770 CHQR Slogan changed to “QR Calgary” on January 9, coinciding with CFGQ-FM simulcasting CHQR. This appears to violate CRTC regulations forbidding an FM station from simulcasting an AM station. Likewise, Spoken Word formats on FM require a Specialty License, and there is no on-line record of CFGQ-FM applying for one. (JP)

The seemingly endless saga of Rogers' acquisition of Shaw was recently highlighted by the Competition Tribunal's dismissal of the Competition Bureau's application to block the takeover. On New Years Eve, Canada's Industry Minister, Francois-Philippe Champagne, who also has to approve the takeover, issued a statement that he will only make his decision after the Competition Bureau has had a chance to appeal the Tribunal's dismissal. Rogers owns radio and television stations but, in 1999, the Shaw family set up a second company, Corus, to hold Shaw's radio and television stations to help gain CRTC approval for the Shaw family's acquisition of radio and television stations from Power Corporation and Western International Communications (WIC). Three former WIC stations are listed below. Two others, CJOB-680 Winnipeg, Manitoba and CKNW-980 New Westminster, British Columbia, could not be heard in Edmonton over Christmas due to unusual DX conditions, so it is unclear if they aired 'Christmas Is' this year.

The sale of Electric Vehicles (EVs) will be mandated by proposed regulations from Canada's new Environment Minister, Steven Guilbeault. Minimums for each manufacturer will be 20% in 2026, 60%



in 2030 and 100% in 2035. Plug-in Hybrid Electric Vehicles (PHEVs) will only qualify as “half electric” and standard Hybrids will not qualify at all, effectively eliminating the sale of both in 2035. Many EVs do not have AM radios available as either standard or optional equipment, and some owners report excessive electrical noise on the AM band when EVs are running nearby. None of which bodes well for Canadian AM radio stations.

100 years ago, as 1923 began, there were about 35 radio stations on the air in Canada. Most were Private Commercial licenses with ‘C’ call letters, but a few were Experimental, with call letters that began with a number. Historical records from those early days of licensing in Canada are few and far between, with the only reliable figure being 58 licenses issued for radio stations in Canada by the end of 1922. It would be another year or two before any attempt was made to keep track of which stations were actually on the air. The Experimental broadcast license class mentioned above was originally named “Amateur” even though Hams used a completely different type license to transmit. Hams were not broadcasting, and were no longer allowed to, based on the new licensing structure created in 1922. Hams were communicating, mostly between two people. Broadcasting was defined as we know radio today: continuous audio transmitted for the benefit of an audience of many people.

- 630 CHED AB Edmonton** – A long-time listener reports that the station’s repeated airing of the 12 hour ‘Christmas Is’ this year is in sharp contrast to 2021 when the station went to great lengths to explain, on air, that they had decided to emphasize the spirit of the season, rather than Christmas, by airing music that emphasized relevant themes like peace and family. The same set of music was aired this year on CHQR-770 (see below).
- 710 CBOM QC Maniwaki** – The replacement FM transmitter is now on the air with 205 Watts on 93.3 MHz. And the three month simulcast period has begun, after which CBOM-AM will go off the air. CBOM-FM will continue as a repeater of CBO-FM Ottawa, a member of the CBC Radio One network.
- 770 CHQR AB Calgary** – Originally produced and aired several years ago in Vancouver on CKNW, CHQR aired the same selection of spirit of the season music on Christmas Eve/Christmas Day this year. Although the music made no explicit mention of Christmas, there were still the usual long breaks for Christmas greetings and ads from station sponsors. For example, one song heard was 1989’s ‘The Living Years’ by Mike + The Mechanics which discusses reconciliation with aging parents.
- 880 CHQT AB Edmonton** – ‘Christmas Is’ was exactly synchronized (simulcast, with different commercials during breaks) with CHED on Christmas Eve. By early afternoon on Christmas Day, the music had drifted apart, but still within the same song. By mid-evening, the stations were not even playing the same piece of music at the same time.
- 990 CBOF-1 QC Maniwaki** – The replacement FM transmitter is now on the air with 210 Watts on 94.3 MHz. And the three month simulcast period has begun, after which CBOF-1-AM will go off the air. CBOF-1-FM will continue as a repeater of CBOF-FM Ottawa, a member of the CBC’s former French AM network, now known as ICI Première.
- 1130 CKWX BC Vancouver** – Heard in Tennessee at **0200 EST on January 5th.**
- 1450 CHMO ON Moosonee** – A 50 Watt Community/Aboriginal station is now back in the federal government’s database of active radio stations, after being off the air for several years. It was deleted from the same database in early 2020.
- 1490 CHTO-1 ON Mississauga** – This licensed repeater of CHTO-1690 Toronto never made it on the air, and the license has now been cancelled. It would have been 23 Watts day but 770 Watts at night when CHTO-1690 reduces power to 1000 Watts and does not provide an interference-free signal into the area around Mississauga.

