We're seeing more and more STA applications at the FCC saying that the applicants hope to apply for CPs for a permanent solution to their engineering problems (especially those that will require a move of the transmitter site) after the FCC adopts the "AM Revitalization" regulations. So if those regulations get adopted soon, we may see an uptick in FCC CP activity.

We'll begin with the changes announced by the FCC over the last two weeks:

Dates on call changes are the effective dates posted on the FCC web site. The posting date is usually later (all of these were posted between January 5 and January 16, but some are as much as two months old) and the date a new callsign is used on the air may be different.

With the Wall Street Journal shutting down radio operations at the end of 2014, distributor Compass Media Networks is launching their own replacement programming. Gordon Deal, who hosted "Wall Street Journal This Morning" from 5-9am Eastern will segue to "This Morning with Gordon Deal" retaining many of the show's previous affiliates. 60 second long "Your Money Now" reports updated at :20 and :50 after the hour from 6am to 7am Eastern will target stations losing WSJ and Marketwatch business reports. Former Wall Street Journal network morning anchor Jennifer Kushinka will report from 6am-12pm, Ray Hoffman from 12-3pm, and Bruce Vale 3-7pm.

Salem Christian Preaching 570 WMCA New York is promoting it will be "No More" on Monday, January 19. The on-air promos state that "Beginning Monday January 19th, New York's Christian Talk will be no more. Find out what we will become Monday January 19th." While speculation already points towards a move of Conservative Talk "970 The Answer" to 570, it appears Salem has another mission in mind for WMCA and its other Christian Preaching stations across the country. Salem registered AM570TheMission.com on December 1 for WMCA along with AM980TheMission.com and TheMissionTwinCities.com for fellow Christian Preaching 980 KKMS Minneapolis. Just as Salem has been consolidating its Conservative Talk stations under the "Answer" brand and Christian AC stations as "The Fish" it now looks as though the Christian Preaching stations in Salem's portfolio will become "The Mission."

- 900 WKDA TN Lebanon** – 12/9 1814 – Fair to good with animated male preacher in Spanish. Confirmed by webstream, which was actually running about 2 seconds ahead of the radio side. **(RD-NE)**
- 910 KINA KS Salina** – 1/3 1943 – ID given "You are listening to KINA, Salina" and then faded out. NRC log says 500/29 watts, must have been 500!! **(FO-OK)**
- 910 KNAF TX Fredericksburg** – 12/30 1829 – Call in program with items for sale "here in Fredericksburg." Phone numbers 997-4433 and 997-1864. At 1834, "This is KNAF AM 910" and into C&W. New here. **(FO-OK)**
- 920 WHJJ RI Providence** – 1/9 1859 – Poor on a crowded band, with a business feature just ending, legal ID into Fox news at ToH. Although calls sure sounded like WHJJ, not much of the ID itself was readable, so the next hour I recorded the LID off the internet webstream to compare the two. The off-air and stream ID's were a match, and I could even make out the words "Rhode Island" in the off-air recording once I knew what I was listening for. The LID read: "Now the

stories Rhode Island is talking about, this is news on News radio 920 WHJJ Providence." New! Only my second RI AM ever. **(BD-WI)**

