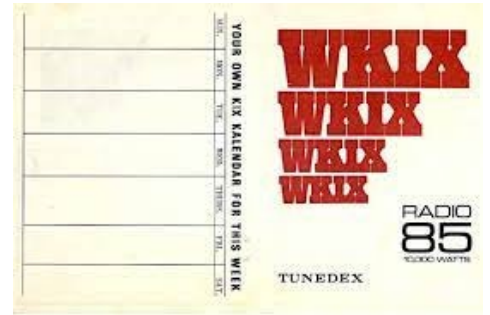

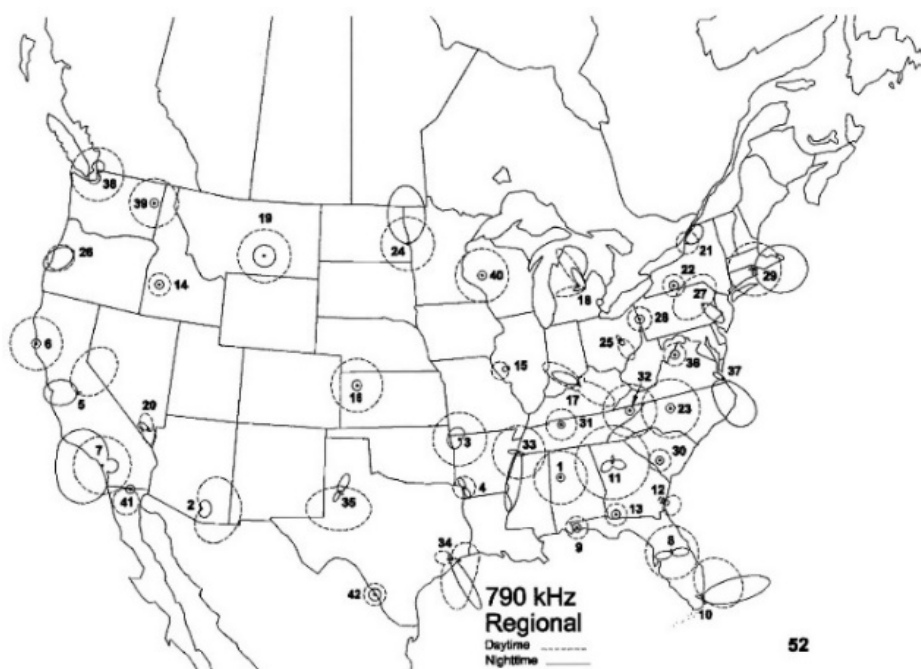
NRC Antenna Pattern Book 8th Edition

- 770 CHQR AB Calgary – 8/27 0453 – “The Shift”** Host Shane Hewitt saying “Good Night” in the wee hours of Friday morning and that the next Live show would be Sunday evening, implying that there is no longer a live weekend host on this program aired on at least eight stations. CHQR’s on-line program schedule also indicated that there were two more hours of “The Shift” after Shane’s “Good Night,” presumably **0100-0300** was repeated **0500-0700**. (JP-AB)
- 800 VOWR NL St. John’s –** Has been off the air since early on August 21st when an intense thunderstorm passed by the transmitter site. Station Manager Doreen Whalen believes that VOWR’s single tower was hit by lightning, damaging the 10 kW transmitter beyond repair. She now estimates another \$30,000 will be required even

if insurance fully covers the loss, but is still hopeful that the station will be back on the air before the end of September. VOWR has no paid employees and still operates out of the Wesley United Church where it began on July 20, 1924 as 8WMC with 100 watts. **(JP-AB)**

