ALASKA 100% LOGGED! At least as far as commercial stations are concerned. This attained by the logging of KJNO-630, Juneau, on frequency test from 4:35 to 4:45 a.m. March 4. KPOA was riding even with KJNO, even here, at better than 10 db/S9, which is unusually strong for KPOA, so I can't help but wonder how RCA could monitor at Point Reyes, Cal. Am inclined to think that KJNO tested with an open carrier, but submitted log of music heard, noting that it may have been from KPOA, but also submitted definite log of announcements from KJNO. Still need their verie, as well as KBYR and KILW to have the Territory 100% verified. Have also logged the 2 AFBS stations shown in Weyrich and International Logs, but know there are other AFBS in Alaska. KCTI-1450, DX heard, though noisy. Mar. 6 saw XEJ-970, KRIS-1360, and KRGV-1290 added on RS at 7:30 a.m. or thereabouts. Also added KIKI-860 250 watts, Honolulu, as verification received from a tentative report of Feb. 25 4:15-4:30 a.m., quote from verie: "From the amount of verification letters received this month, apparently everyone, everywhere, is picking up our signal." Also on the strength of Hal Stein's identification of the 630 kc/s. VIRGIN ISLANDS--HT reports as follows: WSTA (1340) Charlotte Amalie has a new frequency check on first Thursday from 0200-0230.

WIVI (1230) Christianstad signs on at 0600, off at 2200 on weekdays.

COSTA RICA--RA reports TIAC (955) "Radio Accion Catolica" heard several evenings (3/2, 3/3, & 3/4) with Catholic mass. TILX (1145) TIHB (685), TIRA (733), TIFC (995), TIGPH (605), and TIDCR (625) all have been well heard. HH agrees that TIAC has definitely been heard on 955 Kcs. Logged on 3/5 2020-2100 with religious program and then light classical music. HC reports logging TIFC (995) with classical music at 2115 on 3/7 with S-3to4 signals.

PUERTO RICO--HT reports that ACE (1470) San Juan, has been heard on sign-on recently at about 0453 with Star Spangled Banner and Navy song. Seems to be regular time and heard with good signals and in the clear.

EL SALVADOR--RA reports YSEB (1070) on top of the frequency on 3/4. Also YSS (655) very good signals on 3/3, 3/4, and 3/5.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC--HR reports HI3A (1415) topping QRM with good signals on 2/24 between 2131 and 2201 sign-off. RM reports his verie in from HI3A in Spanish in answer to report in Spanish. Signed by Juan I. Vicioso V., Administrador General. Power 1 Kw. QRA is just Santiago, D. R.

BERMUDA--HC reports ZBM1 signals on 1235 peaking at about 65 db over S-9 on 3/1. Wonders what power they are using. (As far as we know, 250 watts, Herb)

ALASKA--RHM reports logging KJNQ (630) Juneau on 3/4 from 0435-0445 on frequency check. Bad QRM from KP0A. He now has logged all commercial CCB stations in Alaska.

MEXICO--RHM has another Mexican logging in XEJ (970) Ciudad Juarez, Chihuahua, logged at 0415 on 3/6, using slogan "The Voice of the Frontier."

UNITED STATES--KB notes the following list and says they were all heard on 2/25: WSM (650), WNBC (660), WCBS (880), WENR (890), WORL (950), WINS (1010), KDKA (1020), WBZ (1030), WMGM (1050), KYW (1060), WPTC (1080), WBAL (1090), WNEW (1130), WHIE (1140), WHAM (1180), WCAU (1210), WGAR (1220), WTOG (1290), WTAL (1270), WKAT (1360), WOKO (1460), WLAM (1470), WTOP (1500), WMEX (1510), WKBW (1520), WCKY (1530), and WPTR (1540) (I always wondered where WPTR's signal went, they are hardly audible in this part of Penna.-FV). RP adds his reception of WPTC (1080) with NBC program "Mind Your Manners", WINS (1010) with weather forecast at 2335, WNAC (1260), WMGM (1050), WNEW (1130), WLAM (1470).