- 920 KKLS SD **Rapid City** – 1/10 0932 – Rock music; 0936 man announcer with "Rapid City's all new Best Hits" and mentioning frequencies of 104.7 FM, 920 AM, and kcls.net; Van Halen was up next. Fair with local KPOF-910 IBOC off for a few minutes (back on at 0945). **(JW-CO)**
- 950 KWOS MO **Jefferson City** – 1/6 1740 – News, talk and call ID. Last time I heard this station it was called KLIK with C&W music in 1999. **(JR-OK)**
- 950 KJTV TX **Lubbock** – 1/12 1900 – Poor in mix with WNTD and others with two Lubbock announcements from a gal and local calls. Extraordinary conditions to that area. New! **(NK-IL)**
- 960 KFLN MT **Baker** – 1/7 0822 – Farm news; ad for Montana Farmers Union, call letter ID. On top with a fair signal. **(JW-CO)**
- 1010 KXEN MO **St. Louis** – 1/6 1430 – Good daytime reception with tuned loop. Religious talk and call ID. **(JR-OK)**
- 1010 KIHU UT **Tooele** – 1/3 1900 – ID as "Immaculate Heart Radio KIHU Tooele-Salt Lake City" and into religious programming. Fair under KSIR, and improving as sunset approached. **(JW-CO)**
- 1030 KCTA TX **Corpus Christi** – 1/12 0659 – Fair, loud. SS REL, thought he was going to have heart attack, hi. No WBZ. Calls in EE. **(JJR-WI)**
- 1100 KWWN NV **Las Vegas** – 12/29 1926 – ESPN radio, no ID, but this is the only ESPN affiliate I can find on 1100. Any others known? **(FO-OK)**
- 1100 KDRY TX **Alamo Heights** – 1/11 2130 – Poor to good in very auroral conditions with a religious program just ending, promo for another religious program and ID: "San Antonio's Christian Radio KDRY." This was followed by the start of Love Worth Finding with Adrian Rogers. Not a sign of normally dominant WTAM. New! **(BD-WI)**
- 1150 KOLJ TX **Quanah** – 1/12 1857-1903 – Fair, almost totally dominant with ID after old C&W music and into news. I think it switched power a bit late, perhaps after news and ads. KNED had this channel 50 minutes later with no trace of KOLJ. New! **(NK-IL)**
- 1180 KGOL TX **Humble** – 1/13 1831 – SS with Houston and ESPN several times, on top of frequency until KZOT took over. **(FO-OK)**
- 1190 KFXR TX **Dallas** – 1/2 1633 – On car radio, emerging thru the QRM here, ad says "north of highway 75 and 121." US 75 goes right thru Dallas TX, so I bet it's KFXR. Yes: detailed atlas map of city shows intersection with state highway 121 just south of McKinney at Fairview. What are the chances of two other same-numbered highways meeting somewhere else with an 1190 station? **(GH\_OK)**
- 1240 KNEM MO **Nevada** – 1/13 1857-1900 – Good peaks with oldish C&W music and AM and FM ID. Nevada pronounced with the first A being long. New and most wanted and now I have only 3 stations left to complete MO. **(NK-IL)**
- 1240 KADS OK **Elk City** – 1/12 1857-1900 – Fair peaks mostly atop KIUL (!) with sports programming and then network ID for WWLS et al. I've never before had two GYers over 700 miles away fighting for dominance over an all land path. New! **(NK-IL)**
- 1240 KOKL OK **Okmulgee** – 1/10 2300 – Poor-fair in mix with others with calls and "The Brew" slogan after oldies. New! **(NK-IL)**
- 1260 WDKN TN **Dickson** – 1/2 1855 – Over/under WSDZ with ad for local restaurant in Dickson during commercial break on the Vol Network. Postgame show followed Tennessee's 45-28 win over Iowa. Station was probably running day power for the duration of the broadcast. **(RD-NE)**
- 1340 KGGS KS **Garden City** – Date? 1900 – Fair over others with Big Dog Sports announcement and call ID. **(NK-IL)**
- 1360 KPXQ AZ **Glendale** – 12/30 1024 – Local religious program, "here in Arizona." Call letter ID at 1025, into talk about "Meeting on a Mountain." **(FO-OK)**
- 1360 KWWJ TX **Baytown** – 1/5 1705 – UC gospel music with requests from Galveston and ads for Houston area. Good reception on fade-ups. **(JR-OK)**
- 1370 WGCL IN **Bloomington** – 12/19 1815 – Weak to fair with "...here on the WGCL radar..." heard during weather forecast that was read by youngish-sounding male announcer, perhaps college age. Had been trying for this at sunrise for a couple of years now, so it was a surprise to get it at this hour. Still, I'll take it. Last new logging of 2014 at this locale. **(RD-NE)**

