Foreign DX Contest Rules

1952-53

1. The contest to be known as the NRC Foreign DX Contest will be run in conjunction with FOREIGN DX DIGEST. It will be managed by your editor, Fred VanVoorhees, Box 132, Lemoyne, Pennsylvania.
2. Each contestant shall submit an entry fee of 25¢ on or before the date of November 15, 1952, or in the case of new members within 30 days of the date of their membership.
3. Contest will run for the period from October 1, 1952, until March 31, 1953. Loggings must be from one specific location except with the permission of the Manager. Entries may be submitted until June 30, 1953.
4. All foreign stations are eligible and will be counted as follows: One point will be given for each foreign station verified. This total will then be multiplied by the number of countries verified to give the total point score. (Example: 12 veries from 3 countries-36 pts.) For the purposes of this contest, CANADA will not be considered a foreign country, and no Canadian station can be counted in the contest.
5. For purposes of fairness to all contestants, the contest will be subdivided into three Leagues. The winner in each League will receive an equal prize. The three leagues are to be known as the West Coast League, the Central League, and the East Coast League. Divisions of the leagues are to be as follows:

SM plans to have them DX for us during test periods.

CUBA--RHM asks for a list of Cuban all-nighters as well as early sign-ons of Cuban stations. (Roy, information has appeared in our column from time to time, and it will all be contained in a new log now in preparation. More about the log later in the column.)

BERMUDA--RM reports regular reception of ZEM in Pembroke now that he is on 1235 Kcs. Over S-9 in the evening, announcing as "ZEM, Radio Bermuda."

BRAZIL--PRE-7 (1410) continues to be heard around 0330. PRE-9 (1200) has been coming through in the early evening. (HH)

EUROPE

GERMANY--From SM we learn that TA reception on the East Coast is off to a swell start. He logged The Voice of America in Munich on 1196 Kcs., at 2130 on 9/28 with S-6 signals. Also had Nordwest Deutscher Rundfunk on 1583 Kcs., with S-8 signals at 2300 sign-on.

SPAIN--"Radio Nacional de Espana" in Madrid on 737 Kcs. has been putting in a powerful signal on the East Coast in the late afternoon. SM had him over S-9 on 9/24 at 1850. Logged several times since. HH also reports him like a local at his location.

PORTUGAL--CSE-2 in Parado on 1034 Kcs. has also been a regular visitor reported by both SM and HH. Signs off at 1900, and is best heard during the last hour of broadcasting.

USS COURIER--SM reports that the COURIER is now operating at Rhodes Island in the Mediterranean Sea, transmitting on 1394 Kcs., from 1730-1900. He thinks he may have heard it, but not sure.

ENGLAND--From HH the information that Start Point (1052 Kcs.), and Droitwich (1083) along with the stations on 1151 Kcs. and Washford Cross on 881, have all been heard at 0030 sign-on. Usually fade out by 0100 or so. HE says they were likely on summer time then, so are probably not coming on now until 0130.

SWEDEN--PT reports a veric form card and transmitter schedule received from Radio Sweden, Falun, signature unreadable.

AFRICA

TANGANYIKA--RM sent along the same information on this station which appeared in the last DIGEST. He gives the complete address as "The Department of Social Development, Box 1649, Dar-es-Salaam.

FRENCH MOROCCO--HH reports reception of Rabat on 1043 several times in the late afternoon, quite weak. Usually heard if at all around 1745.

ASIA

SOUTH KOREA--RM forwards a list of AFBS stations in South Korea, but this list has recently appeared in the DIGEST, so is not repeated at this time. Thanks, anyway, Ray.

AUSTRALIA--RHM has noted several TP signals, but he has not yet been able to positively identify any. RH reports reception of 2BL (740) around 0415 on 9/29. He has been hearing 2WL (1430) quite regularly. Also heard but not logged by SM. HH also reports a station with TP characteristics on 1370 Kcs. Thinks probably 5SE in Mt. Gambier, since RM had previously reported it. Also sent report to 2XP, New Plymouth, New Zealand, just in case. DD reports verio cards from 4QG (790) and 4QB (910). Both were AFC cards.

NEW ZEALAND--In addition to the report above which might have been 2XP, SM reports hearing one on 800 after OKLW signed off which may have been 1ZB. No positive identification though.

NEW CALEDONIA--SM reports the scoop of the year so far with reception of "Radio Noumea", positively identified at 0540 on 9/29. This was on 1500 Kcs., and came in rather weakly. After the above announcement he faded out or signed off. (Steve, information from the new International Log Bookx lists a sign-off at 0530, so no doubt he went off the air-FV)
