begun granting tower owners permission to modify the lighting on their structures. Station owners have applied to turn off some of their tower lights, hoping to save some money in power costs. Officially, the reason for the change is that federal wildlife biologists and other wildlife experts believe fewer migratory birds would die each year if steady red obstruction lights for towers taller than 351 feet were turned off while blinking lights are left on. Broadcasters have never believed that towers caused an inordinate amount of bird deaths, pointing to studies that indicate cats, buildings and windows caused more bird deaths. However, the issue has dragged on for years. Eventually, the FAA bought into the change and the FCC said it would follow that agency's lead on the issue. The FAA agreed the change would not affect air safety and updated its tower obstruction lighting standards: Advisory Circular 70/7460-1K, Obstruction Marking and Lighting.

"Once getting the nod from the FAA, the tower owner must then apply to the FCC, also electronically, to turn off the specific lights. When the lights have been turned off, the tower owner then needs to notify the FCC for each structure individually. Already, six applications have already been granted and three are pending. Officially, the FCC applications are for the modification for Antenna Structure Registrations. The agency doesn't distinguish between, say, a request from someone who owns a cell tower or a broadcast tower. Some structures are used for both."

930	KHJ	CA	Los Angeles – CP granted to move their facilities to that of the 6-tower array of KYPA-1230 and KBLA-1580 at 35-05-08/118-15-24 (near the intersection of California 187 and South Fairfax Avenue) while remaining U2 5000/5000 . Although the new nighttime pattern and effective coverage area closely resembles that of the current set-up, it appears that KHJ's new coverage area will be slightly reduced due to the following factors: the KYA/KBLA towers are all about 60% as tall as the current ones; and the CP calls for three nighttime towers , compared to the current two, altering the pattern. However, the reduced nighttime coverage is still headed 'out to sea' as the pattern is still headed to the southwest from the site northeast of Los Angeles.

- 1340 WMTE FL Manatee – Is operating with U1 500/500 under an STA, as the application states: “After having to vaciate [sic]the licensed site and the STA approved second site due to vacate orders from the two different landlords a third site has been selected than can be purchased. WMTE is currently dark and would like to return to the air. A STA is needed to operate at the new site until a construction permit has been issued. A FCC Form 301 to be filed is ready for filing making this the perminent wnte antenna site.” [And you thought this job was easy, hi]
- 1420 WIMS IN Michigan City – Licensed for U4 5000/5000 from five towers (2-day/5-night), WIMS has been operating under an STA since January with U4 5000/1250 due to failure of their phasing components. This extends the STA as the required licensed parameters have not yet been met. WIMS also corrects their coordinates to 41-40-40/86-56-10.
- 1430 KCWK NV Laughlin – This new station, not yet on the air, had a CP for U4 5000/370 at North Las Vegas. This action grants a change in their City-of-License to Laughlin and the facilities to U4 50000/310.
- 1490 KLZN CA Susanville – This new, unbuilt station, had a CP for U1 1000/920. This action grants their request for U1 1000/970.
- 1510 WQUL SC Woodruff – CP granted to build a new 193' tower at the present site with D1 930/0 CH 280. The new tower will be slightly taller than the present structure, so the day power had to be reduced from 1000 Watts to theoretically cover the same area. However, they were allowed to increase the CH power from 250 Watts.
- 1580 KLNQ WY Evansville – New station, not yet on the air, has been granted a change in City-of-License change from Casper, remaining U1 1000/220.

- ✿ **Returning to the airwaves: WGFP-940 Webster, Massachusetts** has returned with C&W programming; **KCOX-1350 Jasper, Texas** is back on with Talk: *1350 NewsTalk*.
- ✿ **Reported as silent: WBZR-1000 Robertsedale, Alabama; WRAR-1000 Tappahannock, Virginia; WIWA-1160 St. Cloud, FL; WXBR-1460 Brockton, Massachusetts.**
- ✿ **Fines: WDSR-1340 Lake City, Florida:** \$3200 [reduced from the initial \$7000] plus other sanctions for violations involving license renewal mis-statements and unauthorized operation of the station; **KRZE-1280 Farmington, New Mexico:** \$7000 for late filing of renewal application and subsequent unauthorized operation [station has been deleted from the FCC database].
- ✿ **News Item: WWVB UPDATE** – National Institute of Standards and Technology radio station WWVB conducted more tests in an effort to improve its signal penetration. The station, near Fort Collins, Colorado, tested a phase-modulated broadcast format from August 21 through August 24. WWVB continuously broadcasts time and frequency signals at 60 kHz. The carrier frequency provides a stable frequency reference traceable to the national standard. WWVB is also used for high level applications such as network time synchronization and frequency calibrations. During the test period the broadcast randomly switched between the normal WWVB broadcast and the new phase-modulated broadcast format, according to station Broadcast Manager John Lowe. Radio-controlled clocks and watches will not be affected by the test. The station conducted similar tests in June.
- ✿ **News Item: New Sports Radio Networks** – CBS and NBC launched duelling sports radio networks on Tuesday, September 4. CBS Sports Radio isn't due to begin long-form programming until January, but one-minute updates are being offered during the daytime for now. CBS and NBC compete with ESPN, FOX, Yahoo!, and Sports Byline USA in the crowded sports radio field, not to mention sportscasts offered by news networks such as ABC and AP.

- 690 CKGM QC Montreal** – 8/31 2300 – Noted testing with sound clips from various sports talk shows. Not quite a done deal, but they plan to flip to FF sports talk in 2013, pending CRTC approval of Bell’s purchase of Astral Media. (MKB-ON)
 +++ - 9/2 2359 – With talk of the MSL game between the Montreal Impact and DC United, rolled through the top of the hour with no ID, although ID and testing announcement has been heard at other times. (BT-PE) “TSN Radio” began regular programs on 690 as of 9/4, with // continuing on 990 for about 3 months. Mike.