- 1370 KAWL NE **York** – 1/1 0903 – Local weather and then “You’re hooked up to the best classical rock and roll on AM 1370, KAWL.” Semi-local KGNO either off the air or almost off as I cannot hear them at all. KAWL is listed as 500 watts and a long way from my QTH, first time ever heard. **(FO-OK)**
- 1370 KWTL ND **Grand Forks** – 1/3 1755 – Religious talk with call ID. New here. **(JR-OK)**
- 1370 KJCE TX **Rollingwood** – 1/10 1800 – Poor to good at sunset on what would prove to be a night of strong auroral conditions, with only light to moderate QRM from normally dominant KDTH. Promo for Sean Hannity, end of Lifestyle Unlimited Real Estate Investing Radio Show, LID including slogan “Talk 1370” into CBS news. NEW! **(BD-WI)**
- 1380 KLPZ AZ **Parker** – 1/4 0854 – Country tunes, gal announcer; legal ID at ToH: “...KLPZ Parker-Lake Havasu-Blythe”; not sure what followed as KOTA surged back up. **(JW-CO)**
- 1380 WKJV NC **Asheville** – 1/2 1702 – USA Net news, religious program, mentioned WKJV and WKJW-1010, on top with 27000 watt day power listed, also heard 1/9 with 1735 with obits here, no WGRB-1390 IBOC. Heard as WKKE – in 1972! **(KDF-IL)**
- 1390 WGRB IL **Chicago** – 1/2 1735 – Seems to have turned daytime IBOC off, first noticed today, when heard WRJN-1400 in Racine, WI. WRJN used to be daytime regular but not heard in at least five years. **(KDF-IL)**
- 1390 KXSS MN **Waite Park** – 1/1 1745 – Ad for RV dealer in St. Cloud, ID as “13-90 The Fan.” Also new here. **(FO-OK)**
- 1400 KTUC AZ **Tucson** – 12/29 1921 – Nostalgia music and canned IDs, e.g. “...Tucson’s all-time favorites all day long...at 1400 ktuc.net”; songs by Brenda Lee and Johnny Mathis followed. Fair in the mix. **(JW-CO)**
- 1400 KWUF CO **Pagosa Springs** – 1/12 0854 – Guy saying “...more of the music you love to listen at work, we’re The Wolf 1400 AM,” then country music; heard legal ID at 0859:52. Fair signal, topping the competition. **(JW-CO)**
- 1400 KAYS KS **Hays** – 12/31 0937 – Local spot, then “14 KAYS” ID and into music. Briefly fair. **(JW-CO)**
- 1450 KMMS MT **Bozeman** – 1/8 1859 – Dual legal ID for KPRK-1340 and KMMS-1450; Fox News followed. Fair in QRM. **(JW-CO)**
- 1460 WRVK KY **Mount Vernon** – 1/2 1700 – Heard “wrvk1460.com,” then local program, maybe news, not commonly heard. **(KDF-IL)**
- 1460 KZUE OK **El Reno** – 1/10 1821-1831 – Fair peaks rising atop KCLE with Mexican music which I found was // web stream that was about 45 sec behind. “La Tremenda” slogan from a gal noted. Basically no trace of pest KXNO, thanks to antenna and semi auroral conditions. New! **(NK-IL)**
- 1460 KBZO TX **Lubbock** – 1/12 1900 – Poor in mess with Lubbock announcement noted into ESPN programming. Last heard a decade ago. **(NK-IL)**
- 1470 KYYW TX **Abilene** – 1/13 1800 – Good over/under WMBD, in early with IDs and making me think SSS cx would be great to TX again but that wasn’t the case. **(NK-IL)**
- 1490 KNAM CO **Silt** – 1/11 0859 – Legal ID at 0859:52: “The NFL is on Colorado’s Sports Leader The Team 1340 KTMM Grand Junction and KNAM Silt-Rifle.” Fair in KCFC null. **(JW-CO)**
- 1490 KTOP KS **Topeka** – 1/13 1900 – Poor-fair in mix with usual somewhat reverberated (trying to sound macho I guess) deep voiced announcer with ID. “Sports Radio...KTOP Topeka.” Very common here. **(NK-IL)**
- 1500 WBZI OH **Xenia** – 1/12 0711 – Poor though atop/alone. “Classic Country Radio,” weather, frequency, time check. **(JJR-WI)**
- 1510 KMSD SD **Milbank** – 12/30 0958 – Popped up with clear “KMSD” and then gone. Good enough for me. **(FO-OK)**
- 1540 KEDA TX **San Antonio** – 1/3 2043 – Tune-by: “here on Radio Jalapeño, KEDA” pronounced in English, then ad in Span[gl]ish from San Antonio TX. This is usual dominant night signal here instead of KXEL-IA which has a deep null toward the south. KEDA night pattern with 1 kW toward the WNW is not at all favorable for us either, while 5 kW day pattern is less rigid. KEDA easily overleaps 1540 KZMP The Metroplex, also Spanish but ESPN Deportes, with less power and mostly to its east. 1/5 2145 – “KEDA, Radio Jalapeño” ID from San Antonio TX, immediately upon tune-by. Suspect they are frequent, good for DXing. Again the dominant signal on frequency despite nominally unfavorable power and pattern as previously explained. **(GH-OK)**



- 1550 WIGN TN **Bristol** – 1/2 1733 – Good signal with local church announcements, ID, 35000 watt day power listed. **(KDF-IL)**
- 1560 KABI KS **Abilene** – 1/13 2000 – Fair atop with call ID after NOS music. Rare. **(NK-IL)**
- 1560 KZQQ TX **Abilene** – 1/12 1900 – Poor-fair but alone with call ID into Fox sports. Not heard in years. **(NK-IL)**
- 1570 WPTW OH **Piqua** – 1/3 2131 – Poor with calls in fade-up. Not heard in while. **(JJR-WI)**
- 1580 KOKB OK **Blackwell** – 1/2 1645 – Fading with several other signals in/out. I used to hear this well when I lived in Ponca City, but since moving to Shawnee it is much harder to hear. Fox sports with ads for Stillwater. **(JR-OK)**
- 1580 KWED TX **Seguin** – 1/21 0650 – Fading in/out with KOKB. Call ID with C&W music. **(JR-OK)**
- 1590 WRCY IN **North Vernon** – 1/11 2207 – Poor. “Real Country 1590 WRCY” in null, over others **(JJR-WI)**
- 1590 KPRT MO **Kansas City** – 1/7 1901 – Good to fair early evening logging in auroral conditions, with little QRM on this normally crowded frequency. Urban gospel music, quick legal ID at 1901. New! This completes logging all AM’s with City of License Kansas City for me, six on the Missouri and three on the Kansas side. **(BD-WI)**
- 1600 KUSH OK **Cushing** – 1/10 1827-1828 – Fair-good, mixed with KRVA’s Vietnamese with local ads and phone #'s. No sign of KGYM. **(NK-IL)**