- 810 CKJS MB Winnipeg** – The ckjs.com web site is promising that their FM transmitter will sign-on in September, with no exact date specified. No word of them Testing yet, which usually takes a full month. Add that to the traditional three month AM-FM simulcast period, and CKJS will not be shutting down their AM transmitter until at least sometime in January 2022. **(JP-AB)**
- 870 WWL LA New Orleans – 8/29 0526** – Excellent live and local coverage with Hurricane Ida coverage, but sadly, terrible interference from co-channel Radio Reloj, Cuba with exceptionally terrible voltage wobbling noise and -- even more sinful -- WPWT, Colonial Heights, TN (C&W: "96-3 The Possum"), a D1 that constantly runs 10 kW overnights. Recheck pre-sunrise on **8/30**, WWL is much weaker. Still audible daytime, though poor, in local noise. The only other New Orleans- proper licensed station audible is **1280 kHz WODT**, which on **8/29** was blindly running the Black Information Network feed, but on **8/30** at least was airing local coverage under the 'BIN' branding. **1600 kHz KLEB Golden Meadow** with Blues/Cajun music. So far, I haven't traced their signal since, but inconclusive. **(TK-FL)**
- 1110 KRPA WA Oak Harbor** – Despite being only 20 kHz from Vancouver's CKWX-1130, KRPA's signal is now audible in Vancouver, providing South Asian programming for Greater Vancouver and Vancouver Island. Thanks to a new two-tower directional pattern that now allows the station to operate at night (2.5 kW) and with more power (9 kW) in the daytime. It often dominates 1110 in Edmonton at night. **(JP-AB)** [KRPA's two patterns are essentially a circle based at Oak Harbor with the peak power at 322° – Ed.]

--- DX TEST ---

- 600 WBOB FL Jacksonville – 9/04 0000** – Heard Morse code at **0010** and sweep tones at **0030**, under both KSJB (with C&W music) and WMT (with talk). What a great way to start the DX season. **(SMA-MB)**
- 600 [WBOB] FL Jacksonville – 9/4 0000** – Checked many times but no sign of the 50 kW DX Test. Conditions not favouring Florida. Cuba 530 had been heard strong earlier in the week, but no sign of them at the time of the DX Test, just the usual dominant CJWW, sometimes nullable for CKSP. **(JP-AB)**
- 600 WBOB FL Jacksonville – 9/4** – Began the test coming abruptly up at **0004** end of mid-network news, into Simon and Garfunkel's 'The Boxer' and other mostly 60s-70s hits. First Morse ID at **0010**. Sweep tones also mixed in, and reverb live engineer near bottom-of-hour and occasionally beyond with greetings to listeners email, details on analog processing used on this test. Final announcement and back to regular power/pattern at **0205**. Mostly local level from this close proximity. **(TK-FL)**
- 600 WBOB FL Jacksonville – 9/4 0128** – **DX test heard** with Morse code, sweep tones, music from the 70s and earlier, and one voice announcement with a clear ID. Poor with unID US talk show and R. Rebelde. **(MJ-QRO)**
- 600 WBOB FL Jacksonville – 9/4 0128-0130** – **DX TEST HEARD** – Mostly KOGO and KROD with an unexpected visit from KSJB, Jamestown, North Dakota, with sweep tones immediately followed by Morse code IDs that just cut right through the clutter – if only for moments. **Florida #2 from the SoCal desert! 50 kW at 2,031 miles. (SB-CA)**

- 1430 unID** - **9/2 0007-0008** – With a Dodgers – Giants game in progress. A lot of QRM; no KMRB or KMES heard. Who? **(RA-CA)** [A quick check of both the Dodgers and Giants radio networks yield no stations on 1430. But, the lists may be out of date – Ed.]