- WSAN PA Allentown** – 12/30 2119 – In pileup of oldies stations with recorded ID by man: "Real Oldies 14-70, the Lehigh Valley's greatest hits." Better ID recorded later. Relog. **(RWK-CT)**
- 1490 **WCCM MA Haverhill** – 1/11 1620 – Spanish rock music, over/under semi local WEMJ. **(TF-NH)**
- WNGZ NY Watkins Glen** – Poor; "WPHD Corning... WCBF HD3 Elmira, and WNGZ Watkins Glen, My Cool Radio." **(BC-NH)**
- WERE OH Cleveland Heights** – 1/8 0715 – Out of string of Ad Council PSA's with promo for "Flashpoints" program, "what's happening in Northeast Ohio on 1490 WERE." **(MKB-ON)**

- 1510 **WRNJ NJ Hackettstown** – 1/8 1823 – Rock music, alone on frequency, and "The biggest hits of yesterday....the biggest hits of today....right here on 'RNJ," into more rock music, 230 watts from four towers is directional into Campton and heard frequently. 1510 in the area was, for many years, 10,000 watt WRAN (500 watts at night – call stood for "Randolph County") licensed to nearby Dover. **(TF-NH)**
- 1530 **WZTE PA Union City** – 1/3 1704 – Battling usual WCKY with local news mentioning hike in Pennsylvania gas tax, talkerie.com promo. **(MKB-ON)**
- 1540 **KXEL IA Waterloo** – 1/10 0800 – Creaming local CHIN with "KXEL Waterloo, Cedar Rapids, Cedar Falls" ToH ID into Fox News. **(MKB-ON)**
- WSIV NY East Syracuse** – 1/13 1700 – Atop a jumble; gospel music, "WSIV East Syracuse, 106.3 FM and 1540 AM The Voice." **(BC-NH)**
- WULT VA Sandston** – 1/13 1701 – Briefly breaking through WSIV; "1480 WTOX Glen Allen..." New log. **(BC-NH)**

- 1580 **WJFK MD Morningside** – 1/9 1706 – Killing near-local CKDO with talk on betting picks for NFL playoffs. **(MKB-ON)**
- CKDO ON Oshawa** – 1/7 2000 – Good, over WWCD; promo for CKDO on the car radio in HD at 95.9 HD3. **(BC-NH)**
- 1590 **WHGT MD Maugansville** – 1/11 1657 – Religious programming then into promos for "The Beacon of Hope for Cumberland Valley." Call sign ID thereafter. In well with presumed daylight power. **(JW-PA)**
- WAUB NY Auburn** – 1/6 1720 – After WGBW faded out, noted with local weather and news "on Finger Lakes News Radio." **(MKB-ON)**
- WGBW WI Denmark** – 1/6 1716 – "...they're playing on Real Oldies WGBW 1590 AM" liner into "Lover's Concerto" by the Toys, battling usual pest WAKR. **(MKB-ON)**

- 1600 WKKX WV **Wheeling** – 1/7 1800 – Under WWRL; West Virginia University Mountaineers basketball. (BC-NH)

- 1680 WTTM NJ **Lindenwold** – 1/6 0556 – Interesting audio with crazed preacher on this station with another station underneath broadcasting mellow R&B ballads. Coming in very well during the period; switch to Latin programming at 0635 with ID and mention of Philadelphia. (JW-PA)
- 1700 WRCR NY **Haverstraw** – 1/6 0538 – “AM 1700 WRCR” ID at this time and repeated a minute later. (JW-PA)

