(duplicate letters to E. Cooper and B. Duffy re: letters to them of WMCA images.)
Dear Sir:

"Thank you for reporting what seemed to you to be trouble originating in our transmitter. Your trouble of course is "cross modulation." This is a form of interference occurring outside of the station itself and so is not curable by anything we can do. From the frequencies you mention hearing I believe one of the Marine or Beacon stations operating about 350 kcs is responsible for the multiplicity of occurrences of our station on your dial. If you have a receiver capable of tuning the range between 200 kcs and 500 kcs I suggest you try the next time the trouble occurs to pinpoint the exact frequency causing the beats and then use a simple LC series resonant trap to tune it out."

We do not know what "a simple LC series resonant trap" is Mr. Moore speaks of - perhaps some of our technically-minded members can shed some light on the subject.

Marvin brought down his color slides of different radio stations which he visited the past few years. They were exciting to see. Since the last time I have logged the following stations: 2/7- WRFD-880. 2/8- KMIN-980 f/c, KCLA-1110. 2/12- KTOV-900. 2/15- KJLT-970 f/c, KILT-310, KPSD-300 s/off, WFIN-730 DX 2/21- WHBQ-560, WQAL-560, WCTT-380 s/on. 2/22- CKEY-530, CHRO-900 s/off, WINS-1010, WDEM-1130. 2/23- WINZ-940. 2/24- KITE-930, KAMQ-1010, KFLD-900 s/off, KFYO-390. 2/27- CMCD-760, CMCU-360, XERB-630. 3/1- WVA-1170, XBC-1550, KHVH-1040. 3/2 KOKA with ET. With this new batch, I have added one new state plus Hawaii. Veries in from NSAC KTOV WFIN WJLT and a very nice letterhead from KSKY-660. I am trying to get a verification for all 107 frequencies. I now have a total of 348 stations logged. I hope that DXing is still good wherever you may be. Will see you all here in Convention City.

Morning of 2/1 found ET from new station KCCE-1360, Corning, Ark. 2 a.m., also took log on KQEO-920 AN and r/c from KGHF-1400, Roswell, N.M. On 2/14: KCBC was off 1390 and WWOV-1390 Lynchburg, Va. on AN in with WHEM AN in background; also tried for WFEC-1320 DX, Miami, Fla. but an OC seemed on top most of the time. Heard "Lord's Prayer" at 3:10 a.m. but it was probably CJOC. Then got a couple of Nat King Cole numbers and wonder if it might have been WFEC? Noise level terrific. 2/15: Darn lucky to hear WDLF-590 making f/c 3:44-3:50 a.m. as WOW was off, thank goodness. 2/16 was my big morning here. DX finally arrived here in eastern Nebraska as I logged my first two New Zealanders: 2YC-650 Wellington and 4YA-780, Dunedin. 4YA logged between 4:53 and 5:00. 2YC logged between 4:55 and 4:53 a.m. 4YA a little stronger than 2YC. These both surprised me so much almost forgot to mention Radio Trinidad-730 being logged 5:06 to 5:25 a.m. Religious talk at tune-in, ending at 5:15. Gave IDL "This is the radio voice of the West Indies, Radio Trinidad." KIRM-1450 nicely heard on DX here for a most welcome logging, and KTLQ-1490 really a powerhouse here on their DX. WTEB 1490 I'm afraid didn't make it here. Plenty of testing going on, 4:08 "Peg o' My Heart" and again at 4:17 from tester. "Gotta Travel On" at 4:24 and "Charlie Brown" at 4:26, all seemingly from the same test. Fairly strong low tone that seems to be plaguing us in behind this tester. Neither tester was KPCW Omaha, that's for sure- not KTCP either as I heard them leave the air. Anybody know for sure whether WTEB was on? 2/17: KROC-1450 was on for DX and heard amid some terrific QRM here, from KPIG KYOU and KLOS mostly. Ran tone and frequent IDs between 1:15 and 1:50 a.m. 2/19: KWYR-1260 heard on r/c and another report sent; also got KRLC-1350 Clarkston, Wash. with s/off at 1:40 a.m. Will mention latest veries in next report. 73.

We have moved to another apartment closer to Waikiki, and a 150' antenna has been strung up, running N/S. KPOA is two blocks away, and makes its presence known, but still not as much so as KHVH, a good mile away. No DX is available until after 1 a.m. locally (6 a.m. EST) which precludes my taking advantage of the CPC chows. Before an impossible QRN set in, there were high hopes of decent DX. Last Sunday 2/22 WCPC-1320 was logged 5:30-5:45 and KATR-1030 5:45-6:15 for a couple of reports. Saturday morning and this morning (3/2) the noise was too much; of note, however were KKOL-1360 AN, KFAB-1110, WCKY-1530, and KITO-1290 AN, all between 5:10-6 a.m. EST. Most recent veries have been on PP cards, as have been trying to fill up some of the gaps in my log. Total now is 775 veries for 991 reports for about 78.2%. The most regular stateside stations here are in order of consistency, XEAK KIK KPOL XERF and quite a few West Coast ANs plus regulars between 1500-1580. A few Asians creep in occasionally, but nothing which wasn't already heard between here and Japan, at least so far. 73s now.
