To any who did NOT make reservations in time, should then write DIRECT to the Kenton Manor Motel DIRECT at the above address. However in so far as the banquet dinner is concerned, let Pop know, no later than August 29th as to which meat course you prefer.

To those of you who might use the New York Thruway, those coming from the western end turn off at EXIT 53 and continue on this "Niagara Section" to Sheridan Drive (2 tolls of .15¢ each) and keep right on Sheridan and you will come to the Kenton Manor. To those coming from the "EAST" it is suggested that you get off the Thruway at Exit 48 at Depew (NY 78) and when you come off the exit turn "LEFT" on Transit Rd (NY78) and cross Main St and the next intersection will be Sheridan Drive. But go under the bridge and make another "LEFT" turn at the signal, then turn "RIGHT" on Sheridan and you will arrive at the Motel ~~xxx~~ about a 4 mile drive, maybe 5 or 6-Mi, however you cant miss it.

Remember August 15th is the DEADLINE for getting in your reservations to Pop for the Motel, if some of you cannot make definite plans by then, needing a bit more time, then send your reservation DIRECT to the Motel and inform them you are attending the National Radio Clubs Convention. In the meantime, either mail your suggestions for a Domestic and Foreign Contests to Club HQ, OR bring them with you to present at the convention business meeting. Also your ideas on CPC suggestions. All "Proposals" that have been received will be presented at the business meeting including those that have already been acted upon just recently. Lastly, the NY area members will have a Radio Quiz, so sharpen up on your DX-Station calls-Locations etc. Remember all DXers are WELCOME.

An Editorial by Ray Edge, Exec Sec

This being the last issue of DX News that I will publish I believe the following might be of interest to all members, especially the newer ones.

It began over the Labor Day week end in 1940 at Erie, Penna at the NRC Convention. Those of us attending noted that the future of the club was in doubt, in fact very much in doubt. There had been no issues of the club bulletin for 2 months and no insurance that future ones would be issued. Result, knowing this I began to persuade the one person in charge to turn over the club equipment to me and I would see to it that the club bulletins would be published regularly. It was not until early October that my efforts bore fruit. After bringing just a cheap mimeo machine back with me from Erie along with very few bulletin envelopes and nothing more, other than a bit of advice dealing with how to do the mimeo job, a bulletin was published on October 21 1940.

In order to publish that issue I was forced to foot the bills for the mimeo paper-mimeo ink-stencils and stamps. The club when turned over to me was BROKE. I also received a membership list containing a total of 160 names but upon careful examination found that only 63 of those members were paying annual dues. Thus after 2 more issues we continued with a total of 63 members. They were assured that bulletins would be forthcoming regularly and I am very glad to state that those members cooperated to the utmost and the club then continued to grow little by little.

The N.R.C. was originated in 1933 at York, Pennsylvania. It was transferred to Erie in 1937 when complications set in and those doing club work at York could not continue. It was only 3 years at Erie when a like situation occurred. Thus you can readily see that the N R C had its troubles in its beginning.

Since the NRC came to Buffalo in 1940, the regular schedule of 34 issues per year has been maintained without a miss. For the first 6 years (1940-1946) Pop Edge did just about all the club work necessary even to cutting the stencils containing members reports. Then at the Labor day convention in Buffalo Ernie Cooper offered to take the job of stencil cutting off my hands and lighten my work load. Fred Van-Voorhees took on the job of cutting the stencils for our short wave section. A couple years later the NRC dropped everything except the broadcast band and we became the first strictly BCB DX Club in the country, in fact I believe in the world. This decision was wisest move the NRC made because it was from that time on that our membership began to increase rapidly. At this same time Van Voorhees continued to cut the stencils but his short wave section now became the "International Foreign DX Digest". This section of DX News became very popular.

In 1953 Hal Wagner relieved me of the publishing job and kept it for 2 years when I was again asked to relieve him which I did for the years 1954-56 at which time some lads from along the Hudson took it for the year of 1956-57. Wagner retook it from 1957-59 at which time he informed all that he could not continue publishing DX News after the August 1959 issue. We asked for someone or some group to take over with the result that only 2 offers were received, neight were satisfactory, nor did either one guarantee the future of the NRC.

