Speaker: Mr. John Yottes, News Editor of Radio Station WFAS, who will talk on the equipment used by WFAS, the history of the station from the time it first went on the air, and on the subject of news gathering.

The Annual business meeting will also be held following Mr. Yottes' address, with Fred Van Voorhees and/or Lefty Cooper presiding.

Then, for the rest of the evening and perhaps during the wee hours of the morning as well, you're again "on your own." There will be a receiver in Rooms 214-215 available for some DXing, and also in several rooms occupied by members of the National Radio Club in various spots in the Hotel.

The Annual N.R.C. DX Quiz Contest will be held following Mr. Irwin's address, with Kenneth Maylath presiding. Several members have donated prizes for this event, and we thank them and will acknowledge them at the time.

There may be a few surprises at this dinner, so be on the alert!

3:00 or 4:00 p.m., or thereabouts:

VISIT TO RADIO STATION WVIP, Mount Kisco.

There should be enough cars to transport everyone to Mount Kisco and to WVIP's modern studios. "The Modern Sound of Radio in the Round" will welcome us there and we will be shown all around the station, which operates on a frequency of 1310 kilocycles with a power of 1,000 watts daytime with a directional antenna. They have a construction permit for 5,000 watts on the same frequency.

6:00 - 7:30 p.m.

7:30 p.m.

We will meet in Rooms 210 - 211 - 212, where pictures of past Conventions will be shown, and where we may examine one another's verifications, and discuss DX in general.

VISIT TO RADIO STATION WVOX, New Rochelle.

There should be enough cars available to get everyone there. This, like WVIP, is a member station of the New York Herald Tribune Network, and operates on 1460 kilocycles daytime only with a power of 500 watts.
