- 530 CKML ON Chalk River – The appearance of “CKML” in the “Available Call Letters” list confirms this station is deleted. Originally licensed in 1998 as a low-power unprotected AM service, the 50 watt station was tested for one hour each month, with a two hour emergency exercise each year. Other than that, it was intended to only be on the air during an emergency at Chalk River Laboratories, a nuclear research facility in Deep River ON, and was not allowed to air music or

advertising. The site's last nuclear reactor was shut down at the end of March 2018. (Jon Pearkins)

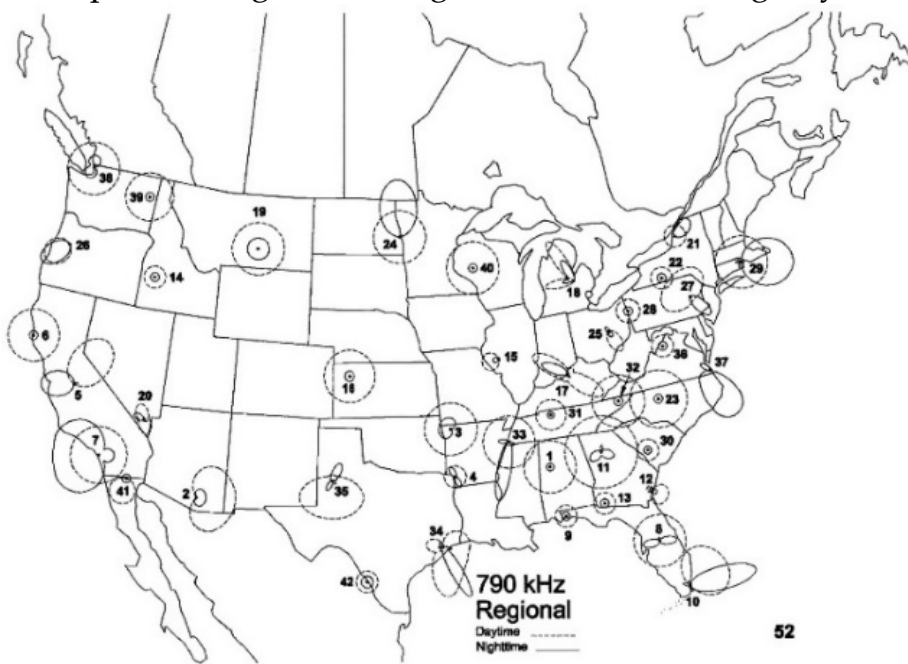

- 1610 CHHA ON Toronto – 6/10 0158-0227** – Heard “Punjab content” listed on new web program schedule from 0000-0500 Tues-Sat and 1000-1300 Mon-Fri, initially baffling me after years of hearing them with Spanish overnights. Especially since clearest signal was with antenna SW/NE, likely a result of neighbourhood RFI in other directions. Messaged the station about the power, and was told it was still 6250 watts, despite recent CRTC approval of 10 kW with same West-facing pattern. Re: AirSpy YouLoop Testing

I recently ordered an AirSpy YouLoop out of curiosity about what it could do in such a small size:

Today I set it up, mounting it on a wooden fence with an orientation of 160-340 degrees. Shape set up: roughly circular. The base feed point is installed about 3 ft. (0.9m) above ground.

Previous to this, I had run some daytime signal tests on a single-turn rectangular loop 5.25 ft. (1.6m) vertical by 8 ft. (2.44m) horizontal, same orientation, mounted on the wooden fence, fed at base center about 6 inches above the grass. That antenna consisted of #14 AWG insulated wire and was used on the recent KJJR DX test. Matching transformer was 3 turns antenna side to 4 turns feed line side on #73 binocular core, hence 1.78 step-up Z ratio.

In both antenna cases a 100 ft. / 30m run of RG-6 coax. ran from the outdoor test site into the house. A 1:1 isolation transformer (4 turns: 4 turns) coupled the in-house end of that cable to the Elad FDM-S2 receiver input.

Short story is that the YouLoop was quite gain deprived compared to the larger wire loop.

Stations tested were in the northwest sector, well inside these antennas major pick-up lobe regions. No amplification was used for the daytime test data below.