### UNID

- 820 UNID -- 1/5 2153 – I’m getting English CCI to WBAP; nulling it as much as possible, and also trying to minimize the IBOC noise from WCCO by tuning to 822. The unID peaks about ESE/WNW, and the two make a slow SAH of 45/minute = 0.75 Hz, the unID on the hi side. I’m hoping to pull an ID circa 2200, but by 2157 it’s losing out to WBAP. After 2200 WBAP is doing local news, while unID is in national, including Motel 6 ad; 2205 mentions ABC News, and both back to separate talk shows. NRC AM Log lists stations in New York and Oregon with ABC on 820, both very unlikely. Trying to find an ABC affiliate listing on various websites gets nowhere, as “affiliates” links are for \*stations\*, not \*listeners\*. As of January 1, ABC networks have been revamped, ending a deal with Cumulus, now with Skyview; press reports say there are many new affiliates signing up. Setting aside the network clue for now, but going with the DF, I have heard before 50/1 kW WWBA Largo FL, Oct 7, 2013 at 0207, IDed by its echoing against WBAP during WBAP-originated Red Eye Radio, but did not log a SAH. **(GH-OK)**
- 1120 UNID -- 1/11 0738 – Very poor in tight KMOX null. Fire, brimstone preacher in 20 minutes & gone. **(JJR-WI)**
- 1240.13 UNID -- 1/2 0945 – Some station is off-frequency to the hi side making a LAH pitch of approx. C3 = one octave below middle-C on my keyboard. Peaks WNW/ESE. At this time an hour after sunrise, it can’t be too far away and more likely west than east. Looks like one of the four Coloradans would be most likely, closest being KCRT Trinidad. During daytime groundwave here, no such het is heard, between Wichita and Elk City. I would also settle for much-needed KBEL Idabel OK or even KOKL Okmulgee. 1/2 2250 – That off-frequency station to the hi side making a LAH against the graveyard pileup is audible again now as well as after sunrise, and again DFs for ESE/WNW. 1/5 2147 – Still heard causing LAH but quite weak, and unlikely ever to be able get any modulation or ID here, but still loops WNW/ESE. Could DXers in Colorado check on daytime groundwave whether it’s KCRT Trinidad as I suspect, or one of the others? **(GH-OK)**

- 700 unID** -- - 1/10 1816 – Two or three different men in SS, each starting slowly but quickly building to rapid-fire hucksterage with many hallelujahs; one mentioned Radio Gloria & Puerto Rico in passing, not as an ID. I assume this is domestic as it was easily topping WLW until 1843 then suddenly disappeared at 1845, possibly power drop. KHSE Wylie TX is a possibility. **(HF-MI)**
- 1310 unID** -- - 1/14 2027 – Briefly up with Glenn Miller's "Moonlight Serenade" and lost to others. Pointing NW/WNW, and not parallel Radio Encyclopedia. **(TLK-FL)**
- unID** -- - 1/14 2025 – Lots of co-channel, but the dominant one seemingly running automated with Oldies such as The Doors "Riders On the Storm"; Del Shannon "Hats Off to Larry"; The Easybeats "Friday On My Mind"; The Beach Boys "Good Vibrations"; "Peter, Paul & Mary "Puff the Magic Dragon"; Linda Ronstadt "Tracks Of My Tears." Pointing NW/WNW, suspect either WHEP Foley, AL 2500/43 or KAHL San Antonio, TX 5000/280. Tried calling WHEP, but just a recording to call during business hours message, and no working audio streaming for either located. **(TLK-FL)**

- 830 WFNO LA** **Norco** – 1/14 2007 – Presumed in local WWBA-820 splatter with weak signal, Spanish male talk until 2014 when Mexi-tune aired. Not EWTN Spanish programming from WACC in Hialeah. **(TLK-FL)**

- 850 **WXJC** AL **Birmingham** – 1/2 1725 – In multi-station mix with male “WXJC” ID, female “... Christian talk 96.5 FM 8-50 AM WXJC.” “You’re listening to the Crawford Broadcasting Company. A God and country station” noted at 1729. **(KK-VA)**

- 990 WNML TN **Knoxville** – 1/14 1735 – “Sports Radio WNML” slogan, peaking for two minutes over station airing Michael Medved Show. (HF-MI)
- 1040 WCHR NJ **Flemington** – 1/6 2035 – Preaching, strong signal, no sign of usual CJMS, lost to WEPN interference. (TF-NH)
- 1060 WHFB MI **Benton Harbor-St. Joseph** – 1/3 0100 – Under KYW, over XEEP; “You’re listening to AM 1060 WHFB Benton Harbor-St. Joseph, Michigan, a Gerard Media Company station,” and CBS news. (BC-NH)
- 1070 WAPI AL **Birmingham** – 1/12 0531 – ABC News, into Red Eye Radio at 0534. Under Radio Guamá. (TLK-FL)
- 1110 WKQA VA **Norfolk** – 1/9 1700 – Over/under WCCM; “This is Freedom 1110, WKQA Norfolk, serving northeastern Virginia and North Carolina with 50 thousand watts of power, and worldwide at WKQA radio dot com.” (BC-NH)
- 1120 WKQW PA **Oil City** – 1/1 1618 – ESPN sports feed, weak signal with splatter from WBBR-1130. (TF-NH)
- 1200 WJUA FL **Pine Island Center** – 1/7 1759 – Spanish pop music and ToH ID that also mentions WNPL (1460). No sign of anything else on 1200 at this time. (NW-ON)
- 1220 WQUN CT **Hamden** – 1/8 2145 – Atop frequency with standards, and clear “AM 1220 – WQUN” ID. (TF-NH)
- 1230 WMAF FL **Madison** – 1/7 2010 – Finally IDed the one I’ve been hearing pre- and just post-sunrise with mostly nonstop Classic Country. This evening, George Strait “Murder On Music Row” popped up briefly between WSBB, New Smyrna Beach (oldies) and UNID talk station. I called the website number, not expecting anyone to answer after hours but “Stephanie” picked up. I told her I was calling from Clearwater and have been hearing what I thought was WMAF; does she know if that George Strait title played 10 minutes ago? “Hold on, let me check the playlist... - WHUC NY **Hudson** – 1/4 0600 – Good; C&W music, “WRWD-FM Poughkeepsie, WRWB-FM Ellenville, WHUC AM Hudson,” and WRWD jingle. (BC-NH)
- 1240 WBAS MA **West Yarmouth** – 1/1 1700 – Poor signal with ToH ID: “1240 WBAS West Yarmouth” and Portuguese program. (NW-ON)
- 1250 KBRF MN **Fergus Falls** – 1/3 2300 – Very poor signal with ToH ID, “KBRF Fergus Falls, Minnesota” into news. NEW! (SC-IN)
- 1270 WMKT MI **Charlevoix** – 1/13 1705 – Over in-state rival WXYT-Detroit with Fox News, “1270 AM 102.3 FM WMKT, the Talk Station” slogan into Northern Michigan weather. (MKB-ON)
- WQKR TN **Portland** – 1/3 2332 – Fair with “This is WQKR 91.5 FM 1270 AM” ID and back to Oldie. NEW! (SC-IN)

