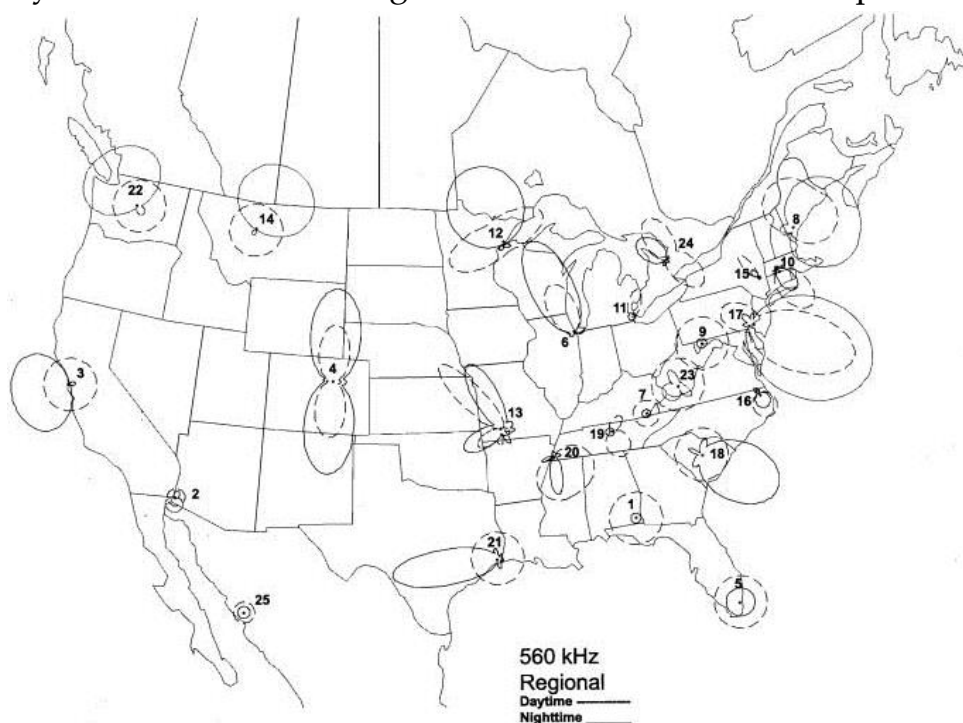

It's only 110 watts at night with circular pattern tangent toward the southwest, same as daytime with 5 kW and big local-quality signal here. **(GH-OK)**
- KTRS MO St. Louis** – 1/10 0505 – Out of ABC News, into commercials for Brook and Park senior memory care, and Metro Lighting. Followed by "The big Five-Fifty KTRS, St. Louis." Followed by Jim Bohannon. **(JDS-MN)**
- KFYR ND Bismarck** – 2/11 1845 – Out of *North Dakota Game and Fish Department Outdoors Report*. "For the latest news, weather and sports it's AM Five-Fifty KFYZ." Followed by lead-in to weather report "From the Dakota storm center here is your KX news weather forecast." **(JDS-MN)**
- 590 WJMS MI Ironwood**- 1/31 09712 – New! Out of country music. "Zac Brown Band *In No Hurry* on Real Country. That makes two of us because I got plenty of time to sit with you. Giving you the best variety in country music. I am Chris Potter. You got Jason Aldean on the way in minutes. But right now, time for a classic my friends. George Jones, *I'm a One Woman Man* on real country." **(JDS-MN)**
- 600 WMT IA Cedar Rapids** – 2/11 1859 – Out of Bloomberg Market News, into weather report ending with current temperature 22 degrees. "Continuous coverage of breaking news, and hourly updates, that keep you informed. This is Six-Hundred WMT AM Cedar Rapids." Followed by Fox news. **(JDS-MN)**
- CKAT ON North Bay** – 1/31 0721 – Poor; weather report ending with "Minus 23 in North Bay." Followed by "Today's best country (inaudible) CKAT." Into country music. **(JDS-MN)**
- 690 CKGM QC Montréal** – 2/11 1923 – "TSN 6-90 Montreal," followed by Oranges at Halftime show. **(JDS-MN)**
- 710 KCMO MO Kansas City** – 2/11 1934 – "KCMO talk radio 7-10. Now on FM 103.7." Into *The Mark Levin Show*. **(JDS-MN)**
- 790 CFCW AB Camrose** – 1/31 0757 – Out of country music. "This is 7-90 CFCW. A Newcap radio station with studios in Camrose and West Edmonton Mall." Then CFCW jingle followed by country music. **(JDS-MN)**
- 820 WBAP TX Fort Worth** – 2/1 0721 – Out of commercials. "WBAP morning news every day, every week, all year. We're here for you. News Talk 8-20WBAP." **(JDS-MN)**
- 840 KTIC NE West Point** – 2/14 0920 – Two men chatting, perhaps an interview, on the subject of dairy farming; area news and ads followed at 0924. Fair signal. **(JW-CO)**
- KVJY TX Pharr** – 2/19 0150 – With WHAS nulled from a SAH more like 8 Hz than last night's 7, a Spanish call-in show again about El Salvador; 0155 break ID as ESPN Deportes; 0158, USG PSAs, still Spanish, including highway safety and 0159 influenza, but fading down just in time to miss a ToH ID, but already know it's KVJY. **(GH-OK)**