UNIDs

- 630 UNID --** - 9/4 0620 – Seemingly locally-originated morning drive talk with male host, very difficult to make out much. One “AM 6-30” heard, then lost when the Radio Progreso, Cuba transmitter abruptly came up at 0630. Seems the only possibilities with this format and at this time for my location would be, maybe in order: WMAL, Washington DC; WPRO, Providence RI; or WLAP, Lexington KY. Rhode Island would be sweet, but doubt Progreso will be down on future checks just before my local sunrise again. - 970 WFLA FL **Tampa** – 8/11 1545 – Local station, not DX, but amusing that the brokered real estate advice program revealed itself as apparently originating out of Miami with this malfunction: at 1552, a male canned "News Radio 6-10, WIOD, and FM 100.3, your official hurricane station." Canned WIOD ID again at 1559 but quickly clipped just as the FM quote portion began, and into a proper WFLA ID, into live local and FOX net news. So, don't believe every ID. (TLK-FL)

It's WDVH, with the 720 simulcast (not audible at this hour) being WRZN, Hernando. Confirmed the one via streaming from WDVH's website. (TLK-FL)
- 1050 KLOH MN **Pipestone** – 8/24 0637 – Fair with ad for drugstore, local weather, temperature 72 degrees, call letter ID. (JJR-MI)
- 1060 KFIL MN **Preston** – 8/24 0737 – Poor, woman with station promo "for complete news, your source is KFIL Crossfield(?)-Preston." (JJR-MI)
- KNLV NE **Ord** – 8/24 2200 – Very poor with KYW faded, ToH legal ID into ABC news and oldies. (JJR-MI)
- 1070 WAPI AL **Birmingham** – 8/19 0354 – PSA for some Alabama school sports organization, "WAPI... Birmingham's Talk Radio" slogan. (TLK-FL)
- 1150 WLLI PA **Huntingdon** – 8/8 2000 – Country music with ID on the hour. "'Willy,' WLLI Huntingdon, Mt. Union." Ad for Allensville Tru Value. Good signal most of the time. (HJH-PA)

- 1230 KTRF MN **Thief River Falls** – 8/13 0600 – Poor in graveyard mess with clear legal ToH ID into CBS news. (JJR-MI)
- WCMC NJ **Wildwood** – 8/13 2323 – Weak, steady signal with ID for //WMID-1340, "Another South Jersey Classic on AM 1340 WMID." (HJH-PA)
- WMML NY **Glens Falls** – 8/13 2329 – On top briefly with ID, "The Hudson's Valley Sports Leader WMML." Fox Sports Radio. (HJH-PA)
- WBLQ RI **Westerly** – 8/16 2205 – ID rising above clutter briefly: "WBLQ Westerly, Stonington." (HJH-PA)

 in Cantú the only one in the state. [Hauser-OK] SEP 5 1200 – Canned ID exactly at 1200:
 "Está Ud. escuchando La Ranchera de Paquimé XETX en los 540 de la banda de AM con
 5000 wats de potencia, y XHTX en 90.5 de la banda de FM con 25000 wats de potencia..."
 followed by address at Calle Jesús Urueta 502 (WRTH says #504, but #502 is correct, as I
 have received correspondence from them); ID also mentions *Grupo DM Radio* affiliation;

- 560 **MEXICO** XEXZ Lupe, Zac. AUG 25 1119 – Canned promo for FM 93.3, then live DJ with phone numbers, mentions Zacatecas, music. Weak but clear signal; where are all the other Mexican and U.S. stations? Held up past 1130. [Hauser-OK]
- 560 **MEXICO** unID SEP 3 1155 – 6:55 time check, mentions "La Triple O," so I'm hoping there is an XEOOO listed, but not, nor any other triple-letter call. Nor any triple-anything on FM related to 560 kHz. [Hauser-OK]
- 570 **CUBA** *R.Reloj*, Santa Clara JUL 15 0100 – Man and woman talk, ticks, ID and timecheck "Radio Reloj, exactamente... nueve de la noche"; huge, annihilating WMCA. [Connelly-MA]
- 570 **MEXICO** XEJB Monterrey, NL AUG 16 1124 – News by man and woman alternating, mentions Montemorelos, Nuevo León, 6:24 timecheck, also mentions Monterrey. No doubt per Cantú it is XEJB *Radio 570* Monterrey 5,000 500, and 630 XEFB was also in, q.v. [Hauser-OK]
- 580 **PUERTO RICO** WKAQ San Juan JUL 11 0200 – Man and woman in Spanish, WKAQ ID; over jumble. [Connelly-MA]
- 590 **CUBA** *R.Musical Nacional*, Santa Clara SEP 5 0400 – Under WEZE; presumed this with choral national anthem. [Conti-NH]
- 590 **MEXICO** XEPH México, DF AUG 16 1127 – Temp a chilly 13 grados en "la más caliente," text numbers, romantic music. Prime suspect is XEPH in Mexico City, official name La Sabrosita, heard a couple weeks ago with non-ID as "Radio Paco," presumably the DJ's nickname. Elsewhere in Mexico, there are stations whose prime name is "La Más Kaliente" with a K. But googling on "La Más Caliente" 590 goes right to XEPH as it is one of their sub-slogans. Cool temp also fits for hi-elevation Mexico City pre-sunrise. [Hauser-OK]
- 590 **MEXICO** XECJU Puerto Vallarta, Jal. SEP 3 1157 – ID sounds like XETJU, or maybe referred to FM XHTJU. So naturally I figure it's got to be in Tijuana, but none on 590. Instead Cantú shows XECJU *La Explosiva*, Puerto Vallarta 10,000 5,000. [Hauser-OK]
- 600 **PUERTO RICO** WYEL Mayagüez JUL 11 0200 – Talk with "Puertoriqueno" mention parallel 580 WKAQ; mixed with domestics. [Connelly-MA]
- 610 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, multiple sites JUL 11 0201 – 9-note Rebelde sounder; over WIOD and WGIR. [Connelly-MA]
- 620 **MEXICO** XEBU Chihuahua, Chih. SEP 1 1201 – Long national anthem, followed by shorter state anthem; 5 minutes total for the two; canned ID as "XHBU La Norteñita 95.7 FM 25000 wats y XEBU 620 AM con 10000 wats de potencia para el estado grande..." followed by address in Colonia Zarco, agreeing with 2012 WRTH; music and canned slogans followed. Fair and alone for a while but eventually faded. [Wilkins-CO] SEP 3 1204 – National anthem by band, then another anthem: yes, it's Chihuahua's with vocal by male, so per Cantú XEBU *La Norteñita* + FM 91.7. [Hauser-OK]
- 627.5 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, unknown site SEP 4 1024 – Not sure if this is back or I simply haven't noticed it for awhile, but it's a strong het when not using USB mode to avoid, or on a non-SSB radio, such as the Sangean PR-D5. Didn't check for top-end 652.5 potential top-end spur of 640 kHz. No audio, just a big carrier/het. [Krueger-FL]
- 630 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, multiple sites JUL 11 0202 – Female vocal parallel 640 Progreso; under WPRO. [Connelly-MA]
- 630 **HONDURAS** *R.América*, Chuloteca and la Ceiba SEP 4 1036 – Bumped up to local level almost instantly with lots of Tegucigalpa and la Ceiba ads, including spots for auto insurance, mortgage financing, Coke-a-Cola, and a couple repeats of "anti-asthma." (That's what it sounded like anyway, maybe a medication?) IDs and time checks, otherwise news format. By 1058, a low growl and micro-second delay from the weaker one. First time I can recall hearing both long-listed sites on the channel and having never known which one to claim as the site previously. Both were fading down pretty fast after 1105. [Krueger-FL]

