It's been a busy month at the FCC. Here's a rundown of the latest official word:

CALL CHANGES

Existing Stations:

- 1450 WQKC IN Jeffersonville – Call change to WXVW.
WRKD ME Rockland – Call change to WVOM.
1560 WZTQ AL Centre – Call change to WLYG.
1590 KRSX CA Victorville – Call change to KVTR.



New Station CPs:

- 740 CP HI Kihei – Assigned calls of KCIK. (CP expires 8/31, maybe it's for real?)
1120 WFNX FL Coral Springs – Changes to WZBR (not on air, WFNX never used).
1490 KGFR MT Malmstrom AFB – Changes to KHTC (this one is still technically a new station CP, although it's been on the air with program test authority for years).

1590 WZUM PA Carnegie – License cancelled, calls deleted; station has been silent since 3/2010.

As we've noted in past issues, when a station discovers its licensed coordinates are more than 3 seconds off from its actual transmitter location (latitude or longitude), it needs to go through a formal CP application and testing procedure ... presumably to make sure that the actual coordinates meet all FCC guidelines for interference levels. But it's a bit of a misnomer to call these "construction" permits, since no actual change in facilities occurs ... so we'll just assemble all that information here in a separate location to minimize confusion. If a new tower is really being built, we'll put it in the regular application – CP – "on the air" sections. And if the correction is small enough that the CP process isn't needed, we'll just note the tweak (as with WDND-1620 above).

 800 WSHO LA New Orleans – 4/19 2100 – Gospel music, into Unshackled program. (DBJ-TN)
 810 WQIZ SC St. George – 4/20 1900 – Rosary recitation. Per NRC DX Log, is 5KW D1. On late? (DBJ-TN) LSS there is 1945 ELT in April, per FCC web site – DY.
 860 WAMI AL Opp – 4/20 2300 – Local news, weather report, into gospel music. Announced as "WAMI." (DBJ-TN)