- 610 **KNML** **NM Albuquerque** – 8/27 0746 – Sports, ads for ‘Tracfone,’ ‘CVS Prescription Delivery’ and ‘Zip Recruiter.’ Fade out, 0749: fade in with ads for ‘Babel Language Courses,’ ‘Technicians for Old Towne Tire and Automotive,’ ‘Disney Bundle Streaming,’ ‘Babel’ and a PSA for ‘Social Security.gov.’ “. . . weekdays at one on 95.9 FM and AM 610, The Sports Animal.” “The A’s on CBS Sportsradio.” “Inside College Football tomorrow.” 0756: Ads for ‘Stathero.com’ sports betting, “Women’s Athletic Pants.” 0801: “The DA (Damon Amora) Show from Rocketmortgage Studios.” Gone by 0810. **(LB-CO)**
- 610 **KILT** **TX Houston** – 8/27 0318 – Ad with “979-665-19??” given. Spanish music. 0323: Ads for ‘Amador Insurance 214-942-7979,’ ‘American Surety Bail Bonds’ and ‘Lawyer 214Abogado.’ Mentions of an event with live music and “Houston Texas.” QRM from Spanish music station. KRTA Medford? Tentative. **(LB-CO)** [Let’s start at the beginning of the report: Area code 979 skirts around Houston’s Area Code district from Northwest to the Gulf of Mexico. Spanish music (more on that later). Not KILT, as they are Sports, affiliated with the CBS Sports Network (reference: The NRC’s AM Radio Log 42) so it’s likely you heard them; all of the “lawyer” references: Area code 214 and prefix 942 is assigned to Dallas. “Abogado” translates to “attorney”/“lawyer” in English, and ‘Lawyer214Abogado.com’ returns a law firm in McKinney, Texas (north of Dallas). This law firm may target Spanish-speaking listeners in the Houston area; “QRM from Spanish music station”: KRTA is likely. – Ed.]
- 630 **KYFI** **MO St. Louis** – 9/4 0703 – ‘Our Daily Bread Ministries’ sponsored inspirational message into lady gospel vocal. This one blows in briefly around sunrise, especially around the Spring and Fall Equinoxes. Sad there’s nothing content worthy. **(TK-FL)**
- 640 **KFI** **CA Los Angeles** – 8/17 0016 – IDs. 0234: “KFI in the Sky” traffic, dominant. **(LB-CO)**

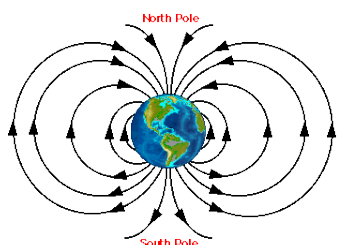

CHINA: For decades, international broadcasts from Beijing were broadcast via the medium wave installation at Ürümqi **1521 kHz** all the way to Europe. That could be over now. Since original information on such topics cannot be obtained, only a collection of reception observations compiled by the *British DX Club* remains. Accordingly, the large medium waves in Hutubi, about 60 km northwest of Ürümqi, seem to have not been active for months. [Kai Ludwig, *Radio Eins Radio-News*, via mediumwave.info]

LESOTHO: *Ultimate FM* has reactivated **1197 kHz**, parallel 891 kHz. [WRTH June 2021 National Update]

NORTH MACEDONIA: The last remaining medium wave in North Macedonia (**810 kHz**) has failed at least since August 14, 2021. According to gossip from the region, the cause in this case is external (brush fires). [Georgi Bancov, *Radio Eins Radio-News* via mediumwave.info]

MALAWI: 675 Malawi Broadcasting Corporation, Ekwendeni, 50 kW, reactivated. [Peter Wilson via Mauno Ritola, *ARC mv-eko*]

SOUTH AFRICA: *Umhlobo Wenene FM* has restarted operation from Komga on **846 kHz**. [WRTH June 2021 National Update]

I find the *AM Radio Log* not just helpful in figuring out what AM station I'm hearing, but it even helped me ID an FM E-skip! On 93.7 I heard an ID for WKHG 1060 and per the AM Radio log I realized my skip station was their 250-Watt translator W229CI! The first translator I've ever received on FM skip. So this NRC tool doesn't just help on AM.

