F.C.C. NEWS:--KGAR changed to KTUC Tucson Arizona. The F.C.C. Granted the application of the Oklahoma Broadcasting Company (KTOK) for a construction permit to change stations equipment and its operation during unlimited hours upon the freq of 1370 kc's, with power of 250 watts during daytime and 100 watts at night...The application of WRNL for a construction permit was also GRANTED to install a directional antenna and to operate station on the freq of 830kc., with power of 1 Kw unlimited time. The F.C.C. DENIED the application of the Illinois Broadcasting Corp for authority to operate station WTAD unlimited time. (Station now operates daytime only on frequency 900 kc., with power of 1 KW.) The F.C.C. DENIED the application for construction permit to erect a new station at Port Angeles Washington., to operate on frequency 1500 kc with 100 watt power. The Commission GRANTED the application of KVOB for a construction permit to change from 920 kc., 500 watts, sharing time with Station KFEL to 630 kc., with 1 Kw power, unlimited time, using directional antenna at night. Providing the applicant furnish satisfactory proof to the Commission that the transmitting equipment to be used meets the requirements of Rules 132 and 139...All the above are to become effective at 3 A.M. EST March 27. 1939.

MAX DEMULING--Eric Penna. WRAL testing--KGNC at sign off at 1am, KSEI at 2 am at sign off. Mar. 20th. WSJS KSEI and KWVC Vernon had a combined freq check and studio DX Jamboree, might be advisable to try for KWVC on 3rd Monday from 2:30-3. To Larry Lundberg and Leo Herz, in their first year as Editors for the National Radio Club, and congratulations goes to them from Headquarters, it has taken Bull Dog Grit for these two boys to hang onto the SW dept of the NRC, many and many a issue there has been only TWO REPOTERS in the SW section, LUNDBERG and HERZ, and here they are still hammering away after a full year. So to Larry and Leo Congratulation's to you two. And I know that all the other NRC members wish you the same. It was just one year ago, Vol. 5 No. 25 Dated March 29 that they entered the SW Dept Editors position.

EDITORS NOTE

DX the past week has been the worst that it has ever been this entire past season. Every member reporting this week tells the same story. Not only has DX been lousy but it has been nil. The members havent heard anything so how can they report anything. During the past week Australia was just arround the corner but Europe often seemed to be another planet. The further away the station the better was the reception of the signal. A freak electrical storm that swept the eastern sea coast probably had something to do with this effect on radio conditions. Befor & after this disturbance very few signals were hrd & when the storm was at its height not one signal came thru on any part of the Short Wave Spectrum.

SOUTH AMERICA

The radio commission of the Republic of Colombia is moving to clear the air of all SW stations that have been operating above 49 meters. HJLABP 9.618 The Voice Of Cartagena will be off the air by July & will either be on 62 meters or silent. Only 3 SW stations are active now as all have been ordered to that portion of the band between 60 & 62 meters. No more licenses are to be issued since that part of the band has been completely filled in.

FRANCE

The French Government is testing a new transmitter on 7.280 megs & the signal is reaching here with clarity & strength.

40 METERS

Drastic changes are taking place everywhere on the short waves. European countries are building high powered transmitters to operate on 40 meters which was once considered a strictly Amateur Band. Between the hours of 2-5am some real catches can be made on 40 meters which has become a very interesting band. A diligent listener should be able to log all continents except Asia within a few hours.

ENGLAND

The British Broadcasting Corporation station will commence transmissions intended for Indian Listeners on GSV 7.249 megs & GSW 7.260 megs in the early Fall but tests will start a long time before this. The power will be 100 Kw.

PITCAIRN ISLAND

The following letter was written by Andrew Young, Radio Operator of VR6AY 14.346 megs on distant Picairn Island in the South Pacific ocean to Horace Hall of the New York Sun. "My transmitter is not working, I'll try & get a radio operator aboard one of the ships to come ashore & help me. But if I can't get him to come ashore I'll have to wait till I get help from you folks up there. The trouble with the transmitter may be a thousand things." Andrew Young, although experienced in Seafaring matters, is very inexperienced in radio so VR6AY must remain silent until the captain of a passing ship permits his radio operator to go ashore. VR6AY has been off the air since January 20, 1939.