## SOUTH AMERICA

BRAZIL--RP reports reception of PRP4 (940), PRE-8 (980), PRE-9 (1000), not heard until 0030 GMT due to European QRM. Also PRG-2 (1040) and PRD-2 (1060). KB also hears Brazilians in England with loggings of PRI-3 (880), ZYK20 (890), PRD-2 (1060), PRI-4 (1110), ZYX-9 (1270), PRG-3 (1280), ZYR-7 (1300), PRH-6 (1340), PRG-8 (1360), ZYO-7 (1350), PRB-2 (1440). SRM has a verie from ZYO-7 (1350) Campina Grande, by registered air mail, a picture card. Photos of towers, transmitters, studios, and transmitter building. Address: "Radio Borborema", Rua Cardoso Vieira, #36, Campina Grande, Paraiba, Brasil.

PARAGUAY--Interesting story from HT reports verie from ZP9 (970) Asuncion, signed by Atilio C. Bajec for reception of special program broadcast during Carnival week on February 21, 1950. Ordinary schedule is 0730-2230. Program heard was at 0125-0200. This completes South America except for French and Dutch Guiana, a goal that has been aspired to since about 1935. This required about \$2.50 in stamps, air mail, IRS's, and at least 20 letters. This long drawn-out contest ended when an attache of the U. S. Embassy (a ham, no less) sat in the office and made Bajec write the verie. This ham says that Hank's letters were all over the office and the rig was far below the average ham "hay-wire" rig in the USA. Out of 58 South American veries, this is tops and perhaps tops any verie Hank has, considering every angle. (Above quoted almost verbatim from Hank's letter-FV)

TRINIDAD--HC marvels at the excellent speed with which he had his verie from Radio Trinidad--8 days.

URUGUAY--This country is reaching England with KB reporting his reception of CX20 (930) and CX14 (810).

VENEZUELA--KB also reports reception of YVMF (1120), while RP adds YVME (1120) as a frequent visitor with faint signal, but heard better than any other Venezuelan.

ARGENTINA--KB reports LR1 (1070) and LR3 (950), both also reported by RP who notes reception of both on 2/28.

CHILE--Only one reported this week is by KB and is CB138 (1380).

## EUROPE

PORTUGAL--Let's start off with Portugal this week with a list of RADIO NACIONAL transmitters sent along by RP. These are owned and operated by the government and include: Lisbon I (719) 50 Kw., Lisbon II (665) 15 Kw., Porto (755) 10 Kw., Coimbra (1367) 1 Kw., and Faro (1358) 1 Kw. Roy notes that Lisbon I is usually jammed by Radio Free Europe and its Russian jammers. Lisbon II and Coimbra are well heard after dark. Roy also notes "Radio Clube Portugueses" (1034) Parade, as a private station heard with S-7 signals at sign-off at 1900, sometimes later. HH says that a follow-up for October report brought QSL letter from Radio Nacional. Said cards were being printed. This was for

reports to Lisbon on 665 and 719 and also for Porto on 755 Kcs.

LITHUANIAN SSR--From HH news of this country. He has a letter from Moscow verifying his reception report. Report was for Kowno on 1385 Kcs. Signed by I. Petrov. Enclosed card showing view of the 70 mile long Lenin-Volga-Don Canal, connecting five seas, the North, Baltic, Black, Caspian, and Azov.

CZECHOSLOVAKIA--HH also reports a QSL letter from Melnik (1286) stating that they answer medium wave reception reports by letter and short wave by card.

FRANCE--RA has a verie from Rennes I, Paris I synchronized stations on 1403 Kcs. Also a letter from "La Chef de Services de Exploitation" in Paris, concerning reception of French stations on 1484 Kc. He wrote that Roger's report agreed with "Radiodiffusion Francaise", "Radio Alger", in Oran. So there is at least one Algerian on 1484 Kc. (Sure sounds like an African verie to me, Roger. However, you'll have to let your conscience be your guide. It's your hobby. FV)

GERMANY--RAS forwards a clipping under a Munich dateline stating that Radio Free Europe turned on the full power of its twenty transmitters on March 5th. This was a concentration of the power of all transmitters in Portugal and Germany and was directed toward satellite communist nations, to warn their people to remain calm and act with caution. RP says that the AFN station in Berlin is now operating on 854 Kcs. and on 611 Kcs.

