How well I remember when five sleepy DXers made a trip to WTRF to make a tape for a future DX. Making the trip to WTRF that foggy morning were Lefty, Joe Brauner, Pete Taylor, Don Kaskey and myself. Brauner's camera seemed to be the only thing that pierced the fog that morning. WONG-540 very strong here daytime and a fair signal heard on car radio at Marietta, Ohio, 80 miles south of Wheeling. If any member has information of dates of cosmic meteor showers this summer, please publish in DX NEWS. Cosmic meteors usually cause freakish radio and TV reception. I am delighted to find I now have NRC members in nearby communities, Waynesburg and Mount Morris, Penna. I note with interest that a CP has been granted for 1390 kc/s. to Middleport/Pomeroy, Ohio. Pomeroy is located along the Ohio River and has only one street shelf-like against steep cliffs. An application is pending before the FCC for a new radio station in Reading. The proposed site of a broadcasting tower is about a mile out, across the river, not very far from WHUM's XR. I believe the applicant is WRAN's Chief Announcer. 5/1- In Teheran, the Shah of Iran dedicated the new \$500,000 studios of "Radio Iraq," donated by the U.S.A. It must be quite a layout! 5/25- Bulletin arrived. I still have three verie reports out. Bob Barry, News Director of WMNS-1360, Olean, N.Y. is getting more flying saucer reports. Their radio tower was buzzed by two mystery objects. Three strange objects came out of the East and as they neared the WMNS tower, located on a hillside in East Olean, one of them seemed to hover in the sky, while the other two objects dropped to a lower altitude and crossed over the top of the tower, a few feet above it. They were reported as small in size and grew brighter (9:34 p.m.) as they came lower. The mystery objects were visible for nearly 15 minutes. Twenty residents including one of Olean's aldermen saw this and others flying northerly, while waiting to observe Russia's Sputnik rocket carrier. The only two mornings I listened were the 6th and the 17th with the total catches gotten at seven. We have received information from the DX STAMP SERVICE which may be of interest to all of you. This service offers mint (unused) stamps of most of the world's radio countries. They stock stamps which will bring replies back via air mail, at prices ranging from 10¢ for Canada to 65¢ for Aden. We all know that stamps work better than IRC's, and in many cases the stamps are cheaper. If you are interested, send a 4¢ stamp to DX Stamp Service, 466 Weaver Road, Webster, New York. You will receive a complete price list of all stamps he has on hand. He promises shipment of stamps the same day the order is received. In this way, we could very easily log a station, order the stamp, and still get the report out in less than a week. We know nothing about the service, but it looks good. The owner is A. N. Ringler, W2SAW.

This brings us to the comment that if you want good DIGESTs during the summer months, you will have to keep information coming to me. Look over your records for the past season, and send along your list of non-verifying stations. We will list them in the hope that someone else has received the veric and can pass on a late signer or a new address. This has worked in the past, and we have the space and time during the summer. If you have any ideas of how the DIGEST should be handled, please let me have them. Send any contest ideas you may have to Roger Anderson. Do your planning now, so that when the new DX season comes along, we will be all ready to get information out.

During the summer is the time for you all to check your tubes. Some may be weak. Perhaps your receiver needs to be re-aligned. Now is the time to do it. If you planned to put up a new antenna, or change an old one, now is the time to do it while it is warm outside. Work out those things now so you will be caught up and ready when the new season gets started.

A brief note may be in order regarding some standard abbreviations which we use. When we list stations, we frequently list them as: XMTB Culiacan, Sinaloa. 500(1) D ND
 Power is always given in nighttime power. In parentheses we list the daytime power in kilowatts. Night power is in watts. D indicates Daytime station. U-Unlimited. ND-Means Non-Directional. DA is a directional antenna. DA-N means directional antenna at night. In listing schedules we often abbreviate D-Daily, W-Weekdays, Sa-Saturday, Su-Sunday. VS-is veric signer. Other abbreviations are the standard ones used elsewhere in the bulletin. And with this note, we close the June issue of INTERNATIONAL DIGEST with the hope that there will be lots more reports for the July issue.

