Oh! I'm back at the dials again. Out there a station is a long way off. I haven't really done much so far but look at those Nov. specials coming up! WOHP didn't make it here either AM. The first AM WKAT, 1350, was on all night. It covers 1390 here with slop-over. Of course KBUN didn't make it. WWPB was the main reason. Veries in this week amount to only one, KSD. This week I got one semi-favorable CP letter. It was from WSBP'S GE Roland Jordan Jr. who says "We would like to have more information on the subject and if we possibly can we will be happy to co-operate." I immediately sent him an answer. A 100 watt station would come in handy for Seth's Special Programs Contest which I am entering today. This week I plan to write to KNON KPBM WEAB WHIN WSOO WPNF WIMC WGAA WLET & WNER about courtesy programs. To Lefty, if WICE gets my card in time, I think they will play you a nice playful record, courtesy of me. Hi. To Evan Davies: I have misplaced your address. Please let me have it again. When is ZEM going to verify? I see by the paper where Robert W. Rounsaville bought WMBM this week. It is subject to FCC approval, of course. Rounsaville owns WQXI WBAC WBEJ WKSX & WEAT besides WMBM. You can start looking for WINZ on 50,000 or 10,000 watts anytime now. Two months ago one of their engineers told me he thought it would be 2 to 3 months before they were ready to go with the new rig. In the Oct. 25 issue Lefty mentioned the frequencies he is having blocked by stray signals. He has really got it bad! Here in the daytime 580 880 1020 1300 1520 1590 are covered by stray signals in addition to the regular ones. At night the only holdover from this group is 580 where I get some kind of signal from WWPB. FCC says the trouble is in my radio or maybe the signal is coming in on the electric wires. That may be a possibility because the WWPB studio and transmitter is just across the street from the power company's generating station. Maybe they add some sort of signal to Miami's electric power. I'm sure that I would like to know. Could that be the reason they get out so far? I know that this is over the 30 lines, but I just called the WINZ transmitter and the engineer there tells me that D-Day for 50,000-10,000 watts out there will be "on or about Dec. 1." I suppose that that means they will start regular with that power then. With that that means they should start testing with 50,000-10,000 before then. 73s.

I am sending in my 10¢ (inflation) worth as I was incorrectly listed as being in Seattle, when here I am in the Capital of the Inland Empire. This is my first report so here are my standings: 147 reports, 108 veries, first verie received March 6, 1952. I have heard nothing great as yet this fall, but here are my October loggings: 10/10 - KERN, Bakersfield, 1:35-2:03, RS. 10/19 - KGBE DX program; CHWK Chilliwack B.C. 3:30 till s/off at 4:05 (this will be a tough one for you easterners as verie states that directional pattern radiates almost no signal east). 10/25 - KBUN DX program came through but could not get WOHP at all; WBZ Boston and WNEW New York both on RS. Veries received in October: KRE-1400 Berkeley; KTRB-860 Modesto, Cal.; KCNA-580 Tucson; KOMK-1340 Las Vegas; KOIN-970 Portland, Ore.; KWKW-1300 Pasadena; KELK-1240 Elko, Nev.; KYA-1260 San Francisco (207 days to get report back); CHWK-1270 Chilliwack, B.C. QSL cards were from KTRB KONA KWKW & KYA. I assume from the Oct. 18 "DX News" that Roy Millar was torn Seattle apart trying to find me. Here I am, Roy. Just for general info, I am using a '52 Midwest 16 tube set with a 75' horizontal high wire. Although it can't compete with commercial receivers, it does quite well for the money involved. Best "distance-power" catch was WWPB in Miami during the middle of last May. I have a future problem - what is the policy (if any exists) regarding counting veries of the club? Does a change of frequency count as a new verie? Also a change of call letters? I do not think a call change should, but a frequency change usually changes reception conditions so I think it should. If there is a standard, I should like to be informed. If not, I think we should all rate on the same standards. Please clarify: 73s. (No set policy exists, Gene. We are all hobbyists only, and count 'em as we see fit - welcome to NRC and sorry we put you in Seattle instead of Spokane! Hope you write in often -Ed.)

I was wondering if our local WIKK would count for me in Gorsuch contest, as we used to count only stations within 100 mile radius. I won an Arvin table radio at one of our local fairs this summer. It also has an earphone attachment to it. I have a couple pair of phones. I have reports out to WWL WBIS & WOHP, all contests stations. My standing is now: 1049 veries and 1775 heard. 73s.

KBWL, 1580, new one at 3:40. Usual TTs with no voice over the dial. This TT is sweat words in my house. 10/31 - KTHH and KECA, 790, in a battle at 3:00. KBWL again at 3:17. These letters were sent out regular mail August 25th. To date I've received 9 replies, including this, and a typed airmail letter from Nigeria listing the 3 channels, all SW, on which they broadcast. The latter was mailed 4 days (9/29) after the one received today, reaching me around the first of October. The unusual thing about today's communication is that it was returned in the same envelope in which I originally mailed it, with address crossed out. On the back of the same envelope is a gummed label with "On His Majesty's Service" printed and, in ink, "The Samba Orchestra, c/o Sampson Inbickpen, P.R.O. Lagos." GOOD DEAL! To Africa and back for 5¢ U.S. stamp! The form enclosed, went on to say "If you require an accompanish will you please bring one with you. (Carroll, git yer zither in chune!) If you are unable to come please inform me immediately, either by telephone or by fast letter, so that another artist (that's me!) may be invited to take your place. May I remind you that the programmes of the N.B.S. are now heard all over Nigeria and beyond and that a high standard is required and expected of our artists. I need harly tell you that that high standard can only be achieved after much rehearsal." Eliminates me! Signed "Leslie A. Perowne, Programme Director (National). Ain't that som'pin!

As far as DX is concerned, we seem to have either a feast or a famine. The latter was the case this week with very little to report in the DX line. Here we go with what we have:

NORTH AMERICA

EL SALVADOR--BW reports regular reception of YSEB (1075) in San Salvador. Still no sign of a verio from him though.

MEXICO--XEPK (1180) Pachuca, logged on 10/10 from 2330-2345 with S-9 signals. (BW)

GUATEMALA--TGN (1180) logged on 10/20 from 2200-2230 with poor signals. (BW)

OCEANIA

NEW ZEALAND--10/27 proved a good morning for this country. 1YZ (800) logged with very good signals most of the time between 0400 and 0500. Best on the dial. 4YA (780) also heard, but barely audible. One reported on 750 Kcs. also. (This is 4QS-FV) 1ZB (1070) also one of the best heard. Comes in most every morning after KNX goes off at 0400. (All from HH)

AUSTRALIA--2BL (740) oftens comes in well, best after 0430. 2WL (1430) continues to be heard, but not as well as it was earlier in October. On 10/27 traces of stations on 1500, 1420, 1190, and 640. (1500-2BS, 3AK, & 5DR; 1420-3XY; 1190-2NZ; 640-5CK;-FV) (All from HH) HH reports that earlier this season he reported reception of a station on 1370. On 9/29 he wrote both 2XP and 5SE. Nothing from 2XP, but 5SE answered that most of the log did not conform to theirs. They suggested that Hank was hearing 5SE with 2LT, and he suggested that Hank write to 2LT, which he has done. Hank still hears a weak signal on 1370. 5SE reported that he was using 500 watts.