Occasionally I receive questions about why there are multiple records on file for a given station. This is a reflection of past editorial decisions to keep the records relevant and interesting in the face of changing conditions over the decades. Over 30 years ago, when DXers in Alaska and Hawaii started claiming a lot of records for western stations, a number of impressive records from within the continental US were "lost," so it was decided to allow a separate record for each station for DXers from Alaska/Hawaii. A few years later, Canada hastily migrated most of its AM stations to FM, suddenly making it much easier for DXers in Canada to log faraway graveyard stations, so a third record was opened up for Canadian DXers. Lastly, there have always been a smattering of submissions from DXers outside the US and Canada. So, if you see more than one record listed for a station, it means you're looking at the best loggings we've got on file for DXers from two or more of the four geographic areas mentioned here. 73 Tim

Transmitter site sunrise 0743 UTC, so westward prop from this northwest tip of Africa is still possible and for some minutes longer still in the dark. [Hauser-OK]
- 1386 unID JAN 3 0354 – Earlier than usual complete 9/kHz split bandscan for JBA carriers. Only one audible is here, worst possible spot next to blasting 1390 local KCRC. If not a coincidental spur out of that, what have we TAs in WRTH? O yes, a neat catch would be 75 kW *R.Baltic Waves*, Lithuania, which relays Ukraine et al. Not much else: 50 kW in Kenya, 10 kW in Egypt, 1-watt LPAMs in UK, unknown power in Greece. [Hauser-OK]

- 530 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, Guantánamo JAN 3 0559 – "Por cada rebelde," pips at top of the hour, and familiar music; fair over CMBQ; Cuba #25. [Jeziorski-QRO]
- 690 **MEXICO** XERG Monterrey, NL JAN 7 1247 – Sounded like play-by-play of the Monterrey Liga MX team, but couldn't have been live at 6:47 a.m., so maybe just an extra long highlight reel. Fair at best with interference; no ID heard. [Wilkins-CO]
- 770 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde*, JAN 8 1100 – Under WABC; cuckoo sounder. [Conti-NH]
- 770 **MEXICO** XEFRTM Fresnillo, Zac. DEC 16 0151-0156 – Rose up briefly over mix of KKOBB and KCBC; Gwen Stefani tune "If I Were a Rich Girl." Parallel stream. Listed at 1 kw nites at 1,095 miles. Re-log. [Battaglino-CA]
- 790 **CUBA** *R.Reloj*, Holguin//Pinar del Rio JAN 8 1000 – Good; "Radio Reloj," beep, "Cinco de la mañana, en año 65 de la revolución desde la Habana, Cuba, transmite Radio Reloj..." then "A continuación los titulares," and RR Morse code. [Conti-NH]
- 810 **BAHAMAS** ZNS3 Freeport, Grand Bahama JAN 8 1058 – Over WGY; reading from the constitution of the Commonwealth of the Bahamas, instrumental national anthem, "This is the Bahamas Radio Network at 1540 AM, 104.5 FM, the national voice of the Bahamas... we're broadcasting live from our studios located on Harcourt Rusty Bethel Drive, Centreville, Nassau, Bahamas, transmitting with a power of 50 kilowatts or 50,000 watts on the AM dial and 5 kilowatts 5,000 watts on the FM dial..." without mention of 810 kHz, into Amazing Grace program. [Conti-NH]
- 1000 **CUBA** *R.Artemisa*, Artemisa JAN 13 0338 – Excellent level with woman hosting mid-tempo traditional Cuban vocals, parallel 1020 kHz. [Krueger-FL]
- 1000 unID JAN 8 0240 – Music in Spanish, brief announcement as "todos éxitos," about equal level to KTOK which is south/southeast, on my east/west longwire, and best audible with KTOK nulled on the DX-398, but can't get a DF on it separately. Searching on slogan or catchphrase unproductive. No U.S. Spanish stations fit – NRC AM Log shown only two religious daytimers in MA, NC. Mexico? Only three still exist, per IRCA Mexican Log 2022/2023, notably XEOY *Radio Mil* in CDMX, but parallel 6010 has been gone for many years. The others: XEFV in Juárez, XETAC in Chiapas. Cuba? Sounded too "commercial" but two in WRTH 2022: *R.Artemisa*, *R.Granma*. The latter named for Castro's revolutionary boat. Do Cubans even realize derivation of the name? [Hauser-OK]
- 1020 **CUBA** *R.Artemisa*, Bahía Honda, Artemisa JAN 13 0340 – Good level, parallel 1000 kHz. [Krueger-FL]
- 1110 **MEXICO** XERED *Universal 88.1*, México, CMDX DEC 29 0531 – "Universal 88.1" slogan between two Police songs; returned to air during my absence; very good; DF #29. [Jeziorski-QRO]
- 1140 **CUBA** *R.Mayabeque*, La Salud, Mayabeque JAN 8 0659 – Man with canned "Esta es Radio Mayabeque... frecuencia modulada" into light news patter. [Krueger-FL]
- 1140 **MEXICO** XEMR *R.Esperanza*, Monterrey, NL JAN 8 0630 – Droning Spanish woman preacher, dominating the channel. [Krueger-FL]
- 1180.06 **CUBA** *R.Rebelde* JAN 8 0247 – MW bandscan at 10-kHz steps finds a het from a JBA carrier about 1180.03 kHz. Nothing in mwoffsets. Most likely one of countless Cuban jammers off-