COSTA RICA-*--TILS (883) Radion, noted 4/3 2305 with ID "Esta es Radion". TIFC (995) "Faro del Caribe", logged 4/12 2337-2400 with English religious program. Then 15 minutes of German announced 0015 s/off. QSL-card specifying 995 and printed letter vack in 8 days. TIRS (920) logged again, and this time I sent my report, with card prepared form from old shortwave letter verie. Can't understand their non-verification policy now, for WRH lists same gerente as my 1951 shortwave verie, who sent nice letter in English, copy of promotional sheet for the station, and very attractive letter opener of wood. Surprised to find TIHB (690) on 0353-0403 4/27 with GRM from intermittent tone test. Is "Radio Reloj de Costa Rica", and at 0400 had what appeared to be birthday greetings, mentioning a name then something like "veinte anos", etc. No sign of either WTIX or XEAK. What goes? (JAC)

CUBA-*--Routine log on UNCD (760) 3/30 0408-0418, while looking for ZFY. Reported. (JAC) who is the Cuban on 1100? announcement 4/3 x seemed to be "Radio Carena (Or Reina) de la Monte", and only town heard 2208-2300 was Camaguey. (I've lost contact with Rafael Rodriguez, 70 years old, diabetic, and always an extremely faithful correspondent, so I fear the worst.)(JAC) OMHB (760) Sancti Spiritus, seeped through WBBM on good LA night 4/4 0025-0031 with Union Radio programming for short report. (JAC)

EL SALVADOR-*--&SC (1015) San Salvador, noted at S9 level and no need for Q-Multiplier 4/27 0237-0301 and later testing new 10000-watt transmitter, according to Spanish announcement. Requested phone calls, cards, and letters. Slogan: "Esta es la nueva YSC, Radio 1025." (Mil veinte cinco.) (JAC)

GUATEMALA*-TGJ, "Radio Nuevo Mundo" (830) logged for report 2335-2400. (JAC) TGUX (1020) "Radio Panamericana", Guatemala City, good 4/4 0045-0104 s/off. (Carrier off 0104) S/off in English and Spanish with Celeste tune. Said 5000 watts. (JAC) Photo QSL card received from TGXA (1040). (RA)

HONDURAS*-Thanks to LBG phone call, found HROW (845) "Radio Monserrat", Tegucigalpa, weak but loggable 4/12 from 2242-2258 $\frac{1}{2}$ Sunday s/off. Report sent with IP drawn free-hand from beautiful SW verie letterhead dated 1951. (JAC)

JAMAICA*-Montego Bay (1180) fine level 4/6 0542-0605. 0542-0548 had fine NA pop records, complete ID 0548, then "Sacred Heart Hour" to 0605, when carried what appeared to be local religious program. Verie back 4/27, usual signer, Mr. Wong, and beautiful embossed letterhead similar to Trinidad on "flimsy" paper. (JAC)

MEXICO*-XEFR (1180) logged 4/4 0009-0019 and 0034-0043 with Latin standards such as "Para Vigo me Voy" (Say Si Si), "La Golondrina", etc. Is "Radio Felicidad". (JAC) XEMO (860) in English with San Diego area commercials 4/4 0105-0125, bad KONO QRM. (JAC) XEJP (1150) 0126-0147 4/4 with "Radio Variedades slogan and time signals. Heard 0324 on 4/27. (JAC) XEOY (1000) "Radio Mil", 4/4 2000-2030 with NA pop tunes. (JAC) XEIQ (960) Ciudad Obregon, Sonora, AM 4/6 with with program to raise money for a kiddies playground. Featured pinao player who was trying to play piano for 64 hours straight, according to announcement in broken English. Piano picked up considerably stronger than his voice, and it sounded at times as if XEIQ was two different stations fighting it out. (JAC) XEFW (810) QSL'd with large card, a photo of two Tampico lovlies in front of XEFW mike; routine. (JAC)

NICARAGUA*-After months of procrastination, I finally got a report in the mail to IND (675) for 4/3 2313-2330 logging. Slogan now deciphered, at last, as "Union Radio, La Onda Musical y Sportiva, 605 kilociclos, en Manague". Had a "Radio Noticias al Dia" at 2320. (JAC) YNX verie in, can't read sig, on my own card, airmail in YNSA-TV air letter. Apartado 1505. TV fans YNSA on Channel 8. (BS?)