- 640 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, two sites JUL 15 0101 – Parallel 650, 660, 690, 750, 900 with Rihanna "We Found Love in a Hopeless Place"; monster-loud, slopping adjacent channels! [Connelly-MA]
- 640 **GADELOUPE** *R.Guadeloupe*, Pointe-a-Pitre JUL 11 0100 – News by man in French; dominant. [Connelly-MA]
- 640 **MEXICO** XEWM *Suprema 64*, San Cristóbal de las Casas, Chis. SEP 5 1102 – Just happened to bring a tight null on *R.Progreso* Cuba to hear the Mexican anthem in progress, male at 1103, "...AM ...Suprema 64" into Mexi-tune. The first or at least only the second Chiapas station I've heard I think. [Krueger-FL]
- 640 **MEXICO** XEHHI Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. AUG 13 1131 – ID for "Radio Uno, Chihuahua." Nice to hear something else from Chihua2 than XEJUA in Juárez. Cantú: XEHHI *R.Uno*, Hidalgo del Parral 10,000 1,000. Today's Enid sunrise is 1148 UT, getting 5-6 minutes later every week. [Hauser-OK]
- 650 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Ciego de Avila JUL 15 0101 – Parallel 640 et al. with Rihanna "We Found Love in a Hopeless Place"; good peak over IBOC. [Connelly-MA]
- 650 **MEXICO** XETNT Los Mochis, Sin. AUG 13 1113- "Buenos Días, Yarderos" show on "Radio 65, 106.5" singing ID. I wasn't sure of that word until I found it on their program schedule at www.chavezradiocast.com for 4-6 a.m. MDT with Alberto Guerrero, "El Fogatero." I still don't know what a yardero and a fogatero are, nor does my dictionary, nor does Google Translate; local slang. Fogatero probably has something to do with fire, arsonist? He sets fire to yards? SEP 1 1159 – "XETNT, Radio 65" ID just as I tune in; a regular from Los Mochis. [Hauser-OK] *Yardero would be a gardener or day laborer.*
- 660 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Jovellanos JUL 6 0900 – Parallel 640, 650 with ID "Radio Progreso, cadena nacional, la onda de la alegría"; atop (!) WFAN. [Connelly-MA]
- 660 **MEXICO** XEEY Aguascalientes, Ags. AUG 19 1121 – This one faded up a couple of times over XEFZ with reggaeton and Spanish dance vocals, several mentions of "102 punto 9 FM" and something pesos, so presume XEEY, listed as simulcast of XHEY "La Kaliente" though no slogan heard. Gone by 1130 with mostly just *R.Progreso* Cuba remaining. [Krueger-FL]
- 660 **MEXICO** XEACB Cd. Delicias, Chih. SEP 1 1205 – Kept talking about carnitas, and Mercado Morelos. While there are such markets all over Mexico, a previous log of OCT 5 last year with more details correlated that with XEACB. SEP 3 0601 – Chihuahua state anthem by tenor and chorus; the keyword to copy is "chihuahuenses." XEACB is the only 660 in the state per Cantú. SEP 6 0600 – Full ID from the only Chihuahua 660 station, and then state song. The third time I've heard it recently without confirming the ID in the volatile Mexican radio scene. [Hauser-OK]
- 660 **MEXICO** XEFZ *ABC Radio/Las Noticias Como Son*, Monterrey, NL AUG 19 1107 – This was a pleasant surprise. Male canned *ABC Radio* ID into "Goin' Out of My Head" by Sérgio Mendes & Brasil 66, another ID, into "You Make Me Feel Brand New" by Jerald Daemyon then the BrasoPortuguese-sung "Desafinado" by Stan Getz/Gilberto Gil. "ABC Radio, 660 AM, las noticias como son" slogans often. Unusual to hear an all-smooth jazz/jazz oldies format station from Mexico. Nicely parallel stream at www.periodicoabc.mx. Signal lost by 1128. [Krueger-FL]
- 660 **MEXICO** XEYG Matías Romero, Oax. SEP 5 1045 – Female canned "660 AM" at 1048, Mexi-tunes, 1059 male "660 Radio Fiesta Mexicana" into choral XE anthem. Mixing with another with Mexi-tunes. Cantu's list has the slogan as "Radio 660" though the 2012 WRTH shows "Fiesta Mexicana." [Krueger-FL]
- 670 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, multiple sites JUL 6 0900 – Rebelde parallel 710; through WRKO slop. [Connelly-MA]
- 680 **MEXICO** XEFO Chihuahua, Chih. SEP 3 1206 – National anthem, then ID mentions "Chihuahua, México," interference. [Hauser-OK]
- 680 **MEXICO** XEORO Guasave, Sin. SEP 1 1206 – "Noticias en Punto" is all I get, but searching on that + 680 leads to (beware of autolaunching audio) megamediosguasave.org which does have such a newscast at 6-8 a.m. and another at 1-2 p.m. MDT, so it is per Cantú XEORO *La Mera Jefa* + FM 93.7 Guasave 1,000 500. SEP 6 1159 – Full ID from "La Mera Jefa" including 93.7 y 680, la radio que manda, Megamedios, Guasave, Sinaloa, 1201 Noticias en Punto. But did not catch any call letters. [Hauser-OK]
- 690 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Santa Clara JUL 15 0101 – Parallel 640 et al. with Rihanna "We Found Love in a Hopeless Place"; very good. [Connelly-MA] SEP 5 0320 – Over CKGM Montreal; romantic vocal parallel 640 kHz, 0400 choral national anthem followed by *R.Progreso* ID. CKGM officially signed on this frequency SEP 4 after weekend tests, moving from 990 kHz where a simulcast is expected to continue for three months. [Conti-NH]
- 700 **MEXICO** XEDKR Guadalajara, Jal. AUG 25 1115 – Weak but steady and unQRMed signal mentioning "1110 AM, Radio Red," so it's the Guadalajara 10 kW relay, XEDKR. SEP 6 1158

