Longtime syndicated Classic Hits host Mike Harvey has announced he will step down from his nightly Mike Harvey Show and Saturday Weekend Party with Mike Harvey on December 31 with many of his affiliates then transitioning to Tony Lorino’s “Throwback Nation Radio.” After a career in programming and station management, including launching “94.5 3WS” WWSW Pittsburgh in 1980, Harvey co-founded Transtar Radio Networks in 1982 with Bill Moyes. Through a series of mergers, Transtar would become Unistar and then fold into Westwood One. His Oldies show “SuperGold Saturday Night” would debut the following year, which would evolve into the two shows he currently hosts. Harvey will now transition to a consulting and partnership role with Lorino’s “Throwback Nation Radio” as the latter will add most of The Mike Harvey Show affiliates. Lorino has been featured on Mike Harvey Show segments over the past few weeks to introduce him to the current audience.

They kept repeating the following phrase from some type of prepared announcement: “. . . if you need further info about any of this, you can go on line to the Pinion Guard Rail Project, as they are still working on it”. No idea of who this may be. (SD-AZ)
 1429.986 UNID – 12/12 0635 – Spanish preacher, “Silent Night” in Spanish, filler by kid. Fades by 0730. I've been hearing this for a few days, never parallel WOIR Homestead's stream, so seemingly not them. Lots of other co-channel on 1430 proper, including an English preaching station, someone with non-secular Christmas (mostly) instrumentals, and WLKF Lakeland, Florida. (TK-FL)

Mostly trashing what was left of WJR’s signal. D1 1000 Watts. (TK-FL)

- 1090 KSOU IA Sioux Center – 12/6 0745 – Poor -- “Classic Hits 101-5” over a weak station with SSB that got lost. (JJR-WI)
- 1170 WSOS FL St. Augustine Beach – 11/30 0653 – Mr. Mister’s lame “Kyrie” into ads for a lawyer, a locally-owned ‘Badcock Furniture’, a doctor, and a Fleming Island window cleaner. Time check, national weather synopsis. (TK-FL)
- 1170 KOWZ MN Waseca – 12/7 0242-45 – Fair, in null of unID sports station, fair to good w/ades, traditional song with harmonica (part of the lyric: “nothing’s more important than the family”), ID as “The Christmas Train” and mentioned // 106.3. Listed as 5 Watts nighttime. New. (NB-WI)
- 1170 WDEK SC Lexington – 11/30 0711 – Overtaking co-Oldies WSOS with “. . . Jammin’ Hits . . . 97.9 FM and 1170 AM” into “Lady (You Bring Me Up)” by The Commodores then “Please Mr. Postman” by The Marvelettes. Co-channel WGMP with Active-ish Rock format at 0725, probably day power up. (TK-FL)

Very good notch filters in the RSP2Pro let me get rid of the squeals that were all over the band. Biggest highlights for me from my tape audits 10/23 all times are ELT 1180 WJNT Pearl MS 0800 “WJNT Pearl-Jackson” full ToH ID not new in the logbook but a new tape for the collection. For those who might be interested in listening to my tapes you’ll find them available on my website www.wayneheinen.com. They are listed under the BCB DX → Taped BCB Veries. The next hour 1180 yielded a new one for my log in KLPF Midland TX at 0900 “Thank you for listening to KLPF Midland-Odessa” and mentions of the Radio Guadalupe network. Usual set of other JBA transatlantic carriers at least on bottom half of band, I relent and don't enumerate this time, but also note some music on 774 at 0334 from the *RNE1* Spain synchros. [Hauser-OK]
- 549 **ALGERIA** *Jil FM*, Sidi Hamadouche DEC 7 0458 – Fair; contemporary vocal, not the choral marching band anthem usually broadcast at this time, then canned time marker with *Jil FM* ID into more music. At 0558 fair; choral marching band national anthem, as noted in the past sometimes broadcast an hour later than usual. [Conti-NH]
- 684 **SPAIN** *RNE1* Sevilla DEC 12 2220 – Many strong carriers at local sunset. Weak, but clear -89 dbm on the panadapter. Time signal with ID, “Radio Nacional de España.” My 16th BCB country. [Smith-NH]
- 774 **SPAIN** *RNE1* synchros DEC 7 0708 – Starting transatlantic carrier search here to find this one strong enough for some audio. [Hauser-OK]
- 1044 **SPAIN** *SER* San Sebastián//Valladolid DEC 12 2120 – Weak but clear when peaking over local noise. -89 dbm. [Smith-NH]
- 1089 **UNITED KINGDOM** *TalkSport* synchros DEC 12 2139 – Near armchair copy with PowerSDR set at 5.6 kHz AM bandwidth. Announcers with soccer news and replays. -85 dbm, the strongest TA signal of the evening. [Smith-NH]
- 1467 **FRANCE** *TWR* Roumoules DEC 7 2245 – Fair; one cycle of *TWR* interval signal and off. [Conti-NH]
- 1521 **SAUDI ARABIA** *SBC R.Riyadh*, Duba DEC 7 2220 – Fair in 1520 WWKB interference; string music parallel 9555 and 9870 kHz. 1521 carrier off at 2231:39 UTC while 9555 and 9870 continued broadcasting. DEC 15 2215 – Good with loud het against 1520 WWKB. Carrier off at 2230:36 UTC. [Conti-NH]