- 880 KHAC NM **Tse Bonito** – 2/19 0805 – Christian song somewhat overmodulated/distorted and not much on the lower sideband, as always from KHAC Tse Bonito NM; 0807 rendition of ‘Star-Spangled Banner’ in English to a different tune than usual! Wonder if they play that every morning. 0808 on to a hymn in Navajo. KHAC is always running day facility 10 kW ND, dominating rather than anything from KLRG AR, which should now be 50 kW ND. **(GH-OK)**
- CKLQ MB **Brandon** – 2/1 0743 – Out of country music, “8-80 CKLQ.” Then back to country music. **(JDS-MN)**
- 910 KWDZ UT **Salt Lake City** – 2/14 0150 – As I am dozing off, rock music from the NW/SE, 0213 awaken to hear a Radio Disney ID. Can’t be WFDF in Michigan, wrong direction and no longer Disney, so has to be KWDZ. The NRC *AM Log* 2014-2015 notes had been silent since Aug 2013 (as of Aug 2014). But NRC AM Switch reported 8/22/14: “Formerly silent stations informing the FCC that they are no longer silent: 910 KWDZ UT Salt Lake City – Silent since 8/17/2013, returned to the air 8/14.” Yet I don’t get any other hits on the NRC website, as if no one had really logged it. Now it’s steady with KVIS Vinita OK from the east nulled. 5/1 kW, KWDZ day pattern has a good lobe toward us, but not its night pattern; hmmm. It sure is taking a long time for Disney to divest itself of all those unwanted stations. **(GH-OK)**
- 920 KVEL UT **Vernal** – 2/9 0105 – Continues to reach out far beyond what ought to be its night coverage area, i.e. a 1 kW lobe to its NE, rather than a 5 kW ND daytime pattern. ID for “104.5 & 920, KVEL,” weather, notices of traffic delays on highways due to construction, or weather? Wolf Creek Pass mentioned – yes, there is one in NE Utah, besides the better-known one in Colorado we have traversed a number of times, and pine to do so again (in the summer!). NRC *AM Log* shows 104.5 is – you guessed it – really just a translator, K283BN, now getting top billing as legacy AM stations continue to dis their roots. At least KVEL covers its routes. **(GH-OK)**
- 930 WTAD IL **Quincy** – 2/6 2018 – WKY is not “indomable” now as I can null it completely to hear English – and immediately ID as WTAD, with local ad, “Talk radio 9-30, WTAD,” plug the KHQA Super Fan Shout out, that being TV channel “7” in Hannibal-Quincy {which I used to analog-DX by tropo}, which by the way here is pronounced Quinsy, not Quinzy. **(GH-OK)**
- 940 WMIX IL **Mount Vernon** – 2/14 0146 – “AM 940, The Legendary WN##” YL ID, then classic rock. I assumed this would be easy to trace, but no such slogan for a 940 in the NRC *AM Log*. DF-wise, far most likely is WMIX Mt Vernon IL. At their website <http://www.wmix94.com/> I don’t find any “legendary” branding, however. Night pattern is tight slightly clockwise from E-W so not very favorable for us; day pattern is 90 degrees from that, almost N-S; 5000/1500 watts. As name implies, format is a mix, basically news/talk/music day, music overnight. **(GH-OK)**
- 960 CFAC AB **Calgary** – 2/7 0617 – “This is the Moose and Maggie Show.” Into commercials including Jack Carter Chevrolet, Cadillac, Shane Homes Calgary, and MDCU Credit Union. Followed by “Sports Net 9-60, The Fan.” **(JDS-MN)**
- 970 WDAY ND **Fargo** – 2/13 0115 – ‘Jim Bohannon Show’ resuming from commercial break, loops N/S vs the CCI. My first guess is WDAY, and that proves to be correct per website listings at 2300-0200; i.e, the 0100-0200 hour is a repeat of the first hour which would have been live at 2300-2400 per the jimbotalk.net web site. No 970 affiliates elsewhere on this axis in NE, TX or even LA. **(GH-OK)**
- WGEE WI **Superior** – 2/21 0659 – “The northland’s new sports radio AM 9-70 WGEE Superior, Duluth. This is CBS sports radio.” **(JDS-MN)**
- 1090 KAAZ AR **Little Rock** – 2/7 0729 – Out of contemporary Christian music “The mighty KAAZ.” Into commercials for Macy’s and Arkansas Health Care. Followed by “Listen at work on your computer 10-90 KAAZ dot com.” Then back to music. **(JDS-MN)**
- 1120 KTXW TX **Manor** – 2/14 1847 – Anti-radical-Islam talk show, criticizing the president for not being anti-that enough, mentions “on a Friday afternoon” so apparently not live. Good signal with weaker KMOX totally nulled, this looping roughly N/S. Phone 1-800-684-3110 and mentions ACLJ.org which is the American Center for Law & Justice. I go directly to KTXW program schedule, <http://ktxw.net/program-schedule/> to find Sat at 5-6 pm CST it’s ‘Jay Sekulow

Live', and guess what, the click-on link on his name leads right back to ACLJ.org --- so this is KTXW, now branded as "The Bridge." (GH-OK)

