By the time this issue reaches you, we should be well into a period of Trans-Atlantic reception. Already several of the fellows have heard Radio Normandie on 1411 kcs., and this should be an indication that better TA reception lies just ahead. Be on the watch for the elusive TA signals now, and let's have plenty of reports concerning the ones you hear.

Last week we paid tribute to several of our DX pals to whom we were thankful for services rendered the DX hobby. This week we pause to acknowledge with the same feeling of gratitude the efforts of several others. First, to all the boys of WPAY...best wishes and sincere thanks for a swell DX tip program on December 1st. The publicity rendered NRC was invaluable. To the English announcer of CMKE, Manzanillo, Cuba, Joseph Sierra, heartfelt thanks for the DX program so kindly dedicated to our club December 4th. Your efforts are really appreciated, Joe. And to the personnel of stations WRNL KAST CJCA CFRN and FQN...many thanks for the special programs and we sincerely trust that our members will repay you in reports for the hours of lost slumber.

To Lee Chadwick of WTAR, Norfolk Va...thank you, sir, for the frank statement of your verification policies. We can readily vouch for the promptness with which you answer DX correspondence and we consider your letter as nifty a verification as any we have seen. Thank you for using discrimination against the "doubtful" reports.

From Chief Engineer J.G. Cobble of WHMA, Anniston Alabama we learn that his station is not required to monitor a regular frequency check. WHMA has a signal of sufficient strength that it can be monitored during its regular schedule by the Atlanta monitoring station. Engineer Cobble adds that he has no personal interest in DX reports. However, he offers his co-operation with DX fans to the extent of ONE special DX program. This program will be dedicated to all clubs and all DXers. An effort is being made to have WBNO stand by for the designated time and if a suitable date can be arranged, WHMA will advise all clubs. The NNRC are arranging the details.

Only minor decisions have been handed down by the FCC during the past several weeks. This has been due to the pressure of other business. It is anticipated that a deluge of major decisions will be forthcoming within the next two weeks.

The only item of much significance concerns the frequency change for KIUN, Pecos Texas. KIUN have been authorized to shift from 1420 to 1370. New transmitters were OK'ed for WILL and KRLH. WMRO, Aurora, Ill which is under construction, is given permission to make changes in the proposed technical equipment and also to install a vertical radiator.

The January DX period from WPAY has been moved from the 1st to the 3rd. This change is necessary on account of the many stations that will be on with New Year programs on the morning of the 1st. The change will be for January only. Don't forget that late tips will be broadcast on this program. The time is 4 to 4:30 AM EST...Jan. 3 1939

WBAA 890kc. 100w day 500w night Purdue, University-Lafayette Ind.

Station WBAA an educational, non-commercial broadcasting station owned and operated by Purdue University, is the oldest licensed station now operating in the state of Indiana. Its activities date back to 1910 when experimental work on code equipment was undertaken by a number of students of the school of electrical engineering. In 1919 the code radio station 9.Y.B. was licensed for operation on 300, 200 and 75 meters. WBAA is on the air five hours daily except Sunday. Original power assignment April 4, 1922 200w. 1924 500w. 1934 1,000w. WBAA employs forty students and three part-time workers. Since the autumn of 1935, Arsenal Technical Schools of Indianapolis and WBAA have cooperated in the broadcast of special features timed and integrated with the subject matter of courses offered in the high school. First program consisted of "Digest of the News" given once each week and received by the entire student body. Purdue University is also presenting television programs regularly. It is the only United States institution of higher learning with an experimental license to frequencies which permit the presentation of television programs. WBAA's purpose is to bring together representatives of civic organizations, commercial and institutional broadcasters to consider problems of mutual interest. Next we will discuss WCAD

Dan Yapp-Kittanning Pa. A new antenna up and a new receiver. Have a Philco 10x that seems to suit my needs. Veries in from WPIC WKBZ KRBA and WBRK to make it 100% on everything reported this season. Reports are out to KCMC KGEF WLAK XBAC And KGER. Logged my first 100 watter on the west coast on the 18th, that being KERN signing off at 3am Also heard WISN testing at 2:30 and WPIC testing at 3:30 the same morning/WPIC mentioned the fine co-operation they had received from the NRC.

Dick Cooper-Kittanning Penna. As usual I'm away behind with my personal correspondence and other DX work. I owe several of the follows letters and will try to get them answered soon. Only veries in this week are CMKE WHAI and CKY. CMKE advise that they will DX for the NRC on the 4th as listed in the last bulletin. WHAI came thru very promptly with a nice two color letterhead. CKY sent printed card and interesting booklet. Logged KGFV on 29th and heard several selections on 1370 that might have been from KAST. WLLH ORMed the station that was on and the signals were too weak to catch the call letters. WPAY gave NRC plenty of nice publicity on the 1st and read tips from the last bulletin. Heard KIDO WSPA KTUL all testing new transmitters. Reports out to WHOM WPEN WFLA WSUN and KOY. Heard that mystery station on 605 kes again This time they were R/7 as they signed off about 8:35 Sunday evening Nov. 27th. They were speaking in Castillian and while I hate to hazard a guess at the call, I must confess that it sounded like TIGH in Costa Rica. I have no record of any such station. Has any of the other members heard it. They break thru only occasionally but are always very clear and distinct when they are heard. Radio Normandie was good on 29th untill after 2 AM. Spick in back of KSL several times lately and someone in back of WNEW about six AM Also weak signal on 900 kes from 5:30 to 6:00am. For John Curgan, the KPLC verie was signed by Ed Wilkerson but I had plenty of grief getting it John Hi (John-Bill Stones verie was signed By:- E.C. Moses-Ed)

Harry F. Hawkins-Manchester New Hamp. Mex on 1150kc. is XEL and none other when they were first found there they were strongly hetrodyned by another station, probably XEC. Dont know if XECL is now deleted, but I recall that I received a verie from them after the Mexican lists had omitted them. Veries coming in very, very slow, more so than ever befor. Dont know how to explain it. XEAF may be found after KDKA and WBZ-BZA sign off. However, their freq. is about 4 kc above XEAC. Spick breaking thru WOAI in early evenings. That to be LS2 Stations using split freq between almost every channel. The 604 kc. station Dick Cooper refers to is audible here too. That may be FQN, but not the 608kc station. He is a Spick, usally playing American dance tunes from 10:45 to 11:00pm. Who were these: Spick 1485kc on 11/20/38, signed at 3:37 am. Nov. 13 3:00am playing oriental music. XEAA coming thru in AM's. WRVA says 50kw job should be on air around Dec. 20. WWL now using 50kw. Western Union must have a neat bill for them, after their recent DX program when all telegrams were collect. Notice to Dick Cooper. I know a Frenchman when I hear one: that station on 608kc is a Spick. Am quite positive it is TIX San Jose Costa Rica, changed from 650 kc., (Say youse guys theres a TIPGH on that freq Ed.) KTUL testing new 5 kw xmit. WCHS testing new 1 kw xmit and new radiator. Spick on 1560 kc. still sounds like CMK not like CMBF, who, as I recall used to sign very clearly and unmistakably on 770.

Heard HP5G R/4 Q/4 last nite (11/29) and belcive he gave HOA's frequency as 2340 kc., he mentioned it being a police band requested reports and KOA is on the air, no go here last night, no sign of it.

Randolph Hunt-Leucadia Calif. Lower California stations continue to use same frequencies as listed by me several weeks ago. No question about several Mexicans using 1150 kcs., but doubt very much that anyone has heard XECL on other than 1100 kcs. This station came on the air a year or more ago and has always been received on 1100 kcs.