VSoft: 1.88 mV/m, 65.495 dBu YouLoop: -97 dBm, 5.25x8': -75.2 dBm

680 WRKO Boston, MA (tx Burlington): 50 kW: 76.1 mi., 122.4 km, 316.6 deg.

VSoft: 4.51 mV/m, 73.088 dBu, YouLoop: -93 dBm, 5.25x8': -72.2 dBm

950 WROL Boston, MA (tx Saugus): 5 kW: 65.7 mi., 105.7 km, 321.6 deg.

VSoft: 2.85 mV/m, 69.097 dBu, YouLoop: -94 dBm, 5.25x8': -70.7 dBm

I put the VSoft numbers in to provide information other US DXers could use as a signal strength metric to compare with a VSoft run for their own QTHs done ahead of running similar antenna tests.

My gut feel is that the YouLoop is far too insensitive for weak signal daytime work and probably still needs about 20 dB of amplifier gain tagged onto it to make a halfway serious go of it at night.

The 5.25 by 8 ft. loop takes up more space but gives typically 13-23 dB more signal at MW. With an amp added, it is completely usable for nighttime DX'ing and not too bad for day if isolated from noise sources. With only a piece of #14 wire and a cheap binocular core matching transformer box required, it is also cost competitive.

Re: Flag Antenna Supports

I am considering building another Flag antenna to favor Western stations. A full size flag is 14' Vertical by 29' Horizontal. I'd like to have something semi-portable to prevent running afoul of our HOA. After a lot of thought, my idea is to use patio umbrella supports to hold up two telescoping fiberglass painters poles.

These poles are fiberglass at the base, while the extension is aluminum. These will be used to support #14 gauge stranded insulated wire. I plan to extend these to 14' feet, and space the poles 29' feet apart. The antenna will be fed with the FLG100LN, and I'll be using Collin's VACTROL for the termination. My questions are:

1.) Will the aluminum support cause any problems? I'm open to a completely dielectric support, but can't think of one that is easily sourced locally that will work.

2.) Thinking about mounting stainless steel pulleys at the top of each paint roller to thread the wire though. Again, any issues with that idea?

3.) Pitfalls or problems that I'm missing?

Re: Antenna Project

I thought I would share what I have been doing over the last 2 weeks or so with my antennas.

With all the discussion on antenna with Patrick and group, I thought it was time to do a bit of work on my 2 antennas here to improve performance.

So, I have two DKAZ antennas here both 140 foot in length and 23 foot at each loop high, one to the East 20 deg and South at 130 deg.

They were both feed with just coax and no matching transformer and 1K fixed resistor at the far end, both did show some directivity but the nulls were pretty poor and somewhat non-existent. I was kind of disappointed I was not hearing Columbia or Venezuelans stations but a lot of Mexicans.

I was looking over the DX Engineering catalog and I noticed these matching transformers listed in the link, <https://www.dxengineering.com/parts/svp-sv-pen>

I thought it would be good to give these a trail. I changed the F-connector to an SO-239 mounted all in a weatherproof box for each antenna. I am using the existing coax at present, I have plans to replace and bury the 2 coax runs in electrical conduit but in the mean time I used the existing coax and I replaced the fixed resistor with what came in the kit, 910 ohms.

So, that night 05/26/2020, I tuned around to see what was about and I was very surprised how the directivity had improved 10-fold and the nulling properties were more than I could have ask for.

For example, 1080khz on the East DKAZ antenna KRLD booming in, on the South DKAZ antenna, no sign of KRLD just XETUL and I could hear two other Spanish stations underneath.

Pretty much the same on other frequencies, 1520 kHz KOKC no sign on the south DKAZ antenna, but I was rewarded with my first Columbian station from my home location, HJLI with matching signal on sdu.hu <http://186.80.203.144:8073/>.

There was some static from nearby storms so called it a night.

The next morning up at 4am and the static was a lot better and clearer. I recorded at the top of the hour on my Perseus for review later. I started reviewing the recording and was rewarded with 580 WELO, 1040 Radio Maybeque and 1090 HJOM plus 1170 HJNW, so 4 new stations in a 6-minute sitting at the radio.

