I'll start off with this. At 5:15 a.m. on Sundays the following frequencies are clear: 540 590 620 690 730 740 780 800 870 880 890 940 1020 1040 1090 1090 1200 1220 1250 1280 1290 1360 1370 1410 1430 1460 1520 1540 1550 1560 1580. In additions 550 is clear except for KBNL, Anchorage, Alaska. We appear to be about at the end of the DX season which doesn't mean there isn't DX to be had. Apparently condx have been very good all year. If QRV isn't too bad DX will continue throughout the summer. I have enjoyed very much participating in all 3 contests this year. I have been playing around with an idea which might be used for next year's domestic contest. It would work something like this. The continent would be divided into 3 zones, that part on EST making up 1 zone, the art on CST another and the part on MST and PST still another. It would be necessary to combine the two last time belts as there are not enough DXers in the MST zone. Those on EST would try to get as many stations in the MST and PST zones, those in CST would try for PST stations and those in PST would try for EST stations. No station using more than 5000 watts would be eligible. Some sort of power bonus could be given and there would be a prize for the winner of each division. This is just something I've been thinking about. I don't know if it would work or not. I wonder how many heard the KIJV (1340) in Hiron, S.C., April 1/c. If you did you probably think as I did that the announcer had a screw loose. He announced, "This is KIJV conducting a f/c on 1530 kc/s." Maybe he just got fired from WCKY, hi! Remember if you're interested in Marine band DX (and by that we mean any station between 1600 and 3000 kc/s.) I want to hear from you. I think I am pretty close to the 30line limit so will close. Don't forget - be sure to vote. 73s.

Verie total here is now 2378, with March being a very generous month with verifications. On 2/10 I heard KRAL on f/c for my first reception of their signal and sent a report. On 2/16 I received a post card written in longhand from them with no signer. The card was placed on the radio to await falling when my 18 months old son decided to do something about it, and he did. He very nearly had it completely chewed up before we found him with it. Naturally, I was disappointed about the card so I promptly sent an airmail letter requesting another card. However, by 3/15 no reply had been received so I dispatched another report including a prepared card. This time the card came back promptly and now I'm happy to report KRAL is safely placed in my DX file. No wonder I'm getting gray at 34, hi. On the subject of prepared cards that some of the boys have been writing about recently, my policy is this. I never send a card with my first report to a station. Then I give them from at least 3 to 15 months to reply. Either a card or letter from them is satisfactory to me if they do reply. If no reply is received, and I consider my information worthy of a f/up. I then write a completely new letter giving my information and including a prepared card for their signature. Results have been excellent with about 98% of the delinquent stations responding and quite often with nice letters. If any of you DXers plan a vacation trip to "The Nation's Most Interesting State," to view the great TVA area of the Smokies, then add the Cumberland Plateau to your itinerary and come by for a visit with this Old Hill-Billy DXer. I am a week late with my report, but with no "DX News" for a couple of weeks, this should reach you in plenty of time. I DXed a while Saturday 3/21 but nothing new to me heard. Monday, 3/23, not much better. Thursday, 3/26 at 9 EST on 900 kc/s, I heard KSJV s/off, still not using KBIF call letters. Next DX session was Sunday, 3/29. Not only is KVEN covering 1450, but on 1490 KTKT said 24 hours a day. Leaves only 1240 and 1400 clear in the southwest nowadays. At 4:30 in rapid succession on 770 kc/s. I heard "This is the ABC", 3LO, Melbourne, Australia; then "This is the Far East Network," Tokyo, Japan, and finally, WABC, New York, N.Y. Monday, 3/30 at 4:31 on 1240 I heard KPIL testing, with music recorded. Fast work for them - granted 3/25 and testing 3/30. On 1420 WJNA was very weak, but a couple of tunes recognized, so reported to them. Now that the contest season is ended, I heard KINT on 1290, re-broadcasting the Seattle baseball game at 3:30, Saturday, 4/4. And far to the north-east, heard snubgn of CKPH on 1400 for a report. Tried for reported WKOD on 1370, but instead heard ZXP at 4:30. 4QR was even with JOAK on 590 at 4:45. To top off the morning, at 5:25 on 1600 KOGT was on RS. Easter Sunday morning started off with KRGV signing on at 7 through KVOA. They went right into their Spanish program. But the best DXing was on 1240 with KASA broadcasting its first of an annual program from Leedey, Okla., heard from 7 to 7:50 a.m. This AM the NNRC special by KRGV on 1400 was pretty weak. Japs still fairly strong, and some also from "Down Under." WRBS was even with WING at 5 s/on. For west coasters, on 860 KIFN signed on at 8 EST with Spanish program, power not given. As for DX specials, did not try for KRCC; no CKDM here, WJNA weak, no sign of KDLA or WJAM here. Veries from KAHU, ten 10¢ candy bars from KDSH, personal letter from KRCC, WMOX from former San Diegan, KHUB from hard-working Larry Yarnes; KSE0, WBUY (thanks, Len Kruse) and WLOA. Page overflowing, so will close. 73s to all.