- 1410 WZBR MA Dedham** – 1/6 2115 – Spanish music way over WPOP's Dan Patrick Show, 25 watts clobbering 5000 watts in a David and Goliath radio match. **(TF-NH)**
- WRTZ VA Roanoke** – 1/11 1727 – "The Roanoke Valley's True Oldies 1410, WRTZ" into "Don't Go Breaking My Heart" by Elton John and Kiki Dee. Mixing with WING-Dayton and CJWI-Montreal. **(NW-ON)**
- 1430 WNSW NJ Newark** – 1/8 2100 – Weak signal mixing with WKOX, with the Holy Rosary, with deep fades, heard a Relevant Radio ID at 2128, and WNSW is now owned by "Relevant Radio." **(TF-NH)**
- 1440 WNPV PA Lansdale** – 1/4 0500 – Under WVEI; "WNPV Lansdale, WNPV 1440 dot com." **(BC-NH)**
- 1450 WKIP NY Poughkeepsie** – 1/5 2053 – in with the Mark Levin Show, promo for the Glen Beck Show on "News Talk 1450 WKIP" before fading into the mush. **(TF-NH)**

- 1550 WSDK CT Bloomfield** – 1/4 2027 – Christian Radio Journal program, ID for WSBK and "Life Changing Radio" and into more Christian talk over CBEF. **(TF-NH)**
- 1570 WMVX MA Beverly** – 12/26 2135 – Spanish music way over French music from usually heard CJLV, 85 watts rolling over 10000 watts!! **(TF-NH)**
- 1590 WKTP TN Jonesborough** – 1/4 0102 – Under WSMN open carrier, through unID gospel and Spanish; promo, "...on ESPN Tri-Cities." New log. **(BC-NH)**
- 1600 WAOS GA Austell** – 12/30 1858 – SS version of O'Reilly Auto Parts and H&R Block spots, and ToH ID into talk about Mexican fútbol. Parallel to a stronger 1130-WLBA. **(NW-ON)**

- 1530 **SÃO TOME** VOA Pinheira JAN 2 2159 – ID at 2200, "This is the Voice of America signing off. For information regarding the times and frequencies of VOA programs, write to the Voice of America, Washington, DC." I had just finished setting up the antenna minutes before, and was amazed to hear this as I was tuning through my recording. I hope this bodes well for the antenna. [Brandi-NJ]