PANAMA*-Words phonetically similar to "Radio Aeropuerto" and "Panama" heard on my 550 station 4/6 0339-0358 #SVA s/on. Also 4/13 0305 KAFY s/off to 0340, but not conclusively ID's. However, little doubt remains in my mind after 4/27 that this is HON31 AM. I heard "Radio Aeropuerto" clearly and precisely this AM, and time signals given in EST which checks. At any rate, I've transferred HON31 from the tentative to the positive ledger in my log. With California on PDT now, KAFY s/off is now 0205 and HON31 has nearly two hours before #SVA makes the scene. (JAC)

PUERTO RICO*-Unneeded WITA (1140) surprisingly atop channel 4/4 0003-0009 ID. (JAC) #ENA (1560) at 0436 4/6 with what appeared to be s/on announcements. Logged until into mud at 0448. (JAC)

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC*-Verie (Attractive 4 color QLL card) with no signature typed in English gives this information. HI3T (620) Ciudad Trujillo, 10 Kw.; HI6T (1380) Santiago, 1 Kw.; HI8T (1360) La Vega, 250 watts. (BS?)

VIRGIN ISLANDS*-WDTV (1190) Columbus Bay, Christiansted, St. Croix was deleted in error in the last bulletin. It should be reinstated with 500 watts power, due on the air 4/29/60. (FCC)

HAITI*- "Radio Lumiere", B. P. 71, sus Cayes, operates on 760 Kc. from 0530-0700 and 1700-2130, Sunday 0700-2130. Verifies by letter. (WRH)

SOUTH AMERICA

CHILE*-In a verification letter, "Radio Soc. Nac. de Minería" states that CB-106 (1060) is now operating with 100 Kw., since last November. (DW)

COLOMBIA*-WJAT (1080) logged second time 4/13 0422-0434, 0445-0454, through intermittent KRLD test. Didn't verify early season report, but came through in 14 days for this one, so apparently my first one just didn't get there. Air mail verie, nice letter and pennant, specifying power to be 1 Kw., after I asked. That amazes me for they are the most consistent Latin signal except for the few good Mexicans. I didn't receive the brokwn record, hi. (JAC)

VENEZUELA*-YVAE (1100) "Radio Cultura", Caracas, surged atop the Cuban 4/3 2227-2232 s/off for short log, with several commercials caught. (JAC) YVOA (994) "La Voz del Tachira", San Cristobal, logged at good strength and readability 0521 s/on to 0530 on 4/6; verie back in 15 days, a large QSL-card, depicting coverage map on one side and preinted verie message in two-color embossed text on reverse. (JAC) Venezuelan on 1030 noted at weak level, 4/6 0532-0541 fadeout. Got several sponsor's names, Maracaibo mentioned several times, so report off with crossed fingers in tentative form to YVMX, though YVQC is more powerful. (JAC) Verie letter and QSL card in from YVMN (1110) signed by Roger Leyba, Director of Radio Coro. (RA)

EUROPE

FAROE ISLANDS*-Torshavn has been broadcasting Sunday mornings from around 1900 (Saturday night here) and again at 2000-2040 on 1367 Kcs. Announced two other special transmissions for seamen at 0700 and 1300. Opening and closing announcements also in English. (DW)

GREECE*-Current Greek Armed Forces station on BCB, s Salonika on 1169 Kcs. (WRH)

AFRICA

FRENCH CAMEROUN*-According to Sorofom the latest schedule of Radio Cameroun I at Yaounde is on 1538 Kcs. with 1 Kw. 0030-0230, 0615-0800, 1200-1600, Sat. 1000-1700. Sunday 0200-1700. (WRH)

REPUBLIC OF GUINEA*- "Radiodiffusion Nationale, Conakry" is now broadcasting as follows: W 0200-0300, 0715-0830 (Thurs 0900), 1330-1600 (Sat 1100-1700* Sun 0500-0845 and 1100-1700. Is on 1403 Kcs. (WRH)

KENYA*-Cable and Wireless Broadcasting Service, Nairobi, is now using 863 Kcs. with 5 Kw. for English programs. On W 2230-2400, 0500-0700, and 1000-1500. Sun 2330-0615, and 1000-1410. (WRH)

MOROCCO*-IBRA Radio using the transmitters of "Radio Africa", Tangier, is now operating on 935 Kcs. with 125 Kw., same schedule as before. (WRH)