- 1140 CHRB AB **High River** – 2/7 0744 – Out of country music. "Stepping back in time with a classic country hit on Southern Alberta's community radio station AM 11-40." Followed by classic country song. (JDS-MN)
- 1170 KRUE MN **Waseca** – 2/7 0752 – Weather report ending with "KRUE Waseca, Owatonna." Followed by song: Fly Robin Fly, by Silver Convention. (JDS-MN)
- 1180 KYES MN **Rockville** – 2/7 0759 – "AM 11-80 Relevant Radio. KYES Rockville, St. Cloud." (JDS-MN)
- 1190 WBHA MN **Wabasha** – 2/21 0759 – New! Out of song: "We Are Never Ever Getting Back Together" Taylor Swift. "The valley's hottest country. WBHA 11-90 AM, 99-Point-7 FM, Wabasha Minnesota." (JDS-MN)
- CFSL SK **Weyburn** – 2/21 0754 – Out of country music "Playing today's hits and all your country favorites. AM 11-90 CFSL." Then back to music. (JDS-MN)
- 1210 KUBR TX **San Juan** – 2/16 2043 – Dominant signal is not KGYN Guymon OK, but romantic music in Spanish looping N/S. Although there are 5 XEs listed in deeper Mexico, this is surely KUBR in the Rio Grande Valley of TX, which is really religious, so if I had listened longer may have detected a revered object of affection, but it fades a bit so when nulled I can hear country from KGYN 90 degrees off, not the big sig it often provides when on day pattern at night. (GH-OK)
- 1220 WSLM IN **Salem** – 2/16 0204 – "Network Indiana" news atop channel from perpetual cheater WSLM Salem IN, 5 kW day power instead of 82 watts licensed for night; same pattern day and night, tightly slightly clockwise from east/west, should that even be maintained. (GH-OK)
- KLBB MN **Stillwater** – 2/7 0817 – "Club 12-20 KLBB." Followed by commercial for GM's On Star, Geico RV insurance, and The Golden Age of Radio weeknights at eight p.m. on AM 12-20 KLBB. Where your music and memories live." (JDS-MN)
- 1250 WSSP WI **Milwaukee** – 2/22 0759 – New; out of program "Sunday Morning." "12-50 WSSP Milwaukee, 103.7 WXSS HD2 Milwaukee, 105.7 The Fan." (JDS-MN)
- 1290 WIRL IL **Peoria** – 2/8 0205 – ID only for "102.7 WIRL," and classic rock, loops NE/SW. Search leads right to Peoria IL, and 102.7 isn't WIRL at all but another FM translator, W274BM, wagging this dog of an AM station, which is really WIRL on 1290, 5/5 kW U4, officially "Good Time Oldies". Night pattern has major lobe to NNE, somewhat lesser lobe to the SSW. (GH-OK)
- 1300 KOLY SD **Mobridge** – 2/21 0934 – Monopoly game quiz, taking calls on-air at 845-3654; finally, a winner at 0939; followed by chat, ag features, livestock report, ads, etc. Good peaks but fading and QRM. (JW-CO)
- 1360 WMOB AL **Mobile** – 2/8 0218 – "Christian programming all day and all night here on WMOB, Mobile" and country gospel tune. As others have concluded, can't be on night power and pattern of 200 watts southwards into the Gulf; day power is 9 kW and supposedly also south only, so really ND? There are also 1360 stations in the Ark-La-Miss between us, being overcome, unheard. Elsewhere I heard a news interview with someone there who pronounces it "MOE-bull. (GH-OK)
- 1450 KBBS WY **Buffalo** – 2/23 0834 – Wyoming high school basketball scores and rankings; call letter ID's and ads. Fair at best in QRM. (JW-CO)
- 1520 KYND TX **Cypress** – 2/9 0900 – Dual legal ID at 0900:45: "This is AM 1520 KYND Cypress and AM 1540 KGBC Galveston-Houston," followed by news in English, with an Asian focus. Fair signal, usually under strong KOKC, but occasionally on top. They must be on their new 25 kW power, and much of that must come this way, since they are often heard here around this time, well after Houston sunrise (about 0800 ELT), and giving pest KOKC a run for their money. FCC website still shows almost all of their signal going towards the southeast into the Gulf of Mexico. (JW-CO)
- 1540 CHIN ON **Toronto** – 2/8 0755 – New! Male and female announcers speaking Chinese. Followed by Hawaii Five-O theme song. Into male voice speaking English "China radio dot com, the voice of public talk show radio. This is CHIN Radio" at 0759. (JDS-MN)