DX is settling into the off season level these days with static-free nights fewer and further apart. Managed a few additions in WGSW, 1350, EP on 4/2, KIEN, 1340, very poorly on regular f/c 4/2; WLDY, 1340 regular f/c on 4/3; WARM 1330 RS s/on through WIBC at 5:30 on 4/3; WGEA, 1150; f/c with music at 1:45-2:00 a.m. on 4/5 and on 4/8 two more news ones with ETs: WECT, 1350 and WSMT, 1050, WECT excellent but WSMT having a time getting through XEG. New veries are letters from KVBC WCON and WLDY. So far WRBS KENG and WRIO have failed to return my prepared cards, all overdue. Heard KEMA on RS at 7:30 recently and tried one on them. Don't seem to have answered any-one. One more item on getting veries. For the letterhead fan, it often helps if you stamp your name and address on an envelope, stick your commemorative or other stamp on it, and send it along with the report, instead of just a stamp. Other recent veries include GKOK UHGH CHNO CJON WCOC WENE WARD WOBY WBUY KHUB WCFM ERAB & WKIC to bring the total to 1887, just 13 short of the season's goal. A bit of information to supplement the above. We get the Lynchburg, Va. newspaper here and they carry a log of daily programs for WLVA-TV and WSLS-TV. WLVA-TV is on a very limited schedule not signing on until 6 p.m. EST. WSLS-TV carries full daily schedule. No program log has yet been indicated for WROV-TV but apparently their 1 K. doesn't reach into Lynchburg well enough to justify the paper listing them. Ed.

Mike Ferguson, 3337 Prospect, Houston 4, Texas: Just thought I'd let you know I enjoy your TV section and those cartoons. The one about John Fohl was especially appropriate, I think. (Miami is ominously silent regarding it, Mike. Hi. Ed.) Although I imagine it's old news by now, KGUL-TV Galveston Channel 11 opened March 22. Humorous to watch them too, because they did everything wrong. The newscaster held up a long roll of news copy, which actually looked like toilet paper, there was such a length of it, and read off the news. He held it in front of his face all during the time he was broadcasting. Really comical to watch. I laughed but realized that I'd probably look just about as silly when our station at the University of Houston goes on. It is KUHT, the nation's first 100% educational station, channel 8. We're due on about April 20, although the official dedication is the 27th.

(Mike Ferguson cont'd.) Hope you fellows will be looking for us at that time. Incidentally, KGUL-TV put in just a mediocre picture here, although we're not far from them. Their transmitter is located at Arcadia, Texas, sorta midway between Houston and Galveston. They want to capitalize on both markets. However, they did get out well, being seen well, according to reports, in Tulsa, Denver, Shreveport, and other places. Had about eight reports from Tulsa, so they must really have been booming in there. (Alas, no sign of them in London City, 100 miles W of Tulsa) Well, this letter was intended to be a short note, so I'll close with a reminder to keep up the good work on the TV DX section. KGUL-TV runs from 3:55 (GST) to around midnight CST. KUHT will run from 5-9 p.m. (CST) until Sept. (Thanks for the nice words and report Mike. Will certainly give KUHT a try beginning the 20th and hope you'll slip in here. Good luck to you and we'll certainly want to hear from you regarding reports that will drift in to KUHT. Perhaps the Club should send you a supply of this issue of the TV DXer to send out with veries. Ed.)