- 550 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, Pinar del Río-San Juan DEC 6 0100 – Fair, over KTRS; deportivo commentary ended with “Muy buenas noches,” then ID, “Rebelde la Habana, emisora de la revolución.” [Conti-NH]
- 720 **MEXICO** XEJCC Cd. Juárez, Chih. DEC 6 1351 – Spanish time check twice as 7:48, presumably automated; ad repeating toll-free phone number 800-110-3130 – I don't think a U.S. number could have 1 as the fourth digit; anyhow it's an ad for something costing 629 pesos “sin gastos de envio.” 1354 another time check, for 7:50, and temp 8 grados centígrados; then mentions *El Fonógrafo*, the network XEJCC sometimes relays (but now during talk, not music), with a couple? frequencies, one of them sounding like 650, which does not compute, must have been 690, XEN. [Hauser-OK]
- 730 **MEXICO** XEHB Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. DEC 6 1341 – Very good signal with Mexican music, much stronger than 700 or 720 kHz; 12 minutes after sunrise here as I start, none of the XE's below 700 are audible. “La Mexicana – le gana” partial slogan, plugging a program Saturday and Sunday at 22 horas; 1350 Suprema Corte PSA, “La Mexicana” ID again. [Hauser-OK]
- 770 **MEXICO** XEACH Monterrey NL DEC 6 1355 – Gobierno de México PSA, loops south/southwest, almost a semihour after sunrise here when the other still skywaving XE's are further west; yes, 1358 Grupo Fórmula program promo; 1400 ID? mentions “canal” algo. Did not hear it a few minutes earlier and KKOB Albuquerque should have popped on ND day pattern at 1400 UTC. [Hauser-OK]
- 940 **MEXICO** XEQ *Ke Buena*, México, DF DEC 6 0559 – Poor, over/under unID Spanish and unID off-frequency 940.9 kHz het with CFNV off the air; choral national anthem, tropical music. [Conti-NH] DEC 6 0707 – Multiple ID/promo's for “La Ke Buena – en cadena.” Dominant signal now, which is rarely the case any more for the major CDMX stations; 50/50

kW listed, and not noticeably off-frequency now. So slogan implies it's networked elsewhere? [Hauser-OK]

- 940 **PUERTO RICO** WIPR San Juan DEC 7 0300 – Poor, over unID Spanish with CFNV off the air; canned ID with URL and slogan, “La señal más robusta.” [Conti-NH]
- 1220 **MEXICO** XEB México, DF DEC 12 0130-0137 – Fair with some fleeting peaks. Spanish music – male singer then a selection featuring female singers noted. Parallel stream. 1,460 miles. [Battaglino-CA]
- 1510 **ECUADOR** HCIO2 *R.Naval*, Guayaquil DEC 7 0858-1000 – Through WLAC and WRNJ; time signal. This has become a pre-dawn regular. [Conti-NH]
- 2861.088 unID DEC 14 0237 – Carrier with maybe trace of modulation. I've been hunting for 2-MHz-band MW harmonics but not much lately, not even 2940+ from Colombia. The 2860 area is next spot to focus on, as reported earlier in 2019, 2859.812 kHz suspected the known active second harmonic of 1430 *R.San Carlos*, Costa Rica, as ID'ed by Jay Novello, North Carolina, but without a precise measurement. In 2017 I reported 2859.82 kHz, JBA carrier on the signature off-frequency of *R.San Carlos*, $2 \times 1430v$ as previously identified. But this variant is considerably different, way on plus side. Fundamental would be 1430.555 kHz. Clues in MW Offsets (which does not deal with harmonicizing); nominal 1430 starts with the CR from almost a decade ago: 1429.91 TIRDVC *R.San Carlos*, and skipping down to the most plus 1430.0119 XEWD, and 1430.018 *La Voz de Salvación*, Peru, neither of which looks likely; or domestic? Anyhow calls for further checking. [Hauser-OK]

- 1566 **SOUTH KOREA** HLAZ, *FEBC*, Jeju Island DEC 6 1343 – I am concentrating on the barely audible carrier from FEBC Cheju Island, fading somewhat, but seems to be gone at about 1344:30, expected time for their beam change from Japan to China. In another month this will be easier right at our own sunrise. [Hauser-OK]

Transpacific carrier search: DEC 6 1324-1328 – On the R75 with east-west long wire, 747, 774 both much stronger than 828; 972, 1143 kHz. Today's sunrise 1329 UTC, still latening by a minute every other day to attain 1344 UTC by Epiphany; on the other hand our earliest sunset is just about now at 2316 UTC. Then at 1328-1333 on the DX-398 hand held, all of them DF'ing northwest from East Asia, not Au/NZ: 693, 737, 774, 828, 873, 972, 1323, 1422, 1566 kHz. DEC 8 1330-1339 – Just at sunrise here, on the R75 with east-west long wire, so no DF'ing but probably East Asian more than DU: 558, 594, 612, 621, 657, 693, 702, 738, 747, 756, 774, 828, 873, 972, 1017, 1035, 1044, 1053, 1098, 1206, 1566, 1575 kHz. [Hauser-OK]

All dates/times UTC.

Receiver: Perseus SDR-IQ v4.1/Lenovo W540 laptop.

Antennas: Beverages on ground (“terminated” means there is a resistor 200 feet from the end of the wire):

1. **NNW/SSE** (~333°/153°) 715-ft unterminated (first 3 nights only).
2. **N** (~355°) 950-ft terminated (2nd and 3rd nights only).
3. **ENNE** (~30°) 910-ft terminated (2nd and 3rd nights only). Moved it to become antenna #10.
4. **NE** (~50°) 1260-ft terminated (first 3 nights only). Broke due at 150 feet the 1st night (seemingly between evening and morning loggings) and at 575 feet the 3rd night.
5. **ENE** (~70°) 1100-ft terminated (first 3 nights only).
6. **E** (~95°) 1280-ft terminated (all 4 nights).
7. **ESE/WNW** (~115°/295°) 900-ft unterminated (first three nights only). Broke at 735 feet the 3rd night. Adjusted it to become antenna #8.
8. **ESE** (~115°) 910-ft terminated (last night only).
9. **SE/NW** (~135°/315°) 930-ft unterminated (2nd and 3rd nights only). Broke at 400 feet the 3rd night.
10. **SSE** (~155°) 910-ft terminated (last night only).

- 530 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde* (multiple locations) OCT 26 0059 – Rebelde interval signal, mixing with Enciclopedia as usual. Relog.
- 540 **MEXICO** XESURF *R.Zión*, Tijuana, BCN OCT 26 0133 – Spanish sermon under CBK. Relog.
- 540 **MEXICO** XETX *La Ranchera de Paquimé*, Nuevo Casas Grandes, Chih. OCT 26 0100 – Fading up under KYAH with ranchera music and full FM/AM ID. Relog.
- 550 **MEXICO** XEPL *La Superestación*, Cd. Cuauhtémoc, Chih. OCT 28 1203 – Way under KFYI and KLLV with AM/FM ID. Relog.
- 560 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, Ciego de Ávila OCT 28 0400 – Cuban anthem parallel many other Rebelde channels. Relog.

