Late News: On December 7 the FCC denied a petition for reconsideration by proposed new station KWIF-1500 Culver City CA, the CP for which has expired unbuilt. The FCC rejected all of KWIF's arguments for further extending the 3-year CP deadline, including KWIF's (inaccurate) argument that it is "the very last new AM station" the FCC will ever authorize.

From Radio Insight:

Sale of WFME-1560 Tower Site: Family Stations Inc. is selling the five-acre tower site of “Family Radio” 1560 WQEW New York to logistics real estate operator Prologis for \$51 million. Commercial Observer reports that Prologis will utilize the land for parking and storage explaining that industrial site operators are looking for more space for last-mile logistics. The land in Maspeth, Queens is located in the middle of an industrial park. As part of the sale, Family Radio will continue to operate WFME’s 50kW signal from the three-tower array until they relocate to a new facility. Family Stations acquired 1560 and the tower land from Radio Disney in 2015 for \$12.9 million to return their

programming to the market following the 2013 sale of 94.7 WFME Newark NJ to Cumulus for \$40 million and 106.3 Mount Kisco NY. Disney had purchased the station in 2007 from The New York Times Company for \$40 million after leasing the signal for nine years.

Radio Disney Signoff: The Walt Disney Company will cease operations of its "Radio Disney" and "Radio Disney Country" brands in early 2021. The youth and tween targeted brand debuted in November 1996 with the company utilizing mostly owned AM radio signals to grow in size. As streaming became more prevalent, the company began selling off most of its signals in 2014, but made now-expired partnerships to place the brand on HD Radio subchannels in many markets on stations owned by Beasley and CBS Radio. It would launch "Radio Disney Country" as a secondary streaming brand in the Fall of 2015, but would flip its remaining AM license, 1110 KDIS Pasadena/Los Angeles to it as KRDC in 2017. Broadcasting & Cable reports that the end of the brands will impact 36 employees. 1110 KRDC will be sold as part of the shutdown.

Re: Zoom Presentation on Bush DXing in Alaska

I've been asked by a ham radio club to do a presentation on DXing in rural central Alaska. I spent about 16 months in Galena, back in 2016 and 2017 while working as the program director for a public/community radio station.

It was a very unique situation with some special considerations one might not have to deal with elsewhere. I spent a lot of time and money experimenting there and had some pretty amazing results.

I will also briefly discuss what it was like as a radio broadcaster in Alaska and the technical challenges we faced in the course of doing business every day.

Re: Sticky Eton E-1

I finally took a deep breath, and went in.

With isopropyl alcohol, Q-tips and rags, I slowly removed the sticky build-up that seems to accompany products with that "rubberized" coating. I think someone recommended 90% isopropyl, but I only had a 70% variety at hand. It's easy to loosen the sticky coating, but takes multiple tries to actually remove it from the plastic surface. I used about a half a bottle of the isopropyl alcohol, and a fist-full of Q-tips. Most of the stick is gone, but it's not easy to get under the knobs. These do not have set screws to loosen them. I guess I could just try pulling them off, but I don't want to break anything. I don't think I'll ever be able to get into the plastic grill over the speaker, unless I find some pinpoint Q-tips. Hopefully this takes care of the problem; I don't think the stickiness will return. I think I have a Grundig ultralight somewhere that will need similar treatment. I hope the manufacturers have learned that this rubberized coating is disastrous!

- 1090 unID -- - 12/6 0600 – Under WBAL; ID with mention of 102.7 FM plus a second translator which sounded like 92 or 99 point something, then Fox Sports sounder. Online sources indicate that WCZZ changed format from Fox Sports to *Magic 102.7* urban. Possibly more than one station was received. - WINQ VT **Brattleboro** – 12/1 2115 – Came to the top of the heap in time to hear local ads for Daniels Moving and Storage, Poop Fix.com, to put the enjoyment in bowel movements with a seven day trial available online (Years ago the station’s license would have been yanked at the mention of this topic), the Big Red Bus running all around Keene, NH (near Brattleboro) on weekdays between 8:00 AM and 5:00 PM, and the Medical Express to take you to your medical appointments, call 352-8494, the fare is a contribution, into C&W followed by a woman ID’ing “98.7 and 106.9, WINQ,” and into more music, soon gone. (TF-NH)
- 1500 WLQV MI **Detroit** – 11/18 1801 – Promo for advertising on the station then full ToH ID for AM/FM stations, “Faith Talk Detroit 92.7 and 1500” slogan. (LVH-NC)
- 1510 WMEX MA **Quincy** – 11/27 1608 – On top of frequency with “Sincerely” followed by WMEX musical sounder, and “1510 WMEX with Joe McMillan,” into “I’d Like to Teach the World to Sing,” not bad for 2000 watts during critical hours, far cry from the original legendary WMEX-1510 of the 1950’s and 1960’s, one of the most popular radio stations in New England. 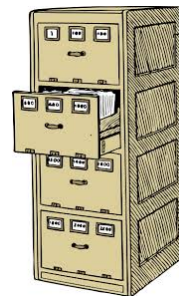


Unreported Domestic Stations

One new station was reported to DDXD this issue for the first time since at least Volume 67 (1999-2000): WTTM-1400. This is offset by a new station on the air, KABN-960, which hasn't yet been reported (and is going to be a tough one for almost all of us). So we hold at 278 stations of 100 watts or greater in the United States and Canada not reported to DDXD at all during this period. Can we knock one or two more off the list next issue? The most recent full list was published in Issue 87-19.

From the *DX News* archives

75 Years Ago – From the December 15, 1945 issue of *DX News*: CJAD-800 in Montreal is now on the air with regular schedule. CMHB-1410 in Sancti Spiritus, Cuba was scheduled for a much-anticipated Christmas-themed DX test on December 20; other non-North American DX tests were scheduled for the new year from HOK-640 in Colón, Panamá, and WXLS-850 (U.S. Armed Forces station) in Greenland. Clarence Burnham in Gloucester, Mass. reported receiving a verification from PRA9-1220 in Brazil that had been held up by the censors and hoped that other outstanding replies from Brazil would be coming through soon.



50 Years Ago – From the December 12, 1970 issue of *DX News*: Gordon P. Nelson published “Loop Distortion – Why Get Skewed?,” in which he described factors in loop antenna design that can harm the ability of loop antennas to produce deep nulls; electronic imbalance (i.e., signal being picked up by the body of the loop or the antenna-receiver connection in addition to the signal coming from the the magnetic loop itself. The *Musings of the Members* column filled 19 pages with reports from 55 members (including half the current NRC Board of Directors, Dave Schmidt and Dick Truax).

25 Years Ago – From the December 18, 1995 issue of *DX News*: A possible record 72-page issue, including Ray Moore with several tentative loggings of Japan from Key Largo, FL, your publisher's one and only lifetime logging from Brazil, and mostly a lengthy report from the October 1995 DXpedition to Cappayahden, Newfoundland, where 95 countries were logged (plus 2 more tentatives).

10 Years Ago – From the December 13, 2010 issue of *DX News*: Marc DeLorenzo reported hearing country #103, with Northern Ireland-1341. Gary DeBock reviewed the new Tecsun PL-606 ultralight receiver.