UNID

- 700 UnID -- 2/10 2028 – WLW easily nulled completely revealing a Spanish gospel exclaiming “en el nombre de Jesús,” 2029 about a “bendición,” so it’s almost over with a benediction? Not exactly; finishes sermon almost breaking up (emotionally, not modulationally), aleluyas, mentions Hermana Gonzales and I guess that’s she on the air at 2031. Not familiar with any XE on 700 with such a format if full-time, but there is 920-watt KHSE in Wylie (Dallas) TX, Spanish religious format I now remember, which is probably this, and it is roughly north/south. (GH-OK)
- 840 UnID -- 2/16 0210 – Steady preacher in English with WHAS nulled, on alleged scriptural prophecy, loops about WNW/ESE, 0213 taking a caller from Nevada, thanking him for his teaching on global warming; mentions 1-800-ENDTIME, or <http://endtime.com>. KXNT web site shows Coast to Coast now; the endtime.com web site lists the only 840 affiliate as Alexandria, LA KWDF, 840 AM, 4:30–5:00 p.m. (CST) Monday to Friday. Per station’s own site (also with nice coverage map!), “KWDF has been airing Gospel music and Christian teaching programs for almost 25 years. In 2008, Wilkins Radio purchased KWDF and continued the Christian format and expanded to an exclusive Christian talk station.” But there’s no program schedule, and one small problem – it’s supposed to be an 8 kW daytimer. Is there an FM translator supplying any excuse to be broadcasting programming in the middle of the night? Another possibility is another daytimer, 10 kW in Mobile AL, WBHY. It does have FM translators. But scheduled for 1-1:30 am weekdays is ‘Grace to You,’ no apparent Connections with the End Times show. The edge to KWDF since the End Times show has been on it although at a different time. (GH-OK)

A 0559 spot mentioned ‘Puerto Rico’ several times in an apparent ID though not much else of the context was clear and I didn’t have WKAQ’s web feed to compare it to. However, based on content I presume it’s the one. [Funkenhauser-FL]
- 630 **HONDURAS** *R.America*, La Ceiba//Choluteca FEB 15 0314 – “Radio America” ID followed by long discussion by man. Peaking to good signal. [Beu-TX]
- 630 **MEXICO** XEFB, La FB, Monterrey, NL JAN 6 0423 – Briefly atop Honduran *R.America* with a shouted ‘La FB’, ranchera music followed by a ‘Fútbol... La FB’ spot mentioning scores for ‘Santa Rosa... Copan’ and others as it faded to the Honduran, *R.America*. [Funkenhauser-FL]
- 680 **COLOMBIA** HJZO *Señal Radio Colombia*, Barranquilla JAN 16 0425 – With unidentified Spanish also, I heard two men in talk mentioning ‘Radio Colombia’ in context, also ‘Señal Radio Colombia’. Also heard ‘...escuchen Radio Colombia’ IDs at 0444, 0511 and 0530. Later at 2330 there were multiple ‘Radio Colombia’ IDs, then two men talking about ‘web radio’, and ‘PlayStation 4’. JAN 17 0343 – ID as ‘Radio Nacional de Colombia’ then a wild tune about ‘Colombianos’ also heard with delay via its web feed. FEB 5 0248 – After a Latin crooner ended, a man went into a lengthy speech about possible border problems with Peru, mentioning ‘Fuerzas armados de Colombia... territorio toda Colombia... Peruanistas conflicto’ with interference. Later a female gave an impassioned pep-talk about ‘Las Cosas de Colombia’ accompanied by ‘Pomp and Circumstance’, then many ID spots containing Radio Señal Colombia, Radio Señal Nacional de Colombia, and Radio Emisora Nacional context. (No doubt about this one!) Mixing now with impassioned ‘fútbol’ play-by-play on La Voz de Honduras. FEB 6 0405 – Latin-flavored jazz in a good signal and a 0408 ‘Radio Colombia’ ID. [Funkenhauser-FL] FEB 24 0858 – Music, talk in Spanish, ID at 0904. [Brandi-NJ]
- 680 **HONDURAS** *La Voz de Honduras* synchros FEB 5 0304 – Mixing with *Señal Radio Colombia* and briefly dominating, but largely heard under difficult conditions causing me to check for a web parallel, namely HRN 92.9 FM Tegucigalpa. Fútbol play-by-play heard under HJZO while the game was underway, commentators included a woman who mentioned ‘equipo Venezolano’. At 0330 with the game wound up there was post game locker room talk, difficult with HJZO interference but heard in parallel via the web feed. At 0345 a clear ‘Deportiva HRN’ on air. Not much chance to ID the location as 680 kHz has six *La Voz de Honduras* stations. [Funkenhauser-FL]
- 700 **COLOMBIA** HJCX, *W Radio*, Cali FEB 2 0432 – First noted with the Bee Jees then a mix of adult English contemporary songs and pop ballads with male/female chatter. ‘Doble U’ heard at 0436, and also a 0501 ID as ‘Doble U... Colombia y el mundo’ and ‘Nuestros teléfonos’. Their web feed was about 30 seconds late. Over the next hour or so I followed *R.Sucre* and this one, and heard James Blunt’s ‘You’re Beautiful’, Lady Ga Ga ‘Very Superstitious’, and new ‘Dance’ with Spanish lyrics and chatter by the DJs. Strong at times but subject to lengthy fading to the oil burner, also trading places once or twice with *R.Sucre*. Subsequent receptions in this time frame shows that HJCX’s program is a mix of talk, some call-ins, popular music (often with English lyrics), and news ‘boletins’ at occasional intervals. FEB 3 0504 – Men in talk and at 0511 McCartney/Jackson singing ‘The Girl is Mine’. At 0513 a short ‘Boletin de Noticias en Doble U’ by a female, a 0514 mention of ‘increíble... Doble U’ and ‘deportes Doble U’ at 0515, with a 0516 program announcement as ‘Monica Martinez... en Doble U’. Partly and covered at 0534 by *R.Sucre* playing Huyunca-like music (confirmed via *Sucre*’s Web feed) but returned with two



females discussing music, then playing Bon Jovi's 'Always'. JAN 6 0428 – Several 'Doble U' mentions then and an unknown English pop female vocalist also heard in a parallel web feed. FEB 11 0212 – Playing Stevie Wonder's 'Overjoyed' then several announcers chatting. One actually said, "I do not understand," in English, while laughing and clowning around. [Funkenhauser-FL]