- frequency. [Hauser-OK] JAN 8 0720 – One of the plethora of Rebelde's on the channel, slightly off-frequency. Very strong, so suspect the Martí-Centro, Matanzas site. First noted by D.Crawford last month. [Krueger-FL]
- 1180 **MEXICO** XEUBS La Paz, BCS DEC 31 0255-0258 – Poor, under KERN/KOFI. Came out of music with female noting "cinco punto cinco... de La Paz en Baja California Sur... ochenta AM." Mexican national anthem – the children's choir version – popped up a minute or two later. No listed night power in Mexican Log, so I'll assume day power of 10 kw, but that said, the signal wasn't all that strong. New Mexican state from the So Cal desert at 761 miles. [Battaglino-CA]
- 1190 **MEXICO** XEPZ *Máxima 99.1*, Cd. Juárez, Chih. JAN 4 0710-0717 – Fair/good under KGBN Asian talk; a mix of Mexican music. Parallel stream. Ex-XEHPR. Listed at 250 watts nights at 593 miles. [Battaglino-CA] JAN 10 1300 – Out of weird music with ID at 1300:50: "...XHEPR 99.1 mHz, diez mil wats de potencia, Juárez-El Paso-Las Cruces – Máxima 99.1," then a "Máxima" jingle and back to the unusual music; no mention of AM in the ID. Rough copy, mixing with stations in Arizona, Kansas, and others. [Wilkins-CO]
- 1270 **MEXICO** XEGL *La Nuestra*, Navojoa, Son. JAN 7 1207 – "La Nuestra" slogan, followed by bad tuba music. Very spotty reception throughout the next 20 minutes or so. [Wilkins-CO]
- 1300 **MEXICO** XECPAD *Radio UV*, Xalapa, Ver. DEC 29 0600 – Newly on air with several "Radio UV" slogans and "Radio Veracruzana," mention of 90.5 FM, unID anthem; fair-good; Ver. #6. [Jeziorski-QRO]
- 1370 **MEXICO** XECCBI *La Más Peligrosa*, Huamantla, Tlax. DEC 29 0603 – Mention of Huamantla and "La Más Peligrosa" slogan; fair and newly on air during my absence; Tlax. #3. [Jeziorski-QRO]

JAN 4 0732 – JBA carrier the only 9/kHz split detectable, surely *R.Kiribati*. JAN 6 0735 – Only 9/kHz split JBA carrier is here. JAN 8 0753 – No signal, presumably another Sunday silence; nor any other 9/kHz splits. JAN 10 0722 – No signal detectable, nor any other 9/kHz JBA split carriers. JAN 11 0744 – JBA carrier, no other 9/kHz splits. JAN 11 0744 – JBA carrier, no other 9/kHz splits. Gary Pence reported JAN 11: 846 kHz detectable in Maui 0412 UTC. JAN 14 0723 – JBA carrier. [Hauser-OK]

ANGOLA: Jorge Garzón reported *RNA Canal A*, Mulenvos active again on **1133.5 kHz**. It was also heard by Joakim Weckström, Raseborg Finland, Jan 7 2023, at 2130 UTC. "Last night at 1950 UTC I discovered a carrier on 1133.5 kHz strongly interfered by Spanish RNE and COPE. Conductor spoke in Portuguese with African accent informing about the African Football Championship and World Handball Cup. Some details mentioned Angola but top of the hour the station identified as *Rádio Nacional de Angola*. MWList mentions Emissora Provincial do Bengo – RNA closed more than 10 years back but this station now has been reactivated or there is another provincial RNA station (probably new activation). Signal wasn't too bad (apart the QRM by Spanish MW txers) with occasional severe QSB. The station was heard with an AirSpy HF+ and a 250-m miniBOG at 180° during my listening December DXP at La Azohía, southeastern Spain." [Jorge Garzon, ARC mv-eko]