– *R.Red* ID and promo, temp as 14.7 degrees, presumably at the flagship hi-altitude DF station XERED, while 700 is XEDKR in Guadalajara; weak but alone on frequency. [Hauser-OK]

700 **MEXICO** XERV *Yo FM*, Villahermosa, Tab. AUG 18 1059 – Male ID, ballad, coral short version anthem from 1102, several slogan IDs. Fair. We're back to the prime 1100 window for XE ID/anthems again, after falling off for a few weeks of then more daylight. [Krueger-FL]

710 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, multiple sites JUL 6 0900 – "Rebelde, la Habana, la emisora de la revolución"; way over WOR. [Connelly-MA]

710 **MEXICO** XEDP Cd. Cuauhtémoc, Chih. AUG 13 1115 – Preacher in Low German. At tune in the accent is so strange that at first I think he's switched to some Indian language until I start to recognize a few standard German words and my mind lox into it; over at 1126 with "XEDP, La Ranchera de Cuauhtémoc" SID; and at 1130, full ID giving priority to their new FM: XHDP 89.7, then XEDP 710. AUG 18 0600 – Looking for Mexican national anthems, but instead hear a different one: since lyric mentions "chihuahuense." I am confident it is Chihua2 and therefore the usual dominator XEDP. A good time to hear the state anthem any



night. There was also an unusual lo het on the frequency; *R.Rebelde* reverberators were nulled. AUG 25 1109 – Still playing the Chihuahua anthem with male singer; then female sings a prayer of some sort; 1111 sign-on or full ID; 1112 right into ranchera music, so no Mennonite preacher today Saturday in Low German or Spanish. [Hauser-OK]

720 **MEXICO** XEDE Saltillo, Coah. SEP 1 0226 – I am trying for KDWN Las Vegas as suggested by Kaz just before local sunset pattern change. I get a good null on WGN, but no KDWN, just Spanish music, and at 0230 fades up for full super-hype ID from XEDE Saltillo, Coahuila, where it's 31 degrees at 9:30. Not quite collinear with WGN, so if I try to null XEDE I get WGN again, no KDWN. [Hauser-OK]

720 **MEXICO** XEAVR *R.Fórmula*, Veracruz, Ver. AUG 19 1059 – Bubbled up with slogan ID a couple of times over the Nicaraguan. [Krueger-FL]

720 **NICARAGUA** *R.Católica*, Managua AUG 19 1056 – Child reciting Rosary with choral music under, ID 1102. Good on my sunrise peak. [Krueger-FL]

730 **MEXICO** XEHB Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. SEP 2 1152 – Lots of AM/FM station hype, then banda music with "La Ke Buena" slogans after each song; short national anthem at 1203, followed by FM/AM ID: "Nombre – Ke Buena; Frecuencias – 107.1 FM, 730 AM; Potencia – 25000 wats; Siglas – XEHB-FM..." then address per WRTH; more music followed after a couple of ads. Generally fair, mixing with XESOS. A new slogan, replacing the distinctive *Radio Viva Villa*. "Ke Buena" seems to be the latest rage in slogans in XE-land, along with new sister FM'ers, all of which seem to be 25 kW. [Wilkins-CO] SEP 3 0503 – Mixture of at least three Spanish on the radio in the bathroom as I am brushing my teeth, positioned to favor N-S paths, yet I make out a "La Ke Buena" slogan mixing with XEX. SEP 4 0502 – "Ke Buena señal, Radiorama, 107.1 FM y 730 AM, son las once" dominating frequency, into music; loops SSW. Ex-*R.Viva Villa*. Rather sorry to find that colorful name in homage to Pancho Villa has been retired. [Hauser-OK]

