Greetings. A most wonderful time was had by yours truly at the Denver Convention. It's always great to meet fellow NRCers. Also enjoyed drag racing my Fairlane at drag strips in the area. I have done some limited work on the ferrite antennae, so will report on what I have found out so far. The most outstanding thing about the rods is the Q. Including capacitive losses to the receiver, the 16" rod wound with 100 turns of 80 strand litz wire has a Q of 800. This provides high selectivity & directivity. There are major problems, however. One is coupling the antenna to the receiver. Open line cannot be used, as it will pick up signal & cancel the directional effects of the antenna. So, well shielded coax must be used. However, coax has capacitance, & with it come losses. So, the coax must be of very large diameter to minimize capacitance, & of short length to do likewise. The rod is also extremely sensitive to nearby metal objects, so it must be kept as isolated as possible. Therefore, it will take a carefully designed installation to get the most from this type of antenna. For coax, I will try some RG-11U with several layers of plastic tubing around it & an aluminum foil shield around the tubing. The shield of the RG-11U would not be connected. This would mean that the shield, the aluminum foil, would be a greater distance from the center conductor, thus reducing the capacitance. I now am using RG11U with the rod in the center of the den. There are many things left to try yet, & I will get to some of them when I have time, which will probably be after the drag racing season is over. 73.