- 570 **CUBA** *R.Reloj*, Santa Clara OCT 26 0206 – Faded up under KVI with usual pips and news. Relog.
- 570 **unID** OCT 28 1157 – Full (4:40) children’s choral version of Mexican anthem under KLAC. Announcement was read by a “Sonora-style” (deep growly-voiced) male announcer. Almost certainly unneeded XEJB, but needed XEOA also uses this version of the anthem.
- 590 **CUBA** *R.Musical Nacional*, La Julia OCT 28 0400 – Cuban anthem in progress, about 10 seconds ahead of the Rebelde channels. Noted several times throughout the weekend with classical music and female announcer. Parallel 1140 not noted this year. Relog.
- 600 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, San Germán OCT 28 0400 – Cuban anthem parallel many other Rebelde channels. Relog.
- 610 **MEXICO** XEGS *La GS*, Guasave, Son. OCT 28 0138 – Full ID by male announcer. Relog.
- 620 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, Colón OCT 28 0400 – Cuban anthem parallel many other Rebelde channels. Relog.

- 620 **MEXICO** XENK *Radio 620*, México, DF OCT 28 1157 – Children’s choral version of Mexican anthem under KTAR and KTNO. Faded out for a few minutes, then barely audible during gaps in the other two stations’ talk/music with start of “Por El Campo” rural affairs program at the top of the hour. Relog.
- 640 **CUBA** *R.Progreso* (multiple locations) OCT 28 0358 – Cuban anthem parallel many other Progreso channels. Relog.
- 640 **MEXICO** XEJUA *La Caliente*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. OCT 26 0057 – Regional Mexican music, slogan, “La caliente 640 AM,” followed by jingle. Relog.
- 650 **MEXICO** XETNT *Radio 65*, Los Mochis, Sin. OCT 28 1200 – Appeared suddenly with a huge signal in the middle of an ad for local concert in Los Mochis sponsored by Grupo Chávez Radio, then into usual “Buenos Días Yardero” program. I’m never really sure about the night power of Mexican stations, but I guess it’s safe to say that XETNT does power down substantially at night, and returns to day power at 5 a.m. local time (Los Mochis was already back on standard time, unlike the U.S. and some border towns). Relog.
- 670 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde* (multiple locations) OCT 28 0400 – Cuban anthem parallel many other Rebelde channels. Relog.
- 690 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, (multiple locations) OCT 28 0358 – Cuban anthem parallel many other Progreso channels. This station has been quite weak in recent years. Relog.
- 690 **MEXICO** XEWW Rosarito, BCN OCT 26 0133 – Huge signal on top of channel with Chinese programming, interrupted by Spanish and English ID’s, which they run fairly often these days. Mexican government PSA’s in Spanish, as well as government-produced programs in Spanish (such as the Suprema Corte program, which was heard later on this Friday night), can be inserted at any time. Relog.
- 690 **unID** OCT 26 0145 – Liga MX fútbol Monarcas Morelia vs. Santos Laguna. I thought I had heard *W Deportes* stations (or at least 730 XEX) carrying this game, but there is no *W Deportes* affiliate on 690. I was hoping this would turn out to be needed XERG, but I heard no ID or local ads, and the broadcast was parallel 720, implying this was unneeded XEN, relayed on unneeded 720 XEJCC.
- 700 **MEXICO** XEGD *La Poderosa*, Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. OCT 28 1157 – Grupera/AC music, “La poderosa” slogan and FM 90.3 mentions. Relog.
- 700 **MEXICO** XEDKR *R.Centro*, Guadalajara, Jal. OCT 28 1202 – Faded up under KALL and over XEGD with nice slow call-letter ID, studio address, mention of 24h/d schedule, and new “Radio Centro” slogan (since 1110 XERED is currently silent, they now simulcast 97.7 XERC-FM Mexico City). Relog.
- 710 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde* (multiple locations) OCT 26 0208 – Long speech about Cuba parallel 530, 1180 kHz. At least three stations noted echoing. Relog. OCT 28 0400 – Cuban anthem parallel many other Rebelde channels. Relog.
- 710 **CUBA** *R.Guamá*, La Palma OCT 26 0401 – Cuban anthem parallel 990 kHz. Relog.
- 710 **MEXICO** XEDP *La Ranchera de Cuauhtémoc*, Cuauhtémoc, Chih. OCT 25 1302 – AM/FM ID and local newscast. Nice to have them back on frequency after many years of being about 150 Hz low. Overall audio quality and signal strength seem to have improved quite a bit too. Relog.
- 710 **unID** OCT 27 1214 – On the east (TX/OK/KS) wire, children’s choral version of Mexican anthem in progress, followed by a lengthy jingle. Hard to imagine this would be anything other than unneeded XEDP, but I have to wonder why any station would be running the anthem at this odd hour.
- 720 **MEXICO** XEJCC *Fonógrafo*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. OCT 26 0158 – ID and “Fonógrafo” slogans, followed by Chihuahua state anthem and fast adult choral version of Mexican national anthem, as if they were signing off... but instead, they segued into “Radio Centro Deportes” Spanish coverage of baseball world series. In the past they have always signed off by 8 p.m. local time. Special schedule for World Series broadcasts, or is this permanent? OCT 27 1143 – Older Mexican music and “Fonógrafo 6-90” slogans. Either they are also signing on earlier now (having signed on at 6 a.m. MDT in the past) or they just stayed on all night after last night’s baseball coverage. This is not helping me log XEJAGC! OCT 28 1206 – Appeared suddenly with “Fonógrafo” jingle and directly into the anthem (which went beyond the end of my recording). Prior to this, there was a very weak station playing older Mexican music which may have been needed XEJAGC. Relog.
- 720 **unID** OCT 28 1201 – Adult choral version of Mexican anthem, very weak under KDWN. This could be needed XEJAGC or unneeded XEDE. So far I can’t hear any of the musical tones which accompany XEJAGC time checks, so perhaps it was XEDE.

