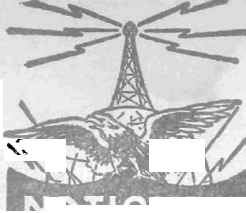

The frequency check is made with Phelps Precision Laboratories of Minneapolis. Announcements will be made about every five minutes. Mr. Broden tells us that they have been heard on occasion, from Coast to Coast on their frequency runs, so perhaps this will be one when that will happen, as the NRC will be on the alert for them. Of course, the channel is not going to be clear so it may take some fine listening, but let's all try for this check from friendly KROX. We thank their Chief Engineer, Mr. Donald V. Broden.

This friendly station will put on a special DX program for NRC on 3/30 at a time when 1340 will be at its clearest. It's a new station, having opened in January 1964 with 1,000/250. Reports go to Sr. Yvan A. Ramirez de los Santos, Presidente. Sr. Ramirez is very interested in receiving the most distant reports possible so everyone, please report. The program will consist of typical Dominican music "with the good Latin beat". They are near the North Coast of the Dominican Republic, and they'll run their 1,000w. transmitter. No calls will be used; everything will be in Spanish, but they will speak slowly and distinctly. This station has no one who reads English, and they will not verify for anyone using a report form! Reports should include either a Dominican Republic stamp or an IRC, or 10¢ U.S. cash. They have written a second letter and Sr. Ramirez says they will accept English reports - if they are written and worded simply, but Spanish is preferred as that is their language. The time for the program will definitely be 3:30 to 4:00 a.m., E.S.T. Here is the complete mailing address: Sr. Yvan A. Ramirez de los Santos, Presidente - Division "Radio Centro" - Carrasa y Cia., C. por A. San Juan de la Maguana, Dominican Republic. Our sincerest thanks to Sr. Ramirez for this signal honor to the NRC, so let's flood him with reports. Remember - no report forms, and try to write in Spanish. Your poor Spanish will be more easily understood than your best and simplest English!

Frank E. Curran - Upper Union Street - North Anson, Maine - 04958

Greetings and all that rot from the recruiting manager of Central Maine's NRC Chapter. Impressive title, huh? On to DX. Since last Musing well over 100 new ones logged. Totals: Verified 69, Heard, 421. Big Deal. Averages out to better than 50 a month, though. I wish I could say as much for the veries. Nothing very unusual so I will just hit the high points. Verie in from 4VEF specifying 4VEF-1035, 8,000w., power increase here, I suppose. Some of the better new ones are: KOB-770 HJFV-1220, WKWF-1600 RTF-1376 KFI-300 Guadeloupe-640 VP4RD-730 YNS-555 VOA-1180 HJDK-750 HJAJ-760 KTRH-740 ZBM2-1340 Venezuela-2200. 1/27- 1:57, IS of five or six notes on a harp around 780 w/s/on at 2am. CSB9, maybe? Ernie, your MM CBCer on 1400 is heard very well here. Only ID is "Ice Radio Canada" and "This is the CBC Radio Network." This ID is given on the hour and half hour. As far as I know, all the stations give call letters in Canada w/ the exception of relays. Only relays that I know of here are CBLV, 40w. and CBLI, 20w. but seems a bit strong even for that combined power. How do you get a verie from a fishing vessel, hi? 2/1, 1:30, noted on 1004-1004 kc/s. fishing vessel in the Atlantic Fleet w/ report on the cod and herring catch. No call letters given but very thick Scotch accent. (Maybe too much Scotch, hi). Moderate 1600 spillover. 2/7- 12:55am, WJVA f/c. If you didn't hear this you haven't lived. The most unusual thing I've heard yet. Beatle's recordson tape, tapes played in reverse, various sound effects and noises. Announcer gives time, WX reports and occasional "Wheeees," corny comments, two or three records played at once, spot announcements for the Beatles coming to South Bend, announces call letters and location, talks to people on telephone about Beatles, announced as test program and also "The Saturday Dance Party." These are just a few of the high points too. I wonder if that announcer got to the unemployment office oh time this week, hi? Looks like I may finally be the first to report something. 3/10, 9:22pm, 1200 kc/s., "Radio Tiempo" Caracas, Venezuela, w/NX & TX every minute. Frequency ID as Radio Tiempo (probably former "Radio Minuto Nacional"-YVOZ). 73s and sorry I ran over. PS- 3/12, 2:02-2:18am, 1440 kc/s., YVFR "Radio Orituco" Altigracia de Orituco u/WNPV's PoP test, fair to good SS (thought first they were IDing as "Radio Aeropuerto" but found different later). Believe first time this year that this Venezuelan has been reported. 500w. according to FBIS & WRTH.

KDTH r/c as per list with another tester; who? Log on WJBK with 1490 mullied out, also somebody testing on 1490 all morning 3/11 with no IDs. Grr. Veries in this week, QSLs, KWRE with Harry H. Coon as v/s, owner of station, WARO also with CM and v/1 along with QSL - very cordial letter. Although I have been a member of the NRC only a few weeks, I feel that I must write to tell you what a pleasure it is to be in the association. The year's membership fee has already been returned many times over in enjoyment and greatly increased knowledge of BCB DX. Recently Mr. Henry J. Wilkinson of North Hollywood invited me over to inspect his HQ-180 and to listen during the early evening hours. I had not realized it was possible to log so many stations on the BCB; in a little over an hour he had pulled in 13 foreign stations! This fired me up and I tore back into the old 1945 Hammarlund Super-Pro. After replacing all capacitors and a few tubes and spending a whole Sunday evening aligning the RFs and IFs, I found that the sensitivity had been increased greatly. Thanks to Mr. Wilkinson, we pulled in eight countries the first week. "Radio Belize" on 834 kc/s. comes in with house-filling volume each evening around 7pm PST. You people have introduced me to a really enjoyable hobby. Previously we had DXed on the SW (30 countries in very hit-or-miss fashion in about a year), but the BCB seems more of a challenge. It looks as if we have a long way to go to get into the same league with the rest of you, but we'll keep at it. When I feel I can contribute something really worthwhile, I'll send in some reports. A question - can someone tell me in a few words what the fascination may be of getting hundreds of U.S. BCB stations logged? I must be missing something. Am going to build a pi-section antenna coupler - will report if it does anything to boost signal strength.