700 **COSTA RICA** FCN *Radio.Com*, San Jose FEB 2 0408 – Highly tentative! Heard for less than two minutes until it disappeared into the noise described below and no ID was heard. The NRC AM Radio Log shows KHSE Wylie, Texas, with Spanish religious programming, but strange propagation conditions this night definitely favored a more southern source. When I finally connect to their web feed for a parallel, suspected FCN was gone in the noise and never reappeared. In the brief interval that I had it, I heard a soft-spoken Spanish preacher in an obvious sermon with mentions of "Dios... en la noche Domingo... para mundo y Cristo." Faded to a noise which I can only describe the sound of roaring forced air combustion in an oil or gas burning furnace – very eerie sounding, rising gradually to completely overtake the channel, then slowly giving way to other on-channel DX. [Funkenhauser-FL]

700 **ECUADOR** HCRS2 *R.Sucre*, Guayaquil FEB 2 0417 – Appearing gradually as the roaring furnace sound faded into a lively Latin vocal to a 0419 ID, "¡Radio Sucre! ¡Ecuador!" Then a fast talking DJ, repeating 'Radio Sucre' and pronounced Ecuador as 'Ecuadorrrrr' followed by talk mentioning 'Gracias' and '...para Quito' but it faded to the noise by 0422, which after a long interval gave way to Colombian W. I had Sucre's web feed going and when it traded places with W at 0447, I was able to confirm I was hearing the same program playing a fast-paced song about Ecuador or Ecuadorians then at 0453 a long, funny novelty song, country after country mentioned in the lyrics with 'Te Amo' attached. This was followed by more talk as it faded to the oil burner but returned after a lengthy absence at 0551 with thumping music and wild accordion accompaniment under W. FEB 6 0441 – Poor with W talk; a wild Latin vocal with distinctive, repeated, 'Hey Hey Hey' in the lyrics, also in parallel via their web feed. [Funkenhauser-FL]

700 **MEXICO** XEGD *La Poderosa*, Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. FEB 19 1259 – Big hum looping southwest on open carrier, 1300 Spanish news starts without any ID. Possibly two different stations, but I doubt it: hummer would be XEGD, 5/1 kW per IRCA and Cantú, 5/0.25 kW per WRTH. [Hauser-OK]

700 **MEXICO** XEETCH Etchojoa, Son. FEB 23 1303 – Indigenous language, then Spanish mentioning Comisión Nacional para el Desarrollo de los Pueblos Indígenas (CDI), its sponsoring agency; at 1304 call-letter IDs at least twice as XEETCH. Poor signal perhaps about to fade out, but no significant interference, loops west/southwest. This is in Etchojoa, Sonora, or Navojoa, 5 kW daytimer per Cantú, La Voz de los Tres Rios, and per IRCA serving three linguistic groups. Website with much more about it in Spanish <http://ecos.cdi.gob.mx/xeetch.html> including, "700 AM / 5000 watts, Dirección: Carretera Navojoa – Huatabampo, Km. 27, C.P. 85280, Etchojoa, Sonora, Horario de transmisión: Diurno de 6:00 a 18:00 horas, Cobertura: Sonora, Sinaloa, Chihuahua, Lenguas en que transmite: Mayo, yaqui, guarijío y español." It would be interesting to see what the same text would look like in those languages, but I see no link to them. Does provide audio streaming, and gallery of station staff. [Hauser-OK]

710 **MEXICO** XEDP Cd. Cuauhtémoc, Chih. FEB 24 0147 – IFE PSA, then mentions Cuauhtémoc (could be an historical or street reference, major figure in México), but it's really XEDP *La Ranchera de Cuauhtémoc*, in the Chihuahua city named for him, with singing ID jingle at 0147, which they frequently play. No het and little interference in auroral conditions. [Hauser-OK]

730 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, La Fe JAN 17 0513 – Regularly heard under semi-local WWTK talk, this night with a nice version of 'Que Sas'. [Funkenhauser-FL]

740 **MEXICO** XEQN *R.Fórmula*, Torreón, Coah. FEB 19 1245 – Horrible low audible het to KRMG Tulsa as often the case on the low side, also in the evenings, but this time with SSB tuning to help, and nulling KRMG as much as possible (not a lot), I manage to copy some of the Spanish, mentioning "noticias Torreón," and later Coahuila, so that's it: XEQN, 10/1 kW per IRCA, Cantú and WRTH. [Hauser-OK]

760 **MEXICO** unID FEB 20 0600 – Under WJR; choral national anthem, suspect XEABC. [Conti-NH]