Bill Moser, 217 Connellville St., Uniontown, Pennsylvania; WTV, Atlanta, Ga. is now WTV-D to coincide with WTV-D, etc. Latest CF's are: Cecil W. Roberts, Bloomington, Ill.-15; Telepolitan Broadcasting Co., Clovis, N. Mex.-12; Meyer Broadcasting Co., Bismarck, N. D.-5; Radman TV Co., also Bismarck-12; South Oregon Broadcasting Co., Madford, Ore.-5; Sherman TV Co., Sherman, Tex.-46; Joe L. Smith, Jr., Charleston, W. Va.-49; and the second share time stations-WEBC, Inc., and Veterans Broadcasting Co., Inc. of Rochester, N.Y. to operate on channel 10. My only source of information on CF's is Billboard Magazine, so I wonder if Len Kruse would take the time to send TV CF's to Hank? (How about it Len? I don't have access to either Billboard or Broadcasting at this time. The SRDS publications are "old" when I see them. Ed.) KS-O-TV is on channel 7 probably, perhaps 3. Local TV schedules are WTV-22 hours except Sunday 0215 to 1015 and Monday 0130 to 0655. WAC-TV-0945 to 0100 (s/off time varies) on weekdays, 1015 to 0030 on Sunday. WPG-1800 to 0000 everyday. WKE-TV is not on regular schedule, but is reportedly testing. KQV is changing network affiliation from Mutual to CBS on June 15. The sole reason is that KQV has an application on file for a TV station and CBS doesn't. When CBS found out, they bought controlling interest in KQV, then proposed a resolution to change network affiliation to CBS. Naturally it passed! The FCC granted special temporary authority to Mount Washington TV, Inc., Mount Washington, N. H. to operate an experimental station to obtain info as to the suitability of the site for a proposed TV station. WBSN-TV and WTAJ-TV, both of Youngstown, Ohio, both operate from 11 a.m. to approximately midnight 7 days a week. Beginning with this issue, every "TV DXer" is being sent to "Radio and Electronics" magazine who operate a research department on TV-DX, so all reports of reception by NRC members may benefit other DXers, too. A complete weather station is being set up here to get weather conditions when TV DX occurs. Here are more FCC CF's: Southern Idaho Broadcasting and Television Co., Twin Falls, Idaho-11; Sirfan Radio Corp., Ltd., San Diego, Calif.-10; Johnson-Kennedy Radio Corp., Chicago, Ill.-20; Las Vegas Television, Inc., Las Vegas, Nev.-8. I'll end this report with a poem: "Spring has sprung, and with it brings, TV-DX for everyone!" (Thanks Bill, and feel sure Len will come to the rescue with the CF info and expect to see some catches from you this time next month. Ditto for you other TV DXers! Ed.)

Tom Johnson, 766 Glendora Avenue, Akron 20, Ohio: First I will give you something I promised for last month, namely, my TV observations on a trip to southern Virginia. The first noticeable change took place near Youngstown where there were a lot of rotators so both Cleveland and Pittsburgh could be received. We went by way of the Pennsylvania Turnpike so I could not tell very well how far we were from Pittsburgh. Near Somerset there were yagis for 2 in Pittsburgh and 13 in Johnstown. Better antennas are needed around this part of Pennsylvania because of the numerous rolling hills. At Bedford Pa. stacked five element yagis were used for Johnstown. Near Winchester Va. there were stacks of four conicals pointed toward Washington...D.C. that is, hi... At Front Royal Va. there was a yagi for Richmond-100 miles. You should see some of the antennas that these people have, almost everybody has a big tower and all antennas are stacked. They need them in the valleys between the mountains. At Lynchburg there are yagis with rotators for Richmond and Greensboro.

(Tom Johnson cont'd.) At Danville, Va. and south, Greensboro is received. At Danville most antennas are five element yagis. The chief engineer of WAKR, here in Akron, has advanced the time for beginning of operation to early May. Here are some CPs which I don't believe have been mentioned as yet: Neenah, Wis., channel 42; Oshkosh, Wis., channel 48; Green Bay, Wis., channel 2, 100 Kw.; Bellingham, Wash., channel 12; Sandusky, Ohio, channel 42 and Yakima, Wash., channels 23 and 29. I guess Lefty is still looking for Phillie. If Lefty tells you that he's broke, believe him, you would be too if you had to buy a 1,000 foot tower, a 30 tube set, boosters, rotators, stacked 12 element yagis, antenna top boosters and more than 1,000 foot of transmission line. HI. HI. ALL because he can't get Phillie. 73s, Best DXing, All, FM & TV. (Thanks Tom. Hope the current season nets you some nice TV calls, and keep us posted.)