## PAN-AMERICAN DX

- 650 **MEXICO** XETNT Los Mochis, Sin. JAN 9 1416 – Poor signal in Spanish mentioning PAN de Sinaloa, so XETNT hasn't quite faded out yet. [Hauser-OK]
- 660 **MEXICO** XEDTL México, DF JAN 7 0010 – Call Letters and ID given at 0010, "XEDTL Radio Ciudadana..." into talk program by male; nice clear signal on top of the channel. [Niven-TX]
- 700 **MEXICO** XEDKR Guadalajara, Jal. JAN 2 0144 – Spanish from south/southwest, discussing Premio Nobel de la Paz, probably year-in-review show, 0146 ID as "Radio Red AM," which is XEDKR, 10000/150 watts, so still on day power? Lucking out that WLW is inaudible, must be in fade cycle as e.g. Chicagoans are not knocked out by aurora. Yes, by 0151, WLW is back with silly ballgame, though still can be nulled for something Spanish making slow SAH. [Hauser-OK]
- 750 **MEXICO** XEJMN Jesús María, Nay. JAN 5 0002 – Hearing this station was a stroke of luck, I just happen to tune from 760 down to 750 when I heard "XEJMN La voz de los Cuarto Pueblos..." by a young girl. New station. [Niven-TX]
- 750 **MEXICO** XECSE Culiacán, Sin. JAN 4 0155 – In not too bad under WSB with English music. 0200 Cyndi Lauper followed by Midnight Oil music, found parallel with URL. [Niven-TX]
- 760 **COLOMBIA** HJAJ Barranquilla JAN 10 1100 – Under WJR; choral national anthem. [Conti-NH]
- 860 **MEXICO** XENL Monterrey, NL JAN 5 0035 – Heard two Spanish stations here with XEUN as one unneeded and the other a new one being XENL, nice. [Niven-TX]
- 900 **MEXICO** XEOK Monterrey, NL JAN 9 0145 – Spanish dominant talking about Veracruz, so maybe XEWB? But then goes on to travel promo for Cancún (Mexicans axually go there?), federal IFT PSA, 0146 Informéxico (?) with espacio deportivo. Loops about north/south which fits for Vcz, but still more likely to be news/talk XEOK which is usually atop anything else including super-powered(?) XEW in the DF. XEWB is listed as Top 40. Then looping further west I am getting another Spanish talker with federal PSAs, Banco de México ad, maybe Chihuahua. [Hauser-OK]
- 960 **MEXICO** XEK Nuevo Laredo, Tamps. JAN 2 0601 – Tonight's Fox-hole by local KGWA Enid is occupied by XEK, as immediately obvious by their proud announcement of founding in 1937, and "estamos en la cuarta generación." XEK goes on to play "Cuando Calienta el Sol," although Nuevo Laredo is far from a beach, unless they refer to the Rio Bravo or dammed-up parts of it. That song is really steamy, as monolinguals may not realize. No national anthem heard during this window. KGWA carrier is much hummier than usual, impeding XEK but it remains atop some things much weaker in English until KGWA modulation resumes at 0605. [Hauser-OK]
- 970 **MEXICO** XESW Cd. Madera, Chih. JAN 7 1300 – National anthem in progress; 1301:45 female announcer with call letter ID and other chat; music ensued at 1303. Rough copy, mixing with others. Heard the next morning, too. Don't know what has happened to XEJ – they used to put a good signal into Colorado on a regular basis but have not heard them for months. [Wilkins-CO]
- 1060 **CUBA** *Radio 26*, Jovellanos JAN 10 1100 – Over/under KYW; woman mentioned *Radio 26* in music segue. [Conti-NH]



- 1060 **MEXICO** XERDO *La Raza*, Reynosa, Tamps. JAN 14 0227 – Horrible rumbling het: east/west open carrier from KIJN Texas, always off-frequency, vs north/south new XERDO even more off-frequency (some have measured it 76 Hz high). Federal PSA for Instituto Nacional Electoral (name change? used to be Instituto Federal Electoral – IFE); 0228 full ID, "XERDO, La Raza, 1060, 10 mil watts de potencia," etc. by overlapping SHVA segments. Or maybe it was 7 as in Cantú, also with a different name, La Radio Matamoros. Right after this I find that USB tuning on the DX-398 helps to minimize the interference on the low side; and then I rotate again to hear a third station, from the west thru the KIJN carrier, 0230 ID as KXPL El Paso, Texas. [Hauser-OK]
- 1080 **CUBA** *R.Surco*, unknown location JAN 4 0500 – Under WTIC; choral national anthem and familiar canned ID, parallel 1140 kHz. Then at 0502 heard choral national anthem from *R.Ciudad de la Habana* parallel 820 kHz. [Conti-NH]
- 1110 **MEXICO** XEWR *R.Guadalupana*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. JAN 11 0219 – Spanish woman talk from east/west with KFAB nulled making a SAH of approx. 269/minute = 4.48 Hz, must be XEWR which IRCA lists as a 500-watt daytimer; but Cantú and WRTH 2015 say 1/0.5 kW. No U.S. Spanish stations around here, but there is one further Mexican, XEVS in Hermosillo, 1/0.25 kW per Cantú. [Hauser-OK]
- 1130 **MEXICO** unID JAN 3 0348 – Weak signal in Spanish, best from the northwest/southeast, but that's influenced by needing to null KMOX IBOC from the northeast. Mentions a .mx website so that narrows it down to four of the seven XEs not in the west. Nothing from KWKH as I tune in, must be in a fade, then back up a bit, but it's always weak at night here on tight westward pattern. [Hauser-OK]
- 1140 **CUBA** *R.Surco*, Morón JAN 10 1100 – Over/under WRVA; canned ID, "Transmite CMIP Radio Surco..." and "Buenos días Ciego de Avila." [Conti-NH]
- 1170 **COLOMBIA** HJNW *Caracol Radio*, Cartagena JAN 3 0600 – Under WWVA; Caracol Christmas jingle, identified by Fredrik Dourén at RealDX. JAN 10 1100 – Under WWVA; Caracol Christmas jingle. [Conti-NH]
- 1220 **MEXICO** XESAL Saltillo, Coah. JAN 1 0058 – Noted underneath XEB with fair signal. Sometimes XEB would fade XESAL would rise to owning the channel. ID noted at 0100 then into long version of national anthem. Found to be the same as the internet feed at <http://www.radionarro.com>. [Niven-TX]
- 1300 **MEXICO** XEP Cd. Juárez, Chih. JAN 9 0152 – Elvis song *segué* to Beatles "Hey Jude," both in English with good signal from east/west. Presumed XEP surely on 38 kW day power rather than 200 watts night. The U.S. stations around here on 1300 are talk, except Marshall MO listed as C&W and surely no such big sig. [Hauser-OK]
- 1430 **MEXICO** XEWD Cd. Miguel Alemán, Tamps. JAN 9 0154 – Norteña music from north/south up to 0200. Don't see how it could be anything but XEWD listed in IRCA Log as REG/NOR format, as none of the Texans or Nebraskans in NRC AM Log are Spanish. [Hauser-OK]
- 1510 **MEXICO** XEQI Monterrey, NL JAN 9 0155 – From north/south, with WLAC nulled, but not much of a factor tonight, speaker in an echoey venue, then losing to music station, presumably Colorado. 0201 back up to outro talk show with 800 number, and 0201.5 finally definite full ID partially copied: "XEQI, 1510 AM... Monterrey, Nuevo León... 10 mil wats de potencia," and some slogan, www. sites and e-mails I can't copy, all by woman with reverb. [Hauser-OK]
- 1560 **MEXICO** XEJPV Cd. Juárez, Chih. JAN 11 0227 – Spanish gospel huxter dominating, phone number, and Radio Viva, Ciudad Juárez ID in passing, 0228 fuller ID with jingle, <http://radioviva.com.mx>. However, 2014 IRCA Mexican Log has XEJPV with 1 kW daytime, slogan as Indie AM 1560, though format REL, which really doesn't match. WRTH 2015 and Cantú have 1560 Juárez as 1 kW daytimer, XEJPV, Indie. On OCT 8 as in DXLD 14-41, in another log I mentioned that "Radio Viva" used to be the slogan on 1560 Juárez. That refers to the 2013 IRCA Log. See also DXLD 14-24 for an ambiguous article about 1560 becoming "Indie," but really Juárez? Website I heard actually forwards to <http://radioviva.mx> clearly Christian, and in the fine print abottom does show 1560 Juárez by this name, so apparently it's back, or never left. Part of the 7-station group MegaRadio in CiJz which also includes 1110 kHz. [Hauser-OK]
- 1620 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, La Habana//Guantánamo JAN 6 0243 – Woman in Spanish here is not parallel *R.Rebelde* on 5025 which has man with baseball during which Matanzas is ahead 7-1. Therefore, I assume the 1620 *R.Rebelde* has switched to Rebelde FM relay. At 0249, I find 5025 to be parallel echoey 1180 kHz. [Hauser-OK]