- 730 **MEXICO** XEX, *W Deportes*, México, DF OCT 28 1159 – Adult choral version of Mexican anthem. Signal faded for a few minutes under KDAV, XEHB, etc., then faded up strongly with Chicago’s “25 or 6 to 4” and “W Deportes” slogan. Relog.
- 730 **MEXICO** XEHB *La Mexicana*, Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. OCT 28 1157 – Regional Mexican music and “La Mexicana” slogan under XEX, KDAV. Relog.
- 740 **MEXICO** XEQN *R.Fórmula*, Torreón, Coah. OCT 26 0159 – *R.Fórmula* programming way under CBX and KIDR. Relog.
- 740 **unID** OCT 26 0402 – Unidentified chimes way under KCBS on ESE (Cuba) wire. Same instrument as used by *R.Angulo*, but not the same musical notes.
- 760 **MEXICO** XENY *R.Gény*, Nogales, Son. OCT 28 1203 – Children’s choral version of Mexican anthem (one verse). ID trampled by KFMB but could easily make out “desde la ciudad de Nogales, Sonora, México.” Relog.
- 760 **unID** OCT 28 1157 – Adult choral version of Mexican anthem way under KFMB and presumed XENY. Soon faded. Most likely unneeded XEABC, but could be needed XEZZ.
- 770 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, Las Tunas OCT 26 1130 – Reloj pips and ticks under KKOB and CHQR. I was initially unsure if this was a new station, or one of the two known transmitters (normally used for Rebelde and Artemisa) that I’ve already logged on this frequency. Per Steven Wiseblood in South Texas, the Rebelde transmitter often runs Reloj programming overnight, putting a good signal into his area. Relog.
- 770 **unID** OCT 26 0358 – Cuban anthem, very weak under KKOB. This was about 4 seconds ahead of the Rebelde stations, and 12 seconds ahead of Artemisa on 1020 kHz.
- 770 **unID** OCT 28 1202 – Very weak signal way under KKOB and CHQR with children’s choral version of Mexican anthem in progress, followed by what sounded like a man praying and preaching in a loud voice in Spanish.
- 780 **unID** OCT 28 1200 – Children’s choral version of Mexican anthem (one verse, starting exactly at top-of-hour) way under KAZM. Announcement after the anthem finished was rather subdued (not the boisterous ID I hear on XELD web stream). It was followed a short orchestral piece with a somewhat indigenous influence (similar to, but not identical to, what I heard on XEGLO web stream when I got home), then some instrumental music resembling older romantic ballads. Both XEGLO and XELD run this version of the anthem. XEGLO seems to run it very close to the top of the hour, and XELD a few minutes after. I’m strongly inclined to think this was XEGLO, but XEXY’s web stream has been down, so I can’t rule them out. A listener in Tampico has confirmed that the new station there is not on the air yet.
- 790 **CUBA** *R.Reloj* (multiple locations) OCT 26 0148 – Usual time pips audible through all the other stations on the channel. Relog.
- 790 **MEXICO** XENT *R.Fórmula*, La Paz, BCS OCT 28 1158 – Under KABC and KBET with *R.Fórmula* sounder and children’s choral version of Mexican anthem (from *Fórmula* feed). Relog.
- 790 **unID** OCT 28 1204 – Way under KABC and KBET with slogan “la ____a, la mera mera, ____ FM.” Didn’t sound like anything I’ve heard on XENT.
- 800 **MEXICO** XESPN, *ESPN R.Fórmula*, Tijuana, BCN OCT 28 1158 – Extremely faint signal under XEROK and KDDD with Mexican anthem from *R.Fórmula* feed. Only audible when the Laboratorios Camacho announcer was talking on XEROK, never when any music was playing on XEROK. Eventually heard slogan, “ESPN Radio *Fórmula*.” Relog.
- 800 **MEXICO** XEROK *R.Cañon*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. OCT 26 0057 – Spanish religious programming and ID. Relog.
- 800 **BONAIRE** PJB *R.Transmundial*, Kralendijk OCT 26 0057 – Under XEROK with Spanish Christian programming, into “Cruzada con Luis Palau” as listed in the broadcast schedule on TWR web site. Tuned in again about 45 minutes later and heard telltale Spanish religious programming read by people who were clearly not fluent Spanish speakers (this is true of many TWR programs). Relog.
- 810 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Guantánamo-Burene OCT 28 0358 – Segment of Cuban anthem parallel 640, 690, 890, 900 kHz. New, Cuba #76.
- 820 **CUBA** *R.Ciudad de la Habana*, Arroyo Arenas OCT 26 0400 – Cuban anthem way under WBAP. Relog.
- 820 **CUBA** *R.Reloj*, Ciego de Ávila. OCT 26 0401 – “RR” pips – on this minute they were at the unusual time of 26 seconds into the minute. Relog.
- 820 **MEXICO** XEABCA *Canal 820 ABC Radio*, Mexicali, BCN OCT 26 0257 – Under KUTR with unusual tropical music, followed by usual pre-recorded ID with “Canal 820” slogan. OCT 28 1202 – Strong signal, fighting WBAP with call-letter ID and secondary slogan “Radio Frontera.” Still announces 3500 watts. Relog.