730 **MEXICO** XESOS Agua Prieta, Son. SEP 1 1219 – Tuned in just as canned man was giving FM/AM ID: "La Ranchera 97.3 XHSOS FM 97.3 mHz y XESOS AM 730 kHz, La Ranchera de Agua Prieta, transmitiendo con 25000 wats... [word] en Agua Prieta, Sonora, México. Una emisora de Grupo Radiofónico ZER [I think]" and into music/canned "La Ranchera 97.3" slogans. Yet another slogan change, ex-*Radio Uno* apparently. Noted again on SEP 2 with the same ID at the same unusual time. XESOS has been topping XEHB lately; previously XEHB almost always had the better signal. [Wilkins-CO]

740 **MEXICO** XECW Los Mochis, Sin. SEP 1 1158 – I am hearing some mariachi music when KRMG Tulsa is nulled, 1159 rewarded by ID for a 25 kW FM en Los Mochis, Sinaloa, and also 740. Cantú shows XECW *Stereo Vida* + FM 96.5 Los Mochis 5,000 1,000. A new one here; KRMG 25 kW night pattern has a deep null at 278°, close to us, tho we can always hear it; major night lobes are 245 and 97°. KRMG daytime 50 kW begins at 1200 UTC in September, ex-1145 in August. [Hauser-OK]

750 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Palmira JUL 6 0900 – *R.Progreso* ID parallel 640, 650, 660; dominant. [Connelly-MA]

750 **MEXICO** XEOH Cd. Camargo, Chih. SEP 5 1205 – After national anthem, Chihuahua anthem, no ID but into CV of some official from the steel industry, Horacio Campaña Acosta. Then, president Calderón gobierno federal PSA also mentioning Secretaría de Educación Pública. Relying on Cantú, station must be XEOH *La Jefa* + FM 96.1 Cd. Camargo 1,000 750. [Hauser-OK]

- 750 **MEXICO** XECSE Culiacán, Sin. SEP 3 1211 – "750, Extasis Digital, Sinaloa," then choral national anthem. There is another *Estasis Digital* on 750 in Acapulco. SEP 6 1202 – Full ID for XECSE *Éxtasis Digital*, Culiacán, also mentioned an FM, and defined the format as featuring música en inglés. Then played choral national anthem in Spanish. [Hauser-OK]
- 750 **VENEZUELA** YVKS RCR Caracas JUL 11 0208 – "RCR deportes" promo; good. [Connelly-MA]
- 760 **MEXICO** unID AUG 28 1202 – Full ID in Spanish, but too much interference to get a clue, then plays choral Mexican national anthem. There are two Sonorans and a Chihuahuan in the UT-6 zone. [Hauser-OK]
- 760 **MEXICO** unID SEP 3 0534 – "La música que te gusta," 11:34 time check. So it has to be one of these two in the UT-6 zone, per Cantú XEES *Antena* + FM 102.5 Chihuahua 10,000 1,000, or XEEB *La Preciosa* + FM 98.5 Cd. Obregón, Son. 5,000 1,000. Since *Antena 760* is a news/talk format, one might lean toward the other; except XEES program schedule at www.antena760.com shows they play music overnight and after 'La Hora Nacional'. [Hauser-OK]
- 770 **MEXICO** XEREV Los Mochis, Sin. AUG 28 1201 – "Gloria" song with Spanish lyrics from WSW; 1206 ID mentioning "104.3, Los 40 Principales" and into rock with English lyrics. Thus per Cantú it is XEREV *Los 40 Principales* + FM 104.3 Los Mochis 5,000 100, and again I can't believe this good signal dominating the frequency on sunrise skip can be on night power, tho the Sinaloans pretend it is 6 a.m. by the local advanced clock. SEP 6 1204 – After national anthem, 2 or 3 funny voices, 1205 mentions "Cadena 40 Principales," the only one on 770 per Cantú is XEREV. [Hauser-OK]
- 780 **MEXICO** unID SEP 4 0504 – State anthem, but which? Underneath WBBM opening 'When Radio Was' and the open carrier from KSPI Stillwater. Assuming played at local midnite, all 8 Mexicans on 780 are in the UT-5 zone. [Hauser-OK]
- 780 **VENEZUELA** YVMN *R.Coro*, Coro JUL 15 0301 – ID "Radio Coro... la alegría musical"; good. [Connelly-MA] SEP 5 0430 – Choral national anthem through heavy lightning noise. [Conti-NH]
- 790 **MEXICO** XENT La Paz, BCS AUG 28 1207 – Amid interference, Spanish talk mentioning "Estados Unidos" (in a way the Mexicans would, not ourselves), 1208 choral national anthem starts rather late, finished already at 1210, mentions *R.Fórmula*. Cantú shows XENT *R.Fórmula* + FM 97.5 La Paz 10,000 750. There is another *R. Fórmula* on 790, but only 250 watts from Guadalajara. Sunrise there is 1236, and in La Paz 1302 UT, but this loops WSW, and I'm quite sure it's XENT. Besides, Guadalajara would be antheming around 1100 UTC. AUG 31 1206 – Choral national anthem, 1207 sign-on, also mentions 25 kW on FM 97.5. More definite than my AUG 28 log; interference from news station in English, ad for Springdale Ford, i.e. KURM Rogers, Arkansas. [Hauser-OK]
- 790 **MEXICO** XERC *Formato 21*, México DF SEP 3 1110 – Very good with political news reports and remotes, male canned "Formato Veinteuno" at 1117. [Krueger-FL]
- 810 **COLOMBIA** HJCY CARACOL Bogotá JUL 6 0900 – Emphasis music, man and woman in Spanish with news of Colombia parallel 1100 and 1170; under WGY. [Connelly-MA]
- 819.54 **COLOMBIA** HJAD Cartegena SEP 6 0145 – Het against WNYC, WGGM, and WWFD. 819.54 per mwoffsets list and past Connelly log, measured 819.543 kHz. [Conti-NH]
- 830 **MEXICO** XEIK Piedras Negras, Coah. AUG 13 1121 – ID as "100.9, la nueva estrella de Radio Zócalo," several PSAs and ads, one mentioning Colonia Roma, so along with Zócalo I naturally think it's the DF station, but then at 1123 mentions Saltillo with 100.9 promo, and 6:24 TC. Consult Cantú: Nothing on 830 in Saltillo, Coahuila; but there is XEIK *La Norteña* in Piedras Negras. And there is a 100.9 in Saltillo listed as XHSA *La Reina*. Grupo Zócalo is not in the DF at all. They got two new FM frequencies for Piedras Negras, 96.7 and 100.9, XHVM and XHIK, to be on the air in six months, in keeping with the 'migration' from AM to FM. So I am getting XEIK, not turned off yet, simulcasting XHIK 100.9. Neither of the new FMs is listed yet in Cantú's Coahuila page under Piedras Negras. [Hauser-OK] SEP 5 1148 – XE tunes, time and temperature checks (UTC-5, 26 grados); at 1153 heard "La Cien puento nueve [100.9], una agradable sorpresa en su radio," followed by Piedras Negras ads. So yet another AM XE station now mentioning FM (presume simulcasting). [Wilkins-CO]
- 870 **CUBA** *R.Reloj*, multiple sites JUL 6 0900 – Reloj news, ticks, beeps; some "wobbling" noted, other Spanish talker under. [Connelly-MA]
- 870 **MEXICO** XETAR Chihuahua, Chih. AUG 29 1200 – The Mexican music I am hearing is coming from KLSQ Nevada as IDed a minute later. Once upon a time, XETAR in Chihuahua owned this frequency around local sunrise here. That's presumably what started to make a SAH of about 5 Hz with KLSQ at 1204 with bits of the Mexican national anthem. AUG 31 1201 – Choral national anthem, 1202, sign-on "desde el corazón de la

