From the Publisher: The main news here is that the 41st Edition of the NRC *AM Station Log* is now sold out! Wayne and his team will now turn to preparing the 42nd Edition for order in August.

We are mostly caught up on material submitted for publication (we're just holding a DX Toolbox column for next issue) but now that we're on a 3-week publication schedule through the spring

Renewing DX News and Your Label Update: We've had some confusion recently about the way renewals work, with some members looking at their label and wondering whether their renewal was received.

Wayne says: "Consider this scenario. Assume you mail your renewal check on December 1, and it takes 5 days to reach our P.O. Box. Since I only go to the Post Office once a week, usually on Friday, when I go there on December 4 your check hasn't arrived yet. I print the labels for Issue 6 (masthead date December 15) on Monday, December 7. So your label on Issue 6 won't reflect your renewal. I pick your check up on Friday December 11 and process it the next day, on Saturday December 12. Your subscription is now renewed. The labels for Issue 7 (masthead date December 29) will be printed on Monday December 21 and will show your new expiration date. But with holiday mail delays, issue 7 might not arrive until the new year. It's now been more than 30 days between the time you receive your label with the new expiration date and when you mailed your check.

"Basically, the point is that there's always going to be a lag time for mailing checks, label printing, and the mailing of *DX News*. In addition, I generally only make a trip to the bank every 4 to 6 weeks depending on the volume of checks we've received. This is due to the long wait lines at drive through windows and no lobby service at our bank due to Covid restrictions. If you use PayPal, we can update your subscription more quickly.

"Thank for your consideration!"

Addendum from the Publisher: And yes, the mail is also somewhat unreliable these days. Last month I received about half a page of another club's bulletin in one of those Post Office "We Care!" baggies, as the postal machine apparently ate the rest of the issue. I'm personally old-fashioned enough to still use the mail for these things, but electronics is the way to keep up to date faster (including about late-breaking DX tests!) – DY

From the *DX News* archives

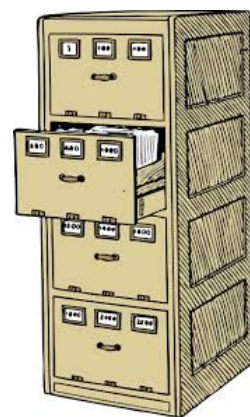
75 Years Ago – From the March 30, 1946 issue of *DX News*: Ralph Johanns of Buffalo, N.Y. lamented how stations running all night were causing interference with the reception of many new stations now testing. Ernie Cooper received a QSL from 300-Watt VOUS-1480 Port Pepperell, Newfoundland, making 1103 verifications and 24 countries verified. (Newfoundland didn't join Canada until 1949.)

50 Years Ago – From the April 3, 1971 issue of *DX News*: WWLE-1170 was set to run a DX test on April 12, with DDXD editor Russ Edmunds at the microphone. WQBA-1140 is receiving significant jamming from Cuba, making the station hard to hear even in Miami. Ken Brownless of Medium Wave Circle (in the U.K.) published a study of TA signals reported to IDXD in 1969-70, noting that (from a British perspective) stations from the north of England and Germany, Scotland, Norway, and Sweden were surprisingly rare, no doubt due to the high-latitude paths that these signals would take over the Atlantic.

25 Years Ago – From the March 18, 1996 issue of *DX News*: The first edition of the *NRC Night Pattern Book* at the printers and ready to be shipped soon. KXBT-1190 Vallejo CA was set to begin broadcasting on 1640 kHz on March 12 (still my only California station from the East Coast – DY). Tony Fitzherbert's column profiled the history of WIOD-610 Miami. Al Merriman sparked a conversation about whether the station on 711 kHz is from Morocco or Western Sahara.

10 Years Ago – From the March 28, 2011 issue of *DX News*: Kraig Krist summarized his 2010 DX year, with 151 new stations and KNX-1070 as his most distant reception. Jerry Berg of the Committee to Preserve Radio Verifications wrote about the historical importance and relevance of QSLing.

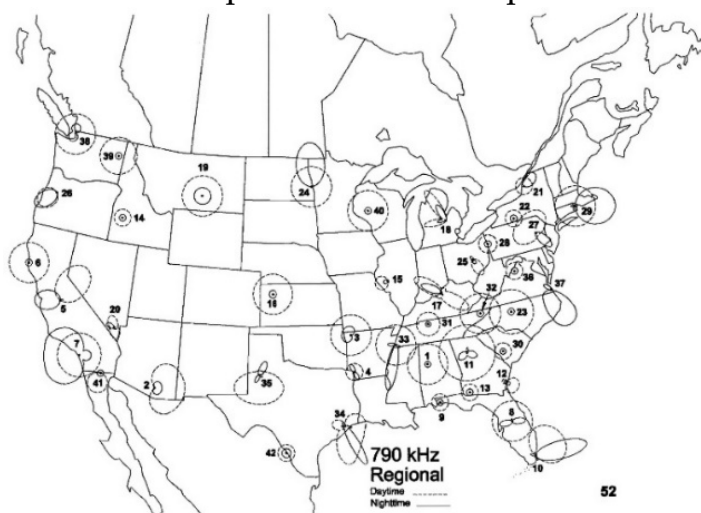


NRC Antenna Pattern Book 8th Edition

Fair at times to very poor in station mix. // to newstalk941.com stream. **(PS-ON)**
- 1610 CHHA ON Toronto** – 2/18 2030 – “CHHA” station ID into program about Canadian Labor News. Mention of upcoming scheduled programs on CHHA. Good, dominant signal. **(LW-NY)** *Though mainly SS “Voces Latinas”, there is a fair bit of EE programming on CHHA. Mike.*
- 1630 KKGM TX Fort Worth** – 3/9 0007 – Presumed with news, mention of the Black Information Network, buried by dominant KCJJ. Fair briefly to very poor. First time heard at this location. **(PS-ON)**
- 1640 WSJP WI Sussex** – 3/6 1725 – Fair signal with religious program, “Relevant Radio” slogan, gave phone number 877-291-0123 for pledges to station. **(LW-NY)**