## NOAA Space Weather Outlook

Issued January 12, 2015 – For the period January 12-February 7, 2015

Solar activity is expected to be at low levels with a chance for moderate levels (R1-R2, Minor-Moderate) from 12 January through 04 February due to possible M-class flare activity from Regions 2255 (S16, L=321, class/area Dai/160 on 04 January) or 2257 and the return of old Regions 2249 (S11, L=165) and 2253 (S07, L=003).

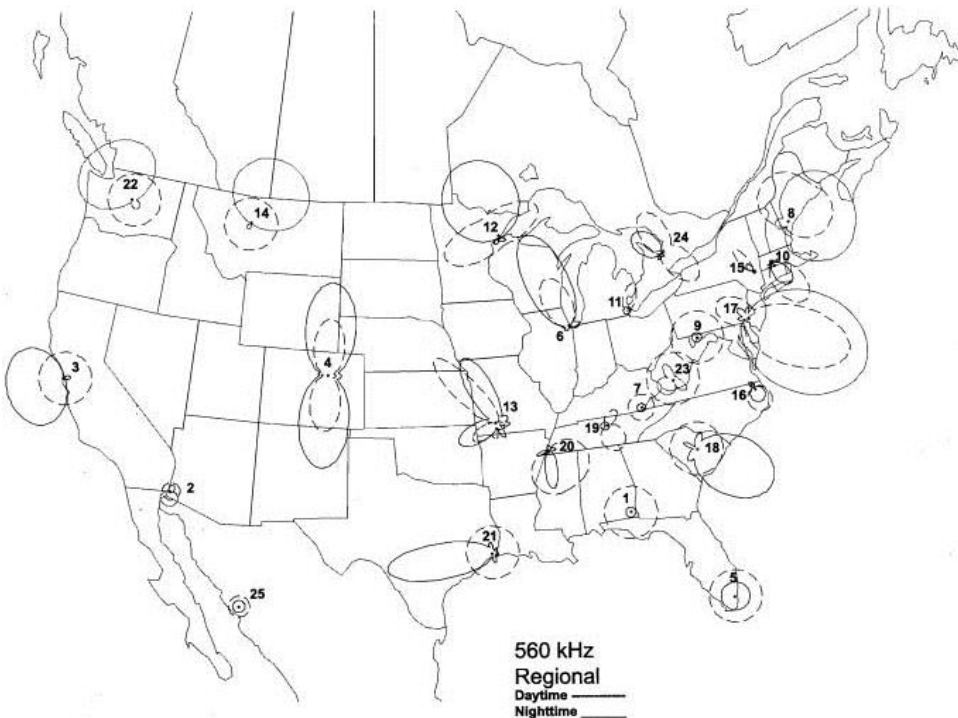
A chance for an S1 (Minor) solar radiation storm is likely from 29 January through the end of the forecast period due to possible significant flare activity from the return of old Region 2253.