cultura indígena," alternating Spanish and local language(s), with indigenous music, but XETAR calls pronounced in Spanish only. Same lite SAH circa 5 Hz as heard 48 hours earlier when KLSQ Nevada was dominant. Looking forward to better reception of this interesting daytime station, especially its full sign-on. [Hauser-OK]

- 890 **MEXICO** unID SEP 3 1118 – XE anthem beginning at tune-in, lost immediately in co-channel from Spanish Christian talk KVOZ and *R.Progreso* Cuba. [Krueger-FL]
- 900 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, San Germán JUL 6 0900 – Progreso programming parallel 640; over WGHM. [Connelly-MA]
- 900 **MEXICO** XEDT Cd. Cuauhtemoc, Chih. SEP 3 1208 – Time check for "6 y 8 en 106(?)," so which 900 station in the UT-6 zone has an FM in the 106s? Cantú shows the only one in MDT/CST is XEDT *Hits FM* + FM 98.3 Cd. Cuauhtemoc 5,000 1,500. So that trumps the FM connexion presumably misheard: "Punto tres" instead of "ciento seis." [Hauser-OK]
- 940 **PUERTO RICO** WIPR *Máxima* 940, San Juan JUL 11 0201 – "Máxima, nueve cuarenta" ID, then woman in Spanish with winning lottery numbers; good. [Connelly-MA]
- 980 **MEXICO** XEQF Cananea, Son. AUG 24 1203 – News and weather originating from the DF, loops more west than south, and suspect it's the *IMER* station I have heard before, per Cantú XEFQ *La Voz de la Ciudad del Cobre*, Cananea 2,500 500. SEP 1 1202 – Live announcer from *La Voz de la Ciudad del Cobre* (Copper City), greeting a new day and a new month, informal slogan "canal 98," mentions *IMER*, 5:03 a.m., 21 grados, all over music bed. [Hauser-OK]
- 990 **MEXICO** XECL Mexicali, BC AUG 24 1202 – Sunrise DX session, LSR Enid at 1157 UTC, at 1202 tune-in, dominant signal from XECL Mexicali giving full ID, *Rocola*. Cantú shows higher nite power! XECL *La Rocola*, Mexicali, B.C. 1,400 3,000. I was also getting Mexicali on TV last night, coincidentally? [Hauser-OK]
- 1000 **CUBA** *R.Artemisa*, Artemisa JUL 31 2351 – Parallel weaker 1020 with Punto guajiro vocals, weak *R.Reloj* under. Repeat log AUG 1 2123 and AUG 2 2322 UTC. [Krueger-FL]
- 1020 **CUBA** *CMKS Radio*, Baracoa, Guantánamo AUG 5 0856 – Following up on a log by David Crawford, Titusville, FL (about the opposite side of the state from me). Traditional folk vocals, female "CMKS Radio... Guantánamo" then "Guantanamera" theme on single chime xylophone-like instrument at 0859, vocal, male announcer 0904 and more vocals including Punto guajiro song poetry with tres guitar accompaniment. Fair, about equal to co-channel *R.Reloj*. No mention of Trinchera Antiimperialista slogan of old, and it seems they may have re-branded as "Radio Guantánamo" at some point as per the following pages: Confirming date/year of CMKS inception, which matches Facebook page www.facebook.com/RadioGuantanamo inauguration details, www.radiocubana.cu/index.php/historia-de-la-radio-cubana/25-Documentales/203-cmks-cumple-70-anos. But the old Trinchera slogan is referenced on this presumably stale EcuRed page www.ecured.cu/index.php/Radio_Trinchera_Antiimperialista, however see bottom page link www.radioguantanamo.icrt.cu/index.php. The 2012 WRTH listed www.radioguantanamo.cu page is dead, for what it's worth. [Krueger-FL]
- 1060 **MEXICO** XEEP *R.Educación*, México DF SEP 3 1124 – Tune-in to oldie French torch vocals – three in a row by the same female – the second IDed by the iPhone's SoundHound app as "J'Aime Tes Grand Yeux" by Lys Gauty, who croaked ages ago per Wiki. Cuban Radio 26 dominating by 1133. [Krueger-FL]
- 1080 **CUBA** *R.Cadena Habana*, Villa María AUG 5 1802 – Tune-in to male live "Radio Cadena Habana, la emisora (de, de la?) música Cubana." Very good. [Krueger-FL]
- 1090 **MEXICO** XEMCA Pánuco, Ver. AUG 18 1117 – Male calls ID into Mexi-tune. Fair in passing. [Krueger-FL]
- 1100 **COLOMBIA** HJAT CARACOL Barranquilla JUL 6 0900 – Emphasis music, man and woman in Spanish with news of Colombia parallel 810 and 1170; mixed with WTAM. [Connelly-MA] AUG 5 1021 – Good in passing with female remote report, ads, ID. [Krueger-FL]
- 1130 **MEXICO** unID AUG 24 1201 – Sunrise DX session, LSR Enid at 1157 UT, I can hear a weak Mexican national anthem under Louisiana or Kansas station. Presumably at 6 a.m. local, so in the MDT/CST zone, not CDT. That means BCS, Sinaloa, Nayarit or Chihuahua. That means one or the other of XELUP Nayarit or XEMOS Sinaloa. Nayarit is rare here, and Sinaloa common. [Hauser-OK]
- 1140 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde FM*, unknown site AUG 5 0825 – Female, "Rebelde... frecuencia modulada... música Cubana..." into Cuban oldies, parallel 1620. Transmitter way over-modulated and clipping audio about 2 X per second. At least couple of 'standard' AM network Rebelede outlets under. [Krueger-FL]