Tom's report of the TV activities on his two trips brings to mind one of those halfbrained ideas we all have from time to time. Wonder when it will be possible for viewers who went into 30 and 40 foot masts, single channel antennas, etc. to peddle their equipment to areas just getting new TV stations heretofore unopened as their own immediate areas get local outlets. For example: Tom's remarks this issue about Youngstown, Ohio which now has its own two outlets. Those people there would undoubtedly be glad to salvage a few dollars out of equipment not now needed. Same proposition some years back when Model A Fords were funneled out of the North to the mountainous area of North and South Carolina where they were still only feasible form of transportation at the time.

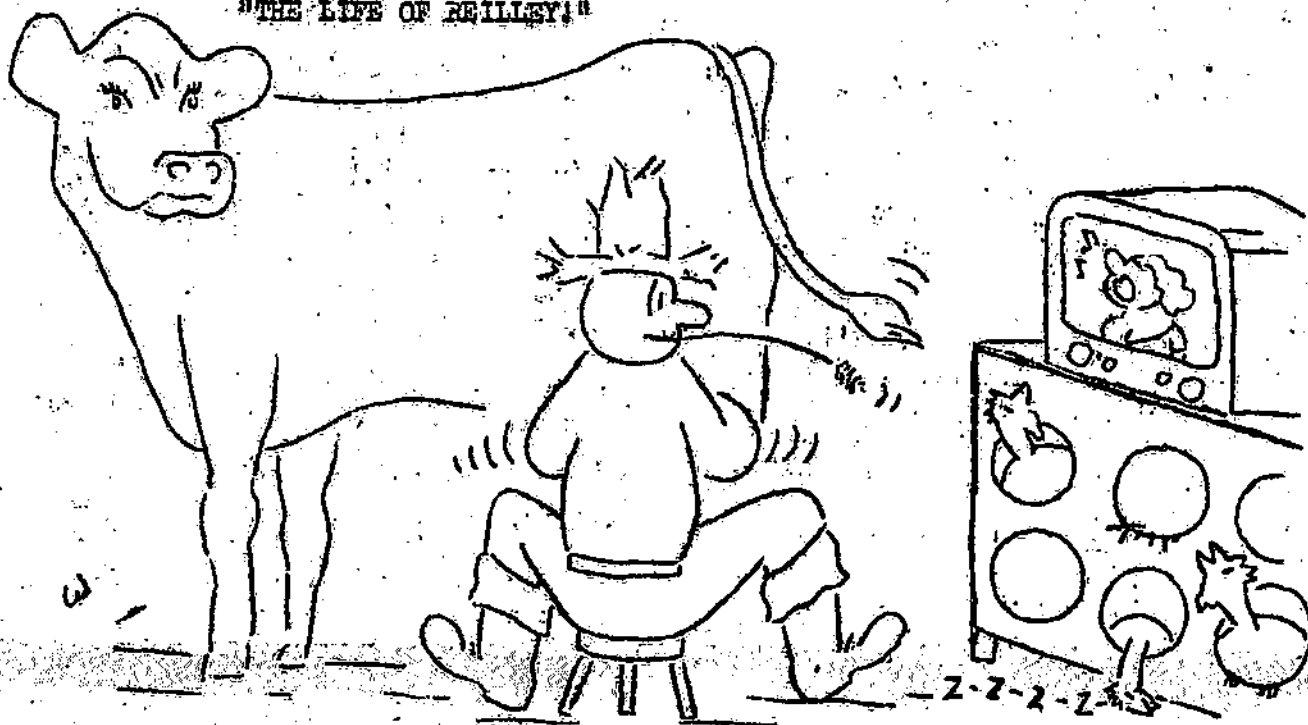
Hal Wagner, R. D. 1, North Girard, Penna.: Sure wish I had a pad by the TV set and kept notes of dates, etc. Will have to start doing that now that the season is approaching. One night here about a month ago had a rushing noise and streaks on the picture tube on all the low channels with the antenna pointed North. Overcast, so don't know if Northern lights were causing it but don't know what else it could be. The high band opened up on a Friday nite a week or so ago and Toronto, channel 9 and Detroit, channel 7 both seen, in fact they were both in on Saturday morning and Detroit announced the fact they would televise the ice hockey game at 10 PM that night, ah, that I, I'll be there, yep, they went out at 5 pm. Almost had a picture out of Toronto of a ice hackey game too one evening but still haven't been able to connect with one bit still hoping that some day I'll see an ice hockey game, either in person or on TV. I got a Vee Deam up here at the house. The first time I didn't have a compass available and put it up by guess. Results, not so good, Buffalo was much weaker on it than on the 4 stack. So refigured, checked everything and then laid it out by compass. Results, worse than before. So now I'm stymied, I hooked the leadin into the All set and even it doesn't perform too well on it. I must have something wrong somewhere but blamed if I know where. If I get time will try some more experimenting with it but with spring fast approaching it doesn't look too promising. (Maybe Bob Brown or one of the other fellows has had some experiences with Vee Deams and will have some comments for you. Ed.)

