

The Annual Convention of the National Radio Club August 31 to September 3, 1962 at the Claypool Hotel, Indianapolis, Indiana

We welcome you one and all to Indianapolis and hope your stay here will leave you with many pleasant memories. This is your guide booklet to help you get the most out of this year's convention.

CONVENTION SCHEDULE

Listed below is the schedule of planned activities which we plan to follow during this year's convention. Please be on time for all activities as a delay in the start could delay the rest of the activities which follow. If you do not wish to partake in a particular activity, the Indiana State Fair is now in full swing. Busses are available from most downtown locations directly to the fairgrounds.

Friday, August 31, 1962 - 8:00 AM - Please be assembled at the registration area of the 8th floor and ready to leave for Mason, Chio. Those who will drive will take about 3 or 4 members each. Please be divided into groups and ready to leave on time. We should be at Mason by 11:00 PM. We will divide up in to 2 groups, alternating between WIW and WIWO. After the tours, we will have lunch and proceed to Chillicothe. We should arrive at the FCC station by about 2:00 PM, at 3:00 PM we will start for home, arriving at about 6:30 PM. Following supper, there will be an informal gathering in room 844.

Saturday, September 1 - 10:00 AM - Official Registration at registration area on 8th floor. Banquet and incidental fees will amount to \$6.00. At this time you can collect convention information, maps of Indianapolis, State Fair information, etc. You can also pay your \$2.00 extra for the XE lunch if you should desire to partake in this activity.

12:00 Noon - At this time we will gather in the Skyline room for the Mexican banquet. Official Mexican background music will be provided to enhance the atmosphere.

1:30 PM - We will leave at this time for the station tours. Please be gathered in the registration area. From there we will proceed to the WLWI parking lot where we will divide into 3 groups and each start with a different station and will rotate. Drivers of cars will be given marked maps to show the way to the WLWI lot.

WIWI - 1401 North Meridian Street WFBM - 1330 North Meridian Street WISH - 1440 North Meridian Street

The tours will be finished by about 4:30. At this time we will return to the Claypool.

7:00 PM - This will be the time of the banquet, after which we will have our guest speaker and business meeting. The speaker will be Mr. Edwin B. Dooley from WLW. Remember this is a coat and tie function.

11:00 PM - At this time there will be an informal gathering in room But. There will be various receivers there and tape recorders.

Sunday AM - There will be no planned activities at this time. Instead, we suggest you attend the church of your choice, a list of which is included in this booklet.

1:00 PM - At this time the Sunday banquet will be held. Dress will be informal. After the banquet, the annual convention quiz will be held.

5:1.5 PM - We will visit the "Traveler", the mobile studios of WXIW. This is quite unique and should prove quite interesting for all.

7:00 PM - At this time there will be a gathering in room 844. Slides will be shown on previous conventions and some interesting radio stations. Following this, there will be a Monday AM DX session.

9:00 PM - All those who want to stay up for the all night DX party will proceed to 5721 Radnor Road.

Monday 11:00 AM - Tour of WIWI-XR.

Monday PM for those remaining, there will be a group tour of the State Fair which closes Labor Day.

Addena: Immediately following the convention quiz, we will proceed to WSVL at Shellyville, Indiana. This typical midwest small town operation should prove interesting to all.