At the Omaha NRC Convention 1959 Pop Edge was persuaded to re-take the publishing job. This was done but under the conditions that I outlined at that convention which were;- The NRC Government would consist of the Exec Sec and Publisher - the Musings Editor and the International DX Digest Editor. That DX News would be limited to no more than 10 sheets of paper (20 pages) That the annual dues would remain at \$4.00 per year and that I would guarantee that DX News would continue to be published 34 times each year and on time. Lastly that I would guarantee the above for 5 years at which time I intended to retire. This was unanimously adopted by all attending that conven-

tion. In recent months a very few stated that it was forced upon them. I will repeat here that nothing was forced upon anyone as they could have rejected my proposal there and then. Now to my reason for my proposed type of club government. In the many years past we had different forms of club government, Board of Directors and then an Advisory Board. Neither type were willing to make definite decisions when necessary, some did not bother to cast a vote, thus when many important decisions were to be made the required majority could not be attained. Some stated they did not wish anyone to get mad at them and others did not bother to cast a vote. Under both types of the above club governments the correspondance necessary was enorinous and it did not accomplish its purpose. Too much of it had to be done by one person with the result that often times long delays occured. Thus my proposal would eleminate all this and knowing that both Ernie Cooper and Fred Van Voorhees along with myself were adult enough plus having vast DX Club experieence could honestly and fairly operate the club and when necessary, hand down decisions which also would be honest and fair to all concerned. When Van Voorhees had to be releived of his job, Pete Taylor took over and I am sure that he too faithfully filled Freds shoes as both Editor and part of the governing body of the NRC.

Now to what has happened within the NRC in the past 24 years. It was in excellent condition when Hal Wagner took over in 1952. It was also in excellent condition when Pop retook it in 1959. However this part might be interesting. As you were informed on the front page, the NRC was brought to Buffalo, BROKE. When it was returned to Buffalo in 1959 the club had in its treasury a total of \$713.31 but no bulletin supplies worth mentioning. The reason for this was that Hal did not wish to have a large amount of supplies on hand in case he would have had to transport it to a new publisher. Thus at Buffalo we had to immedately make purchases of mimeo paper-mimeo ink-stencils-bulletin envelopes and stamps, and all went well. Since 1959 the club has made the following purchases; A new A B Dick Mimeo machine - 1 Addressograph and the original address plates for all members. The club, since Jan 7 1963 absorbed the increase postal rate on our DX News which amounted to .01¢ per bulletin. All in all the above expense amounted to a total of over \$600.00. Yet as of August 1 1964 the following figures are correct. Bank balance \$680.97 plus supplies of mimeo paper-mimeo ink-bulletin envelopes alone amounting to a total of \$144.00. Thus as of Aug 1 1964 the club has an actual balance of \$824.97. Further our total membership as of the same date is the largest ever, now totaling 328. This result can be due to a couple of things. First is because those who have been governing the NRC have faithfully maintained the clubs original policy which is, give the members all possible and up to date DX information at the quickest possible time and keeping the annual dues to a minimum. The social end of the club was left to those attending convention and/or the different gatherings in different sections of the country during the year. Despite the fact that a very few thought otherwise, the governing body of the NRC faithfully believed that DX News with its DX information was most important to the majority of the members and from the results it seems that we were correct.

There were only 2 sad occasions in the past 24 years. The first was the deaths of 3 of our members on their way to the Indianapolis Convention in 1962. The other was when a very few decided that in wanting to satisfy a personal desire used every conceivable means to obtain their goal. In other words, a personal desire became more important than the hobby of DX itself. But the results showed that the getting of DX info was most important to the majority of our members who must be given a large part of the credit for keeping the NRC on top. So thanking all of you for your splendid cooperation and wishing all of you to continue to support your future NRC Governing Body, I will say so long and thanks again. Yep in time you will hear from me thru a musing now and then.