Hal also informed me of a new NRC member who wants info on TV DX dates. He is Don Nichols of Mason, Michigan. Welcome to the NRC Don and hope to have some nice reports from you. Generally speaking we TV DXers look on this time of the year as opening up the season for the next five months when we may stumble on new TV stations breaking through to our location. Another peak period reported some months back by Bill Moser was about a three week span at the end of the year. At that time, Mexico was heard and occasionally seen daily here. We had hopes of arranging definite TV DX dates with a couple of stations this season but since this reception is so unpredictable it has been shelved, at least until engineers and others come up with a basic explanation of this "freak" reception which will either prove or disprove a definite pattern of forces involved that make the "impossible" reception of TV signals that shouldn't be in a certain area nevertheless there. If a definite pattern during the summer months not contingent on weather, clouds, etc. is ever established, then we will have some basis to go on and will move accordingly to bring these special DX shows to the membership. You will note Bill Moser's remarks in this issue about that

very subject. I believe you'll find the remarks and comments of the fellows helpful and no doubt have some experiences of your own or pet theories that we would find interesting. Hope this column helps you as well as prove entertaining.

Fat Reilly, 11 Irvine Place, Jamestown, N. Y.: It is now 1:50 AM, Sunday, March 22nd. Put up TV antenna in back yard, can turn it by hand in different directions now. Needs a little soldering but pretty cold yet to use bare hands on the pipe, etc. I'll solder when I can take mittens off. Moved the old 10" Copchart out of upstairs and into barn, then when I got temporary loadin up, the tube in booster was burned out. Buffalo on 4 was OK without booster. Strong audio voice from WICU on 12, WJAO on 6 and WDTV on 2 with a snowy picture but will get tube for booster Monday. Also had voice, seesawing back and forth and too cold in barn to stay long enough to catch call on channels 3, 7, 9 and 13 but booster will help. TV was snowy tonight and had to put on booster on the Motorola but it has a builtin booster and couldn't use it in barn. Seldom use the booster on Buffalo, got audio on Pittsburgh on 2 but too snowy for picture. WTTN got word that they had license OKed by FCC for channel 58 but did not know what call would be or when they would start to build. Have a few comments to make here, so will go ahead with them. Want any of you who have some ideas on foreign contests to let us know so that we can have the type of contest that the members want.

Card in from Steve Mann from Nassau, in the Bahamas, states that the weather has been perfect, and comments that there is nothing new with ZNS DX-wise. He was then scheduled to move on to Havana.

John Johnson tells us that he has an RME-69 with a DB-20, complete with bandspread on the broadcast band, as well as a crystal. He has high hopes of being among the top DXers in the foreign field next season. He promises to let us know just how the combination performs.

I suppose that many of you will lay aside the phones until next fall, but if you don't, and manage to hear any foreign stations, we will be wanting to pass on the information to any others who might be tuning. Look elsewhere in the bulletin for deadlines in the future. These are set up in Brooklyn, and we try to adhere to them too.

## INTERNATIONAL DX DIGEST

The mail today was really full of reports, so I'm glad I waited until I could get it for the DX NEWS which now follows:

## NORTH AMERICA

MEXICO--on 4/5 JC logged an 0800 sign-on from XEBW on 1280 Kcs. This was a Sunday morning. PM has added veries from XERT Reynosa, and XEBU Chihuahua, and he mentions that he still has 20 Mexican reports out. Good luck, Pete. GA reports hearing XEDA (1290) at 0314 on 3/2. Also XEMC (1590) verie received, a station picture card plus prepared card verie, signer unreadable. PM also noted XEJ verie.