The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at geosynchronous orbit is expected to be at moderate to high levels on 13-14 January, 19-21 January, and again from 26 January through 07 February due to CH HSS activity.

Geomagnetic field activity is expected to reach unsettled levels on 12-13 January, 17-19 January, 21-22 January, 24-27 January, 29 January-04 February, and again on 07 February. Active periods are likely on 22 January, 25 January, 31 January-01 February, and on 03 February due to recurrent CH HSS interaction.

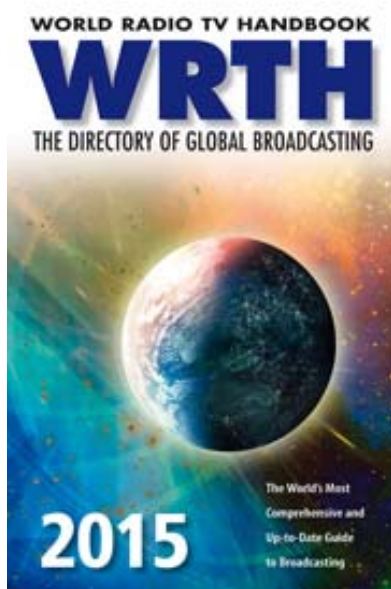

## With Rise of Talk Radio, a College Sport Fades as a Staple of the Airwaves

Dave Popkin, the play-by-play announcer for Seton Hall men's basketball games, knew things would be different when the team switched radio homes three years ago. After almost two decades on the air with WABC-AM, Seton Hall's games moved to WMTR-AM – a 7,000-watt station based in Morristown, N.J., But fans were finding only static.

"I'd hear it on social media and anecdotally," Popkin recalled, "that people who lived in certain areas could't get the game as well, because of the signal."

Seton Hall games had moved from a station that could be heard clearly around the region – WABC has a 50,000-watt signal – to a station fans could not pick up near the university's South Orange campus. That relationship lasted only one year; Seton Hall switched last season to WNYM-AM. But while Seton Hall's new home broadcasts at 50,000 watts during the day, it drops to 5,000 at night – when most games are aired.

That leaves Seton Hall in a situation more and more college basketball programs are finding themselves in as stations have found they can bring in more advertising money with news or talk-radio programs than with sports.

"Certainly, there are a lot of different options for a fan base now," said Aaron Worsham, senior vice president for affiliate relations of Learfield Sports, which represents the media interests of nearly 100 colleges and universities, including Seton Hall.

"It's progressed throughout the years, and there are some differences from years past," he said. "But I'm still a firm believer in college and radio. Tuning into a station – whether it's AM or FM, whether it's on an app or being streamed – live content is unique."

This season, especially, is one that Seton Hall fans would most likely love to tune in for,. The team (13-3, 3-1 Big East) entered the Associated Press Top 25 rankings at No. 19 last week, its highest ranking since the 2000-1 season; this week it dropped to No. 21. It began the season 12-2 and started Big East play with victories over ranked opponents, St. John's and Villanova, before losing on the road to Xavier on Wednesday and then barely surviving against Creighton, 68-67, on Saturday.

In Philadelphia, Villanova had a multiyear contract with WIP-AM, formerly an all-sports station. But seven of Villanova's 16 games have been broadcast on WIP's sister station because of time conflicts. Boston College and Georgetown have similar arrangements with their partners.

"In a major market like we're in, we don't talk a lot of college sports at all," said Spike Eskin, program director for WIP-FM, which formerly broadcast Villanova games. "For me, I don't know if in a major market – with pro teams – it has a ton of fit."

Rutgers is the lone team in the New York area that has a steady radio home, despite not having reached the N.C.A.A. tournament in 24 years. WOR-AM has broadcast Rutgers games for almost a decade, partly because Rutgers pays close to \$10,000 per game – a price many schools are unwilling to pay to guarantee consistent airtime on a major station.

Seton Hall and St. John's each pay WNYM \$5,000 per game. As for all-sports stations, WFAN – the New York area's most prominent – charges about \$12,000 to air a college basketball game, because its professional sports deals are far more lucrative.

"We had St. John's on for a number of years," said Mark Chernoff, WFAN's vice president for programming. "And it got to a point that in their 30-plus-game schedule, I was only able to clear sometimes eight to 11 games of their season."

Increasingly, universities are looking toward digital and satellite radio, and to apps like TuneIn Radio, which allow users to listen anywhere on phones or tablets.

"It was a luxury for Seton Hall to be on WABC, because the signal was huge," said Popkin, the Seton Hall announcer. "I used to be able to listen to Seton Hall games all the way out to Chicago. But things change. Conservative talk dominates AM radio so much that this is where we're at. But we're still on the air."
