
# NATIONAL RADIO CLUB CONVENTION 1969

# ANHEUSER\* BUSCH & RADIO STATION TOUR DIRECTIONS TO TOURS FOLLOW CLOSELY

FROM PARKWAY HOUSE AIRPORT Motel to ANHEUSER BUSCH Plant: Tour begins at 10:45 am

From motel parking lot turn right into Lindbergh, go north 0.8 mile to Interstate 70, turn right into ramp marked I\_70 EAST. Follow I\_70 signs; "I\_70 EAST", "THRU TRAFFIC", downtown St. Louis is about 15 miles.

When approaching downtown area, going thru it, & out other side of it, keep to left of the lanes in the highway. Beware of sign "I-70 HLINOIS", do not turn off on that ramp! The highway then becomes Interstate 55 SCUTH, follow signs: I-55 SOUTH, "MEMPHIS". Keep to left lanes until the Gravois Ave (US-66) exit is passed, then the highway becomes 4 lanes each way, (8 lanes both directions) This is when you move over to right lane of highway, for you exit at the next exit: ARSENAL Street. Keep to left of ramp approaching Arsenal St.

Turn left onto Arsenal St, go east to 7th Street, turn left (north) onto 7th. Go two blocks north on 7th, then turn right onto Pestalozzi St, then immediately left into the VISITORS PARKING lot.


FROM ANHEUSER\_BUSCH Plant to WIL Radio Studios & lunch: (Lunch at 12:15, WIL tour begins at 1:00)

Retrace back down 7th Street to Arsenal, right on Arsenal to I=55, turn right into I=55 NORTH, follow I=55 keeping to right & get off at next exit: GRAVOIS Rx Ave (North), (or East). Stay to left of ramp, go straight ahead into Gravois, keep to left lanes on Gravois, which then becomes 12th Street as it curves around to the left. Follow 12th Street north into downtown area, when 12th becomes extremely wide, stay to right, especially after passing Market, then Chestnut Streets. Our destination is the 12th & Locust Street Garage, because of one-way streets do this: turn right into Olive St, (next street after Pine St) then immediately turn left at next intersection into 11th Street, go one block north, then turn left onto Locust St......Park in the garage just ahead: 12th and Locust Garage. Recommended for our lunch spot by our tour host at WIL, Mitzi Hirschboeck, is the Hollings Cafeteria, 11th & Locust. WIL is right around the corner at 300 N. 12th from Locust.

FROM WIL STUDIOS to KXEN: (Leave downtown St. Louis by 2:30 at latest)
----KXEN tour starts 3:00 to 3:15

Go south to Chestnut St. (one block beyond Pine) or Walnut St. (2 blocks south of Chestnut, a block S. of Market). Chestnut or Walnut St are one-way east to Memorial Drive, which flanks the Third St. Highway (Interstate 70). Turn right onto Memorial Dr, look for and follow the sigh "I-70 EAST - ILLINOIS" This takes you over the new Popular Street Bridge, follow Interstate 55 NORTH - INT-ERSTATE 70 EAST about six miles following Thru Traffic, then turn off onto Illinois HIGHWAY 111, go North on 111 seven miles, then straight under the underpass at I-270, the towers of KXEN will be visible to the right. Turn right onto the "access road" & go a half-mile, your'e there.

KXEN to the PARKWAY HOUSE, go back to Highway 111 & 270, follow I-270 about 15 miles EA WEST (towards St. Charles), turn off at exit LINDBERGH BLVD South, South on Lindbergh 4 miles to motel.