780 **MEXICO** XESFT *La Poderosa*, San Fernando, Tamps. JAN 3 0340 – Latin vocals mixing with *R.Coro*. At 0402 time check, '...y dos minutos' only partly audible, then a punctuated spot with "¡La Poderosa! HSFT La Poderosa... transmite desde... frecuencia modulada" in context and that was followed by the Mexican national anthem. Despite thumping sounds,

echo effects and interference, after replaying my recording numerous times, I was able ascertain there was absolutely no mention of 'X' nor of 'E' in the call letters announcement. I heard the FM call! Fred Cantú's Mexican list shows their call letters on FM 103.7 as XHSFT, so AM on 780 kHz is perhaps just a simulcast of FM. JAN 4 0403 – Much weaker under talk with a shouted/echo spot containing multiple 'La Poderosa' mentions, and as before, was followed by the Mexican national anthem. There are two La Poderosa listed on 780 kHz in Fred Cantú's list and one in the 2014 WRTH. In my last report, I listed XEXY 'La Poderosa-La Voz de Balzas' in Altamirano as presumed heard on NOV 18 0154. Comparing that date's recording to the more recent ones, and also listening XEXY's live feed, I am correcting my earlier report. The punctuated 'La Poderosa' spots that I recorded from XESFT are not heard on XEXY, which has a good live feed ('en vivo'), so I've listened to XEXY on the web (but not much luck with connecting to XESFT web site, however). On XEXY I've heard several ID spots as a 'La Voz de Balzas' with the call XEXY and 'La Poderosa' in context, but not the same animated and punctuated 'La Poderosa' announcements that I hear on XESFT. [Funkenhauser-FL]

800 **BONAIRE** PJB *TransWorld Radio*, Kralendijk FEB 8 0315 – Discussion by man followed by religious music. Strong signal peaks. [Beu-TX]

810 **COLOMBIA** HJCY *Caracol Radio*, Bogotá FEB 3 0432 – Talk program fair under *R.Progreso*; two men and a woman discussing sexual activities or problems from a medical perspective, heard via web feed. Sports at 0442 and at 0444 a punctuated 'Mas informacion en Caracol' spot. [Funkenhauser-FL]

830 **CUBA** unID FEB 17 0453 – I recorded 8 minutes of jumbled Spanish music/talk and English talk. A very weak *R.Reloj* Morse code 'RR' was heard first at 04:53:32 and at minute intervals to 04:56:32. Though in the jumble, I heard a Spanish male evenly-speaking for a minute, mentioning 'Santiago de Cuba' in context. When he stopped speaking, instead of the expected RR, I heard what sounded like fanfare and then the Cuban national anthem at 0459+ UTC. Seemed to go into music thereafter with no other 'RR' tones. No idea who this might have been. The BAMLog Cuban Map doesn't show anything, anymore from Cuba on 830, nor does WRTH. [Funkenhauser-FL]

830 **DOMINICAN REPUBLIC** HIJB Santo Domingo FEB 1 0112 – Mellow vocals in interference and 840 slop, and a hard to understand DJ, however at 0134 a lengthy ID heard in part as 'desde Santo Domingo... música de la noche... HIJB... more', and an unclear ad spot. This was followed by 'The Green Fields of Summer' in Spanish, originally by The Brothers Four and other romantic 'música de la noche' with IDs at 0214 and 0247. FEB 2 0214 – Much weaker in periods of fading and WACC interference; a similar program and garbled, presumed 0234 ID spot. FEB 3 0346 – Faded up with mellow vocals and IDs 0355 and 0400



followed by the Dominican national anthem, then more traditional, livelier sounding music, 'Te quiren mucho'. FEB 11 0237 – A program of Latin tear-jerkers and música romantica with a male host. IDs at 0233, 0237 and 0300 this one with an 'Onze hora' time check, then news. FEB 17 0434 – Music and song, poor but also via web parallel. [Funkenhauser-FL]

830 **MEXICO** XEITE *R.Capital*, México, DF JAN 18 0416 – Weak Latin music and Spanish talk, mixing in a jumble of sports confused by WACC Spanish religion program. Not very intelligible, but with Audacity I extracted a part ID at 0447 as 'Esta es XEITE' and punctuated 'Radio Capital' mentions, 'frecuencia modulada... Grupo Capital Mexico' in a lengthy ID with echo and percussion. When I first replayed my recording, all I could make out was 3 or 4 'Radio Capital' announcements and 'frecuencia modulada...' in context. Thinking like a newbie, Wow! – maybe *R.Capital* Lima, Peru. Without further checking I rushed a clip to Conti for his opinion of this possibility. Bruce calmly suggested the more likely *R.Capital* in Mexico City as shown in Cantú's list. Accordingly, I checked Cantú's resource and also WRTH (Something I should have done first!) and found XEITE listings in both of those. Definitely one for the Face is Red Dept. [Funkenhauser-FL]

850 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Trinidad FEB 1 0308 – With *R.Reloj* ticking below it, playing hot Saturday night music parallel 640 kHz. [Funkenhauser-FL]

870 **MEXICO** XETAR Guachochi, Chih. FEB 23 1306 – A bit of the Mexican national anthem is overtaken by XETAR IDs, mentioning Comisión Nacional para el Desarrollo de Pueblos Indígenas, as I had just heard on sibling station 700 XEETCH. 1307 full ID in Spanish by woman and man alternating, as La Voz de la Sierra Tarahumara, poor signal and soon fading. CDI page linking to all its emisoras <http://ecos.cdi.gob.mx/index.html>. There are 20 around the country, but only heard XETAR and XEETCH here. And XETAR page, same format as for XEETCH, <http://ecos.cdi.gob.mx/xetar.html>, "870 AM / 10000 watts, Dirección: Felipe Ángeles y Francisco M. Plancarte Col. El Salto, Guachochi, Chihuahua. C.P. 33180,