- 870 WIJR IL **Shelbyville** – 5/11 1438 – Weak in KWPC splash (and using USB option on my receiver) with lots of southern gospel songs off the Here's Help Radio Network. Long ID at 1458 mentioned every station on the network, including WIJR. **(RD-IA)** *You mean WINU-870 Shelbyville? Or WIJR-880 Highland? – DY.*
- 870 KFJZ TX **Fort Worth** – 5/10 1420 – Unknown foreign language broadcast heard with loop in N-S orientation. I suspect this is Radio Salaam Namaste, an Indian station in Ft. Worth, TX which broadcasts in Pakistani and Indian languages. **(JR-OK)**
- 940 KTFS TX **Texarkana** – 5/11 2205 – Weak with old classic hits, Beatles, etc. KTFS is no longer silent and returned to the air on December 20. On April 19 the format was changed to classic hits. **(JR-OK)**
- 950 KFSA AR **Fort Smith** – 5/2 1415 – Very weak top 40s music heard in loop null of KJRG, Newton, KS. **(JR-OK)**
- 950 KWOS MO **Jefferson City** – 5/16 2140 – Call ID, Michael Savage and news then lost in fade out. **(JR-OK)**
- 950 KPRC TX **Houston** – 5/16 2200 – Call ID with some ads then was lost in fade out. **(JR-OK)**
- 960 KMA IA **Shenandoah** – 5/18 0100 – Courtesy KGWA's Fox-hole of hum only, upon otherwise open carrier: some station with local weather, then KMA ID in passing and joining ABC News in progress. Maybe a SBG ran over. Although ABC news is commonly heard, and always assumed to be primarily from KMA Shenandoah IA (except when KGKL San Angelo TX was malfunctioning), it's rare to get a real ID from KMA as normally it's only network programming at 0100-0105 while KGWA is silent. **(GH-OK)**
- 960 WABG MS **Greenwood** – 5/10 2219 – Fair with "WABG" heard in liner after blues ballad. KMA took over with Kansas City Royals BB about a minute later. **(RD-IA)**
5/16 0102 – During KGWA Enid Fox-hole of no modulation except persistent hum, main occupant is blues music with harmonica, so presumed WABG Greenwood MS, which others have concluded is sometimes on day facilities at night. **(GH-OK)**
- 960 WTCH WI **Shawano** – 5/10 2236 – Fair with Milwaukee Brewers BB and instantly recognizable voice of play-by-play man Bob Uecker. First time for hearing WTCH at this locale since 1/23/1991. **(RD-IA)**
- 970 KSYL LA **Alexandria** – 5/16 2210 – Brief with clear call ID but then lost in QRM. **(JR-OK)**
- 990 KWAM TN **Memphis** – 5/28 0105 – Dominant signal loops E/W, legal ad, 0106 opening Phil Hendrie show giving east and west coast times, but nothing for the Great Center of America! In the nightmiddle here, 990 is normally a battle between CBW and XET, but not tonight. Assume it's KWAM running 50 kW day facilities on east-west pattern, rather than 450 watts night, although that pattern is favorable too. Hendrie's website <http://philhendrieshow.com> has 815 pages, but to find "Aphiliates" you must go thru the 'Live' tab. Listed by state, yes, there's KWAM at 12-3 am CDT. **(GH-OK)**
- 990 CBW MB **Winnipeg** – 5/11 0106 – Opening 'Vinyl Tap,' when I was expecting to hear 'As It Happens, Midnight Edition,' but apparently that does not apply to Friday nights on CBC Radio One; usual CCI and SAH from XET Monterrey, which we can never get rid of completely, despite supposed southward-only pattern "covering all of Mexico." **(GH-OK)**
- 1020 KMMQ NE **Plattsmouth** – 5/11 1422 – Fair in WPEO null with regional Mexican music and "La Nueva Diez Biente Ah Emmay" ID. Caught a mention of "Omaha" at 1432. First time ever heard at this QTH -- in the old days, it was just WPEO alone on this channel in the daytime. **(RD-IA)**
- 1120 KEOR OK **Catoosa** – 5/17 0720 – Praise music in Spanish seemingly from Ca-Tulsa direction, i.e. KEOR, and no KMOX; then that fades back in with the usual few-Hz SAH, and shortly the PMS is no longer heard, so KEOR at less than 200 km may also have been via sky- rather than ground-wave; unless it was really something else, as IDs are scarce. Lately KEOR has mostly been active in full daytime. 5/18 1548 – Check on car radio at squirrel haven, KEOR Catoosa is gone again. **(GH-OK)**
- 1160 KCTO MO **Cleveland** – 5/28 0725 – Mexican music, vs. no KSL, presumed KCTO Cleveland MO (Kansas City) now on 5 kW day power; soon overcome by Disney, "wake up sleepyheads," i.e. KRKY San Antonio TX. At 0729 Spanish back up, "Buenos Días, Solanía" (? sounded like) and fadeout. Website is



under construction; <http://www.lasuperx1160.com/> without a program schedule, but very active on Facebook. **(GH-OK)**

- 1240 KCCR SD **Pierre** – 5/16 2300 – Good; peaks and clear with Central SD announcement in call ID then CBS news. Common. **(NK-IL)**
- 1250 WGL IN **Fort Wayne** – 4/26 2216 – Fair with ad mentioning URL “lawyersonthesquare.com” and including a phone # in the 260 area code, then got an ID of “AM 1250 The River.” Not new, but not the most common station on 1250 at this QTH. **(RD-NE)**
- 1290 WIRL IL **Peoria** – 5/11 1415 – Good with The Crystals’ “Then He Kissed Me”, an ID as “Oldies 1290 – 102.7, WIRL”, then into The Temptations’ “Ain’t Too Proud To Beg.” A daytime regular in Iowa City, but first time heard since switching to the oldies format. **(RD-IA)**
- 1340 KVGC CA **Jackson** – 5/11 0100 – Faded up nicely for ID “Hometown Radio for Amador and Calaveras Counties, KVGC, Jackson, _____, Sutter Creek, Voice of the Gold Country,” into ABC news. New! This was only the third top-of-hour recording I had made on the Perseus. **(TH-CA)**
- 1340 KAND TX **Corsicana** – 4/30 2205 – Heard call ID but then lost in graveyard jumble. **(JR-OK)**
- 1350 KCAR TX **Clarksville** – 4/30 2155 – C&W music, call ID and “Red River Country.” Good signal on fade ups. **(JR-OK)**
- 1370 WMGO MS **Canton** – 4/30 2140 – UC gospel music, call ID. Heard briefly than faded. **(JR-OK)**
- 1370 KAWL NE **York** – 4/29 2205 – Baseball game, KC Royals with call ID and good signal. **(JR-OK)**
- 1400 KBRB NE **Ainsworth** – 5/16 2300 – After Huskers BB coverage (all 3 NE on 1400 are on net) into weather for N. Cent. NE and S. Cent. SD with nuisance WGIL faded down. **(NK-IL)**