PUERTO RICO--HH was among the lucky ones who heard WWWV (1520) with an early sign-on at 0454, logged until 0520 on 3/13, and no longer very easy with WKBW on all night. Verie was back in 7 days for a new one for Hank from Puerto Rico. RB reports his verie is now in from AHD (780) Ramsey AFB. Reported 2/19 and back 4/1. PM QSL'd WNEL.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC--HH reports his verie is in from HI3A (1415) verifying his report of 2/24 with a letter. Says that HIG is the mystery station he reported in March. Logged on 3/10 between 1930 and 2000, with fairly good signals.

CUBA--RH reports a form letter from CMBE (830) Havana, reading "It is with pleasure that we acknowledge receipt to your letter reporting our reception." Wants to know if we consider this a verie. As far as counting veries is concerned, Roy, it is your hobby, and you should count just as you see fit. Since most of us accept anything coming out of Cuba that doesn't outright deny our reception, I would most certainly count it a verie. Will count in the contest, anyway. RA reports another one in via CMQ card, this one for CMKJ (730) Holguin.

## SOUTH AMERICA

URUGUAY--RA reports CX-18 (890) Montevideo, heard on 4/3 from 0417-0455 fadeout with continuous talking. HH mentions one in this city logged on 3/27 from 0409-0455, but he didn't say what frequency and call, so we assume he was also talking about CX-18. All talk and no music, but Montevideo is often mentioned. HH also says he finally got a good log on CW-1 (543) Colonia, between 2241 and 2400 on 4/5. Popular Spanish and US recordings.

BRAZIL--HH reports his 16th Brazilian verie in form of registered letter from PRA-3 (860) Rio de Janeiro, signed by Eddy Dias da Cruz, enclosing post cards of Rio. KB notes reception over there of PRA-3 (860), PRE-8 (980), PRG-9 (1100), PRI-4 (1110), PRC-9 (1170), PRG-3 (1280), and PRC-5 (1450).

ARGENTINA--Argentiniens seem to be going overseas rather than north. The only ones reported this time are by KB and are LR-1 (1070), and LR-3 (950).

VENEZUELA--KB notes reception of YVMF (1120) and also notes that YVME is the short wave transmitter on 4900 Kcs. GA adds that YVLR (990) was heard on 3/9 at 0515 and later QRMing WPRA.

## EUROPE

CZECHOSLOVAKIA--RA has a long, friendly letter verifying his reception of Melnik (1286).

AZORES--This from KB who listed it under Africa. Guess we'll have to decide where it is. Ken says that he has logged Ponta Delgada on 1214 Kcs. at Midnight GMT and a little while afterward.

YUGOSLAVIA--RA reports a pamphlet-card verie in for reception of Belgrade I (683) and another for Zagreb (1133) with color view of seaport of Dubrovnik. Address is "Radio Yugoslavia", Post Office Box 97, Beograd. Prior to veries by regular mail they sent an airmail letter with data sheet to give information on reception of short-wave outlets on 6100 and 9505 Kcs. This was during test transmissions in April. Roger says both frequencies were blocked, so he couldn't help them at all. RM also reports a Zagreb (1133) verie in.

YUGOSLAVIA (Cont'd) HH reports a verie in from Ljubljana (917) for his report of 2/20 with a letter and photos of studios. Signed by Gosic Mitko, Director.

FRANCE--\*--HH reports a letter QSL in from Strasbourg II (1277). This was for report of 2/9.

NORWAY--\*--QSL card received from LKP Fredrikstad for report of 2/14. (HH)

HUNGARY--\*--RA notes that a late mail brought him a nice verie card for Budapest I (Kossuth) (539). It is a positive verie in English with oblique aerial view of Danube running through Budapest. Roger comments on nice veries from Communist countries.

GERMANY/ENGLAND--\*--The following is a quotation taken from the April issue of WIRELESS WORLD, an English publication, and forwarded to us by KB: "Medium wave coverage of Germany by the BBC has been improved by the use of the high powered transmitter at Osterloog, near Norden, operated by the NWDR. This transmitter, which is now being used for the BBC European Service, instead of the station at Ottringham, Yorks., is radiating on 1295 Kcs. The programs are fed by line from London." So it looks as if the station you will be hearing on 1295 in the future will be Osterloog, not Ottringham.

