Reports again were few and far between, geing to the following stations: 5/22-CKY on all-night flood broadcast from 2:45 to 3:15 a.m.; KRSN on f/c from 2:16 to 2:25 a.m., and WPBB on ET from 3:35 to 3:57 a.m. 5/29 - WRCO on ET from 2:53 to 3:17 a.m. 3/1 - WHHH on regular schedule from  $5:43\frac{1}{2}$  a.m. sign on to 6:00 a.m. 6/12 -WRHC, Jacksonville, Fla., 1400 kc/s., testing from 3:15 to 3:21 a.m. A Missouri station was heard on 1220 kc/s. from 3:29 to 3:35 a.m. on 6/12, possibly KNCM? Latest veries here were a card from KDAL and letters from WNAM WMIL & WRAC. KDAL confirms my reception of their all-night program on 610 with a government post card which looks like it was typed on an electric typewriter. WNAM verified my report of June 12, 1949 by letter after I wrote them again. At present they use 1 kilowatt on 1280 daytime only but they will start full time operation on July 10. However, they say that their directional pattern will prevent me from hearing them after local sun set. Local VMIL verified by letter and they say that they always answer letters from rudio clubs. WMIL's descillator is an 807 into an 813 into a pair of 833s in parellel They also have a pair of 845s driving the modulators which are 833s. They use a vertical tower 310 feet high situated on top of a former dump in agreement with data previously reported by Leo of the Windy City down Cook County way. Due to a poor ground system WMIL has a sky wave. WMIL formerly used the call WMLO. I understand that WKNK of Múskegon will soon use 5 kilowaytts. At present their daytime signal is rather poor here; as a matter of fact KSD of St. Louis on 550 puts in a better signal although they are 350 miles airline from Milwaukee while Muskegon is only 70 miles across the pond. This one signed on at 3:23 with a musical program. Call letters distorted but sounded like WANB??? (How about WOND, Pleasantville, Sid - Don't know if it's on yet - Ed.) Lone letter verie was from WEML for ET report of March 26th. v/s L. O. Fitzgibbons, Manager. Reports of the New Zealand boys are always very interesting, so keep them coming, boys. The new mimeograph machine is doing a swell job and DX News rates tops, even in the dull season. Have hopes of listing some real catches for the next issue. That's all from out of these hills. Frank Wheeler - Box 174 - R.D. 5 - Erie, Pennsylvania Not much to report on. One night in early June I received WKLX as a new one. I received a verie from WEGR after I sent them two follow-up cards. They were very sorry in delaying my answer, but they had mislaid my report. They sent a nice verie. WDSU sent a nice folder and a map of reports from DXers (That is, one or two from different cities, etc.) of their TV station. Somebody in Erie received them. Our local TV station WICU, has been received several times as far as Philadelphia. I sent out 114 reports this past season and received 111 veries for a 95%, which isn't bad. I still have reports out to WKVM, WRIA and WWL. My totals are now 947 verified and 1596 heard. A preacher in Chicago heard my name over one of the stations and he wrote to me as his name was Frank A. KVFD (1400) TT-f/c 2:38-2:50 as per f/c list. 6/13 - WAPA (580) recorded music f/c 2:18-2:25 s/off. WMVG (1450) TT-f/c 3:40-3:50 as per f/c list. 6/19 - KTRI (1470) late base-ball game 1:09-1:58 s/off through XESM. 6/20 - WLAM (1470) election returns 2:00-2:25 s/off. WPAB (1370) recorded music f/c, very strong signal 2:30-2:39 s/off. 6/21 - WEDR (1220) recorded music ET 2:06-2:30. 6/22 - WJOY (1230) special all-night Dance Party 1:35-2:05. 7/3 - WJEH (990) ET with 500 cycle tone 1:34-1:45. 7/5 -RTUL (1430) election returns 3:00-3:22 s/off. WBAB (1340) TT-f/c 3:30-3:44 as per f/c list. 7/6 - WOMI (1490) TT-f/c 2:14-2:20 through WJBK. 16 varies for the same period to bring that total to 472 with far too many reports still out. 6/13 - XESM (1470) nice card with photograph of transmitter for regular program 5/26. 6/16 -WKRC (550) card for regular program 6/4. 