### LETTER FROM R.C.A. RIVERHEAD

#### NOTICE OF DISCONTINUANCE OF FREQUENCY MEASURING SERVICE

"This is to advise that the Frequency Measuring Service now provided by our Riverhead, L.I. Station will be discontinued as of Midnight EST, on December 31, 1958.

### DAY STATIONS LOSE BID

(from a clipping sent in by Robert Reck, of Manhasset, New York)

Washington, Sept. 20 (AP). The Federal Communications Commission rejected yesterday a proposal that daytime-only standard radio stations get additional operating time. They are now limited to the hours between local sunrise and local sunset.

"The Daytime Broadcasters Association petitioned in 1955 for a change in the rules. It proposed that the daytime outlets be allowed to operate from 5 a.m. or local sunrise, whichever might be earlier, to 7 p.m. or local sunset, whichever might be later.

"The commission asserted that if this were permitted, the population that would gain service would be vastly exceeded by radio listeners who would lose service because of the interference factor."