## AFRICA

TANGIER--\*--A question from KB to KM, asks if his report of Radio Internationalc on 1228 Kcs. was meant to be 1238 Kcs. KB says he has information that they were to move from 1232 to 1238 Kcs.

ALGERIA--\*--RA has a verie card in from Algiers III (1421) for his fifth African. This one 5 Kw.

FRENCH WEST AFRICA--\*--RA wants to know how to get a verie from Dakar for the past season. He sent a good report with two follow-ups complete with prepared card and plenty of postage, but nothing back so far. If anyone has any information that will help, please let RA know right away.

## ASIA

RYUKU ISLANDS--\*--GA reports reception of KSAR (740) at 0515 on March 12th. This is the first reception reported of this country in the USA. Congratulations, Gene.

JAPAN--\*--GA reports JOFC (1420) QRMing WLNA on special program of 3/30. PM reports a verie in from JOHN Kagoshima. JC heard JOHR (1230) quite clearly at 0445 on Monday 4/6. Says TP signals are now fading pretty badly. RHM adds a verie in from JOBB (830) Osaka, signed by T. Yoshida. The following information is taken from the March issue of NZ DX Times, and is forwarded to us by JF:

JOFR (1290) "Radio Kyushu", power 10 Kw Day, 5 Kw Night.

FORMOSA--\*--RHM has a letter sheet from Taiwan which caused some excitement at his place, but turned out to be only the schedules of broadcast by the "Voice of Free China". Only BCB station listed is BED-2 (670). Formosa is 8 hours west of PST per this schedule which shows no English language broadcasts on 670, but does include some other Asian tongues beside "Taiwanese", as the local language is

FORMOSA (Cont'd) called. Is this all Ray gets for his reception report to BED-33??

PHILIPPINES--\*--Again from the NZ DX TIMES, DXCC (1560) Cagayan de Oro, Mindanao, verified by owner, Henry R. Canoy, general manager. Uses 500 watts, to be 1 Kw. First on air 7/4/52 with regular transmissions 30 days later. Inverted L half-wave antenna, 75 feet high with home-made transmitter. Also from NZDX TIMES & "Bob Hardy, CE of AFRS, Clark Field, says they have a relay at Camp John Hay at Baguio City, 70 miles from Clark Field. No frequency mentioned. Clark Field has new equipment. The above passed on to us, by JF. HSN adds a note clearing up his unknown station of February on 800 Kcs. He has a verie back from DZPI. Schedule shows American programs transcribed, so be on look-out for him, as the signal was good.

## OCEANIA

AUSTRALIA--\*--RM reports that TP conditions have been getting worse right along. His only news is a verie in from 2QN (1520). He has sent a report to 4IP, heard on 3/15. JF reports the following as official changes; Frequency changes; 5RM to 800 from 830; 6WN to 810 from 800; 6GN to 850 from 820; 4RO to 1000 from 1080 (Note this station did not change to 1490 as per Log Book); and 4GM to 1570 from 1540. PM also reports a 2QN verie. GA adds following reception; 2CR (550) 3/1 at 0546; 3LO (770) on 3/1 at 0615 overriding AFRS TOKYO; 2NR (700) on 3/2 at 0357; and 3WG (1150) on 3/23 at 0445. HH reports logging 4QR (590) Brisbane between 0426 and 0457 on 3/13 with political program and good signals. RA adds 2CO (670) Corowa, heard on 4/6 at 0405. Signal fair, but too much static to copy.

NEW ZEALAND--\*--HH reports 2YA Wellington on 4/6 from 0331-0451 with inaudible to fairly good signals. GA heard 2YC (660) signing off at 0530 on 3/11. PM notes verie in from 1YC Auckland. JF sends the following: New station ZKV on 1460 Kcs. with 500 watts. Operated by The New Zealand Post Office for Army trainees. Gives morse lessons with announcements every 15 minutes between 0130 and 0230. Will later give lectures to the trainees. Address - Wellington Radio, Post and Telegraph Department, Wellington.

HAWAII--\*--PM reports veries in from KILA Hilo, and KAHU, Honolulu.

## OMISSION

ALASKA--\*--Forgot to include this item under North America, but GA also reported reception of KABI (550) on March 9th Frequency Check.

## MYSTERY

Both HH and RM have also heard the one on 1540 which I reported last time. RM thought it was a domestic, and HH says he heard both a British-accented announcer in English and later a Spanish announcer. Anyone else any ideas on who it might be?