TOGO*-Monsieur G. Ekue, le Directeur du Service de la Radiodiffusion du Togo", Lome, writes that reception reports should be directed to him at Boite Postale 434. Medium wave frequency is 1394 Kc and power is 1 Kw. (DW)

ASIA (NEAR EAST)

TURKEY*- "Radio Injirlik", situated at Injirlik Army Air Force Base, near Adana, is weakly heard in Cyprus on 850 Kcs. around 0300 with AFRS programs in English. Is rated only 50 watts. "News every hour on Radar" is broadcast at 0300. Some splatter from Bucharest on 854 Kcs. (DW)

ASIA (FAR EAST)

JAPAN*-Verie in from JOEP (1200) 1 Kw., located in Onomichi, Japan, on a report of March 16, 1959. Is a member of the NHK. ID'd on the hour at 0300 PST. My 38th Japanese verie. (HJW)

TAIWAN*-Recently reported stations heard are BEV72 (1370) Taipei; BEC25 (1350) Haulien; and BEV45 (1310) Taipei. (NZ)

NORTH KOREA*-NZ advises that reports to stations in this area should go to Mr. Ryoo Yung Pyo, Vice Chairman, Korean Central Broad

casting Comm., Pyongyang, North Korea. I still do not believe that we have postal service to North Korea, but I think some of the members have been getting through via China.

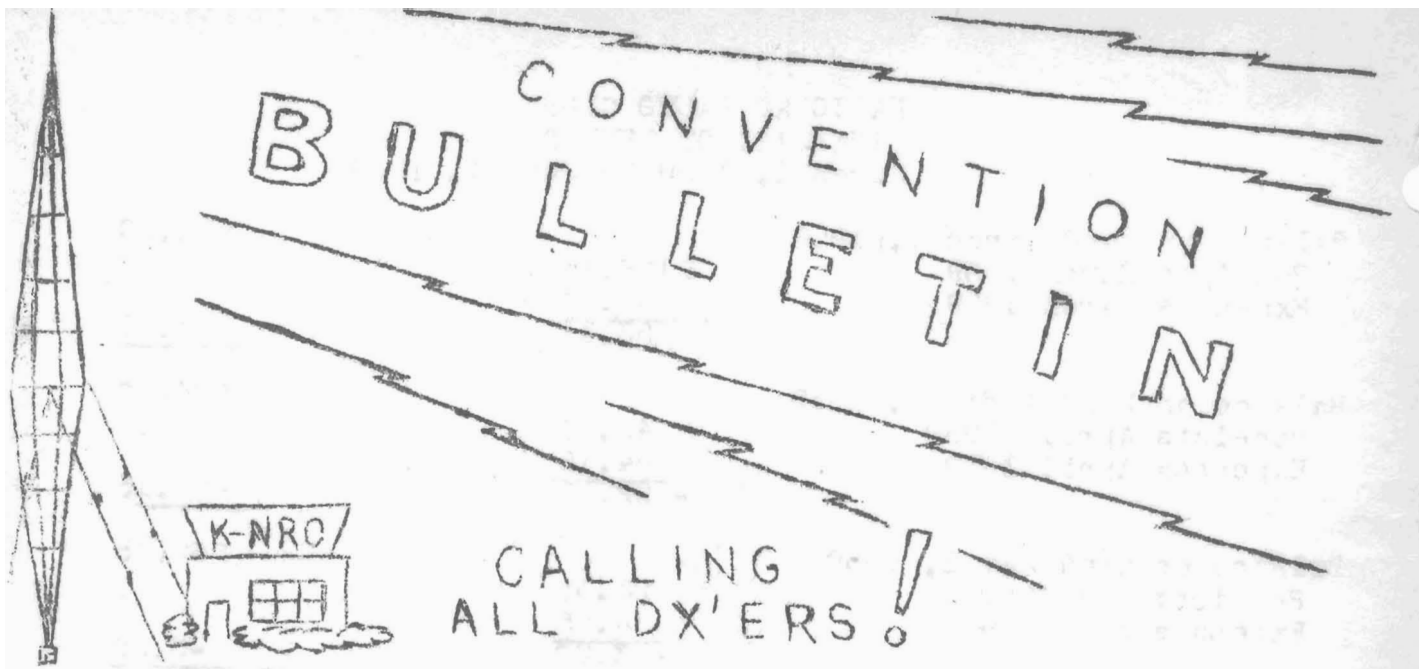