There are no 1210s in northern or western Mexico, so probably KUBR, though 50/5 kW XEBCO in Colima2 would be nice, IMER station 24 hours, which would not be preaching, and which IRCA asks if it is really on the air? It’s NOT listed by Cantú or WRTH {and no XEBCO on any frequency in Cantú}. The SS had faded out completely by 0122. **(GH-OK)**

MAY 28 1108 – Chihuahua state song is ending; trying to outdo the national anthem for militarism (after all, the tierra of Pancho Villa); 1109 full ID for XEDP and XHDP with MW power as 5 kW, which really gets out (WRTH has odd figure of 7 kW), “La Ranchera de Cuauhtémoc” sung ID, but first: a bit of choral hymn, and ‘Die Bibel Sagt’ in Low German; preacher keeps asserting past 1121 this day, but fading after 1115 with interference coming up from KGNC and/or KCMO. Enid sunrise today 1117, to attain 1113 in a biweek. [Hauser-OK]

- 2910 **MEXICO** XEVT Villahermosa, Tab. APR 27 1118 – Woman giving phone number, “pide que se comuniquen,” missing person perhaps; then about something happening “hoy a las 8 de la mañana,” brief bits audible at peaks between lightning crashes, typical morning news format of 970 x 3 XEVT. Their sunrise today 1147, almost same as here, but they will lose only a dekamminute of darkness by June. MAY 28 1055 – Trace of AM talk vs storm crashes which aren't too severe a few minutes before sunrise; presumed usual XEVT. [Hauser-OK]

International News

GERMANY: AFN Europe, in coordination with IMCOM Europe and USAREUR, is turning off its 873 kHz transmitter in central Germany MAY 31, as part of the Department of Defense's ongoing efforts to reduce operating costs. The transmitter is one of two that serves Wiesbaden Army Airfield. The 873 AM transmitter provides *Power Network* programming, a mix of news, talk and political commentary. The second transmitter, 98.7 FM, broadcasts AFN *The Eagle*, a 24/7 service of contemporary music, community information and top of the hour news. Wiesbaden area listeners will still get news, traffic, weather and community information from 98.7 FM. News and talk fans may still listen to two popular *Power Network* shows, Morning Newswatch, from 0600-0900 and Afternoon Newswatch from 1600-1880 weekdays on AFN 360: *Internet Radio*. AFN decoder owners may tune in *Power Network* 24 hours a day on their “box.” AFN Europe hopes to be able to offer *Power Network* as a 24/7 streaming audio service on AFN 360 sometime in the future. Some iPhone and Android mobile device users may be able to listen to AFN streaming audio in their car. The 873 AM transmitter, which is located off post in Weisskirchen, Germany, was singled out for cost savings because of its isolated location and high-cost upkeep requirements. ST. KITTS & NEVIS: 555 ZIZ is off (again), per Dave Marthouse on the NRC list: “I have an amateur radio friend who lives on St. Kitts and he informed me a few weeks back that 555 was down. He didn't know what the reason was. Their fm station is still up.” [Mark Connelly via *ultralightdx*]

ST. KITTS & NEVIS: Trinity Broadcasting Network (TBN) has donated long-time 50,000-watt Caribbean AM radio station *R.Paradise* (820 kHz) to Flowing Streams Church in Vero Beach, Florida. Flowing Streams and its senior pastor, the Rev. Rick Wiles, produce a daily international radio talk show entitled Trunews, and will use *R.Paradise* to extend its Christian message throughout the islands of the Caribbean. *R.Paradise*, which moved from Dutch St. Maarten to St. Kitts and Nevis in the early 1960's, has been owned and operated by TBN since 1992. The AM frequency reaches out to the many islands of the Caribbean, including the nation of Cuba, offering listeners an audio feed of TBN television programming, along with regional Christian programming. The new format will include music, ministry programs, and world news that is relevant to Christian listeners. [www.zionline.com/news]