The *Pattern Book* is an amazing tool too! Please keep the DX Achievement listings. I'm still trying to assemble my numbers, this gets tricky given all the frequency shifts and what not. All the syndicated programming on the AM dial is hurting in getting IDable material along with all the 800 number national spots. The dial has been pretty flat this summer. 650, 670, 700, 720, 780, 830, 840 off plus my locals on 730, 900, 1470, 1490 & 1520 off with not much new to show for them being gone. WJYM 730 is back on after tower work. They've now popped a translator on at 106.9 ugh, 900 WFRO long gone remains covered by WLS 890 or WFDF 910 IBOC, ugh, 1470 gone for 5 years sounds like off frequency hash. Oh, for DXers be careful about WTOE reception – they are oldies but as I found out WWBG in Greensboro NC is back on and they are a parallel repeat of oldies formatted WTOB 980 in Winston Salem NC. Rene Auvray's request in last month's Musings for remembrances of AM Top 40 when growing up, brought back a flood of memories about my early radio listening. I always lived in the NY Metro area so from as far back as I can remember, probably around 1950, the radio in the kitchen was always on and usually tuned to WOR NY 710 which featured talk shows. The morning drive time was the province of John Gambling Sr and later his son, John R. This was followed by "Breakfast with Dorothy & Dick" with newspaper columnist Dorothy Killgallen and her husband Dick Kollmer. Late at night into the early morning, Barry Farber told stories and never seemed to repeat himself. I'm not sure what stations carried soap operas like "The Guiding Light," "Helen Trent," "Mary Noble, Backstage Wife," and many others which ran from about noon until late afternoon in 15 minute segments. At home and over at my Grandmother's, those soaps were on all afternoon. By the time I was old enough to go to school, I was a true soap addict. Sometimes I'd feign sickness so I could stay home and listen, until I discovered that if I listened to the Friday segment, I could get the gist of the whole week's storyline. I also remember listening to programs like "Grand Central Station," "The FBI in Peace and War," and "Gunsmoke" and "Johnny Dollar" as well as "Burns & Allen" and many more. I even remember a lot of the jingles from products that supported those programs.

The music scene as I remember it didn't interest me until my teens and then WMCA 570 and WABC 770, WNEW, WCBS 880 were favorites. Cousin Brucie Morrow, Murray the K and Scott Muni come

to mind. For classical music, there was WQXR 1560 which my father tuned into on Saturday afternoon to listen to opera with host Martin Bookspan.

To my mind, the worst thing that happened to AM radio was the advent of 24 hour/7day all-news stations. WINS 1010 and WCBS 880 went that way and once you hear the headlines, there's a lot of repetition and precious little depth to the reporting. The other change was the replacement of local programming with nationally syndicated programs, especially overnight, which wrecked the variety that used to be available not to mention how it made station IDing more difficult. My current favorite time to hunt for regional stations is right before sunrise when I can still hear local ads and the occasional farm or livestock report.

I'm sure everyone is looking forward to the new DX season and I hope you'll share your triumphs, and disappointments too, here in upcoming months. 73 and good DX!

Pro Sports Networks

Here is National Football League (NFL) flagship information for the 2021 season via Internet searches. Some of the network lists are undated, so I do not know if they are for the current season. And I cannot rely on the copyright date at the bottom of each page, as that is probably added globally for the web site. even if the specific web page being viewed has not changed. And some team sites do not list the announcer team, while others have bios that are a few seasons' old, so I do not know if they are current. I found some network list pages that were not linked from the team home page or sub-section "home" page; I assume that there are "orphan" pages that are not current. And some I could not find via the team's "Search" option, so I have no idea what pages that search is reviewing.

Some of the online lists cannot be cut-and-pasted, as they are graphical images. One could download the JPEG image file and then feed it through an OCR scanner, but I find it simpler to hand-compare it to the text file I have saved from last season and create a new text file.

These lists were checked by David Yocis against the official FCC AM and FM databases, so what you see below might differ from what you find at the URLs listed.

And I am not sure that I have all of the Spanish-language stations correct.

I do not know the sources for the gottoknow lists, so I cannot trust them 100%.

