EGYPT(UAR)-*-"Alexandria (1205) fair signal around 1230 EST 0530 (NZT) several mornings lately. (RC) Egyptian on 926 Kcs., possibly Luxor, also heard recently. May have increased power on this frequency. (RC)

ANGOLA-*-"Emissora Oficial de Angola" indicates its schedule on ECB as 0600-0830 and 1300-1730 on 1368 Kcs. with 1 Kw. Call is possibly CS6SD. (WRH)

MOZAMBIQUE-*-"The English program of "Radio Clube de Mocambique" is radiated from 2230-2400 and 1030-1600 on 917 Kcs. Location of station is Laurence Marques. (WRH)

MADAGASCAR-*-"A QSL card from "Radio Tananarive" indicates the following schedule: French weekdays 2230-0030, 0400-0600, 1000-1430. Sunday 2300-0245, 0530-0600, 0915-1430 on 1394 Kcs. with 1 Kw. In Malgache weekdays 2230-0000, 0320-0530, 0900-1200. Sundays 2300-0045, 0330-0600, 0900-1200 on 1502 Kcs. with 1 Kw. (WRH)

ASIA (NEAR EAST)

CYPRUS-*-"According to a recent list of stations operating on this island, the ECB transmitters are as follows: Limassol (638) BBC Relay; BFN (British Forces Network) (719) and (1484), latter 1 Kw, former not known; Nicosia (606) 10 Kw.; BFN (1092) 1 Kw.; Paphos BFN (719) and (922) powers not known; Kyrenia BFN (719) power unknown; and Episcopi BFN (719) power not known. (All the 719 Kcs. transmitters are low in power.) (RP)

ASIA (FAR EAST)

NORTH VIETNAM-*-"Radio Hanoi" is now broadcasting news in English at 1515-1530 GMT and dictation news in English at 1545-1610 GMT on 1155 Kcs. (WRH) However, we have a report of a powerful signal on 1200 Kcs. Asian speaking. Announcement at 1015 "Vietnam, Hanoi, Vietnam". Sign-off is at 1100 EST. Would not like to say for certain that this is Vietnam until I've listened again. Could be a shift from 1155 as this transmitter has not been heard recently. (RC)

NORTH KOREA-*-"Pyongyang (620) with good signal 0100 replays 785 Kc. transmitter. (RC)

PHILIPPINE ISLANDS-*-"VOA (1140) was logged from 0631 to 0700 with fair signals on 10/27. New country. Report out to Washington. (HJW)

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SOUTH VIETNAM *-VTVN ("Radio Saigon") operates as follows: A Program (1090) 5 Kw., 1745-2130, 2300-0130, 0400-1100 in Vietnamese. B Program (838) 1 Kw., 1800-2130, 2330-0315, 0500-1100 in English and Thai. C Program (1360) 1 Kw., 1800-2115, 2330-0315, and 0500-1100 in French, Cambodian, and Chinese. (WGH)

JAPAN*-JOLK (610) Fukuoka, logged for 20 minutes on AM of 10/27 New one here. A station in Florida made it tough. (HJW) JOBB (830) Osaka, was S 9 at 0625 on 10/26 and S 9 plus at 0540 on 10/27. (HJW) JOLB (870) Fukuoka, S 7 at 0620 on 10/26, one of the best this season. (HJW) JOHK (890) Sendai, was S 6 to S 7 with a musical program at 0405 on 10/27. Was S 7 at 0610 on 10/26 with a popular music program. (HJW) JONR (1010) Osaka, was S 6 to 7 at 0530 on 10/26. Also had a musical program. Easy to ID. (HJW) JOQB (1030) Niigata, was fair at 0620 on 10/27. (HJW)

OCEANIA

HAWAII*-KHVH (1040) Honolulu, was S 8 to 9 at 0520 on 10/26 with HFC sponsored program. Best this season. (HJW)

NEW CALEDONIA*-Noumea (1400) is back on the air in French with a terrific signal at 0200 until s/off at 0525. Plays popular American songs around 0515. (KC)