6/19 - KVFD (1400) card for f/c 6/12. 6/23-WREC (600) poor card for f/c after 3rd report 3/17/49. 11/15/49 and 6/3/50. 6/24 -WMOA (1490) card for f/c 5/14 enclosed in a Booster envelope for the National Intercollegiate Regatta. 6/26 - WABY (1400) letter for f/c after 2nd report. First sent 4/11/49. Another old one in. 6/28 - WEEL (1380) detter for DX 3/26. 6/30 - WJW (850) prepared card for regular program. WRHC (1400) nice letter from this new station for ET 6/5. They started regular programming July 4th - v/s Harold B. Russey, C.E. 7/3 - KLVL (1480) nice letter from Charles L. Belfi, Gen. Mgr. for ET 5/1/50, for this new 1 km, station. He states in part "DX reports were received from the states of Mass., Wash., Calif., Fla. and yours from Conn. and over 100 cities between the four corners of the U.S." KTRI (1400) letter for Baseball Game 5/19. WJOY (1230) letter signed by John C. Quill, C.E. for special All-Night Dance Party to get Fresh Air Homes for City kids. 7/7 - WFBR (1300) card for f/c after 2nd report. First one sent 4/11/49. WHSC (1450) card for f/c after second report, first sent 10/3/49, 7/8-WDVA (1250) letter for regular program after second report. WPRP (910) air-mail letter for regular program after 2nd report. Wind - that is the works for this time. More for the August bulletin I hope. I wonder, Lefty, how long you have been DXing that 1.922 figure of yours is really something to shoot at. Don't believe I'll ever hit that as I am on the shady side of life- 3 grandchildren puts me in that category I guess. I am going for all I can get and am just waiting for the new DX season. NDZ (1050) 265 South Park Street, Decatur, Ill, G.L. Holden, eng. supervisor says. "Moved from Tuscola Dec. '49 and the s/off for summer is 6 pm CST. f/c are only when Ill. Bell monitor (north of Chicago) fails to get us Sunday AMs." WNAH (1360) V. T. Irwin, Jr., Gen. Mgr. "1350 grant was modified for better service south of Nashville and also eliminates QRM with another station. Sked, 6:00 a.m. to 7 p.m. for July and 6:45 p.m. in August, 2nd Wed. 2:00-2:15 EST is f/c." WRMN (1410) G. A. Ralston, Mgr., Sekd 6:00 a.m. (Sunday 8:00) - 8:30 p.m. in July and 8:00 p.m. in August, never used 1490 kc/s, and f/c is irregular. KLVL (1480) a printed v/letter by C.L. Belfi, Gen. Mgr. WLIN (730) C.E. says, will start August 1 construction for 550 kc/s. 1,000 watts with directional antenna for nights, and most likely 6:00 a.m. to midnight sked, 4 300' towers for directional array, the 730 kc/s. f/c is 2:15-2:35 a.m. E.S.T., 2nd Thursday. KROX (1050) W. J. Kiewel (WØDPU) CM says "Change to 1260 kc/s. 1,000-500 on approximately August 20th with unscheduled tests and regular sked 6:00 a.m. (Sunday 8:00) - Midnight with a possibility of 1:00 a.m. Monday through Frdday and Saturday through to 2:00 a.m., WCRI (1050) Jackson County Brodcasting Service, Scotteboro, Alabama, R. C. Payne, CE, a new station, heard 6/23 ETing with M & TT. Only isted a couple of times in June and noted WLIO (1570) r/c TT ending at 3:08 EST to return at 6:00 a.m. After him at 2:09 came XERF s/off f/c with Kansas City. Same morning (6/27) WBVP (1230) ended regular program with news and 1:15 was off. Then at 1:33 (after TTQ- came a WCRO call and more TT. WEDR (1220 ET/M 2:00 etc. on 6/21. WELR (no veries noted yet)(1360) ET/M 3:45 etc. 6/29 and WRGA (1470) with election returns. Their letter; heads are all similar in green with Mississippi map and stations, but each its own call-letter. This AM 7/10 WROB r/c TT got WHTC TT to 2206 EST s/off to return at 6:00 a.m. and WNAT TTed already at 2:092. WHOX at 2:40 got WUSN as company and at 2:47 WCTC (1450) tested till 2:51 to return at 7:00 a.m. On 1400, WNAG TTed till 2:35, and so got KVFD f/c. 1490 had KICO M/c with easy-heard calls and KOIL (1290)" M/program, said 24 hours, and celebrating 25th anniversary. WHK (1420) with a long test used 1 or 2 short notes and carrier and WMGM (1050) tested and so nothing heard on KTRE WEAS KTFY WNOP WJBO, a few I wanted.