UNITED KINGDOM: *Absolute Radio* (1197, 1215, 1233, 1242, 1260 kHz) is "saying goodbye to AM." How you listen to Absolute Radio could be changing. 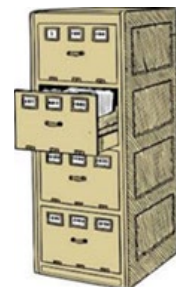

Last time I heard them they were WTJZ Praise. 73's, Martin

The AM band continues to be very noisy here. The weather has been extremely odd with temperatures ranging from the low 30's to close to 60 F. The other evening there were some scattered thunderstorms which is not common for the middle of January. I kept trying for the WNJC tests with the RSPDx, but the only station that came through was WDRC and that wasn't as strong as usual either. I also tried from Demarest, NJ on the C.Crane Skywave SSB on Jan 14, but the noise was so strong that even WDRC did not appear. The weather was unstable again with intermittent snow showers and the temperatures falling from the 50's to the low 30's in the course of a few hours. I have a verification from the test they ran in October 2020, which was easily heard. I wonder if something aside from the weather, perhaps some equipment change, kept their signal from reaching the NY Metro area this time?

Initial Report from Newfoundland October 16-31, 2022

James Renfrew

This is my initial set of nearly 700 loggings between OCT 16-31, 2022, from Cappahayden, Newfoundland. Though there were six of us participating, this report is mine alone, though I try to give credit to any team member whose tip or assistance helped me add a station to my log. Eventually, we will compile a group log for 2022, and we also have a cumulative log going back to the 1990's, but it takes a long time to prepare these. In fact, my Perseus recordings from 2009 and 2010 and every year since have not been completely reviewed, by me or the team. With four antennas used in 2022, with Perseus recordings at the top and bottom of each hour from 1900-1100, the time needed to review all of the Perseus files seems endless. We joke that it will take the rest of our lives to complete the task! Some of our previous reports can be found at **www.DXing.Info**, under "DXpeditions in Canada", though we have not kept this updated too well.

So in the interest of trying to abbreviate the lag time between actual listening and reporting to clubs, I am submitting this initial report. It is far from complete and may benefit from many corrections.

Team members in 2022 were JB **Jean Burnell** (NS), JF **John Fisher** (ON), CH **Chuck Hutton** (WA), BN **Bill Nolman** (CT), JR **Jim Renfrew** (NY), and BW **Bill Whitacre** (VA). Some were present for two weeks, others for just one. Our location is right on the Atlantic Ocean south of St John's on the "Irish Loop", in Cappahayden, on the way to Cape Race of Titanic fame.

There were four antennas: NORTH wire aimed at Northern Europe/Asia, SOUTH wire aimed at Brazil, LOOP aimed at Africa, and REMOTE wire aimed at South Pacific or Alaska on different nights. The first three are fed by coax into the house, but the REMOTE antenna required Jean to sit in the car by the side of the road in the middle of the night! Team members divided recording responsibilities and then traded files each morning.

My equipment: Perseus SDR and Lenovo laptop. I use Sound Tap for saving audio clips (sorry, but embedding these clips in my report would take too long). Everyone else also used an SDR (or two).

My report doesn't include everything; there are many easily or previously heard stations not included. You are familiar with the aphorism: "Yesterday's DX is today's pest!", or is it "Today's DX is tomorrow's pest"?

Observations:

The NORTH wire did not perform so well this year due to auroral conditions. The extensive local and regional IDs from RNE stations in Spain are my attempt to get every last one of them! Brazil is in

transition, with many stations leaving MW for FM. While many familiar stations are no longer there, it allows for some of the remaining ones to be found. Also, many Brazilian stations do not seem to power down at night, as far as I can tell.

I think my best reception this year was Radio Nacional in Tierra del Fuego, Argentina. Heard with a distinct sound effect under CBN 640 St John's in parallel to the more easily heard Radio Nacional in Buenos Aires on 870. While we did not log the South Pacific or Alaska, the remote antenna got lots of new domestics and some Mexico. Maybe the best domestic was KGIM 1420 South Dakota, our first from that state.

Finally, though I packed long underwear, hats, scarves and gloves, our two weeks in Newfoundland were t-shirt weather! So it was easy to take hikes on the beautiful East Coast Trail that runs right past the house.