- Horario de transmisión: Diurno de 6:00 a 18:00 horas, Cobertura: Chihuahua, Sinaloa, Durango, Lenguas en que transmite: Tarahumara, tepehuano y español." [Hauser-OK]
- 900 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, San Germán-Urbano Noris FEB 24 0859 – ID and signature tune at 0859, well over normally dominant CHML, fading under CHML by 0901. [Brandi-NJ]
- 900 **MEXICO** XEDT Cuauhtémoc, Chih. FEB 19 1302 – Chihuahua anthem concludes, full ID by XEDT 910 and XHDT 98.3 with 25 kW (but 5/1.5 or 1 kW on 900!), street address in Colonia Centro, Ciudad Cuauhtémoc, “una estación de Cadena Hits” and into “el programa número uno de Chihuahua,” con música country en inglés. Earlier around 1230 I was hearing Spanish newscast on 900, probably XEOK Monterrey. Forget about XEW and its ‘250 kW’. [Hauser-OK]
- 940 **COLOMBIA** HJTL, RCN, Cucuta JAN 26 0130 – With a timely tune-in at the half-hour, I heard ‘Radio Cadena Nacional’ with a punctuated ‘RCN’ even as it faded into others and XEQ hum. Faded up with talk from time to time and was also heard via a somewhat delayed web feed. [Funkenhauser-FL]
- 940 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Sancti Spíritus JAN 18 0341 – Fair with an XEQ growl; ‘Progreso’ ID at 0344, also heard parallel 640 kHz. [Funkenhauser-FL]
- 939.877 **MEXICO** XEQ Mexico, DF JAN 25 0358 – Heard poorly in LSB and quacking *R.Progreso* spillover; ending a soft Latin ballad then a ‘¡Las noches! ¡Tropi Q!’ spot. FEB 17 0646 – Fair to sometimes good with weather reports from various reporters in numerous cities in Mexico, mentioning ‘Meteorologico Durango’ and others, cero gradas (zero degrees!), hasta la México, Sonora, many names and ‘Gracias...’ for reports. [Funkenhauser-FL]
- 950 **MEXICO** XEMEX *La Mexicana*, Cd. Guzmán, Jal. FEB 21 1133 – This one I’ve been chasing for a couple of weeks, always with a kiddie choral and instrumentally unaccompanied version of the anthem at 1200 and a brief flute theme varying between 1202-1204. Today, someone with a very low het suddenly up at 1133, then this (on frequency) at 1134 with nonstop accordion-backed Mexican vocals, “La Mexicana” atop one song at 1144. Into the kiddie anthem at 1200, the flutes at 1202, then male, “XEMEX, La Mexicana...” and back to Mexi-tunes, rapidly lost in the sunrise and WTLN Orlando power up from 1201. That kiddie anthem seems to be gaining momentum on stations of late. [Krueger-FL]
- 970 **CUBA** *R.Guamá*, Los Palacios-Andresia JAN 18 0321- Trading places with *R.Rebelde*; a female mentioning ‘Guamá’ in context and playing fast-paced new ‘dance’ music. [Funkenhauser-FL]
- 970 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, Trinidad JAN 18 0321 – With *R.Guamá*; talk program also heard on 5025 kHz, and at 0327 a full ‘Radio Rebelde’ ID and Rebelde’s nine note signature sounds. [Funkenhauser-FL]
- 1060.082 **MEXICO** XERDO *La Raza*, Reynosa, Tamps. JAN 11 0239 – Running a bit high of 1060 with Cuban *Radio 26* phased; briefly dominant to provide rollicking accordion over interference – bits of classical music from suspected XEEP and KYW news. Followed at 0243 with a nice ‘La Raza, Mil Sesenta, La Estacion de Todos’ ID. Reported in *mwdx* as running slightly high of 1060. The Excalibur calibrated against WWV on 10 MHz first locked in at 1060.082, then later at 1060.085 kHz. [Funkenhauser-FL]
- 1110 **MEXICO** XEWR Cd. Juárez, Chih. FEB 24 0136 – ID sounds like R.Metropolitana, 1110 in promo, with sound effects. I was expecting 100/50 kW XERED, but this is further southwest, and fits really for XEWR *R.Guadalupana*, which IRCA lists as a 500-watt, 24-hour daytimer (i.e. blank for night power). But WRTH says 1000/500 watts. 0137 IFE PSA (sounded like, outdated one instead of INE?), 0138 regreso a su programa, “Levántate con...” woman-hostessed talk on the tema, “la mentira.” A wakeup show? Then it’s an evening playback. Conditions are auroral, and KFAB Omaha in the opposite direction is absolutely no problem, not needing avoidance by nulling. Other northerly clears are blacked out, including 700 WLW, 720 WGN, 780 WBBM, 830 WCCO, 840 WHAS, 850 KOA, 890 WLS, 1120 KMOX, 1510 WLAC, 1530 WCKY. [Hauser-OK]
- 1140 **MEXICO** unID FEB 22 1201 – Weak with anthem, lost after that in the multiple Cuban co-channel. XEMR *R.Esperanza*, Monterrey previously heard here. [Krueger-FL]
- 1220 **MEXICO** XEB México, DF FEB 24 0134 – Spanish news and it’s about one word ahead of 1570 XERF, so sibling station, or rather parent station XEB with ‘Antena Radio’ from IMER; despite its 100 kW clear-channel status, not always audible at all. [Hauser-OK]
- 1320 **MEXICO** XECPN Piedras Negras, Coah. FEB 24 0132 – Spanish news by anchoress, with quick sounder between items, looping south/southwest. She brings up a reporter on phone. Presumably XECPN with news format, *La Poderosa* with 10000/100 watts. Recheck at 0148, cáncer PSA, group ID “Radiorama, la cadena que une a México,” and that checks for XECPN too. [Hauser-OK]