Due to NFL Restrictions, online streaming of games is prohibited by affiliates. You can listen and/or watch games online via NFL.com

The announcer names are found at this URL: http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List_of_current_NFL_broadcasters That page seems to have been updated for the 2021 season, but the footnotes on that site point to web page retrievals in 2012.

I cannot include a network in this column if there is a "Do Not Reproduce" warning on the web page.

I am not sure that I have correct information on Spanish-language broadcasts and announcers. Some team web sites did not include this information.

The Westwood One Radio Network (renamed to Dial Global Sports and in 2013 and then renamed to WestwoodOne Sports) will broadcast NFL games that occur Sunday nights, Monday nights, and Thursday nights. This URL <http://westwoodonesports.com/football-announcers/> has the list of announcers. Here are the announcer teams:

From the *DX News* archives

75 Years Ago – From the September 14, 1946 issue of *DX News*: Starting this issue, individual member reports (which were still called “LPO Reports”) would be collected a separate editor (Ernie Cooper) rather than the publisher (Pop Edge), thus beginning what would become the Musings of the Members column. The convention was held in Buffalo; as you can see from the photos, it was a more formal affair than became customary in later years!

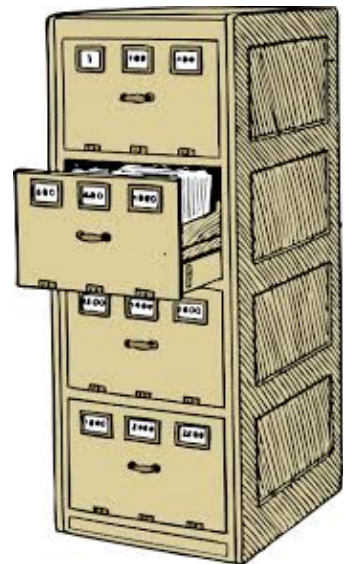


50 Years Ago – From the September 11, 1971 issue of *DX News*: Bob Bundy reported to IDXD from Truk Atoll (now called Chuuk Lagoon in the Federated States of Micronesia) with many Asian receptions and possible England on 1457. An excerpt from *QST* describes the confusion among amateurs about starting to adopt GMT as a universal time standard – which IDXD had also recently adopted. Ron Schatz reported that ZNS-1540 Nassau, Bahamas would increase power to 20 kW and begin to use a 2-tower directional antenna later in the year. Stan Morss of the Boston area led the total domestic logging totals with 3,377 stations heard and verified from all 50 states and all 10 Canadian provinces; Frank Wheeler of NW Pennsylvania was second with 2,536 domestic stations heard.

25 Years Ago – From the September 16, 1996 issue of *DX News*: Kermit Geary was named Domestic DXer of the Year, while Al Merriman received the honors as International DXer of the Year. Guy Atkins reviewed the new AOR AR7030 receiver. Kermit Geary reported on his visit to Kintronic Laboratories, Inc., in Bluff City, Tennessee, on his way home from the Knoxville convention; this was the source of the experimental test broadcast Kermit had heard on 1680 kHz earlier in the year. Paul Ormandy reported some North American stations from Down Under: WBBM-780 Chicago, KVEG-840 Las Vegas, CJBC-860 Toronto, KMOX-1120 St. Louis, KXNO-1140 Las Vegas, and KDIA-1320 Oakland.

10 Years Ago – From the September 19, 2011 issue of *DX News*: A few East Coast stations were still off the air after Hurricane Irene. A museum was set to open at the former Voice of America transmitter site at Bethany, Ohio. Preparations continued for the Omaha convention in October.

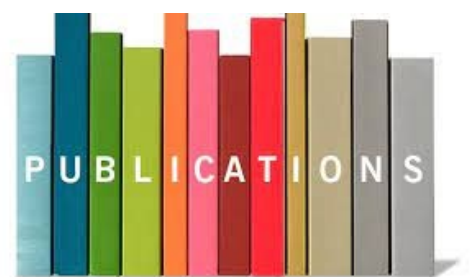
