TEN I	YEARS AFTER***THE	LAST T	IME IN	THE ST.LOUIS AREA	

The first NRC convention in the St.Louis area was held Labor Day Week end,1969, in what was called the Parkway House Motel, on Lindberg Blvd. in St.Ann on the southwest edge of Northwest Plaza shopping center. The Parkway House has since changed ownership and is now called the Northwest Airport Inn, but its still very much the same yellow brick building. In 1969, its two uniqe features were refrigerators in every room and a large green-eyed elephant at the front desk, something that not even Noah's Ark has to this writer's knowledge! The hosts were Bruce Reynolds, Dave Carlson, Rich Eddie & Walt Breville.

Fifty-six DXers & guests were there from 22 states and Canada.On Sat. the gang visited the Anheuser-Bush Brewery(worlds largest), the WIL-14 studios & the KXEN-1010 studios/XR site. The Sat. evening banquet fea ured a talk by Richard E.Wood on DXing from Hawaii, Frank Waldon(who was not there) got the Domestic DXer award, Cesar Objic got the International DXing Award, he also was not there. DXers who were there receiving awards were Gordon Nelson being handed the Man of the Year ANARC plaque from Glenn Hauser, and Jerry Starr giving the Outstanding CPC plaque to Len Kruse. On Sunday, technical discussions were given by Gordon Nelson and Dave Fischer, slides were shown by Wayne Plunkett and Russ Edmunds.


The MM DX sessions were low in static with good results, with one group using a COllins 51-JS with a variety of loops at the motel, carriers were noted from Dakar-764 & Nice-1554, on1205, jumbled audio as well as carriers were pulled from France & Sierra Leone. TA conditions turned out to be unusually good at this time, as a British DXer reported very unusual reception of KO,O & KFBK on Sep.1 & 2,1969, from England.

TEN YEARS LATER continued

Walt Breville led a DX pedition armed with portable radios to what was then wide open countryside, 10 miles west of the motel at US 40 & Hwy 340 where KNX was quite loud & clear and a DX test was logged from Jolly Roger-1580 in Cincinnati, a bootleg operation with a 100 watt XR and 300' vertical ballon-supported wire, this test also got as far as New York and Massachussets.