- 1370 **MEXICO** XEGNK Nuevo Laredo, Tamps. FEB 17 0155 – Mexican national anthem is in progress, by children’s choir, followed by three more verses at 0156, 0157 and 0158, finally stops at 0159 with no announcement but steady carrier which has been dominating frequency stays on a while. As the only 1370 XE listed by IRCA to sign-off at 0200, and the closet one, this is surely XEGNK. IRCA shows as 5/0.5 kW, Fiesta Mexicana, Mariachi Estéreo (but no FM attached). Cantú agrees, no FM, so must we conclude it’s AM stereo? [Hauser-OK]
- 1470 **MEXICO** XEHI Cd. Miguel Alemán, Tamps. FEB 24 0128 – Spanish norteña song, slightly clockwise from north/south, 0130.5 XEHI ID, 7:30 time check. Cantú shows 10000/250 watts, slogan *La Caponera*. IRCA says 3000/250 watts, *La Consentida*. WRTH splits the difference with 10000/250 watts, *La Consentida*. [Hauser-OK]
- 1510 **MEXICO** XEQI Monterrey, NL FEB 24 0127 – Spanish talk from south is dominant, presumed XEQI; no WLAC needing to be nulled. [Hauser-OK]
- 1559 unID FEB 21 1000 – Het fading in/out against 1560 WFSP, measured 1559.000 kHz. Noted every morning since 1560 WQEW signed off. Also received by Mark Connelly and Marc DeLorenzo in Cape Cod, Bill Nollman in Connecticut, and Rick Shaftan in New Jersey. Possibly of Latin American origin, although no DXers outside the northeast U.S. have reported it which makes me suspect a domestic spur. [Conti-NH]
- 1560 **MEXICO** XECHZ Chiapas de Corzo, Chis. FEB 24 1100 – Rose up over domestic ESPN with vocal music, notes from a pan flute, “Radio Lagarto” ID by a woman, then into a vocal version of the Himno de Chiapas. Fell into the noise but heard a few minutes later with the Mexican national anthem. [Saylor-PA]
- 1560 **VENEZUELA** YVLZ RNV Mérida FEB 18 0224 – “Emisora... Venezuela... La Voz Informativa” and low key Spanish vocals. YV #20. WQEW off. [Frodge-MI] FEB 24 1100 – Fair and alone with WQEW off the air; presumed this with nostalgic orchestra music through the hour without ID. Not present at the top of the previous hour. RNV sign on is listed as 1030 UTC. [Conti-NH]
- 1560 unID FEB 20 0600 – Poor, WQEW off; woman in Spanish, Bogotá mentions. [Conti-NH]
- 1570 **GUATEMALA** Radio VEA, Ciudad de Guatemala NOV 25 0058 Christian music, extensive ID at 0100, “¡Desde Guatemala!” sung: Radio VEA de... “la potencia de la... 1570 AM... Radio VEA punto o – r – g,” sung Radio VEA de... into more music, another ID, asking listeners to call, phone number. [Brandi-FL]
- 1590 **HONDURAS** Radio Zol, Choluteca NOV 25 0159 – ID at 0159:25, popped up briefly under domestic basketball game, possibly reappeared at 0201 with music. [Brandi-FL]
- 1610 **ANGUILLA** Caribbean Beacon, The Valley FEB 8 0249 – Religious discussion by woman. Very good signal peaks throughout the evening. [Beu-TX]

## NOAA Space Weather Outlook

Issued February 23, 2015 – For the period February 23-March 21, 2015

Solar activity is expected to be at very low to low levels through about 04 March. From 05-18 March, a chance for moderate activity exists due to the return of old Region 2282 (N11, L=191) which was an M-class flare producer on its last transit. Upon old Region 2282's exit, very low to low conditions are expected from 19-21 March.

No proton events are expected at geosynchronous orbit in the absence of any significant solar activity.

The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at geosynchronous orbit is expected to be at normal to moderate levels throughout a majority of the outlook period. However, moderate to high levels are likely on 01-09 March and again on 15-19 March due to coronal hole high speed stream activity.

Geomagnetic field activity is expected to be at predominately quiet to unsettled levels throughout the outlook period with active conditions likely on 27-28 February, 01-02 March and 16-17 March due to coronal hole high speed stream activity.