- 820 **MEXICO** XEBA *R.Cañón*, Guadalajara, Jal. OCT 28 1202 – Barely audible under XEABCA and WBAP with adult choral version of Mexican anthem. Relog.
- 840 **unID** OCT 26 0402 – Very faint signal under KXNT and WHAS with start of Cuban anthem. There are two stations listed here, and I still need both of them. Could not find any parallel channel for *R.Revolución* or *Dobleve*.
- 850 **MEXICO** XEZF *Buenísima*, Mexicali, BCN OCT 28 0130 – Instrumental version of Mexican anthem. They pulled the plug before it finished. Relog.
- 850 **MÉXICO** XEMIA *R.Disney*, Guadalajara, Jal. OCT 28 1158 – Pop music, children’s choral version of Mexican anthem, and back to pop music (parallel 900 XEOK with Mexican *R.Disney* feed; checked 710 for the Acapulco *R.Disney* outlet, but no such luck). XEZF and XEMIA are the last two Mexican stations left on 850. Relog.
- 860 **CUBA** *R.Reloj* (multiple locations). OCT 27 0034 – Usual time pips and news. Relog.
- 860 **MEXICO** XEMO *La Poderosa*, Tijuana, BCN OCT 26 0133 – Mexican government PSA’s, slogan “la poderosa, música de recuerdo.” Relog.
- 860 **MEXICO** XEZOL *Radio 860 Noticias*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. OCT 28 1158 – Under KNAI and XEMO with local news and traffic, mentions of Grupo Mega Radio, and fast choral version of Mexican anthem. Relog.
- 890 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Ciego de Ávila OCT 28 0358 – Cuban anthem parallel many other Progreso channels. Relog.
- 900 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, San Germán OCT 28 0358 – Cuban anthem parallel many other Progreso channels. Relog.
- 900 **MEXICO** XEW, *W Radio*, México, DF OCT 26 0057 – Mixing with Progreso. Ads and Mexican government PSA’s, “W Radio” slogan and ID. Relog.
- 900 **MEXICO** XEOK *R.Disney*, Monterrey, NL OCT 28 1206 – Faded up under XEW with Mexican *R.Disney* feed parallel 850 XEMIA. Relog.
- 910 **CUBA** *R.Cadena Agramonte*, Camagüey and *R.Metropolitana*, Villa Maria OCT 26 0400 – *R.Cadena Agramonte* and *R.Metropolitana* with Cuban national anthem about 10 seconds apart from each other. Relogs.
- 910 **MEXICO** XEAO *R.Mexicana 910*, Mexicali, BCN OCT 28 1159 – Under KGME with full ID mentioning 1 kW and Grupo Audiorama Comunicaciones, followed by older Mexican vocals. Relog.
- 930 **unID** OCT 26 0359 – Doorbell chimes (3 descending, followed by 2 descending) on ESE/WNW (Cuba) wire.
- 930 **unID** OCT 28 1200 – Children’s choral version of Mexican anthem way under KSEI and KCCC, then clobbered by KAFF before it ended. For the last few years, the only station on 930 has been XETLA, but this anthem does not seem to match the version I recorded from their web stream. Either XETLA has a new anthem, or the CP for XESAME must be on.
- 940 **MEXICO** XEMMM, *940 Oldies*, Mexicali, BCN OCT 28 1157 – On top of the channel over KGMS and KIXZ with U.S. oldies and disco hits, and new jingle “940 AM” (sounded like “940 la M” at first). Slogan in Spanglish: “940 oldies, donde tocamos tus requests.” Relog.
- 950 **CUBA** *R.Reloj* (multiple locations) OCT 26 0210 – Usual time pips and news. Relog.
- 950 **MEXICO** XEKAM *R.Fórmula*, Tijuana, BCN OCT 28 1157 – On top of channel with full ID for *R.Fórmula* flagship station XERFR-970, network promos, and children’s choral version of Mexican anthem from network feed. Relog.
- 970 **CUBA** *R.Guamá*, Los Palacios OCT 28 0358 – Cuban anthem parallel other Guamá channels. Relog.
- 970 **MEXICO** XEJ *La Jota Mexicana*, Ciudad Juárez, Chih. OCT 26 0059 – Mexican AC music, and back to old slogan “la jota Mexicana” as recently reported by other DX’ers, but still uses “Radio México” at times. Relog.
- 980 **CUBA** *R.Coco*, El Sapo OCT 26 0400 – Presumed (certainly not the other station on this channel, *R.Reloj*) with Cuban national anthem. Suddenly appeared over KWSW and an unidentified station that was running the U.S. national anthem. Relog.
- 990 **CUBA** *R.Guamá*, Pinar del Río OCT 26 0400 – Male announcer “Radio Guamá...” followed by 3-note ascending attention signal, then continuing with time check “12 de la noche” and into Cuban anthem, followed by some more doorbell tones. Noted on other nights parallel other Guamá channels. Relog.
- 990 **MEXICO** XECL *Rocola 990*, Mexicali, BCN OCT 28 1157 – On top of the channel with older Mexican hits, full ID, “Rocola 990” jingle and “Radiorama Mexicali” jingle. Relog.
- 1000 **CUBA** *R.Artemisa*, Artemisa OCT 27 0043 – The “Whoop-Whoop” jammer is back. This had previously been reported as coming from the *R.Artemisa* transmitter. Relog.
- 1000 **CUBA** *R.Granma*, Media Luna OCT 26 0358 – Under KOMO and XEFV with Cuban anthem (identifiable as Granma because it was not //Artemisa-1020). Relog.