05/30/2020 I set the Jaguar software to record every hour from 8pm to 8am. I have already checked 2 recordings and rewarded with 6 new stations, 1270 WNOG, 1010 WJXL (Normally I hear wall to wall KBBW, no sign on south DKAZ), 770 HJJX, 660 WXQW and 570 WTBN (Normally KLIF wall to Wall) and 650 HJKA.

So, overall, I am pleased with the 5 new Columbians and the few new Floridian stations.

So, to my issue.... I am trying to connect PL259 to my coax with little luck, I don't know what I am doing wrong. I have watched YouTube videos and followed their steps, used a multi meter to make sure I have no shorts.

From all accounts, I should not have connectivity from the outside ring barrel and the center pin on the PL259 but I do. So, at present I have the coax connected to each antenna with duct tape which I know is the incorrect method and can lead to issues but works at the moment.

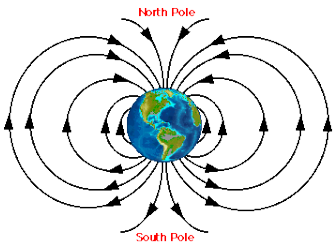
The present coax is rg-58 on one antenna and rg6 on the other antenna. Would rg-6 coax and f-connectors be better than PL259 since I have SO-239 sockets. I know I can buy adapters from SO239 to f-connectors and maybe add the f-connectors to my coax and hope I don't have shorts.

I know this step of adding connectors to coax is not rocket science but I am having a hard time.

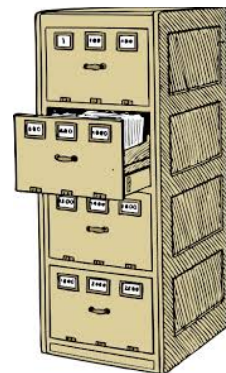
75 Years Ago – From the June 16, 1945 issue of *DX News*: According to the FCC, as of May 21 there were 928 standard broadcast (AM) stations in the United States, with 23 more under construction and 180 pending applications for new stations. In addition, the FCC plans to expand the broadcast band to include the new frequency of 540 kHz. Publisher Pop Edge noted that “more and more stations are not answering [requests for verifications] as they have in the past.”

50 Years Ago – From the July 4, 1970 issue of *DX News*: It appeared that the total number of pages of *DX News* for Volume 37 will now top 1,000 pages. Plans were well underway for the New York City-area annual NRC convention to be held in suburban Hasbrouck Heights, N.J., with reservations to be sent to Russ Edmunds. J. Alex Bowab sent a lengthy report from his U.S. Navy mission in the eastern Mediterranean. Gordon Nelson offered tips on “Logging Those Rare Summer Africans,” including his own loggings in recent years from Liberia, Mali, Mozambique, Nigeria, Senegal, Sierre Leone, and Tanzania, mostly logged at station sunrise a few minutes after sign-on. The FCC levied the maximum \$10,000 fine on WWOM-600 New Orleans for numerous technical violations and pre-sunrise operation and KIKK-650 Pasadena TX for operating prior to sunrise without authorization for 21 years.

25 Years Ago – From the June 19, 1995 issue of *DX News*: Jean Burnell sent a report from the third Cappahayden, Newfoundland DXpedition, held in the normally inauspicious time of May 10-14, 1995. Jean, along with John Bryant, Werner Funkenhauser, and George Hakiel, with 70 countries logged. Mark Connelly, Bruce Conti, and Tom Beaton DXed the same weekend from Rockport, Mass., where Brazil-840 and French Guiana-1070 were among the highlights, as well as a better reception of the HCJB-690 (Ecuador) DX Test than was had in Cappahayden! Plans were well underway for the 1995 annual NRC convention in Aurora, Colorado.

10 Years Ago – From the June 14, 2010 issue of *DX News*: Gary Siegel sent a Musing tribute to WTOD-1560, which signed off on April 23; WTOD was once the highest-rated daytime station, and early Top 40 station with many memorable personalities. John Malicky followed with a report on a large number of Detroit stations he had recently visited. Plans were well underway for the 2010 annual NRC convention in Rochester, New York. (Has it really been 10 years?)
