## --RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR S &amp; E CONTEST OF 1939-1940--

- RULE:--(1)--Contest to begin on September first 1939, and end June first 1940.
- RULE:--(2)--Any member in good standing, may enter his or her veries..
- RULE:--(3)--This contest to be in charge of Joseph "Pat" Reilley. The Board of Directors will be the judges: and in case of all disputes, the decision of the Board will be final.
- RULE:--(4)--To be eligible, only verification received on or after January first 1939: will be counted in the contest.
- RULE:--(5)--Eligible verifications must be from stations location (500) five hundred miles or more distant from the DX'ers location and not over (5000) five thousand watts power, on the NORTH AMERICAN continent. (United States: Canada: Mexico and Alaska) All other countries located outside of this jurisdiction, no limit to power, as listed in RADEX magazine. This rule applies only to American and Canadian members. For members living outside of this jurisdiction write contest manager for proper listings concerned in your case.
- RULE:--(6)--Only veries direct from the stations themselves will count in this contest. No MONITORED or veries Via the 10 cent monitored way will be eligible in this contest.
- RULE:--(7)--Prizes for this contest will be drawn up, by the Board of Directors. In case of ties identical prizes will be awarded.
- RULE:--(8)--Verifications may be called in at any time by the contest manager, but only in case of dispute by the contestants, or doubt, on the part of the contest manager.
- RULE:--(9)--The leading contestants, at the end of the contest, will forward all verifications, to contest manager, for inspection. The veries will be called in only in case of a dispute. In this case, any contestant, entering a false singleton, or eliminator will forfeit (10) ten points, for every false entry. A committee of (9) nine members to be the judges, in this case: the contest manager to remain neutral.
- RULE:--(10)--Scoring of points--Singletons as noted below, and eliminators one half points awarded the Singleton:--

- RULE:--(11)--The Board of Directors, reserve the right to amend these rules at any time, it may be deemed advisable.

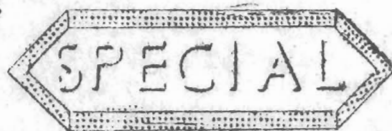