- 1000 **MEXICO** XEFV *La Rancherita Mil AM*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. OCT 26 0057 – Ranchera music, slogan and jingle “La rancherita.” Relog.
- 1000 **MEXICO** XEOY *Mil AM*, México, DF OCT 28 1159 – Under KOMO and XEFV with “Somos NRM” company theme song (see note on 1410 XEBS). Relog.
- 1020 **CUBA** *R.Artemisa*, Bahía Honda OCT 26 0358 – Artemisa piccolo theme song and Cuban anthem. Relog.
- 1030 **MEXICO** XESDD *La Tremenda*, Puerto Nuevo, BCN OCT 28 1157 – Over KTWQ and KCTA on Mexican wire with usual political talk, “la tremenda” slogans, and promos for PSN news. This station is one of several owned by the governor-elect of Baja California. Relog.
- 1040 **CUBA** *R.Mayabeque*, Güines OCT 26 0359 – Mixing with WHO. Choral version of Cuban anthem (quite different from the version used by Progreso and Rebelde) and ID, “Esta es Radio Maybeque, transmitiendo las 24 horas del día, por las 1040 y 1140 de la onda media, y la 104.7 de la frecuencia modulada, desde la ciudad de Güines...” Relog.
- 1040 **MEXICO** XESAG *R.Lobo Bajío*, Salamanca, Gto. OCT 28 1200 – Children’s choral version of Mexican anthem, into morning newscast from Grupo Informativo Así Sucede Guanajuato. Relog.
- 1040 **MEXICO** XEBBB *Esne Radio*, Zapopan, Jal. OCT 28 1159 – Children’s choral version of Mexican anthem, then back to *Esne Radio* music program parallel 1670 KHPY. Note that this station is parallel KHPY and other U.S. *Esne Radio* affiliates (including 1040 KURS!), except when running the Mexican national anthem, and for a few hours on Sunday nights when the U.S. affiliates run some bilingual and English programming while XEBBB runs the Mexican national hour and other related programs. Relog.
- 1050 **MEXICO** XED, 96.9 FM *La Poderosa*, Mexicali, BCN OCT 28 1207 – Faded up above XEG with slogan “96.9 FM la poderosa.” Parallel 96.9 XHMUG since returning to the air. Relog.
- 1050 **MEXICO** XEBCS *La Radio de Sudcalifornia*, La Paz, BCS OCT 26 0159 – Way under CJNB with FM/AM ID. Relog.
- 1050 **MEXICO** XEG *La Ranchera de Monterrey*, Monterrey, NL OCT 26 0101 – Ranchera music and ID, way under KTBL. Relog.
- 1070 **CUBA** *R.Guamá*, Guane, Pinar del Río OCT 28 0358 – Cuban anthem parallel other Guamá channels. Relog.
- 1080 **unID** OCT 26 0359 – Cuban anthem under KRLD and KSCO. Probably unneeded *R.Cadena Habana*. No parallel noted on 1140 kHz.
- 1090 **MEXICO** XEPRS *Ultra 104.9*, Rosarito, BCN OCT 28 1157 – Odd collection of American and Mexican rock music, usual pre-recorded ID, bilingual announcers, and promo telling listeners to dial the Ultra hotline. Still relaying 104.9 KJAV Alamo, Texas. Relog.
- 1090 **MEXICO** XEAU *Milenio Radio*, Monterrey, NL OCT 26 0058 – ID by female announcer: “Escuchas XEAU... desde Monterrey, Nuevo León, México.” OCT 28 1200 – Mixing with XEPRS and KMXA with second hour of Milenio Noticias morning news block. New, NL #14, México #198.
- 1100 **unID** OCT 28 1200 – Mexican anthem (probably the children’s choral version, but too weak to be sure) way under KFNX, KWWN, et. al. Most likely unneeded XETGO.
- 1110 **MEXICO** XEWR *Cristo Rey Radio*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. OCT 28 1157 – Loud signal, relaying 1540 WACA “Radio vida en abundancia,” a commercial Spanish Catholic station in Maryland, complete with local Maryland ads! Then they broke away for local programming, gave their usual *Cristo Rey Radio* slogan and segued into a traffic report for El Paso. Relog.
- 1120 **MEXICO** XEMX, *MVS Noticias*, Mexicali, BCN OCT 28 1202 – Faded up under KANN and KPNW with MVS Noticias slogan/format. Relog.
- 1130 **MEXICO** XEHN *Los 40*, Nogales, Son. OCT 28 1203 – Faded up under CKWX and KSDO with “Los 40” top 40 format and ID which only mentioned 89.9 FM. Relog.
- 1150 **MEXICO** XEAD *Metrópoli*, Guadalajara, Jal. OCT 28 1159 – Under/over KEIB with uptempo adult choral version of Mexican anthem, followed by 3 slow pips (long tone every two seconds) and into Notisistema news. Full ID almost four minutes after top of hour, followed by “Buenos Días Metrópoli” program. Relog.
- 1150 **unID** OCT 28 1157 – Once again I had bits of classical music overnight, but by the time I could restore my wifi hot spot and check XEUAS web stream, the signal was gone.
- 1150 **unID** OCT 28 1200 – Children’s choral version of Mexican anthem on SSE (Central México) wire. Could either be needed XEBF or just KNRV picking up the anthem from the *R.Fórmula* feed (although it was about a minute late for the *Fórmula* feed).
- 1150 **unID** OCT 28 1205 – Yet another children’s choral version of Mexican anthem on SSE (Central México) wire. When the anthem ended, all I heard was KCKY “Radio Casa” slogan and multi-station ID (but I checked parallel 580 KSAZ, and there was no Mexican anthem). Needed XEBF seems likely.