- 1140 **MEXICO** XEMR Monterrey, NL JUL 30 1101 – Anthem in progress; ID at 1103: "Deportes XEMR 1140 de amplitud modulada transmitiendo con 50000 wats de potencia desde Avenida Madero Número 1110 Oriente, Monterrey, Nuevo León..." then a time check for 6:02 and into program "El Mundo de Trabajo," about labor and labor unions. Despite their slogan, I don't know if they have sports programming any more – I've not heard sports during any of my morning DX listening windows. [Wilkins-CO] AUG 9 0500 – I suspend SW monitoring to try to catch a definite ID from XEMR. Initially good dominant signal belying the 'nothing to the north' pattern, music which stops at 0500 with no ID, right into Mexican anthem, choral multiverse lasting until 0505; finally, when it has faded a bit, quick and hard to copy ID with self-imposed QRMusic includes XEMR, 1140 AM, 50 kilovatts, street address (apparently a mandatory part of legal IDs in Mexico), and right back to music. Did not hear "Radio Esperanza" mentioned. AUG 28 0506 – After national anthem, too-quick full ID, just caught "Radio Esperanza, emisora manantial, del grupo..." right into gospel rock praise music. Continues to dominate frequency even tho pattern shows all signal goes south. [Hauser-OK]
- 1170 **COLOMBIA** HJNW CARACOL Cartagena JUL 6 0900 – Emphasis music, man and woman in Spanish with news of Colombia parallel 810 and 1100; mixed with WWVA. [Connelly-MA] AUG 25 0015 – In-studio female bantering with remote reporters, frequent mentions of Colombia, brief ad block, then Caracol Colombia ID. Good. [Krueger-FL]
- 1170 **MEXICO** XEZZ Coahuila, Ver. AUG 25 1059 – Presumed by default choral Veracruz anthem at tune-in, the only listed Veracruz station on 1170 kHz. WAVS Davie up on power/pattern at 1101, messing with. [Krueger-FL]
- 1170 **MEXICO** unID SEP 3 1058 – XE anthem, lost in co-channels. XEZZ Veracruz the last one heard on this frequency. [Krueger-FL]
- 1180 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, multiple sites SEP 3 0135 – In the clear and on top of big pest KYES; good tropical and Caribbean music. I double checked and they were parallel 5025 kHz. The first time I have heard this one in several months, not new but a good catch here now with KYES on. [Axelrod-MB]
- 1190 **MEXICO** XECT *Contacto 1190*, Monterrey, NL AUG 18 1102 – Spanish ballads, short choral anthem from 1107, female ID with calls and slogan. Good. [Krueger-FL]
- 1230 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, unknown site AUG 28 0014 – Man and woman skit, male host, some type of serial entertainment show. Briefly excellent on post-sunset enhancement, parallel weaker 640 kHz. [Krueger-FL]
- 1410 **MEXICO** XECF Los Mochis, Sin. AUG 26 0450 – Noted with norteñas and banda music. Frequent "La Mexicana" slogans. Full ID after national anthem at 0600 giving parallel 93.3 XHCF FM. Fair-to-poor in mix with KGSO in phase of local 1420 XEF and an unID C&W music station. [Vance-TX]
- 1430 **MEXICO** XEWD Cd. Miguel Alemán, Tamps. AUG 26 0730 – Fairly dominant with banda music, and frequent "Radio X" and "La Fórmula Perfecta" slogans. Full ID just after the hour announcing 5,000 watts and station address. [Vance-TX]
- 1480 **MEXICO** unID AUG 31 0507 – Choral Mexican national anthem under talk from presumed KQAM Wichita. 0508 seguí to soprano with a state anthem, I've heard before but can't remember which one. By announcement at 0510, too much interference to copy. There are four possibilities in the CDT zone. [Hauser-OK]
- 1560 **MEXICO** XEJPV Cd. Juárez, Chih. AUG 19 0530 – ID "en Radio Viva," timecheck for 11:30, into a song about salvación, barely atop the pileup of signals here, loops rather E/W and wonder if a U.S. station? No, googling leads right to XEJPV in Ciudad Juárez – which Cantú lists as a 1 kW daytimer, but it's almost midnight! IRCA Mexican Log of 2011 however has it as 10 kW day, maybe 1 kW nite; WRTH 2012 shows it as 1 kW fulltime. [Hauser-OK]