VATICAN CITY--RP notes this country heard on 1529 Kcs. at 1815 GMT with English program. Says the 1500 GMT transmission is also on this outlet, but has never been heard.

MONACO--JF notes that Radio Monte Carlo is now verifying with a white card with red and black printing. Gives call sign as 3AN2, but never heard on the air.

## AFRICA

ALGERIA--For only African note for this week, see the notes on FRANCE under EUROPE above.

## ASIA

FORMOSA or TAIWAN--From RHM, the note that he has added to his log as positively identified BED33 Taipei, and BED24 Tainan. This on the strength of HSN's identification. Says BED33 may have been above 630, but not on 635 as noted in International Log. BED24 is on 1040, and both were logged back on 11/17/52. Reports were sent, and Roy is now hoping.

## OCEANIA

HAWAII--SRM reports a verie in from KAHU. RHM has a verie from KIKI (860) Honolulu, from tentative report of 2/25 from 0415-0430. This is his best Hawaiian.

FIJI ISLANDS--Make the following change in your INTERNATIONAL LOG. On 930 Kcs. ZJV is now using new transmitter with 2000 watts. Also add the note that ZJV has a shortwave relay. (From JF)

AUSTRALIA--More changes for the INTERNATIONAL LOG. On 1540 Kcs. 2CN, Canberra, is now in operation with 2000 watts. On 1560 Kcs. 2RE Taree, 500 watts, is now in operation. Opened Saturday 2/21, using slogan "The Voice of the Manning Valley". (Australia now has 105 commercial stations, and 2RE was the first new one in NSW for 14 yrs.) On 830 Kcs. 3GI is in operation from 840 Kcs. Now a total of 148 stations in the country. RM reports some reception from Australia with a tentative identification of 3LX (1090) Lubeck, very weak 0612-0620. Also 3LO (770) Melbourne, good at 0605; 2WL (1430) Wollongong, S-5-7 0615-0635; 2QN (1520) Deniliquin, S-5 0615-0635, all above on 3/1. HH also noted good reception on 3/1 and reports 3AR (610) coming through around 0630 with moderate QRM from a U. S. Station. 2CR (550) heard around 0630. Another one around that hour was 2GB (870). 2WG (1150) was noted around 0600, and on 3/1 and 3/2 2QN (1520) was well heard. RA also was also in on the fun and had 4QG (790) at 0600 with

news followed by symphony on 3/1. Also 2BL (740) at 0447 with historical drama on 3/2.

NEW ZEALAND--On 3/2 HH reports 2YA (570) with good signals but with a strong buzzing sound. 3YA (690) was weak.

#### MYSTERY

HH reports a mystery station in Spanish evenings with good signals on 945 Kcs. RA adds to this one ones on 835, 1135, and 1265.

RA also asks about a British speaking station on 720 Kcs. at 2030-2115. From last week's DIGEST, you will have learned that this is "Radio Jamaica" hunting a clear channel. Roger also reports as being well heard an SA on 545 Kcs. mentioning Argentina and Buenos Aires, but no positive identification. Apparently this is CW-1 in Colonia, Uruguay, which is not far from Buenos Aires.

KB asks further about the station on 655 Kcs., reporting that he and a friend thought it might be in Peru, and that he checked with the Peruvian embassy in London, who stated that "Radio Nacional", Lima, has a station on 655 Kcs. No further information as to call letters. To Ken, YSS has definitely been identified by several of our members by this time.

FW asks for identification of the Spanish speaking station on 1350 Kcs. almost every morning. This is the correct time station in Mexico City, XEQK. I have no idea how to get a verie from him. I have never succeeded.--FV.

JJ also asks about the Spanish speaker on 545, which we rather think must be CW-1. The Cuban on 720 Kcs. is CQHU, Cienfuegos. JJ also wants to know who is on 802 or 803 Kcs. Anyone know?