- 1160 **MEXICO** XEQIN *La Voz del Valle*, San Quintín, BCN OCT 27 0131 – Good signal under KSL parallel web stream. Relog.
- 1170 **COLÓMBIA** HJNW *Caracol Radio*, Cartagena OCT 27 0504 – Solid signal on top of channel with “Caracol Radio” slogans. Relog.
- 1170 **MEXICO** XECD *La Romántica 92.9*, Puebla, Pue. OCT 28 1207 – Appeared suddenly over KFAQ and KYET with animated female announcer “Amigos de la Romántica 92.9, muy buenos días!” Relog.
- 1170 **unID** OCT 27 0504 – Mexican anthem very weak under HJNW and KFAQ. Seemed to be the children’s choral version, which would seemingly not be XECD (they use an adult choral version). The other station remaining on 1170 is XERT, still needed here.
- 1180 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde* (multiple locations) OCT 28 0400 – Cuban anthem parallel many other Rebelde channels. Noted often, on almost every wire, with varying numbers of echoes. Relog.
- 1180 **MEXICO** XEUBS *R.Uaas*, La Paz, BCS OCT 25 2357 – Way under KLPF with BC Sur PSA’s. Relog.
- 1180 **MEXICO** XEFR *R.Felicidad*, México, DF OCT 28 1157 – Under KLPF and KOFI with Mexican recuerdos (oldies) music, children’s choral version of anthem (starting abruptly, as heard on web stream). New, DF #23, México #200!
- 1190 **MEXICO** XEWK, *W Radio*, Guadalajara, Jal. OCT 28 1158 – Faded up over KNUV with adult choral version of Mexican anthem (one verse) and slogan “W Radio.” Clobbered by KXKS which appeared in mid-sentence (KXKS seems to be switching to full day power at 6am instead of 30.3w PSRA). Relog.
- 1190 **MEXICO** XECT *Contacto 1190*, Monterrey, NL OCT 28 1201 – Adult choral version of Mexican anthem (multiple verses, slightly fast) and seemingly directly into a newscast. Third Mexican anthem heard on this channel in two minutes, the others being XEWK and a partial anthem from KNUV. Relog.
- 1200 **MEXICO** XECPAC *Radio y Televisión Querétaro*, Jalpan, Qro. OCT 28 1200 – Appeared suddenly, mixing with WOAI and KPSF. Fast adult choral version of Mexican anthem. Faded out for a few minutes, then returned with morning program of Huapango music, “Que Suene el Huapango.” Ex-XEQJAL. I did not hear a call-letter ID this time, but the call change was apparently mandated due to a lapse in their license. Relog.
- 1220 **MEXICO** XEB *La B Grande*, México, DF OCT 26 0159 – Faded up over KSLM with long AM/FM ID and slogan, “La B Grande, con la música de México, una emisora del Instituto Mexicano de la Radio.” Relog.
- 1240 **MEXICO** XEWG *Bengala 1240*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. OCT 28 0045 – Promo for La Hora Nacional, jingle “La más prendida.” Relog.
- 1260 **MEXICO** XEMW *Río Digital*, San Luis Río Colorado OCT 28 1158 – Old/romantic Mexican music, full FM/AM ID now giving the FM as 91.1 (meaning XHMW and XHLBL have swapped frequencies yet again!). “Río Digital” slogan used often. Relog.
- 1300 **MEXICO** XEP *R.Mexicana*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. OCT 28 1157 – Older Mexican music than I’m used to hearing on this station, and back to old “Radio Mexicana” slogan. Also heard a new slogan, “información contundente” (blunt information), seemingly in reference to the news programs they have added during the day. Also noted Morse Code “S” (three quick “dots”) during news promos. National anthem ran at this hour, because Cd. Juárez was still on daylight saving time with the U.S. Relog.
- 1300 **MEXICO** XEXW Nogales, Son. OCT 28 1201 – Garbled ID under XEP, mentioned FM 90.3. Format has changed twice this year. Relog.
- 1310 **unID** OCT 26 0204 – Tropical music on SE wire. Sounded South American. Maybe needed XEVB with vallenata format? A few Colombians were actually coming in at this time.
- 1310 **unID** OCT 28 1200 – Appeared suddenly with banda/grupera music. Soon faded under KIHP. Possibly a domestic station, as this format doesn’t seem to fit the surviving Mexican stations on 1310 kHz.
- 1310 **unID** OCT 28 1201 – Appeared suddenly with children’s choral version of Mexican anthem, mixing with the banda/grupera station. This is almost certainly unneeded XEHIT.
- 1350 **MEXICO** XEQK *Tropicalísima 1350*, México, DF OCT 28 1200 – Full (4:40) children’s choral version of Mexican anthem, ID including studio address as found on station web site, into tropical music. Relog.
- 1350 **MEXICO** XELBL *R.Centro*, San Luis Río Colorado, Son. OCT 27 1330 – Sign-on with full ID. Relog.
- 1370 **MEXICO** XEHG *Vida 1370 AM*, Mexicali, BCN OCT 28 1157 – On top of channel with light Mexican music, “Vida 1370 AM” slogans. I was expecting a slogan change to “Ecos del Valle”

based on some new web pages they posted this summer, but they were still using the old slogan. Relog.

- 1380 **MEXICO** XECO *Romántica 1380*, México, DF OCT 28 1157 – Under KLPZ and KHEY with children’s choral version of Mexican anthem already in progress, ID by female announcer. Relog.
- 1410 **MEXICO** XEBS *Bandolera 1410*, México, DF OCT 28 1157 – On top of channel with brisk adult choral version of Mexican anthem (very similar to the one used by XEKB) already in progress, followed by the Núcleo Radio Mil group’s theme song, “Somos NRM.” Still using “Bandolera 1410” slogan. Relog.
- 1410 **MEXICO** XEKB *Alfa 99.9 FM*, Guadalajara, Jal. OCT 28 1202 – Faded up under XEBS with brisk adult choral version of Mexican anthem. Relog.
- 1420 **MEXICO** XEXX *TuDN Deportes*, Tijuana, BCN OCT 26 0000 – Fading up over KTOE with *TuDN* sports programming. Relog.
- 1420 **MEXICO** XEF *Activa 1420*, Ciudad Juárez, Chih. OCT 28 1157 – Fast adult choral version of Mexican anthem already in progress (Ciudad Juárez was still on daylight saving time with the U.S.), followed by full ID. They seemed to run the same anthem again at 1204 (which is when I usually hear it), preceded by an ID and followed by time check (6:06). At first I thought one of these anthems might be coming from the other remaining station on 1420 (XEEW, still needed here), but I know from web stream monitoring that XEEW’s adult choral anthem is at regular tempo or maybe even a little bit slow. Relog.
- 1420 **MEXICO** XEH *Antología Vallenata*, Monterrey, NL OCT 28 1159 – Appeared suddenly under XEF on SSE (Central México) wire with instrumental version of Mexican anthem, matching web stream. New, NL #15, México #201.
- 1440 **MEXICO** XEABCJ *Rock 101 GDL*, Tonalá, Jal. OCT 28 1202 – Children’s choral version of Mexican anthem faded up way under KAZG. XEEST was still silent until December 2nd, so this would have to be XEABCJ. Both have already been logged here.
- 1460 **MEXICO** XEYC *R.Fórmula*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. OCT 26 0057 – *R.Fórmula* sounder, Mexican government PSA’s, and full ID, then into *Fórmula Financiera* program. Relog.
- 1460 **MEXICO** XECB *R.Ranchito*, San Luis Rio Colorado, Son. OCT 28 1202 – Faded up under XEYC and KENO with local announcements, “Radio Ranchito” slogans, and older ranchera music. Relog.
- 1470 **MEXICO** XERCN, *RCN 1470*, Tijuana, BCN OCT 26 0259 – “RCN 1470” slogan and ID, followed by promo for *La Hora Nacional*. Relog.
- 1470 **MEXICO** XEAI, *Radio Fórmula*, México, DF OCT 26 0058 – *Radio Fórmula* sounder way under KYYW and KSMM. Relog.
- 1480 **MEXICO** XEZJ *Simplemente Supérate*, Tonalá, Jal. OCT 26 0205 – Rose above KBMS with Spanish motivational talk format. Announcer referred to the 8 p.m. program which had just ended, “Zona de Retos” with Javier Rosario Figueroa. A check of Figueroa’s Facebook page indicates his show airs on XEZJ (Mon-Fri 8 p.m. Central Time) and occasionally on 1300 XEP. Listed 20 kW days, 1 kW nights. Antenna was aimed SE, not SSE, so *I have to wonder if they left the day rig on late tonight*. New, JAL #17, México, #199.
- 1480 **unID** OCT 28 1201 – Children’s choral version of Mexican anthem faded up way under KHQN and assorted mush. This is almost certainly unneeded XETKR.
- 1490 **MEXICO** XECJC *R.Net 1490*, Ciudad Juárez, Chih. OCT 28 1201 – Very weak with adult choral version of Mexican anthem. Relog.
- 1500 **MEXICO** XEDF *R.Fórmula*, México, DF OCT 26 0059 – *R.Fórmula* sounder way under KYYW and KSMM. Relog.
- 1500 **unID** OCT 26 0358 – Way under KSTP and another station on ESE (Cuban) wire with classical music. At the top of the hour, the announcer made a brief announcement (he may have mentioned the name Junípero, then he referred to “amigos que nos visitan en 1500 AM.”) After a few more seconds he said what sounded like “Primera del Sur” (as if it were the name of the next hour’s program) and the classical music resumed. Definitely not XEDF (no *R.Fórmula* sounder or canned top-of-hour ID), and it sure doesn’t sound like anything I’ve heard on YVRZ.
- 1510 **ECUADOR** HCIO2 *R.Naval*, Guayaquil OCT 26 0205 – Time station noted under KGA with solid time pips, with a ten-second gap at the end of each minute where the time is read by the announcer (not clearly audible) then a slightly longer pip at the beginning of the minute. Exactly matches Mark Connelly’s recording at <https://app.box.com/s/3d09mnqzir1d31cktx97fsrjj0w6qcz8>. Listed at only 500 watts, but I can’t imagine that’s still true. New, Ecuador #1, Country #16!