ARGENTINA: 1630 *R.Melody* (ex-*R.América*), San José, Entre Ríos noted off frequency at 1629.827 kHz. [Paul Crankshaw, *mwoffsets*]

CUBA: Look at this Radio Cuba/ICRT page: www.radiocubana.cu/index.php/directorio-de-radio-emisoras-cubanas with lots of interesting local FM stations, including some heretofore unknown ones with unusual slogans, such as *Radio Triple M*, *Radio 8SF*, etc. The 1T, 4T etc. presumably indicates number of transmitters vs. actually helping their own citizens and DXers by listing the frequencies. All to be taken with a grain of salt of course. [Krueger]

GERMANY: *Radio 700* is now on **1593 kHz**, August 31. Fair reception here in the Belgium Ardennes. [Ge Huijbens, *emwg*] The *Radio 700* "Schlager Und Oldies" website www.radio700.eu lists several FMs plus two shortwave frequencies; 3955 and 6005 kHz. The German Wiki states for 1593, "Gesendet wird einer horizontalen Steilstrahlantenne mit 10 kW Trägerleistung am Senderstandort Kall-Krekel." [Conti]

INDIA: Per Jose Jacob tip on dx_india list, *AIR* Rajkot is now on the air also in the evening on **1071 kHz**. Heard here in Finland at 1610 UTC with very strong signal, much stronger than *AIR* 1566 kHz. It is a kind of signal that it used to be in my youth in the '70s! On a clear offset at 1070.989 kHz. [Mauno Ritola, *mwoffsets*]

MEXICO: 1470 XEAI México DF new slogan "Fórmula Femenina 1470." [Andrew Brade, *RealDX*]

MEXICO: 1140 XEMR Monterrey new religious format, *R.Esperanza* slogan. [Bryan Clark, *NZRDXL*] "La estación que cambia tu vida." [www.radioesperanza1140.com]

MEXICO: Following up on the status of former XEW relays, 540 XEWA Monterrey is now relaying *Dominio FM* 96.5 while high-power 540 XEWA San Luis Potosí is *Los 40 Principales* + 103.9 FM. 900 XEWB Veracruz is also *Los 40 Principales* + 98.9 FM. 900 XEW remains *W Radio* + 96.9 FM. [mexicoradiotv.com]

ST. HELENA: *R.Saint Helena* will be shutting down, according to the interim station manager; "Our final broadcast will be on the 25 December to coincide with our opening on the 25 December '67. This will make us 45 years of broadcasting." The AM signal on **1548 kHz** with 1 kW will be shut off for good. As I understand it, at some point, a government funded radio station operating on FM will launch. The shortwave broadcasting mast has been dismantled by Cable & Wireless, but he's talking to local ham operators to see if they can lash up something for their final broadcast so they can get on shortwave. No promises though. If the shortwave makes it on December 25th at all, it is likely to be the last time it will ever make it on air. [Paul Walker via Mike Terry, *mwdx*]

UNITED KINGDOM: BBC locals 774/1602 *R.Kent*, 1368 *R.Lincolnshire*, 1485 *R.Merseyside*, and 1584 *R.Nottingham* have all stopped broadcasting regular programmes on medium wave, instead directing listeners to FM and DAB. It's part of a five-week trial to make savings, and to find out if listeners will miss or complain about the lack of AM services. The BBC told RadioToday.co.uk, "MW services mainly duplicate what is already available on FM and DAB, and most listeners will be able to hear their local stations on FM. The BBC is also committed to a full roll out of local radio stations across the DAB network. If local radio is not already available on DAB it will be in the future." The trial will be finished on September 24. [radiotoday.co.uk]

Network listings for professional sports play-by-play coverage

Here is National Football League (NFL) flagship information from Internet searches. Some of the network lists are undated, so I do not know if they are for the current season. I have not yet located the list for the Chicago Bears and Tampa Bay Buccaneers. And some team sites do not list the announcer team, while others have bios that are a few seasons' old, so I do not know if they are current. The announcer names are found at this URL:

That URL also has flagship and network size information. The site

<http://www.freqseek.com/nfl-radio-networks.aspx>

has the NFL networks, but there is no source information there. And I do not know if the site honors the "Do Not Reproduce" statement at the bottom of some of the network list pages. I will not include a network in this column if there is a "DNR" warning on the web page. I compared two "official" list to freqseek lists to see what differences I found; see the New Orleans Saints and Miami Dolphins below.

There is a site <http://nflfootballtv.com/onlineradio.html> that has Internet online radio – streaming audio and video information on each team.

The Westwood One Radio Network (recently renamed to Dial Global Sports) will broadcast NFL games; the schedule, network lists, and announcer lists are found at this URL:

<http://www.nfl.com/tvradio/broadcasters/westwoodone>

I checked, and some of the information on that web site has the 2008 season schedule, so I am not sure about Dial Global coverage. I know that the Chicago "progressive" radio station will carry NFL games on its three FM stations on Sundays during the season; the regular lineup of Sunday shows will be carried on the AM station. Of course, the season has yet to start, so I do not know about the broadcast feed in Chicago; I assume it is Dial Global. I assume that a game will not be broadcast by Dial Global in the home cities of the two teams. If, for example, the Kansas City Chiefs are playing a night game, then Dial Global will not broadcast that game in the Kansas City area, deferring to the Chiefs' flagship station broadcast.

As always, any of these network lists can change during the season. Please send me any additions and/or corrections. Thanks.