- 1510 **MEXICO** XEQI *Opus 1510 AM*, Escobedo, NL OCT 28 1205 – Faded up under KGA with slightly uptempo instrumental version of Mexican anthem, into weekend music program. Relog.
- 1530 **MEXICO** XEQR *Éxtasis Digital*, México, DF OCT 26 0145 – Classic rock, “Éxtasis Digital” slogan and Mexican government PSA’s. Good signal tonight. Relog.
- 1550 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde* (multiple locations). OCT 26 0100 – Rebelde interval signal with very obvious delay between at least 3 transmitters. The third one is new, Cuba #77.
- 1560 **MEXICO** XEJPV *R.Deportiva 1560 AM*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. OCT 26 0204 – W Deportes coverage of World Series baseball in Spanish. OCT 28 1201 – Appeared suddenly with children’s choral version of Mexican anthem (one verse), followed by several minutes of truly bizarre “music” – it basically sounded like a drunk person trying to improvise a rap. Not sure how this fits their regular sports format, or the romantic AC format they have been relaying overnight. Strong signal over KNZR was more than enough to block the more interesting stations that sometimes come in on 1560. Relog.
- 1570 **MEXICO** XERF *La Poderosa*, Cd. Acuña, Coah. OCT 26 0204 – On top of channel with lots of ID’s. I can still hear smaller stations through XERF on some wires. Relog.
- 1580 **COLOMBIA** HJQT *Candela 850*, Bogotá OCT 26 0207 – Faded up over KQFN and KGAL for nice clear slogan “Candela 850 AM.” HJQT is a relay of 850 HJKC, which has been logged here before. Listed 5 kW. New, Colombia #13.
- 1620 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde* (multiple locations) OCT 28 0400 – Cuban anthem parallel many other Rebelde channels. Relog.
- 1620 **unID** OCT 26 0400 – Barely audible with opening fanfare of Cuban anthem. Must be unneeded *R.Bayamo*, since the Rebelde stations (which were still audible on top of this signal) had aired their anthem two minutes earlier tonight. Checked 1150 and 1160 (where I still need the Bayamo stations) for parallel, but found only a possible trace of Cuban anthem two minutes after this one.
- 1630 **MEXICO** XEUT, *UABC Radio*, Tijuana, BCN OCT 26 0135 – Over KRND with “UABC Radio” slogan and multi-station ID’s.
- 1640 **unID** OCT 26 0401 – Noted some simple 2-note descending doorbell tones on the ESE/WNW (Cuban) wire.
- 1660 **PUERTO RICO** WGIT *Faro de Santidad*, Canóvanas OCT 26 0358 – Spanish ID with nice clear mention of “Canóvanas, Puerto Rico” followed by call letters in accented English. This was followed by a program of fairly boisterous worship music in Spanish. 3197 miles. New, PR #1, “Country” #17!
- 1700 **MEXICO** XEPE *La Tremenda*, Puerto Nuevo, BCN OCT 26 0159 – Mixing with KCLF. Still relaying 1030 XESDD, using “la tremenda” slogan and promoting XESDD web page. The Tijuana politician who operates both stations (and a few others) was recently elected governor of Baja California. Relog.

TRANS-PACIFIC DX

- 567 **JAPAN** JOIK, *NHK1*, Sapporo OCT 26 1328 – Very weak with Japanese music parallel 594 kHz. Relog.
- 594 **JAPAN** JOAK, *NHK1*, Tokyo OCT 26 1359 – Time pips, very weak. Relog.
- 693 **JAPAN** JOAB, *NHK2*, Tokyo OCT 26 1359 – Poor-fair with time pips. Relog.
- 738 **unID** OCT 26 1359 – Solid carrier with 3+1 (maybe 4+1 or 5+1) time pips about two seconds early, about the same as last year. I don’t think it was the KBS station, because KBS on 972 kHz (which was not audible at this hour) usually runs its time pips at the same time as NHK. The big 150 kW station in Changchun, Jilin, China would be right on the main beam of this antenna, but I don’t know if they use this type of time pip, and could not find a parallel.
- 747 **JAPAN** JOIB, *NHK2*, Sapporo. OCT 26 1359 – Poor-fair signal with time pips. Relog.
